4 pounds of large red potatoes

3 tablespoons olive oil 4 garlic cloves, minced 1 teaspoon dried oregano 14 ounce can Italian peeled tomatoes, drained and chopped

3/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

1-1/2 teaspoons salt & ¹/₂ teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Preheat oven to 350, brush shallow baking dish (I use 11 x 7) with 1 teaspoon olive oil

Cook potatoes in boiling salted water for 10 minutes only. Drain, remove skins and cut into ½ inch slices. Place 1/3 of potatoes in baking dish, overlapping slightly. Use 1/3 each of the garlic, oregano, tomatoes, remaining olive oil and season potatoes. Repeat twice. Bake 40 minutes or until the potatoes are tender when tested with a knife and lightly browned and bubbly.

Our Missouri state bird, the Eastern bluebird, lives mostly in open country around trees with little or no understory. Originally, habitat probably included savannas, beaver ponds, mature open woods and forest openings. Today they're most common along pastures, agriculture fields, suburban parks, backyards, and golf courses.

Bluebird populations fell in the early twentieth century as aggressive introduced species such as European and starlings house sparrows made available nest sites increasingly difficult for bluebirds to hold onto. In the 1960s and 1970s, establishment of bluebird trails and nest box campaigns alleviated much of its competition for nest sites, especially with box designs to keep out the larger starlings. Bluebird populations have been recovering ever since.

In February and March, the male bluebird starts at cavities displaying or boxes bringing nest materials and waving his wings. That is pretty much his only contribution to nest building: the female builds the nest and incubates the eggs. Both males and females feed the brood.

Bluebirds often exhibit extra-pair paternity: females may mate with more than one male which means that the males sometimes care for offspring that genetically are not their own.

Females may build nests in many available sites but typically use only one site to raise a brood, and may use the same nest for multiple broods. They will attack other species that they deem a threat, including house sparrows.

Nest building takes 2-6 days and one egg is laid each day until there is a clutch of 4-7 eggs. Bluebirds are members of the thrush family (some as robins) so eggs have a robin egg blue tint with occasionally all white eggs.

The female waits about a week to start incubation to assure all eggs will hatch around the same time. They often have multiple broods in March, May, and even July. Incubation takes 12-14 days.

Insects caught on the ground are the bluebirds main food source for much of the year. Major prey include caterpillars, beetles, grasshoppers, crickets, and spiders. In the fall and winter, their diet consists of large amounts of fruit such as mistletoe, sumac, black cherry, dogwood berries, pokeweed, and juniper berries.

Bluebirds may be attracted to your yard by putting up nest boxes. It's fun to do and a great opportunity to introduce and get kids involved with nature. You can make a bluebird nest box using one 1"x6" board 5" long. Too much heat is detrimental to broods so make sure the opening of the nest box faces east. You can get the box plans by going to mdc.mo.gov and type in birdhouses.

Cardinals Sweep Clinton Tourney With Drubbing Of Skyline

After a tough game with Pleasant Hill for three quarters in their 53-40 victory, Lincoln romped past Clinton 63-40 in the second matchup in as many days in the Clinton Tournament on Tuesday night. Lincoln jumped out to a 12-0 lead and led 12-1 at the end of the quarter. The Cardinals went to town in the second quarter with a 25-7 halftime lead.

Lincoln had struggled early in their last three starts against Sacred Heart, Cole Camp and Tipton but on this night, the flow of the game was in their favor early on and carried over throughout the contest.

Asked about the difference, Lincoln coach Tyler Burke commented, "Well, I think at the start of the game, we forced some turnovers and that allowed us to get out and run and attack the basket."

Asked if the game surprised him in any way, Coach Burke commented, "I think it surprised me a little bit how effective our defense was from the jump. We did a great job on their best player. Everyone was locked in defensively. That shouldn't surprise me, we've been doing it all year."

Lincoln, who normally plays man-to-man, switched their defense up at times.

"We were in the box-andone for quite some time. We had that prepared if Connor (Lynde) picked up a foul early, and he did", Burke said. "The kids did a good job in that we hadn't practiced that in a long time; another example of being able to lean on the experience of our seniors."

It was 49-33 as Lincoln subbed most of the second half. Lincoln moved to 18-0.



Wednesday night, On Lincoln wrapped up their three straight games in the 98 year old tournament in Clinton with a 63-40 thrashing of Skyline.

Lincoln dominated the contest from start to finish and held a 27-3 first quarter lead. Ross Johnson, who rarely scores but is on the floor for his much needed defense and rebounding, hit their first two baskets.

With the big lead and the conference tournament coming up on Saturday, Cardinals coach Tyler Burke used the opportunity to rest his starters and play his bench.

He said, "It was a good game. Starters played well in short minutes. We got the opportunity to play some guys that needed minutes and I was proud of the way they played. We have had a long week here of three games in a row so it was nice to not have to play the starters heavy minutes. We will be rested and ready for the conference tournament." It was 51-23 after three. Connor Lynde didn't score in his shortened minutes of playing time. Freshman Riley Sanders led the scoring with 14 points and gave the fans a glimpse of the future. Kyle Eckhoff had 12 points and never missed a shot going 5-5 with two 3-pointers. Asked about a trophy, Coach Burke replied, "I'm not sure about a trophy. We got in the tournament because it helped them fill out the tournament and it fit an opening on our schedule so it was good for both sides. Our kids played well tonight. They have been playing well. We will look to maintain health and try to perform our best in the last month of the year already." Lincoln moved to 19-0 while Skyline fell to 3-16.

The game was at ten in the morning and a thirty mile drive for most. However, the contest between heated rivals lived up to expectations in a physical 45-44 victory for Sacred Heart over Cole Camp on Saturday in the Kaysinger Conference Tournament.

Tanna Howe led the Ladycats with 19 points.


In their second round game, Warsaw battled it out with Climax Springs, and though it was a good fight, the Ladycats yielded yet another one, 40-35.





Watch out for tax season scams

It's that time of year when we do our taxes — but it's also the same time that tax scammers go to work. What scams should you watch for — and how can you avoid being victimized?



This payment could be a sign that a fraudulent tax return was filed in your name, and it might be followed by a communication from a supposed IRS agent requesting this overpayment be sent to them. If this happens to you, you'll want to contact the IRS right away, and you could also ask your bank to return the deposit to the government. Other scams don't claim to originate directly from the IRS, as scammers pretend to be from real or imaginary tax organizations. For example, you could get a message from the Taxpayer Advocate Service, an independent organization within the IRS, but this agency won't contact you without a legitimate reason. Or you could receive a message from the nonexistent "Bureau of Tax Enforcement." Your best bet is to delete these messages

immediately or send them to

your spam folder.

Not all tax season scams originate from fraudulent IRS representatives or fake agencies. You also need to be careful about whom you hire to prepare your taxes. If possible, get a recommendation from a trusted friend or family member. And keep in mind that a legitimate tax preparer must have a valid Preparer Tax Identification Number and must sign your tax return. If someone doesn't have this number or is reluctant to sign your return,

it may well be a sign that this individual is a "ghost preparer" who only wants to pocket your fee.

Tax scammers are. unfortunately, here to stay — but remaining vigilant can help you keep them from causing problems for you in this tax season and all the ones in the future.

Sadly, the list of scams is pretty long, including demands for payment or requests for "additional information" pertaining to your tax refund, in which the sender asks for your Social Security number and other personal information. These scam emails can look quite official, often incorporating the IRS logo. You might also receive scam text messages containing bogus links claiming to be the IRS website or an online "tool" that can help process your refund faster.

But keep these points in mind:

• The IRS generally won't contact you by phone and won't contact you by email, text messages or social media channels to ask for personal or financial information. The IRS begins most correspondence to taxpayers through regular mail delivered by the U.S. Postal Service.

• The IRS won't call to demand you make an immediate payment through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. If you owe taxes, the IRS generally will mail you a bill. And the IRS won't threaten to bring in the police or another law enforcement group to arrest you for not paying your taxes.

In general, be extremely skeptical about any type of communication purporting to be from the IRS that sounds bullying or overinquisitive — and certainly don't give out any personal or financial information. But these fake messages aren't the only tax-season scams out there. You might even receive a direct deposit from what appears to be the U.S. Treasury Department — but if you weren't expecting it, something's likely not right.





In 1 Corinthians 11:20-34, Paul addresses the church of Corinth, and the responsibilities believers have to their community. In the early church, taking Communion or the Lord's looked Supper, very different because it was an actual meal with the "bread" and "wine" part of the meal. Some who were powerful or well off, would get off work early, start eating, leaving no food for those who were struggling the most when they arrived after work.

Paul tells them this is the Lord's Supper, yet the church is divided. He reminds them it is not the job of those who work to leave early – it is the job of those who can, to help those in need. Those who have are to find a way to help. There are some in our community who are not doing ok, and if we are given the ability to help and we do nothing – we

fail to do what God wants us to do!

The purpose of Communion or the Lord's Supper is in memory of what Jesus did for us. Jesus intends for us to remember Him. He is reframing the idea of Passover and the celebration of the power of the Almighty God when he took the enslaved and made them mighty! Remember the power of your God who sat with you. If we believe - we are free from our sins! Not in remembrance of a time long ago, but of the sacrifice Jesus made for you and me! Jesus died for everyone! He loved us all equally enough to die on the cross!

We should be unified and not separated. Communion is not for your own benefit - this is about Jesus! If we eat or drink in an unworthy manner, we are sinning against God! 

Dealing With High Feed Prices

High feed and input prices are impacting ag producers. Often, the initial reaction to high prices for feed or fertilizer is to reduce the use of these inputs to cut production costs. While this strategy may reduce production costs in the shortterm, there may be long term negative consequences to consider.

When dealing specifically with high feed prices, there are several factors to consider. With hay needs, for example, it is important to have some idea of the nutrient value of forage both in inventory and potentially purchased hay.

The second important piece to understand is knowing the nutritional demand of the livestock you are trying to feed. Factors such as age, weight, stage of production, and desired productivity determine animal requirements. When this information is combined with forage quality data, appropriate supplementation strategies can be developed.

A third major factor is reducing feed waste. Tremendous variation in hay waste exists between hay feeders, for example.






