## Benton County CPA'S Rev Up For Rigorous Tax Time

**Dr. James And JoAnn Bourland Recognized For Donation To Cancer Care**

One of the peaks of tax season is usually in January and February with a break in March before the second peak in April. But that is not the case for Twin Lakes Accounting at 936 E. Main Street. The business is owned by Janet Mitchell and her Associate is Brenda Kreisel.

"A lot of taxpayers with Earned Income Credit and Child Tax Credit (CTC) are having tax returns hitting their bank accounts now," said Mitchell. "But business tax returns must be ready by March 15, so we are busy with that. We are also helping a lot of people who have not filed taxes in prior years. If someone is getting a tax refund, then there is no penalty if they don't file an income tax return. However, if they owe the government money, they will probably be penalized for not filing in a prior year.



"THE ONLY SURE THING IN LIFE IS DEATH & TAXES," is an oft quoted saying. Local accountants are in the thick of tax season including Brenda Kreisel and Janet Mitchell who helped Tom Boland with his 2022 return.

Our business is steady all year with accounting and payroll work, as well with the work we do during the summer on extensions. We enjoy the work and have several new clients that

are among the nice people moving to the area." Lori Dunkin, owner of Johnson Tax Service LLC at 201 S. Hwy 65 in Lincoln, says there is really no slow time at the office during

the tax season. She said there might be a little "calm before the storm" at the end of March before the rush, but days are long at the office, and she takes work home too. She credits her

staff of six for helping take care of over 2,000 clients saying she doesn't know how she would get along without them. She said she was blessed.

## Brodersen Turning Dream Into A Major Philanthropic Reality

State Farm agent Suzie Brodersen has been active in the Warsaw community for many years. She has served on the Benton County Community Foundation and organized the Benton County Wine Stroll to help raise money for the foundation which in turn gives out grants to help non-profit organizations.

And while these grants have helped many struggling organizations, Brodersen wasn't satisfied. She wanted to do more.

"It has always been a dream of mine to find a more impactful way to help nonprofits in our area," said Brodersen. "The Benton County PHIL will be a limited membership organization where 100% of the membership dues each year will be used to grant back to our communities."

PHIL stands for Philanthropic, Hometown,

Impact Leaders. The idea behind P.H.I.L. is to give back \$250,000 each year to three non-profit organizations. Brodersen wants to have 100 members who will each donate \$250. Each member of PHIL will have a vote to determine which non-profit receives a part of the \$25,000. By limiting the number of grants the organization will be able to award a much larger amount than the Benton County Community Foundation has been able to

The WARM House at 100 E. Long View Terrace in Warsaw has been serving the Benton County community since the 1990's with emergency food, energy assistance and clothing for those in need. In recent years it has taken on additional responsibilities of contributing to other worthy organizations in Benton County. In 2022, the WARM House donated just

under \$75,000 to events and organizations as follow.

A total of \$27,834 was spent for Energy Assistance to 110 families. Although a monetary amount was not supplied, 64 households including 173 family members were given Emergency Food Assistance; \$6,000 was given in scholarships to all three public high schools; \$8,994 provided gift cards and supplies for Benton County elementary and high schools; \$8,463 was donated to Dolly Parton's Imagination Library Program which provided

4,745 books to 341 enrolled children; \$5,000 went to the Benton County Cancer Fund; \$5,000 supported Christmas for Kids; \$4,286 provided 100 Christmas Food Baskets to Benton County residents; \$3,000 went to the Salvation Army to Feed the Kids Program; \$2,000 supported Smart Start; \$2,000 went to Warsaw Middle School Wildcat Bucks Program; \$1,000 was donated to Friends of the Sheriff K9; \$900 provided chicken dinners at the Senior Center, and \$500 was provided

“Refunds are smaller this year since Child Tax Credit is back to normal,” said Dunkin. “But I attribute the smaller refunds mostly to the fact that federal and state governments have formulated withholding charts, so people are having less tax taken out in paychecks during the year in order to stimulate the economy. “I advocate having the money throughout the year so you can control withholding – that is your decision.”

Dunkin said that her business was started by her mother over 55 years ago, and Dunkin started helping her mother when she was in eighth grade – giving her years of experience.

World Finance, at 187 W. Main Street in Warsaw, reports that its tax preparation services have slowed down a little bit after a jump start in January and February. Tara Smith, Branch Manager at World Finance, said the business usually gets a few more people coming in during March and will also start seeing those who have to pay taxes. She also reported that returns are smaller this year than they were during pandemic levels. The business stays busy the remaining part of the year by processing installment loans.

H&R Block, at 1878 Commercial Street in Warsaw, has its busiest season from January through March 1. It’s second busiest time for tax preparation is at the end of April.

“We are seeing changes to tax returns for 2022 because the tax relief stimuli provided during the COVID-19 pandemic during the last two tax seasons are no longer available,” said Rebecca Minks, franchise owner of the business. “Now most rules that were in place since 2020 are reverted.”

Minks said that there are penalties for those who wait too late to file their tax returns. The last day of the tax season for 2023 has been extended from April 15 until April 18 because the original ending date is on a Saturday.

www.cbsnews.com has verified that U.S. taxpayers could receive a shock when they see their tax refunds due to the expiration of many pandemic benefits that lawmakers had designed to help Americans weather the crisis. That means families may see smaller refunds when they file their taxes for the 2022 tax year, said Mark Steber, chief tax information officer at Jackson Hewitt. The average tax refund in 2022 (for the 2021 tax year) was almost \$3,200, a 14% jump from the prior year, according to IRS data.

The website also reported that many of the tax benefits still exist, but under current tax law they have reverted to their smaller, pre-pandemic levels, such as in the case of the CTC which is credited with lifting millions of children out of poverty. The CTC is reverting to its prior level of \$2,000 per child, compared with a pandemic credit that was as high as \$3,600 per child.

The website also revealed that between 15 and 20 million people file their tax returns the last week before Tax Day, while another 20 million file after the due date. The good news is that for those who need more time, filing for an extension is quick and straightforward. If you have an address within

a federally declared disaster area, there is no need to get in touch with the IRS to ask for an extension. You will have to request an extension by April or face a “failure to file” penalty, according to the IRS. You will need to fill out Form 4868 with the IRS by going online to <https://irs.extension>. Or check with a local tax preparer for more information.

grant. The PHIL will collect dues which in turn will be allocated each year to no more than three non-profit organizations in the county.

With a goal of \$25,000 each year, the PHIL will divide funds into proposed grants of \$15,000, \$7,500, and \$2,500.

Membership is limited to 100 individuals/businesses. Married couples wishing to join, must join as individuals and each has a vote.

Membership dues will come due each year in the amount of \$250.

Businesses may join but are limited to one voting member.

Each year, a grant request will be opened for all non-profits operating in Benton County. The grants will be reviewed and narrowed by at large members of the PHIL, and they will present the finalists to the membership for a vote.

At an annual meeting, each member will receive one vote, and the grants will be awarded based on vote count.

“My goal is to have a full membership by June 30th, 2023. That means \$25,000 to give back - and the members VOTE on who receives the grants. And once you are a member, you simply pay your membership dues each year to maintain your vote,” said Brodersen.

Brodersen will be holding a meeting to introduce PHIL to interested members of the community on Monday, March 13, at 5 p.m., at Creative Palette, Main Street, Warsaw.

“We have held meetings in Lincoln and Cole Camp and found there was an interest in organizing a P.H.I.L. group in Benton County. This is an exciting opportunity to be a part of something so much bigger. If you have any questions

or would like to know how to be a charter member of the Benton County PHIL, please reach out to me! I would be excited to bring you on board,” said Brodersen.

The Benton County PHIL is an extension of the Benton County Community Foundation. Its purpose is to create a membership of like-minded philanthropic leaders in Benton County. BCCF operates under the umbrella of the Community Foundations of the Ozarks.

With annual membership dues, these individuals or businesses will maintain a fund that will provide impactful contributions to the county.

Volunteers work hard, but enjoy the companionship of each other, plus they get to meet many customers and clients. There is a need for more volunteers, and anyone interested is invited to go into the WARM House during business hours where someone would love to talk discuss the program.

find it. They will also talk about the role of Behavioral Health Consultants at Bothwell and how they work with providers at several clinics, including the Warsaw clinic, to provide same-day appointments for patients needing behavioral health services.

The seminar is being organized by the foundation’s Community Relations committee. Their goal is to create awareness of Bothwell services in the communities the health center serves and provide educational opportunities that share resources and support to people about health challenges they or their families are facing. Cliff Callis, committee chair, said this is the second free seminar put on by the committee.

## Cole Camp Wins Sectional In Three Overtimes; Eliminated In Quarterfinals

When a game is on the line, you want the Bluebirds' Ethan Shearer to have the ball. Simple as that. The senior guard hit an NBA buzzer-beater three point bank shot in the third overtime to give Cole Camp a 54-51 victory over North Callaway at Capital City on Monday night in the opening sectional round of the 2023 MSHSAA Class 3 State Basketball Tournament. He did basically the same thing last year in the sectional round. Maybe we should just call him "Buzzer-Beater" as he hit another one in the first overtime to save the day for Cole Camp.

Shearer missed all four of his shots in the first quarter as Cole Camp went scoreless in a baseball-like first quarter score of 3-0.

The second quarter wasn't much better as both teams struggled scoring with a football like halftime score of 12-6. Shearer did all of their scoring hitting two threes.

Clayton Moore guarded Gentry Dieckman in the first half while Isaiah Creighhead guarded the 6'6" forward in the second half limiting him to seven points on the night.

Coach Shearer said, "This was a physical game. Gentry is a great player and needed a game like this. He came on big down the stretch."

The biggest factor on defense was 6'6" Trenton Jones, who had more blocks than the official scorer

could count and a slew of deflections.

Coach Shearer said, "He was the greatest defender under the basket I have ever seen."

The third period saw Cole Camp come alive taking a 21-20 lead.

In the fourth, with the game tied with 7.4 seconds to go, Shearer showed his quarterback arm with a length of the court pass to Dieckman only to have Jones block two shots. Cole Camp had a five point lead with a minute to go and people had headed to the door only to see North Callaway come back. Time ran out with the game tied at 33.

In the first overtime, North Callaway had it won only to have Shearer hit a well guarded three at the buzzer

to make it 40-40.

The second overtime saw both teams revert back to their first half struggles scoring just three points a piece with a 43-43 deadlock.

In the third overtime, Owen Ives forced a huge turnover as Cole Camp took a 51-48 lead. Samuel Pezold then hit a game tying three for North Callaway.

With three seconds left, the pass came into Ives who dribbled and passed to Shearer, who took two dribbles across half court and launched an approximately 38 foot bomb that hit the backboard and rattled in for the game winner.

Cole Camp fans went belistic and the North Callaway crowd stood froze in disbelief.

Matthew Weber, North

Callaway's all-time leading scorer, who kept his team in the game with threes and short jumpers, had 24 points for the Thunderbirds after twisting his ankle in the first quarter.

Cole Camp's clutch player, Shearer had a lot to say after the game, "We didn't play our best game tonight, but we found a way to win. We had been in three overtimes before against Stover last year in the district championship. I told Reid (Harrison) that somebody has to be the killer and want the ball. This wasn't just about me. It was about my team. I told my guys to get me the ball. Their diamond and two hurt us but our shots started falling."

Harrison hit some big late threes for 18 points to help the cause in a complete team effort. Shearer had 23. Michael Wissman had one of the biggest layups in the fourth quarter of his career.

Coach Shearer said, "I kept big Mike out for a long time and he surprised them at the end."

Cole Camp went 14-22 from the line.

Cole Camp moved to 22-7 and North Callaway ended their season at 16-13.

There were great similarities between this season and last year's for the Cole Camp boys basketball team.

Both teams lost in the quarterfinals after buzzer beaters by Ethan Shearer in the sectionals. Both teams experienced a post regular season three overtime game. Last year was over Stover in the finals of district play and this year was against North

Callaway in sectional play. Friday night saw the Bluebirds lose to Lutheran North, 41-28 in Moberly, MO. The final score is misleading as Cole Camp trailed by a single point with 3:30 to go. Costly turnovers and free throws made by Lutheran North stretched the score beyond reach as time expired. The Bluebirds were hindered by a 1-3-1 zone defense.

Coach Shearer commented, "Yes, we had to take some risks and they capitalized, it was 29-28 with 3:30 left, we could just not score in the last 3 minutes."

It was 16-4 after one. Michael Wissman, the Bluebirds' big 6'4", 325 pound center, powered in a couple of layups for Cole Camp's first quarter points.

Lutheran North led 26-12 at the half.

It was 29-21 after three. Lutheran North decided to pull the ball out and run the clock with five minutes left. Unless you have Phil Ford, that move too early usually backfires and it did in this case as the Bluebirds closed the gap. It was 29-28 with 3:30 left in the game.

Free throws were a huge difference as Cole Camp was 3-3 and Lutheran was 11-15. Reid Harrison was 2-2 and Gentry Dieckman was 1-1. For Lutheran North, Jacinth Prude was 4-4, Jameer Cretter was 5-6, Davell Long 2-2 and their big man Amez Newton was 0-3.

Lutheran North had 17 points off turnovers compared to six for Cole Camp. Ethan Shearer was held to just two points in the contest.

Coach Shearer commented on the game and their season, "LN was the most athletic team we had seen since last summer at Columbia Hickman Camp, Athleticism like that must be beat with discipline and toughness and we just could not pull it off."

Lutheran North made an effort to take Shearer away and did a good job at that.

"The LN assistant and myself have coached against each other dating back to this team in junior high and before with the Lutheran School state tournament. He knows me very well and our LSA kids; it was an asset to LN, its a interesting story and I enjoyed seeing him and competing against him," said Coach Shearer.

"The LN head coach played for him when he was a player and I had 2 of my ex-players on my bench, it was a good night except the loss," he added.

Cole Camp ended up 22-8 in a season with highs and lows.

Coach Shearer commented, "Ups and downs are caused by a team trying to find an identity and we did towards the end of the year when it counted and I am proud of the boys."

Can you plan for an unplanned retirement?

Many people plan to take an early retirement, so when that day arrives, they're ready for it. But what if you were to face an unplanned retirement? Would you be prepared to deal with the financial issues?

It's something worth thinking about, because any number of factors — illness, a spouse's illness, downsizing, other issues — could lead to an abrupt departure from the workforce. But taking action while you're still working may help you make the transition easier on yourself.

Your first move, of course, should be to at least consider the possibility of having to retire earlier than you planned. You can then move on to some concrete steps, possibly including the following.

- **Build an emergency fund.** Under any circumstances, it's a good idea to build an emergency fund — but it's especially important if you want to prepare for an unforeseen retirement. Generally speaking, your emergency fund should contain three to six months' worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account. But if you suspect an earlier-than-anticipated retirement may be in your future, and you have some time to prepare for it, you should consider an emergency fund that contains a full year's worth of expenses.

- **Consider your portfolio's asset allocation.** If you're concerned about an unexpected retirement, you may want to consider the equities allocation in your portfolio. If you think you may need to tap into your portfolio sooner than you



expected, you may not want to be over-exposed to investments most vulnerable to market volatility. However, these are the same investments that offer you the most growth potential — which you'll need to help stay ahead of inflation. So, look for an investment balance that's appropriate for your needs. As part of this positioning, you may want to shift some assets into income-producing vehicles, while also adding to the "cash" portion of your portfolio to boost your liquidity.

- **Evaluate your Social Security options.** An unplanned retirement may cause you to consider taking Social Security earlier than you had planned. You can start taking Social Security when you're 62, but your monthly benefits will be up to 30% lower than if you had waited until your full retirement age, which is

likely between 66 and 67. If you have sufficient income through other sources, you may be able to delay taking Social Security until your checks will be bigger — but of course, if you need the money, waiting may not be an option.

- **Address your health care needs.** If you take an unplanned retirement, and you have employer-sponsored health insurance, you'll have to look for alternatives. You might be able to get extended coverage from your employer, but this could be quite expensive. Of course, if you're already 65, you can get on Medicare, but if

you're younger, you might be able to get coverage under your spouse's plan. If that's not an option, you may want to explore one of the health care exchanges created by the Affordable Care Act. To learn more about these exchanges, visit [healthcare.gov](http://healthcare.gov).

## SFCC Names Brad Driskill Agriculture Director Of New College Farm



**BRAD DRISKILL** has been named Agriculture Director of State Fair Community College's new farm.

State Fair Community College has more than doubled the size of its Sedalia campus with the purchase of 200 acres of farmland adjacent to the college on West 16th street. SFCC closed on the purchase from the Lamm family last fall. SFCC Agriculture program coordinator Brad Driskill has been named Agriculture Director and will oversee the college's farm in addition to his responsibilities for all agriculture education programming.

"Agriculture is the number one industry in Missouri, and it is very important to our 14-county service region," said Dr. Brent Bates, SFCC president. "We have one of the best agriculture programs in Missouri. This farm expansion builds on that strength and enables the college to serve even better our students and community. Brad is one of the best Ag educators; he is well respected and is a great asset to our college."

The goal for the college farm is to expand SFCC's Agriculture program and operate a farm that exhibits diverse agricultural production techniques in support of the local agriculture community. The farm will include livestock and row crops that will enhance educational learning experiences for degree-seeking students, agribusinesses and agricultural producers.

The livestock will feature a cow/calf herd and later

incorporate small ruminants such as sheep and goats. Other livestock may be added later to support classroom activities and demonstration events. Breeding techniques, pasture management, grazing practices, and herd management will be explored and developed as the farm advances.

Crops will include a variety of forages on the pasture ground such as cool and warm season grasses and legumes. Crops will be rotated and will be based on students' learning needs. The row crop operation will go beyond traditional crops and will incorporate modern precision agriculture practices.

Students will benefit through the hands-on application of theory learned in the classroom. They will help with all operations and will conduct stand counts, practice yield estimates, and scout crops throughout the growing season.

Driskill grew up on a beef cattle operation near Cross Timbers. He earned an Associate of Arts degree from SFCC and completed his Bachelor of Science in General Agriculture degree from Missouri State University. He later earned his Master of Science in Technology from University of Central Missouri.

While working in the fescue seed industry, Driskill began teaching agronomy classes part-time for SFCC. In 2011, he became the Agriculture program coordinator at the college. Since then, he has served on the Board of Directors for the National Professional Agriculture Students (PAS) and represents PAS on the National Council for Agriculture Education.

Driskill was named SFCC's 2018 Instructor of the Year and received the Governors Excellence in Teaching Award from Missouri Community College Association. In 2019, he was named Post-Secondary Teacher of the Year by the Missouri Association for Career and Technical Education. The Missouri FFA Association in 2021 awarded Driskill an

Honorary State FFA degree.

Driskill believes the new working farm will be a unique and impressive engagement tool for SFCC.

"In addition to the experiences for degree seeking students, I hope to host demonstration events for the public and work with industry partners to conduct seminars and non-credit classes for interested parties, as well as hold training events and demonstrations for high school agriculture programs," says Driskill. "The farm will be an exceptional opportunity for SFCC to engage the entire community."

Driskill lives in the Shawnee Mound community with wife Tiffany and three children. He enjoys working on the family farm and serves as president of the Shawnee R-III School District Board of Education.

## UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI Extension

### Spring Pasture Management

Drought conditions last summer and fall resulted in overgrazed pastures in many locations in central Missouri. Below are some ideas to help these fields recover productivity.

Soil test and at a minimum fertilize to the most limiting nutrient. If pH is low, add lime. If phosphorus levels are low, add phosphorus to soil test recommendations. If you decide not to fertilize or reduce the amount of fertilizer being applied, where is the potential missing forage going to come from?

However, it is not a good idea to fertilize just to get stuff produced. Fertilize and manage acres to get as much production and nutrition harvested as you can. Fertilizing all pasture acres the same way is probably not a good strategy, especially with high fertilizer prices. Target some acres for quicker growth in the spring, while other acres can be fertilized based on their most limiting nutrient.

Rest pastures as long as possible this spring before grazing. Four to six inches of forage height are probably ideal before

starting to graze a pasture. Rotational grazing systems will also help pastures recover by providing built-in rest time. Be sure to move livestock rapidly through the paddocks early in the grazing season to help reduce seed head formation.

Assess what plants are growing in the pasture. Are there more weeds than desirable grasses and legumes? Can you get by with just overseeding additional grass into the pasture, or do you need to do a complete renovation? If complete renovation is in order, consider replacing pasture with native warm season grasses or novel endophyte tall fescue varieties.

Expect weed pressure and deal with it accordingly. Identify the dominant weed(s) and use appropriate control in a timely manner. Wait to re-seed legumes until after weed pressure is under control.

A couple of quick comments on hay production. Try to get at least some hay produced as soon as possible in the spring. This will help ensure some high quality hay is conserved and allows time during good growing

conditions for additional regrowth to occur.

Alternatively, producers might consider putting up a combination of summer and winter annuals for the hay supply and save the cool-season perennial fields for grazing. Push the pencil on this, but it might be a better alternative than harvesting 1.5 or 2.0 tons of grass hay per acre.

When grazing or cutting hay, RAISE THE HARVEST HEIGHT! Leave four inches of residual for cool-season grasses and 8 to 10 inches of residual for native warm season grasses. There is little to no nutritional value in the stems below this point. Plus, this will help keep perennial forage plants healthy and promotes a thick, dense sod.

Finally, assess why there is a forage deficit on the farm. Is the operation overstocked by either numbers or livestock weight? On an annual basis assuming a harvested forage yield of 4,000 pounds per acre and a daily feed intake of 2.5 percent of body weight, it takes an extra 23 acres to feed 50 head of 1,400 pound cows versus 50 head of 1,200 pound cows.

### MDC Reminds Snaggers That Paddlefish Season Begins March 15

Imagine catching a giant, prehistoric fish whose ancestors swam during the time of dinosaurs. That is a reality for thousands of paddlefish snaggers during Missouri's annual spring

paddlefish snagging season. Paddlefish -- named for their large, paddle-shaped snouts -- are an ancient species that can grow to seven feet and weigh more than 100 pounds.

According to MDC, the state's major paddlefish snagging waters include Lake of the Ozarks, Harry S. Truman Reservoir, and Table Rock Lake.

The paddlefish snagging season for these and most other waters in the state runs March 15 through April 30. The season for the Mississippi River is March 15 through May 15 with a fall season of Sept. 15 through Dec. 15.

A fishing permit is required, unless exempt. The daily limit is two paddlefish, and the possession limit is four. No person shall continue to snag after taking a daily limit of two paddlefish.

The statewide minimum length limit is 32 inches -- measured from eye to fork of tail -- with a minimum length limit of 34 inches for Lake of the Ozarks, Table Rock Lake, Harry S. Truman Reservoir, and their tributaries.

All paddlefish under the legal minimum length must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught. MDC offers these tips for returning undersized fish:

Use landing nets, not gaffs, which can kill young fish.

Wet hands before handling fish and avoid excessive handling.

Never put fingers in the gills or eyes.

Remove hooks carefully and get undersized fish back into the water as quickly as possible.

Extracted paddlefish eggs may not be possessed while on waters of the state or adjacent banks and may not be transported. Paddlefish eggs may not be bought, sold, or offered for sale.

Invasive species are aggressive, non-native plants and animals that reproduce and spread rapidly and can cause harm to the environment, economy, and/or human health. The new species then have few if any natural predators or controls to keep them from quickly taking over a landscape. Some invasive species

particularly problematic in Missouri are: callery pear trees, zebra mussels, sericea lespedeza, invasive carp, garlic mustard, emerald ash borers, Japanese stilt grass, hydrilla, bush honeysuckle, and feral hogs.

MDC Invasive Species Ecologist Angela Sokolowski will share her expertise during the webcast in what individuals, communities, and organizations can do to identify invasive species, control their spread, and even eliminate them in some situations.

"Invasive species are one of the biggest challenges conservation faces today," said Sokolowski. "They are increasing in numbers and locations, are very difficult to control, and can be very expensive to eliminate. The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) will offer a free paddlefish snagging clinic on Saturday, April 15, in Warsaw. Two sessions will be offered, but space is limited. Registration is required and will open on March 8. This clinic is for newcomers to learn about paddlefish, snagging gear and techniques, how to clean paddlefish, and then go snagging for two hours on the upper end of Lake of the Ozarks.

Session 1 will be from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., and Session 2 will be from 10:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. COVID-19 safety precautions will be followed. Participants are encouraged to register in groups of two to four. This program is offered to first-time participants only. MDC will provide boats and equipment.

Paddlefish are a prehistoric fish and one of Missouri's largest. They filter feed on plankton and other small organisms. In the spring, they make spawning runs upstream. At Warsaw, their upstream migration out of Lake of the Ozarks is blocked by the dam for Truman Lake. The paddlefish fishery that anglers enjoy is sustained by MDC stockings of hatchery-reared paddlefish.

Participants must have a valid Missouri fishing permit unless they fall in an exemption category. Life jackets are required when on the water. Life jackets will be available, or participants can bring their own. Youths 17 and younger must be accompanied by an adult. Besides snagging tips, participants will learn how to clean paddlefish. Attendees will meet in the Harbor Room in the lakeside Warsaw Community Building.

This was a busy week in the Missouri House of Representatives. With one more week until our legislative spring break the pace is steadily increasing around here. This week, one of the bills I have sponsored this year, HB. 713 passed out of the House with a 150-0 vote. It will now head to the Senate where I will start the process to have it passed by them. I worked with many people to get the bill to this point. You will find a description and a brief report of the bill below.

*HB 713 would change current state law that requires assessors to determine vehicle values by using the National Automobile Dealers' Association Official Used Car Guide. The bill would repeal that requirement and instead have assessors use the manufacturer's suggested retail price (MSRP) for all vehicles for the original value of all motor vehicle assessment valuations. The bill establishes a 15-year depreciation schedule that would be applied to the MSRP to develop the annual and historical valuation guide for all motor vehicles.*

*The bill sponsor said the change is necessary "so that our taxpayers can be assured that once they have that car that it's not going to go up in value and increase their taxes."*

*In order to give assessors time to transition to the new process if the bill becomes law, the legislation would not take effect until January 1, 2024. However, an amendment added on the House floor would allow assessors to utilize other sources to determine the true value of motor vehicles for 2023 assessments.*

*In his closing remarks to his colleagues on the House floor, the bill sponsor said, "The bottom line is it's a taxpayer protection act. If there's nothing else we*

*can do, we can protect our taxpayers from unjustly having to pay more taxes on a vehicle that's a year older; that has more mileage."*
