## County Commissioners Sign 2022 Budget



The Henry County Commission formally signed the 2022 budget at 9:30 a.m., January 4. The general revenue funds were significantly lower than last year's, however, the county was able to roll out a zero-levy this year. Last year's general revenue funds stood at \$5.1 million, while this year's is about \$3.9 million - the county only spent \$3.5 million of their \$5.1 million last year, though. “It looks good,” said Presiding Commissioner Jim Stone.

Some of the major expenses for the county were the court house renovation (of which about \$35,000 is still owed for December's work; the renovation is complete, however), and the NE 301 Bridge, which came in at about \$710,000. Much of the money for the bridge was paid for out of the gas tax (the county was responsible for a 20% soft match of the funds). Also, recall that the county picked up Benton County's circuit court, but expenses for Henry County as far as the non-Henry County circuit courts (and juvenile department) are reimbursed.

Henry County does foot the initial costs for these which has to be included in the budget. Another factor in the budget is the expenses for the trial concerning Gary Michael. The county prepared for the expense last year, however, it has again been pushed back. The new projected date for the trial will be in 2023. Commissioner Dale Lawler made a motion to accept the budget, followed by a second from Commission Rick Fosnow. It was unanimously approved and signed.

Nearby Gas Prices Drop  
Clinton Competition Stays  
The Same



While Harrisonville, Peculiar and Garden City have lowered their gasoline costs following the Christmas holiday, most Clinton area stations have kept the higher price. The Flying J, a gasoline retailer in Peculiar led the pack of communities northwest of Clinton with a price of \$2.79 for unleaded regular gasoline on December 30. Now the Harrisonville Love Truck Stop and the Casey's there, has matched it with a price of \$2.79 on January 3. A Garden City Conoco convenience store on the east side of Highway 7 is close, with a price of \$2.84. Everyday Convenience Store in Clinton, at \$2.89 is still running a full 10 cents under everyone else in town. Breaktime, Caseys and the rest remain at \$2.99 per gallon. Gary Mount of Clinton, complained to Casey's management. He relayed those concerns to the Democrat. "Come on Casey's," said Mount in his e-mail he copied to the Democrat. "Step up during these hard times." Mount wrote to Caseys, following a previous story in the Democrat. He had written about

the cheaper gasoline prices northwest of Clinton, on his way to the Kansas City area. "I filled up (\$2.99) at the south Clinton Casey's," Mount said. "I feel our community is being ripped off." Jennifer D. with Casey's guest relations, responded matter-of-factly to Mount's concerns. "Several factors are considered when pricing our gasoline," Jennifer D. said. "Generally we price with the competition in the immediate surrounding area." This is similar to what other convenience stores stated to the Democrat. But Jennifer D. with Casey's did go one step further. "I will share your (Mount's) concerns with Casey's fuel pricing team," Jennifer D. said. At press time, there has been no lowering of any prices. Gasoline at Everyday Convenience Store, remains at \$2.89 per gallon. Everywhere else the Democrat checked, Clinton residents have to pay \$2.99 per gallon to fill up their vehicle tanks. The Raytown QuickTrip is at \$2.71 per gallon, meaning Southeast Kansas City area residents can beat Clinton's prices by 28 cents per gallon.

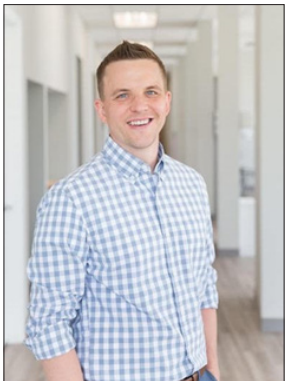

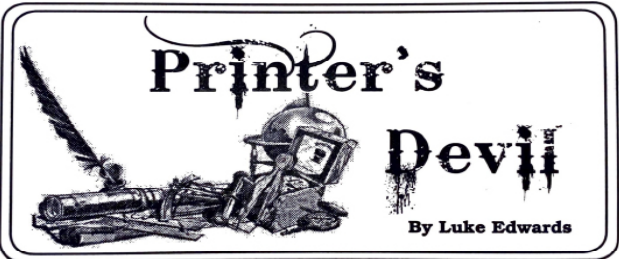

Well, it is 2022. Despite the events of the past almost two years, time still keeps marching forward. Of course, many have made some resolutions for the new year. Others have opted out of making any promises to themselves they might not be able to keep. For me, I am just sad Betty White didn't make it to her 100th birthday.

I have a list of books I usually cycle through in a year: they are the same books and once I have finished the list, I start over (I mix it up with new works as well). I've done this for many years and, aside from the enjoyment of certain literature, it really serves no purpose. This year, I've decided to switch up my list a little. Why not? Everyone can use a little change now and then.

When I started looking for books "I have already read, but will read again" I ran across a book I had not read grad school: "The Shoemaker and the Tea Party." I won't give all of the details away in case it is something you might wish to read for yourself, but it was written by Alfred F. Young, an historian who primarily studied social histories of the American Revolutionary time frame. He was interested in the "regular Joe's" experience and stumbled across a gem concerning his academic scholarship: George Robert Twelves Hewes, a shoemaker who lived from 1742 to 1840 and was the last surviving participant in, what we now refer to as The Boston Tea Party.

The book is not really about that famous event tied to the American Revolution, but about why we remember what we do and, more importantly, what we remember as important. Young admits that he had been unable to even find it referred to as "The Boston Tea Party" until about 1820 – some 60 years after Americans protested the politics of Great Britain in December of 1773 by dumping crates of tea into the Atlantic at Griffin's Wharf. It was not that Americans had "forgotten" the event (it had been referred to under different names), but it re-surfaced as "important" during a pretty critical time in our history and became a symbol for defiance and independence. So, a few newspaper guys caught wind of "the last surviving participant" in the "Tea Party" and sought to get his recollection of what happened. Young learned that memory is fallible, but also surprisingly accurate. And, in the context of American History, there is contest for public memory over such events: "willful forgetting and purposeful remembering," is what Young refers to it as. It happens over and over again in American History (and probably in non-American History as well). For example, for a long time the event of British soldiers firing on a crowd which helped spark the American Revolution was only known as "the matter on King Street." We remember it today as "The Boston Massacre." Again, I won't give away too many details of the book, but Hewes, who lived in Boston through the Revolution, has a certain take on events which is important to us today. Even monuments have their own "willful forgetting and purposeful remembering" of sorts and are part of the public contest for memory.

We all have our personal memories, too. If nothing else the book reminds us that we also tend to discard memories we do not find "useful" and recall the memories that support what we believe. That is, our perspective of what we remember changes with the situation we currently find ourselves in. We are, after all, human. At any rate, may the new year bring you all you wish for and prosperity find its way to your doorstep. Happy New Year!

People can learn about owls Jan. 7 at Springfield Nature Center

Indoor and outdoor activities will provide opportunities to see and listen for owls.

Owls are infrequently seen because of their nocturnal lifestyles. But that doesn't mean they're not appreciated. Because they hunt mice, rats and other rodents that can be pests for humans; these fascinating creatures are a beneficial part of Missouri's outdoors.

People can learn more about the species of owls found in Missouri on Jan. 7 at the Missouri Department of Conservation's Springfield Conservation Nature Center's "Owl Prowl and Evening Stroll" event. This owl-themed evening will have both indoor and outdoor components.

For the indoor portion of the program, Dickerson Park Zoo docents will offer programs in the nature center auditorium at 6 p.m., 7 p.m., and 8 p.m. that will feature live owls. There, people can see several species of owls that reside in Missouri and people can also learn more about the unique physical characteristics that make owls effective nocturnal hunters. COVID procedures will be in place for this program which means masks are strongly encouraged.

In addition to this, people will be able to enjoy a stroll along the Springfield Nature Center trails at night. Stop by one of the naturalist stations on the trail to meet and chat with a naturalist about owls. The ceremony will take place in the Academy gymnasium, 1510 East Elm Street, Jefferson City, MO, and the public is invited. The graduation ceremony will be live streamed on the Patrol's Facebook page at [www.facebook.com/motrooper](http://www.facebook.com/motrooper). The graduation ceremony will begin at 10 a.m. The 112th Recruit Class reported to the Academy on August 2, 2021, to begin the 25-week training to become a trooper. The new troopers will report to duty in their assigned troops on Monday, January 31, 2022.

Governor Michael L. Parson will provide the keynote address and Col. Olson will also speak to the class during the graduation. The Honorable Patricia Breckenridge, Supreme Court of Missouri, will administer the Oath of Office to the new troopers. Provost Roger K. McMillian, vice president

The Troop F Color Guard will present the colors and Sergeant Andrew Henry (H) will sing the national anthem. Pastor Dale D. Four class awards will be presented. The recruits accumulate points toward graduation in the categories of physical fitness, firearms, and academics throughout their 25 weeks at the Academy. election to the State Senate in 2012 by defeating a Republican incumbent

In the Senate, he led a record 40-hour filibuster of an amendment attacking marriage equality. He also fought to ban lobbyist gifts to legislators, expand Medicaid and protect victims of rape, domestic violence and sexual abuse. Scott filed legislation to rein in the municipal court system, fought Republican efforts to water down Missouri's employment discrimination laws and helped secure passage of the Ferguson Commission's recommendation on the use of force standard into law. Scott relentlessly filibustered Republican efforts to take the right to choose away from rape and incest victims.

He won a second Senate term in 2016, overperforming amidst that year's Trump wave.

He graduated cum laude from Truman State University in 1996 and received his Juris Doctorate from the University of Michigan Law School in 1999. He practices at OnderLaw, where he focuses on environmental cleanup litigation and fights to help recover taxpayer funds spent combating the opiate crisis.

Sifton answered questions from his constituents for the remainder of the evening. He was clear and concise in his answers to questions regarding his stance on immigration, the economy, Medicaid expansion, Biden's Build Back Better plan, and many other concerns that are looming large in Missouri's Senate race.

This will be a race that the nation is watching and listening to.

In an article from CNN's Simone Pathe titled "The 10 Senate Seats Most Likely to Flip" Pathe ssid "Trump has also suggested he'll be endorsing in Missouri's Senate race, where GOP Sen. Roy Blunt is retiring. The biggest concern has been that he'd pick disgraced former Gov. Eric Greitens, who resigned from office following a probe into allegations of sexual and campaign misconduct. Trump was noncommittal in an interview with Hugh Hewitt earlier this month, who implored him not to endorse the former governor. "Well, that's an interesting opinion, that's true. He's right now leading by quite a bit," Trump said.

"I know, but he will lose the seat. We will lose the seat," Hewitt said. "I understand that. Okay, some people feel that," Trump responded. Kimberly Guilfoyle, a top official on Trump's 2020 campaign and the girlfriend of Trump's son, is the national chair of Greitens' campaign. GOP Rep. Billy Long met with Trump at Mar-a-Lago last month, so he could be another potential endorsee. But the field keeps growing, with state Senate President Dave Schatz announcing his campaign last month. The fear is that an increasingly splintered field will only mean more votes for Greitens, who could jeopardize what should be a safe Republican seat much the same way Todd Akin did in 2012."

"A seat in deep-red Missouri probably shouldn't be competitive. But Democrats would like their chances a whole lot more if GOP voters nominate Eric Greitens — a former governor who left office mired in scandal — to succeed Sen. Roy Blunt, a Republican not seeking re-election. The Republican field also includes state Attorney General Eric Schmitt, Reps. Vicky Hartzler and Billy Long and attorney Mark McCloskey, best known for waving a gun at Black Lives Matter protesters outside his St. Louis home in 2020. A poll of likely GOP primary voters this month by the political news service Missouri Scout found Greitens and Schmitt locked in a close race, with Hartzler a distant third.

Democrats have at least a half-dozen candidates in the mix, including Scott Sifton, a former state legislator. Marine veteran Lucas Kunce has earned some buzz in national progressive circles. But two of the state's most familiar and formidable Democrats — former Gov. Jay Nixon and former Secretary of State Jason Kander — are staying on the sidelines."

With the race heating up over the next ten months, Missouri politics will be thrust onto a national stage yet again.

Local Man Resists  
Arrest By Fleeing



Policemen had their hands full, pulling over and arresting a local resident on December 27 in Clinton.

Robert L. Elliot, was charged with felony resisting arrest, attempting to flee and creating a substantial risk of serious injury to another person.

Originally charged with operating a motor vehicle in a careless and imprudent manner, and operating a vehicle without a proper license, those additional charges have since been dropped by the office of prosecutor Richard Shields.

Also, the 24-hour-hold the suspect was placed on, has now resulted in a \$50,000 bond required for his release.

Elliott will make his first appearance before Associate Circuit Judge Harold Dump at 9 a.m. on Friday, January 7 in the Henry County Courthouse in Clinton.

At press time, Elliot does not have an attorney or public defender.

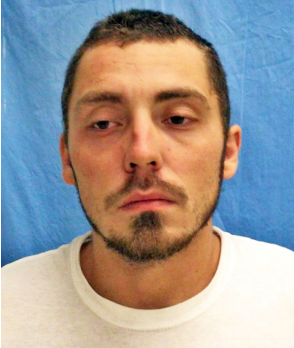
The suspect will likely have a not guilty plea entered for him, and another hearing scheduled.

Assistance for document filing for a public defender, will also likely be initiated.

Casenet documents show Elliot as having a former address in Seda-lia, but arrest records show him with a Clinton residency.

Missouri online sentencing guidelines, show the penalty for felony resisting arrest to be up to four years in the Missouri Department of Corrections, and fines up to \$25,000.

Elliott remains in the custody of Sheriff J. Kent Oberkrum, in the Henry County Jail in Clinton.

“When Boston Won the World Series”, by Bob Ryan. A neat look at the very first World Series in 1903. It was between the Boston Americans and the Pittsburg Pirates. (Boston would not become the Red Sox until 1908. Fenway was built in 1912.) The book supplied a neat comparison between modern MLB and the good old days. game was called. A potential HR might be called a triple or vice versa. Another big difference was in the pitching. MLB in 1903 had not yet invented the art of relief pitching. Also, the 1903 fans were often rowdy, singing loudly, gambling and drinking. You see, some things never change...

Carli Lloyd, When No One Was Watching, (with Wayne Coffey). If you are a soccer fan, especially if you like the US National teams you may know Carli Lloyd. She recently retired from soccer after 17 years and two Olympic medals and two World Cup Titles. Takeaways from her book? It was amazing how hard she worked. She never felt skill-building and fitness came naturally to her. She would

# Henry County Commission Discusses Flood Plains And Retirement Funds



The Clinton Daily Democrat stopped by the Henry County Commission Tuesday, December 28 to catch up on business pertaining to the county. Present was Sheriff Kent Oberkrom and Henry County Detention Center Administrator Captain Sam Boyd. Sheriff Oberkrom was filling in the commission on retirement funds for the Sheriff's Association (for Missouri). Some time ago a class action lawsuit had been filed pertaining to the fund:

Oberkrom, who is the chair of the Missouri Sheriff's Association for that particular topic, explained that, although the fund is in good shape for the foreseeable future, it could have an impact at some point. A portion of collected fines (\$3) goes to the funding of it and that could change pending the outcome of litigation. Otherwise, Sheriff Oberkrom said that things for the Sheriff's Department "were going well." Oberkrom and Boyd left the commission about 10 a.m. and Henry County Emergency

Management Director Vin Journey with Henry Countian Rick Abdoller entered the commission chambers. Director Journey hoped the commission would review an application for a duck pond (near Blaristown) which had been put together by Abdoller (although he is not the principle applicant). The matter needs reviewed because of potential flood plain issues – none of which appear to be a concern in this particular application. "I see no impact upstream or downstream," said Director Journey. The

commission, after ensuring the duck pond construction would not impact any other property owners (reviewing plat maps and asking questions) gave their blessing. It was reported the area in question is planned on being cropped in the off-season. Commissioner Dale Lawler said there have been a lot of applications for people wanting to do work in a flood plain lately. Although there is a \$25 fee for the application, it has been waived in most cases. Coverage of the commission meeting ended about 11 a.m.

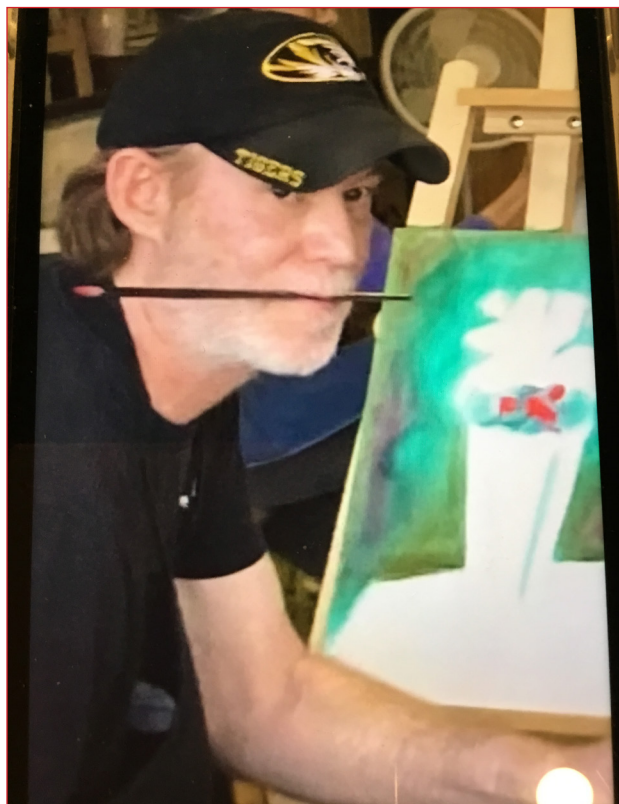

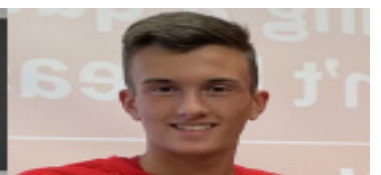
