Tips to keep your mood and motivation steady during the winter season include getting outside where there is no substitute for natural light, get regular exercise, and stay social with family and friends on a regular basis, according to <https://newsnetwork.mayoclinic.org>. All these options are available in the local area, many of them free of charge.

Pickleball was created in 1965 and has grown into a popular sport in the U.S. and Canada with about 40 players in Warsaw. It combines many elements of tennis, badminton and ping-pong, and can be played indoors or outdoors with paddles and plastic balls with holes. Barbara Zillner is the local force behind the game and credits her brother who first played it in the area three summers ago while camping in his RV. He brought a portable net and played at tennis courts and

routinely at the gym. We play Monday, Wednesday and Friday starting at 8:00 AM and finishing at 11:00 AM. If anyone wants to watch, we have extra paddles. A winning score is

usually 11, but if we want more teams to have a chance to play, we set the winning score at 7."

The week leading up to Courtwarming will include special days for students. "Candyland" is the theme for Courtwarming 2023 with Tuesday being Twix

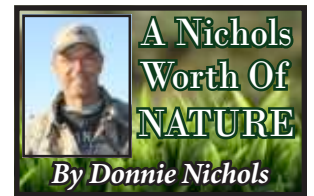

Our 14th annual Cole Camp Christmas Bird Count was conducted at the end of this past December. One species whose numbers were alarmingly down was the Eastern bluebird. Extremely cold weather, like the Arctic blast we had during December, can be very hard on populations. Sometimes birds spend more calories trying to stay warm than they can take in and they freeze to death. Bluebirds will use abandoned nest boxes as shelter and sometimes several use the same box in an effort to stay warm. After an extended cold spell it is not unusual to find dead bluebirds in some boxes. Following is some information on bluebirds and at the end something we call all do to help our local population.

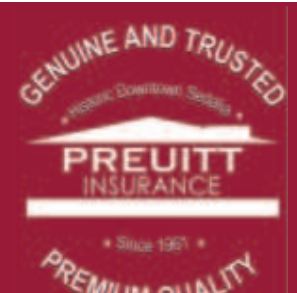

Our Missouri state bird, the Eastern bluebird, lives mostly in open country around trees with little or no understory. Originally, habitat probably included savannas, beaver ponds, mature open woods and forest openings. Today they're most common along pastures, agriculture fields, suburban parks, backyards, and golf courses.

Bluebird populations fell in the early twentieth century as aggressive introduced species such as European starlings and house sparrows made available nest sites increasingly difficult for bluebirds to hold onto. In the 1960s and 1970s, establishment of bluebird trails and nest box campaigns alleviated much of its competition for

nest sites, especially with box designs to keep out the larger starlings. Bluebird populations have been recovering ever since.

In February and March, the male bluebird starts displaying at cavities or boxes bringing nest materials and waving his wings. That is pretty much his only contribution to nest building: the female builds the nest and incubates the eggs. Both males and females feed the brood.

Bluebirds often exhibit extra-pair paternity: females may mate with more than one male which means that the males sometimes care for offspring that genetically are not their own.

Females may build nests in many available sites but typically use only one site to raise a brood, and may use the same nest for multiple broods. They will attack other species that they deem a threat, including house sparrows.

Nest building takes 2-6 days and one egg is laid each day until there is a clutch of 4-7 eggs. Bluebirds are members of the thrush family (some as robins) so eggs have a robin egg blue tint with occasionally all white eggs.

The female waits about a week to start incubation to assure all eggs will hatch around the same time. They often have multiple broods in March, May, and even July. Incubation takes 12-14 days.

Insects caught on the ground are the bluebirds main food source for much of the year. Major prey include caterpillars, beetles, crickets, grasshoppers, and spiders. In the fall and winter, their diet consists of large amounts of fruit such as mistletoe, sumac, black cherry, dogwood berries, pokeweed, and juniper berries.

Bluebirds may be attracted to your yard by putting up nest boxes. It's fun to do and a great opportunity to introduce and get kids involved with nature. You can make a bluebird nest box using one 1"x6" board 5" long. Too much heat is detrimental to broods so make sure the opening of the nest box faces east. You can get the box plans by going to mdc.mo.gov and type in birdhouses.

Watch out for tax season scams

It's that time of year when we do our taxes — but it's also the same time that tax scammers go to work. What scams should you watch for — and how can you avoid being victimized?

Sadly, the list of scams is pretty long, including demands for payment or requests for "additional information" pertaining to your tax refund, in which the sender asks for your Social Security number and other personal information. These scam emails can look quite official, often incorporating the IRS logo. You might also receive scam text messages containing bogus links claiming to be the IRS website or an online "tool" that can help process your refund faster.

But keep these points in mind:

- The IRS generally won't contact you by phone and won't contact you by email, text messages or social media channels to ask for personal or financial information. The IRS begins most correspondence to taxpayers through regular mail delivered by the U.S. Postal Service.
- The IRS won't call to demand you make an immediate payment through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. If you owe taxes, the IRS generally will mail you a bill. And the IRS won't threaten to bring in the police or another law enforcement group to arrest you for not paying your taxes.

In general, be extremely skeptical about any type of communication purporting to be from the IRS that sounds bullying or over-inquisitive — and certainly don't give out any personal or financial information. But these fake messages aren't the only tax-season scams out there. You might even receive a direct deposit from what appears to be the U.S. Treasury Department — but if you weren't expecting it, something's likely not right.



This payment could be a sign that a fraudulent tax return was filed in your name, and it might be followed by a communication from a supposed IRS agent requesting this overpayment be sent to them. If this happens to you, you'll want to contact the IRS right away, and you could also ask your bank to return the deposit to the government.

Other scams don't claim to originate directly from the IRS, as scammers pretend to be from real or imaginary tax organizations. For example, you could get a message from the Taxpayer Advocate Service, an independent organization within the IRS, but this agency won't contact you without a legitimate reason. Or you could receive a message from the nonexistent "Bureau of Tax Enforcement." Your best bet is to delete these messages immediately or send them to your spam folder.

Not all tax season scams originate from fraudulent IRS representatives or fake agencies. You also need to be careful about whom you hire to prepare your taxes. If possible, get a recommendation from a trusted friend or family member. And keep in mind that a legitimate tax preparer must have a valid Preparer Tax Identification Number and must sign your tax return. If someone doesn't have this number or is reluctant to sign your return,

it may well be a sign that this individual is a "ghost preparer" who only wants to pocket your fee.

Tax scammers are, unfortunately, here to stay — but remaining vigilant can help you keep them from causing problems for you in this tax season and all the ones in the future.

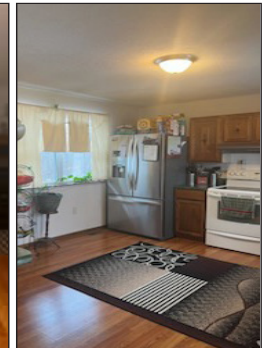

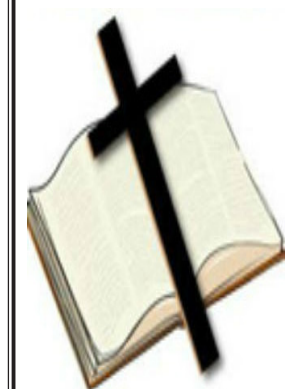

Dealing With High Feed Prices

High feed and input prices are impacting ag producers. Often, the initial reaction to high prices for feed or fertilizer is to reduce the use of these inputs to cut production costs. While this strategy may reduce production costs in the short-term, there may be long term negative consequences to consider.

When dealing specifically with high feed prices, there are several factors to consider. With hay needs, for example, it is important to have some idea of the nutrient value of forage both in inventory and potentially purchased hay.

The second important piece to understand is knowing the nutritional demand of the livestock you are trying to feed. Factors such as age, weight, stage of production, and desired productivity determine animal requirements. When this information is combined with forage quality data, appropriate supplementation strategies can be developed.

A third major factor is reducing feed waste. Tremendous variation in hay waste exists between hay feeders, for example.

Finally, when purchasing inputs, are you doing this in the most cost-effective manner? There can be large cost differences between buying hay by the bale vs. buying hay by the ton or purchasing bagged vs. bulk supplements.

These topics will be



explored in more detail at the upcoming Central Missouri Ag Club Ag Expo. This session will be held on Friday, February 3 beginning at 11 a.m. in Assembly Hall next to the National Guard Armory and Mathewson Exhibition Center on the Missouri State Fairgrounds in Sedalia.

Expanding on the issue of increased input costs, questions arise such as what is the production cost of not adequately fertilizing pastures or hay fields, for example. Livestock have to eat, and if fertilizer applications and forage yield are reduced, where is the needed pasture or hay going to come from? From an animal perspective, what are the consequences of calving thin cows for

control expenses while still maintaining desired productivity. A lot of factors go into these decisions. The initial reaction of "I can't afford to fertilize." or "I can't afford to supplement these animals." can lead to unnecessary loss of animal productivity and farm enterprise profitability.

Having a management plan and actually carrying out that plan will assist producers with surviving this era of increased input prices. If you have additional questions on these topics, I'll try to answer some of those at the Ag Expo seminar on February 3 or you may contact me via e-mail at schmitze@missouri.edu or by calling the Pettis County Extension Center at (660) 827-0591.
