



## An Interview with Cardinal Pride Band

He went on to student teach with Mr. Dave Robinson in Knob Noster. After graduation in 2008, he taught at Green Ridge. He returned to the "nest" as a Cardinal in 2015. Mr. Miles won the Clinton Teacher of the Year Award in 2018-2019.)

Mr. Miles covered the importance of the band parents: (The officers of the Band Aides are Mr. Tim Dudley-President, Mr. Johnny Crawford and Mrs. Melissa Crawford- Secretaries, Mrs. Amanda Johnson-Treasurer.) "All our band parents put in so much work to make sure our students have the best possible experience during their time on our team! Not only do they help plan events and assist with props for marching band, they provide meals, support and supervision for our kids during competitions and trips. We are very fortunate to have such an involved group of parents invested in our group's success."

How does this year compare to others? "Every coach will tell you that every year is different. I don't like to compare groups, but I can tell you this year's group will be larger than what we've seen in previous years. We are definitely


