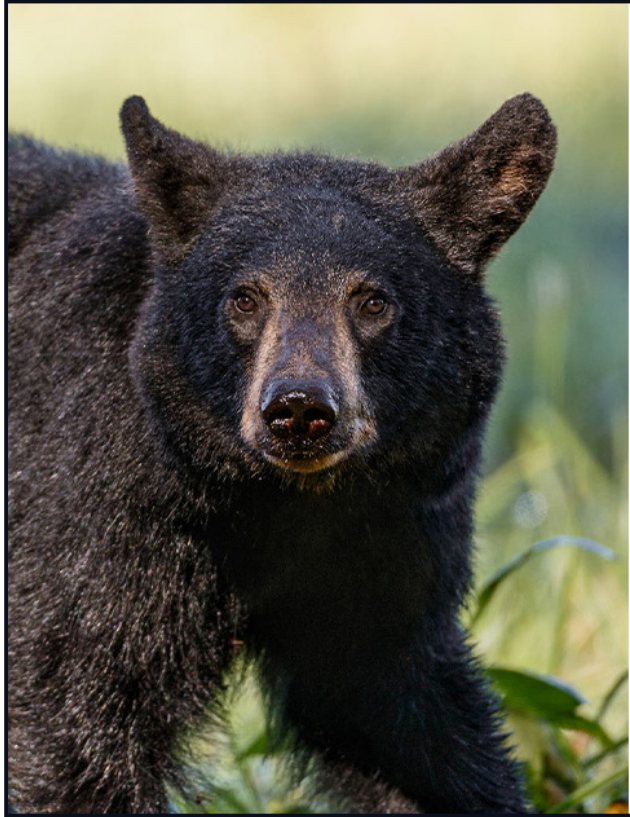
'They're Out There!' Why Mountain Lion And Bear Sightings Rise In Benton County

People in Missouri who work or hunt near creeks, in forests or wide-open lands are spotting more mountain lions and black bears than in the past. According to Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) agent Jacob Strozewski that is probably because there are increases in game cameras that photograph the animals when no one is around.

"Missouri has its own black bear population that is moving from southern Missouri, and the sightings are increasing," said Strozewski. "Most are within the Ozark part of the state. At one time it was thought that the state was depleted of bears, but now there are from 500 to 800, including a breeding population. There is a bear season in October, but hunters shouldn't use bait or other less desirable methods to hunt them. No harvesting was reported last year in Benton County."



LIVING WITH LIONS AND BEARS has people talking in Benton County as sighting them has increased. So far, there have been no close encounters, but any sighting of a large predator can instill both excitement and fear.

Strozewski stated that there have been 99 confirmed reports of mountain lions in Missouri since 1994, with the last official report for Benton County occurring in March 2021. He said

that they normally come from the north and west and no evidence of normal reproduction has been detected. The mountain lions are usually males. There is no open season for



mountain lions. However, if they are threatening people or their livestock those affected can protect themselves. Any such incidents are best reported to MDC so studies can be

carried out to determine where these animals are coming from.

Sightings are not always reported to MDC, so the numbers of local mountain

Warsaw Conducts Meeting By Zoom, Puts Two Issues On April Ballot

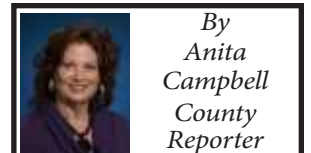

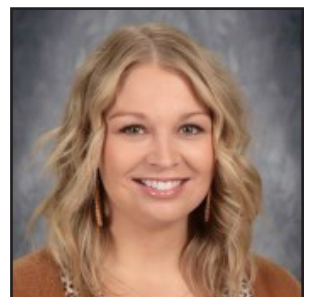

And The Beat Goes On: Parrott's Power Through To Provide Heart Screenings

Devon Parrott was just 10 years old when he suddenly fainted at Lincoln R-2 School. After routine checks were covered and no explanation arose, Devon and his family travelled to Children's Mercy for an EKG. The results of that test would change their lives forever.

Devon was diagnosed with a S.A.D.S. (sudden

arrhythmia death syndrome) called Long QT. Devon and his family were devastated to learn that he was at high risk of cardiac arrest and was lucky to be alive. His football playing days were apparently over and he could not be left alone for more than a few minutes.

Devon's mother, Angela Parrott, began to research S.A.D.S.: its prevalence and prevention.

"I learned that nearly 4,000 young people die each year from heart conditions like my son's", she said. "It is more common than

childhood leukemia, but not very many people are aware of it."

The family decided to hold a 5K to raise awareness in Devon's honor, and Devon's Beat was born. Since then, the event has turned into a fundraiser to help pay for heart screenings for young children all over Missouri. 1 out of 100 kids has a detectable issue. Though many are not as severe as Devon's Long QT, it is imperative for their future health that they are aware of it.

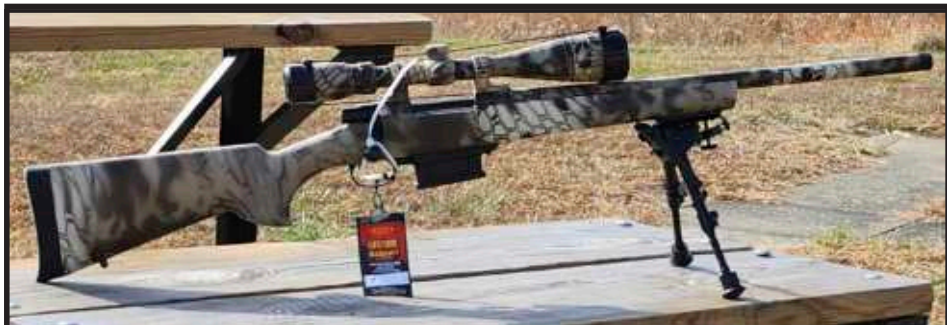

Bothwell Foundation Presents Four Life-Saving Devices To Heckart Community Center

Members of Wear Red for Women, a Bothwell Foundation committee, recently presented four automated external defibrillators (AEDs) to Sedalia Parks and Recreation for the Heckart Community Center. An AED is a small, lightweight device that allows individuals and first responders to treat sudden cardiac arrest. The machine automatically analyzes the heart rhythm and when appropriate, it delivers an electrical shock to the heart to restore its normal rhythm. According to research, the majority of sudden heart attack victims have good chances of survival under certain common conditions, including that the event is witnessed, the collapse occurs in a large public place, an AED is handy, and bystanders use CPR and the

AED. Funds to purchase the device were raised during the 2022 Wear Red for Women luncheon and auction. The committee's goal is to have AEDs in every place people work, learn, play or pray in Sedalia and Pettis County. Since the inception of the luncheon event in 2020, 47 AEDs have been placed in or committed to various locations. The 2023 Wear Red for Women event is Feb. 24, 2023.

lions and black bears are more numerous than those confirmed by the state. A couple of Benton County residents and Sheriff Eric Knox described their encounters with these animals.

"I have seen mountain lions on several occasions during the last three to five years," said Sheriff Knox. "They are a goldish brown with long tails, and there are a lot of them. Folks near Mora had cattle killed by one several years ago, which was determined by the scratch marks on the livestock bodies. I saw a black bear near Hwy AA during the day as it ran across a field with its hair flying. It crossed a fence, then fell upside-down and became stunned. I saw it from my cop car when I was on duty. Last year I saw a bear at night on Walker's Road. It crossed in front of me so I stopped and put on my thermal vision and could see it 20 feet in the brush. It was very slim and skittish."

Matt Henderson, a businessman at his cattle ranch, at Deer Creek Stone and Sand, and a Warsaw High School Girls Basketball coach, said that he and his employees come across multiple sightings of mountain lions.

"In the past ten years we have probably averaged two sightings a year," said Henderson. "They (mountain lions) come up on Deer Creek where we get our gravel. About four or five years ago one hung around and made a noise like a screaming woman that upset our dogs. A black bear crossed through the field at my uncle's place and I have a video of it running."

Jack and Jo Spicer, who live in Edwards at Forbes Lake of the Ozarks, had a mountain lion in their back yard two years ago. Jo Spicer said that they follow the waterways and come through the area (which is adjacent to Lake of the Ozarks.) She said that they got a good picture of it strolling down the path.

Although some people may be frightened by the fact that these particular wild animals pass through Benton County, Agent Strozewski said that a person is more likely to be struck by lightning than attacked by a black bear or mountain lion. He said that they really don't want to have anything to do with us. He said that if you know you are walking where these animals have been seen, have a phone with music, or bells to scare them.

www.mdc.gov offers guidelines about being aware of a bear. Among other things, it states that feeding bears will make them lose their natural fear of humans and they will learn to go to places like homes, campsites and neighborhoods to look for food instead of staying in the forest. They could

become aggressive and dangerous and would then have to be destroyed. The website also states that you should never corner a bear. Make sure it has an escape route, and back away from it slowly with your arms raised. Speak in a calm, loud voice. Do not turn your back to the bear and do not run.

"MDC is trying to make sure we do right by the bears (and mountain lions) and by the citizens," said Agent Strozewski.

When Devon needed surgery for a ruptured appendix in 2015, doctors were aware of what medications were safest for him and he pulled through. In August 2015, his implantable cardio defibrillator (ICD) saved his life when he went into cardiac arrest at the movies.

The family's biggest scare came in 2020, when Devon coded for 13 minutes on the operating table. He was in for routine replacement of his ICD. When the doctor removed the old one, the wire that delivers the charge to his heart tore away with tissue, causing his chest to fill with blood. Luckily a heart surgeon was able to repair the tear, and Devon amazed his doctors with a quick recovery.

What could have been a tragedy has become a mission of awareness for Devon's Beat. With multiple screening events in which 50-60 are kids are screened for S.A.D.S., there is no telling how many young lives Devon's Beat has had a positive effect on. The next screening is scheduled to be in Lincoln on Saturday, February 25, 2023. The annual Devon's Beat 5K Run, Dance and Auction is slated for Saturday, April 22, 2023. First actions by the group was to approve January 3 council meeting minutes and pay bills presented.

The group then went into new business, approving three ordinances which: (1) Imposed a three percent sales tax on all tangible personal property retail sales of "adult use marijuana" sold within the city, pursuant to the state constitution and subject to approval by city voters at the general municipal election to be held on April 4; (2) Authorized the Mayor to execute a contract between the city and Burns & McDonnell for engineering services in connection with the city's multi-million dollar 2023 RAISE application assistance, relating to city streets. City Administrator Randy Pogue said the engineering firm has the needed software and the project would not expand the city's 2023 budget; (3) Authorized an election to annex real property north of the city limits, subject to approval by city voters on April 4. Administrator Pogue said the real property involved is the old city golf course and three other properties in that area.

The meeting was closed about 12:22 PM. These open sessions are usually held on 1st and 3rd Monday evenings; visitors are welcome.

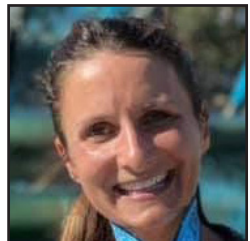

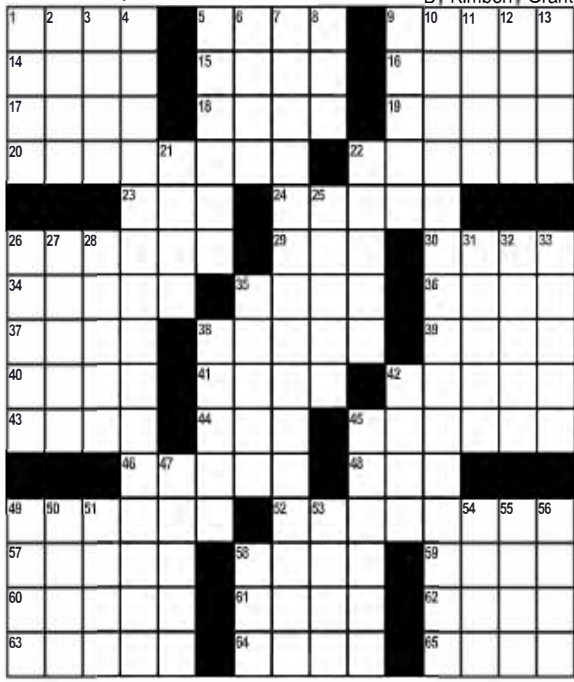

Open the (back) door to a Roth IRA

There aren't many drawbacks to having a high income — but being unable to invest in a Roth IRA might be one of them. Are there strategies that allow high-income earners to contribute to this valuable retirement account?

Before we delve into that question, let's consider the rules. In 2023, you can contribute the full amount to a Roth IRA — \$6,500, or \$7,500 if you're 50 or older — if your modified adjusted gross income is less than \$138,000 (if you're single) or \$218,000 (if you're married and filing jointly). If you earn more than these amounts, the amount you can contribute decreases until it's phased out completely if your income exceeds \$153,000 (single) or \$228,000 (married, filing jointly).

A Roth IRA is attractive because its earnings and withdrawals are tax free, provided you've had the account at least five years and you don't start taking money out until you're 59½. Furthermore, when you own a Roth IRA, you're not required to take withdrawals from it when you turn 72, as you would with a traditional IRA, so you'll have more flexibility in your retirement income planning and your money will have the chance to potentially keep growing. But given your income, how can you contribute to a Roth?

You may want to consider what's known as a "backdoor Roth" strategy. Essentially, this involves contributing money to a new traditional IRA, or taking money from an existing one, and then converting the funds to a Roth IRA. But while this backdoor strategy sounds simple, it involves some



serious considerations.

Specifically, you need to evaluate how much of your traditional IRA is in pretax or after-tax dollars. When you contribute pretax dollars to a traditional IRA, your contributions lower your annual taxable income. However, if your income is high enough to disqualify you from contributing directly to a Roth IRA, you may also earn too much to make deductible (pretax) contributions to a traditional IRA. Consequently, you might have contributed after-tax dollars to your traditional IRA, on top of the pretax ones you may have put in when your income was lower. (Earnings on after-tax contributions will be treated as pretax amounts.)

In any case, if you convert pretax assets from your traditional IRA to a Roth IRA, the amount converted will be fully taxable in the year of the conversion. So, if

you were to convert a large amount of these assets, you could face a hefty tax bill. And since you probably don't want to take funds from the converted IRA itself to pay for the taxes, you'd need another source of funding, possibly from your savings and other investments.

Ultimately, then, a backdoor Roth IRA strategy may make the most sense if you have few or no pretax assets in any traditional IRA, including a SEP-IRA and a SIMPLE IRA. If you do have a sizable amount of pretax dollars in your IRA, and you'd still like to convert it to a Roth IRA, you could consider spreading the conversion over a period of years, potentially diluting your tax burden.

Consult with your tax advisor when considering a backdoor Roth strategy. But if it's appropriate for your

situation, it could play a role in your financial strategy, so give it some thought.

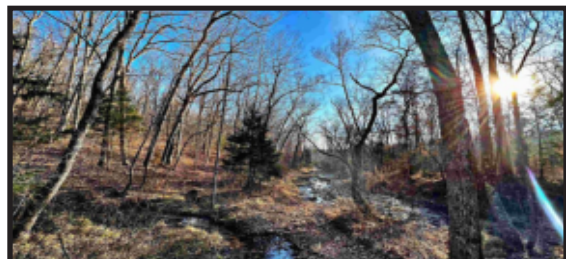

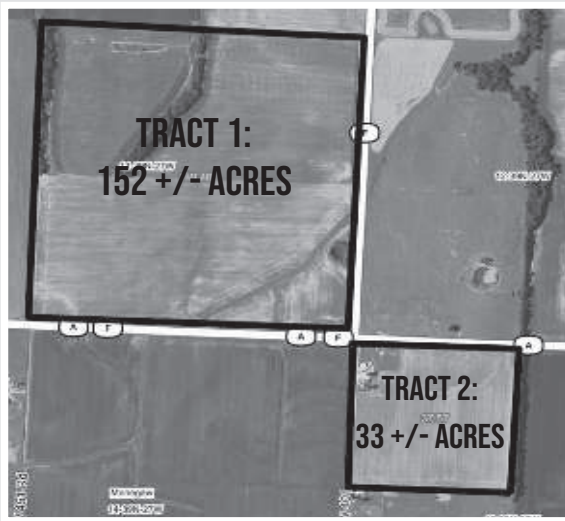

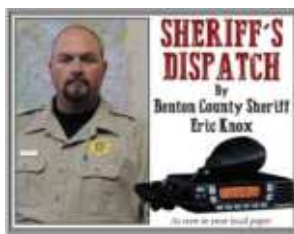

I want to thank you all for putting your trust in me to carry out the Office of Sheriff of Benton County. You believed in me when I approached you for a new jail while running for office. I focused on building for the future rather than building a smaller facility and adding on later. I am pleased to announce that your new Jail provided an additional \$1,813,000.00 of income to Benton County through the housing of Federal detainees. There were bills paid out of this number so that is our gross, not net profit. We were able to exceed the \$1,500,000.00 I predicted



a court date. Trinity Michelle Burgess-Brown of Montrose, MO was sentenced to an Order of Commit on 01/20/23 for DWI. Subject was released for time served.

Kyle Reece Lalanda of Lincoln, MO was arrested on 01/21/23 for domestic assault. Subject was released and given a court date.

John Dale Wilson of Warsaw, MO was arrested on 01/21/23 on a El Passo County Colorado warrant for sexual exploitation of a child and obscenity times 2. There is no bond and subject is being held in the Benton County Detention Center.

Robert Wayne Hensley of Columbia, MO was arrested on 01/22/23 on Camden County warrants for failure to appear - failure to register a vehicle, driving while suspended or revoked and operate motor vehicle without financial responsibility. Total bond was set at \$800 cash or surety or release after 24 hours. Subject posted bond and was given a court date.

due to the excellence of the jail management and the men and women doing the work in the jail. I am very proud of the job they have done and their continued improvement. What these men and women have done is nothing short of a small miracle. In addition, the Benton County commission was able to give much-needed pay raises across the entire county workforce using some of these funds. Many positions within the county are still underfunded compared to the industry standard but any pay raise for these hardworking, dedicated employees is welcome and appreciated.

January brings a summary of some of the previous year's statistics and a little insight to the upcoming year. I'm going to list some of the more serious stats here for 2022 that I think you will be interested in, a full list of our calls will be available at the Sheriff's

Office. Second Degree Burglary, 31 up from 24 in 2021; death investigations which include any deceased person outside of city limits, 43 up from 28 in 2021; domestic assault, 54 up from 47 in 2021; possession of a controlled substance (non-marijuana) 53, down from 63 in 2021; property damage 2nd degree 40, up from 38 in 2021; stealing \$750 or more 36, up from 34 in 2021; non-traffic related warrant arrests, 60 down from 90 in 2021; traffic related warrant arrest, 39 up from 38. I always focus on being transparent and would like to see these numbers down rather than up but crime does not take a break and the short staffing that has plagued our nation for the past several years will have its effects on the number of arrests.

With the Friends of the Benton County Sheriff's Office leading the way, we intend on providing a Citizen's Academy this year. This would allow small groups of the community to experience a shortened version of the training and education required to be a law enforcement officer. The Friends are currently raising funds for a MILO training system which a state of the art, digital force-option simulator which allows military, law enforcement and the community to experience real world simulations on various real-life situations such as shoot/don't shoot, car stops, domestic violence and just about any other interaction involving force on force. There is no room in the county budget for this equipment but it will be an integral part of our citizen's academy and benefit all area law enforcement in training and even qualifying on various weapons platforms.

We also plan on taking a look at raising funds to build a small, law enforcement use only, animal care facility. This will be used to house animals in emergency situations like quarantine for dog bites, road side arrests where animals are in the vehicle or even warrant arrest where animals are involved with no one to take custody of the furry family. Often times, my staff feed, water and care for these animals on their own.

The commissioners approved all of our 2023 training budget so that will be a top priority. Training is so important in any organization but especially so in the law enforcement and jail setting. 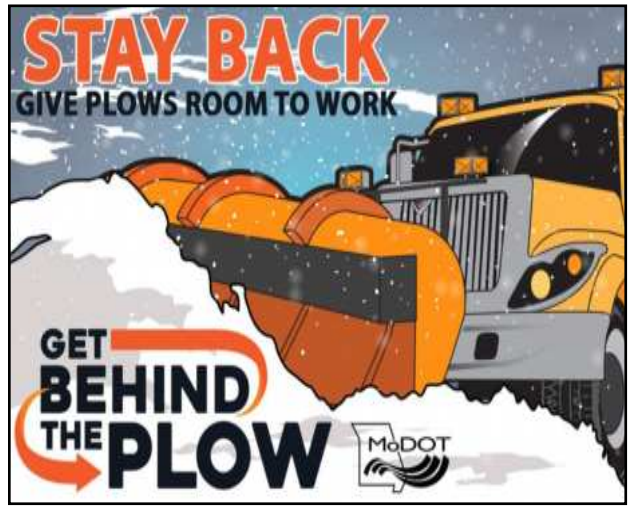
