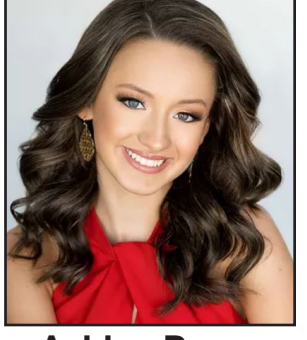

Life guards, construction workers, city street crews, and trash collectors are just a few of the outdoor workers who need to

be vigilant about sun safety. Even those who are only in the sun during recreational activities are risking sunburn, skin aging (such as skin spots, wrinkles, or leathery skin), eye damage and skin cancer. www.fda.gov reports that skin cancer

is on the rise in the U.S. And, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention project that there will be 106,110 new cases of skin melanomas and 7,180 deaths in 2021 in the U.S. Skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in the

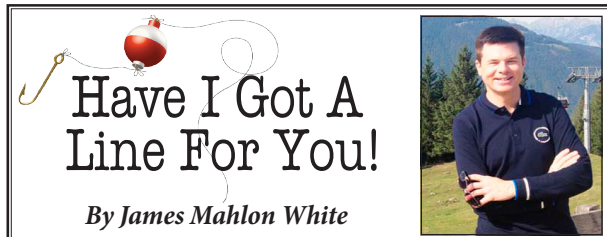

A distant cousin that I've never met stopped in the Enterprise office. Lois brought a number of old Enterprise copies from the 1910's that I really welcomed. Our copies from that period were damaged years ago. Wish we had as many archives in Clinton for the Democrat. It started in 1868 but all of those precious files burned in 1953. The office and everything in it were nearly destroyed. Newspaper files are big bound books with copies of each year's papers in them. The files from way, way back are brittle but still readable and give an account of Warsaw from 140 years ago. In 1881 the Enterprise printed an article that proclaimed Warsaw would have many visitors because "A great dam would be built on the Osage River. "That prediction was only about a 100 years off. One story from those early archives tells about the "Dazzling good looks" of a Main Street saloon keeper's

offspring. She was referred to as "Zarlinski's beautiful daughter." Warsaw was rambunctious and lively. Still is for that matter.

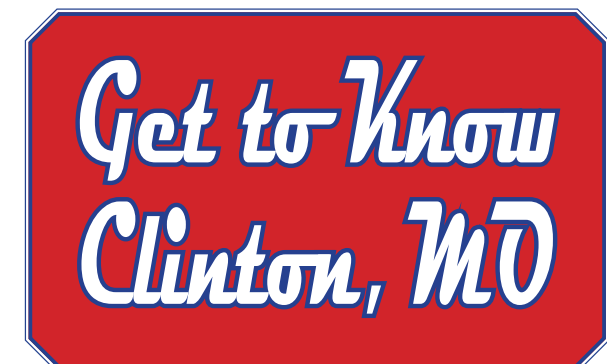

Cabin. In attendance were several members of the SAR as well as the inductee and his parents.

Robert Moore, who graduated from the Naval Academy about a month ago, is a 2017 Clinton High School graduate and is the son of Denise and Bob Moore. His parents, being able to track their lineage back to a supporter of the Revolutionary War (through Benjamin Moore, a Revolutionary War Patriot) gifted him the membership upon his graduation from the Naval Academy. "It is truly an honor," said Rob Moore addressing those gathered for his induction. "I believe strongly in our country and its values. It means a lot to me and my parents and I am proud to wear this emblem."

Gene Henry, the President of the Martin Warrant Chapter and Secretary of the Missouri Organization (SAR is a national organization with various state chapters) did the honor of inducting 2nd Lt. Moore. He explained that the emblem (a rosette which Rob Moore's mother pinned to his lapel as part of the ceremony) represents the colors of George Washington. Gene Henry also gave 2nd Lt. Moore a 250th Revolutionary War anniversary coin. Rob Moore affirmed that he would support the National SAR Society as able. Presiding with Mr. Henry over the induction ceremony was the Vice President of the Missouri SAR Association and Secretary of the Martin Warren Chapter, Michael Powers.

How hard is it to become a SAR? Marilyn Henry, State Registrar for the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) and present at Robert Moore's ceremony, explained that the time to research the lineage necessary to prove membership varies. All the various stages of records have to be documented: "Some take only a day [to verify], and some can take years," she said. In essence, one has to be able to track their ancestry back to someone who supported the Revolutionary War effort.

Robert Moore was happy to accept the honor, and is also ready to move forward with his military career. "I am excited to be a Son of the American Revolution and also excited to get my career in the Marine Corps started," said Moore. The Clinton Daily Democrat was also present at CHS (in Principal Jerrod Steffens office) when Moore, sitting with his parents, received the phone call from Vicky Hartler recommending his appointment to

the Naval Academy.

al in skin cells, causing mutations. Sunlamps, tanning booths, and X-rays also generate UV rays that can damage skin and cause malignant cell mutations. Basal cell carcinoma and squamous cell carcinoma have been linked to chronic sun exposure, typically in fair-skinned people who work outside. Melanoma is associated with infrequent but excessive sunbathing that causes scorching sunburn. One blistering sunburn during childhood appears to double a person's risk for developing melanoma later in life.

Fortunately, experts are shedding light on ways you can reverse some problems caused by the sun. It's not possible to erase all of the damage, but there are some steps you can take for these common conditions. www.fda.gov reports that the risk for sunburn, skin cancer and early skin aging can be lowered by 1) Limiting your time in the sun, especially between 10 AM and 2 PM; 2) Wearing clothing to cover skin exposed to the sun, such as long-sleeve shirts, pants, sunglasses and broad-brim hats; 3) Using broad spectrum sunscreens with a SPF value of 15 or higher regularly and as directed; and 4) Consulting a health care professional before applying sunscreen to infants younger than six months. It is suggested that you choose sunglasses with a UV400 rating or "100 percent UV protection" on the label. These sunglasses block more than 99 percent of UVA and UVB radiation and provide the most protection against UV rays.

Katy Trail Community Health in Warsaw also provided some safety tips and tricks

to beat the summer sun, including 1) Stay hydrated; 2) Apply sunscreen every two hours that is water resistant and SPF 30 or higher; 3) wear a wide-brimmed hat; and 4) Keep children under the age of six months in the shade. The clinic reported that sun burn can still occur on a cloudy day, it suggested that a self-skin exam be performed once monthly, and did not recommend the use of sunscreen on children under six months.

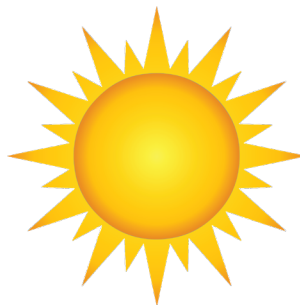
A spot check with some Clinton businesses where workers spend a lot of time outdoors revealed that there is a conscious effort to lower sun damage on a voluntary basis.

A female representative of Wesport Construction Company, at 1006 Clark Street, explained that the business is very aware of the heat index and protections that should be taken to be safe in the sun. She stated that most of the guys have been with the business for a lot of years and practice using sunscreen, wearing long-sleeved shirts, drinking lots of water and getting shade when possible. She said that when a new employee begins working, the "long-timers" gives advice about sun protection.

Ann Drury, Pool Manager at the Clinton City Swimming Pool, on Artesian Avenue, said that the City tries to provide umbrellas, and sunscreen is available for use by employees at their discretion. Some life-guards have visors and the pool management takes the Red Cross suggestion that recommends sunglasses for wear in the sun. Drury said that the slides have canopies and there are life-guard shirts that can be worn voluntarily. Lifeguards also take breaks every 45 minutes.

Facials can often reduce the appearance of sun damage, wrinkles and age spots. According to The Art of Dentistry and Spa, facials can cleanse and detoxify your skin. They stimulate cells improving texture, luminosity, collagen depletion and reduce inflammation. The Golden Valley Serenity Spa, at 116 Jefferson, is one local spot that offers facials and other skin care treatments ranging from \$40 to \$90.

Dermatological care is also available at Golden Valley Memorial Healthcare.

**Fourth Of July Safety**

The July Fourth weekend is a great opportunity to enjoy one of Missouri's national parks, recreational opportunities, lakes and rivers, or a backyard barbecue. Colonel Eric T. Olson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, reminds Missouri's travelers to make smart choices for a safe July Fourth holiday. Safety should be at the top of the list when planning how you'll celebrate our nation's freedoms. No matter how you decide to spend the long weekend, your smartest choice is to follow all Missouri traffic and boating laws.

During the 2020 counting period, 15 people were killed and 671 injured in Missouri over the holiday in 1,356 traffic crashes. Over the 2020 July Fourth holiday, troopers arrested 145 people for driving while intoxicated. In 2020, there were 14 boating crashes, which included seven injuries and zero fatalities. Two people drowned during last year's July Fourth holiday. Troopers made six boating while intoxicated arrests over last year's July Fourth holiday weekend.

The 2021 counting period for the July Fourth holiday will be from 6 p.m., Friday, July 2, to 11:59 p.m., Monday, July 5, 2020.

The Highway Patrol will be participating in Operation C.A.R.E. (Crash Awareness & Reduction Effort) and Operation Dry Water over the July Fourth holiday weekend. Operation Dry Water specifically targets impaired vessel operators. All available troopers will be patrolling Missouri roadways and waterways to enforce traffic and boating laws, and offering assistance as needed.

Missouri's boaters are asked to do their part by remaining alert for other boats and swimmers, and being courteous on the water. With more boats on the water, it is even more important to pay attention when operating your vessel. Never operate a vessel if you've consumed alcohol. Boaters need to be aware that it is illegal to discharge fireworks from a vessel. Leave all fireworks in a safe place on shore. Watercraft operators must consider the effect their actions have on others: Share the waterway and use common sense, good judgment, and courte-

## Monty Stratton Joins Clinton United Methodist

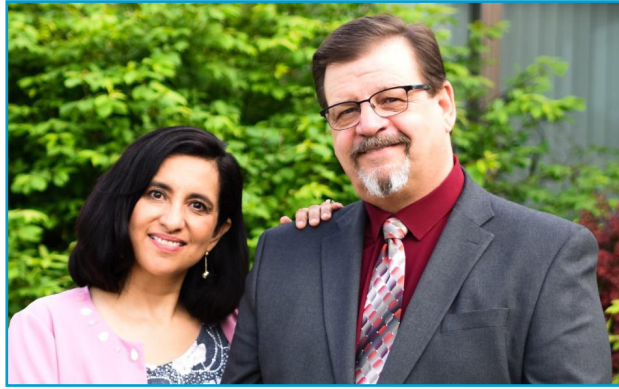

## Governor Parson Signs House Bill 271



Governor Mike Parson recently signed HB 271 into law, which establishes greater accountability for local leaders when imposing public health orders and prohibits local COVID-19 vaccine passports.

"This legislation I am signing today requires local leaders to be more transparent in their reasoning and accountable for their decisions when it comes to public health orders," Governor Parson said. "It also prohibits local, publicly funded entities from requiring a vaccine passport in order for residents to use public services, and while we encourage all Missourians to get vaccinated against COVID-19, it is not the government's job to force them."

Under HB 271, political subdivisions may only issue public health orders that directly or indirectly restrict access to businesses, churches, schools, or other places of assembly for 30 calendar days in a 180-day period when the governor has declared a state of emergency. Orders may be extended more than once with a simple majority vote by the local governing body.

If a state of emergency has not been issued by the governor, political subdivisions may only issue orders that limit access to businesses, churches, schools, or other places of assembly for 21 calendar days in a 180-day period. These orders may be extended more than once with a two-thirds vote by the local governing body.

Additionally, HB 271 prohibits county or municipal governments that receive public funds from requiring documentation of COVID-19 vaccination in order for residents to access transportation systems or other public services. "We appreciate the leadership of Senator Sandy Crawford and Representative John Wiemann in working to get this legislation passed," Governor Parson said.

With regular session closed I am back in the district and I continue to work daily on constituent issues. I am proud to announce that Blake Brodersen has joined my staff as my Legislative Assistant. Blake is a Benton County native and will be in the Capitol office Monday through Thursdays from 8:00 - 5:00 and from 8:00 - Noon on Fridays.

David, the young shepherd from the house of Jesse, was chosen by God. His father sent him to the military camp of Saul to bring food for the army. David hears the challenge of the Philistine giant, Goliath, taunting the Israelite army and calling for a man to fight him in single combat, but no one had the courage to fight him. David, young and brash, would hear no more and he answered the challenge. He threw off the armor that Saul had put on him, and taking only his sling, staff, and a few stones—and with God's help—he defeated the great giant and won the battle for Israel.

If we put ourselves in David's place, what kind of bravery would it take to face down such a giant? Yet David trusted in God and faced down the enemy winning a glorious victory for his country. When no other soldier dared fight, this little shepherd boy gave the victory to God and delivered God's people.

There is no enemy or force or obstacle so great that it cannot be overcome with God's help. But we must have faith that God will deliver us and we must go into battle. God requires us to find the courage to march against our enemy, trusting that He will do His part.

When the dark waters of the world rise up against us, our Lord will stretch out His hand and calm the storms of our personal struggles, just as Jesus did for His Disciples on the boat. Find the courage through faith to face down your enemy. As Philippians 4:13 tells us, "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength."

## Circuit Court News

The Henry County Commission met pursuant to adjournment at the courthouse in Clinton, Missouri on June 10, 2021.

Those members present were: Jim Stone – Presiding Commissioner, Dale Lawler-South District Commissioner, Rick Fosnow-North District Commissioner, Rick Watson- County Clerk

The agenda was approved.

At 9:05 a.m. Commissioner Stone brought the meeting to order. The minutes from the Tuesday June 8th, 2021 meeting were read. Commissioner Lawler made a motion to approve the minutes. Commissioner Fosnow seconded the motion, motion car-

ried.

Commissioners met with Officer Shane Lawson and Officer Keller to discuss the Clinton Police Officer's Association Olde Glory Days beer garden. After discussion, permission was granted for the use of the courtyard for the event.

Expenditures from the following were approved to be paid:

Elections Emergency Management Law Enforcement Fd Buildings and Grounds Admin Handling Cost Fund Gen County Govt Capital Schools Prosecuting Attorney ARPA Fund

The closed minutes from the Tuesday June 8th, 2021 meeting were read. Commissioner Fosnow made a motion to approve the minutes. Commissioner Lawler seconded the motion, motion carried.

John Clark, made an appointment to meet with the Commission to discuss addressing, but did not show.

The Commission received a certificate and recognition from the Missouri Association of Counties Trust, as the county did not have a work claim during the year.

There was brief discussion on the repairs needed on Road and Bridge equipment.

Commissioner Fosnow shared of the progress on the BRO-29bridge in Tebo Township. He also shared of numerous roads he had inspected including NE 601 Rd, in Deer Creek Township; NW 300, NW 500, and NW 131 roads, in Fields Creek Township; and NW 101 Rd and NW 401 Rd in Honey Creek Township.

There was discussion on the Library Board appointment.

Dennis Bowers, Road and Bridge Supervisor, met with the Commission. He gave an update on the projects with the department. He stated that he received notice that the county will receive \$55,000 soft match credit for the 1st of 6 county built bridges. He has begun work on the documents needed for the 7th bridge. He also shared of another breakdown with the red straight truck. There was much discussion as all the repairs and money that has been spent thus far on the truck and the option of getting rid of it.

At 10:00, the Commission conducted a bid opening for a new dump truck. There was only one bid received, from Custom Truck, of Kansas City. The bid came in at \$142,050 with various additional warranty options. The group had discussion. Commissioner Lawler made a motion to accept the bid for the purchase of the truck,

without the extended warranty, Commissioner Fosnow seconded the motion. The motion passed with a roll call vote of Lawler – yes, Fosnow – yes, and Stone – yes.

There was more discussion on the red straight truck breakdowns.

At 10:30, the Commission met with Sam Boyd, Jail Administrator, and Sheriff Kent Oberkrom via conference call, to discuss housing Federal Inmates. Sam presented the group with adjusted estimates of various costs and potential revenue. There was much discussion. It was decided to not pursue the housing of Federal Inmates, at this time, due to many unknowns. There was discussion regarding the possibility of contracting with other close counties.

There was brief discussion on the pretrial release program and it becoming a Circuit wide program.

Commissioner Stone shared of a meeting he and Clerk Rick had with Ranger Power, as they are still committed to installing a solar farm near the former KCP&L plant, using their transmission lines.

The Commission adjourned at 12:00 p.m.

## City Council Minutes

The Clinton City Council met June 15 at City Hall. All members of the council were present; Mayor Greg Lowe presided.

Following roll call and the saying of the Pledge of Allegiance, the previous meeting's minutes were approved (from June 1).

A personal appearance was made by Pastor Leroy Goodwin: he spoke to the council about supporting them and the need for the council to be aware of issues in the community. Pastor Goodwin said that he had not been attending council meetings but would be doing so from here on out. "I've been neglecting [coming here] as a citizen but will be coming from now on [to council meetings]," said Pastor Goodwin. He said that pastors and ministers had been meeting every two weeks on the square since last October praying for the city, mayor, and council.

A report was heard from Wallace White, Regional Airport Manager: he reported he has an intern working at the airport presently; the intern is currently in the airport management program at UCM. White reported that business traffic at the airport is picking up and that he and the intern attended the Missouri Airport Manager's meeting at Lake of the Ozarks

last week. The meeting included managers from large to small airports across the state. "Smaller airports tend to have similar problems," said White speaking about what he learned from the meeting. "There was a lot of talk about funding and regulations."

White concluded his report by telling the council he was keeping up with mowing at the airport. He asked the city administrator (Christy Maggi) if there was a firm date for the start of the apron project. Administrator Maggi said that the plan, as she understood it, was for the project to start no later than August 15 and be done around November.

The Public Works report was given by councilman Cameron Jackson: he reported that the engineering cost bid for the Franklin Street Bridge project came in at \$68,716. The council accepted the bid which will take the project process through the bid process for the actual bridge work. Estimates for the construction costs range from \$300,000 to \$500,000 – there is currently some gray area about costs because the bridge lies in a flood plain and will involve dealing with the Corps of Engineers.

The signal light timing for the Green and Second Streets intersection was presented at Public Works: the recommendation from Public Works was to use the a proposal involving a certain timing relay for each direction at the light. The matter will again go to Public Works for discussion. Other options include various timers and, possibly, have a yellow flashing light after a certain time in the evening. The matter will be decided at a future council meeting.

A mill and fill bid was awarded to Capital Paving (\$143,386). The mill and fill measure is a preventative one and should help drainage on certain streets. The largest portion of the paving will be on the downtown square and adjacent streets but also include portions of Allen Street, Walnut, Hudson and Franklin (from 7th street to 3rd). The projected is funded by the transportation tax. Related to that, the seal coat bid was also approved in the amount of \$193,215 to Vance Brothers also part of the street improvement project money.

The council approved the hiring of a full time ATS driver. Last year the ATS program was funded through CARES Act money and the savings could

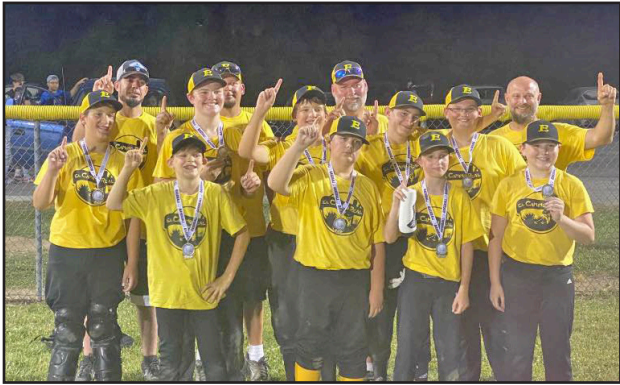

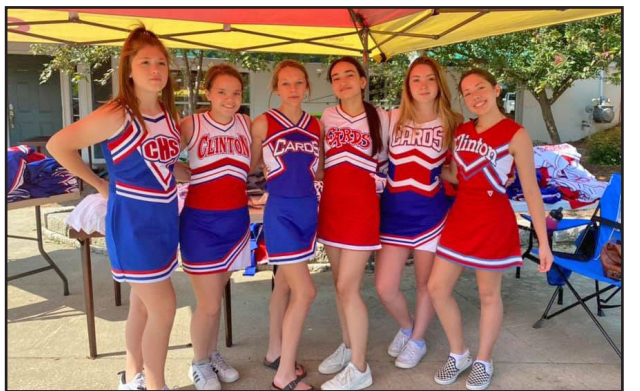

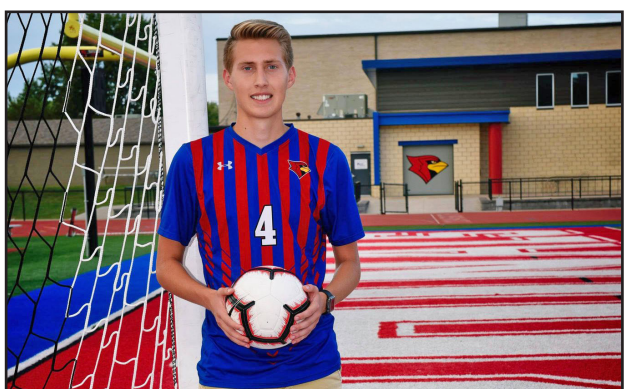
