

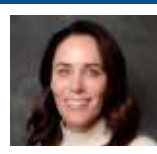

Wrestling Takes Over Town For Warsaw Invitational And Youth Tournaments

It was a grappler's paradise over the weekend when Warsaw welcomed teams and wrestlers from across the state to the Warsaw High School Invitational Tournament on Saturday and the Warsaw Youth Wrestling Tournament on Sunday.

Nine teams competed in the invitational event on Saturday with Warsaw bringing in their highest team finish for the year in second.

Team results were: Versailles (220.5), **Warsaw (172.0)**, Whitfield (171.0), Smith-Cotton (166.0), Eldorado Springs (146.0), Sherwood (100.5), Lincoln College Prep (49.5), Windsor (39.0) and Stover (38.0).

The Wildcats placed seven wrestlers on the podium, including three champions, on Saturday.

Warsaw coach Justin Wisdom was pleased with his team's performance,

Rescuing and providing a home for an older dog led to a new career for author Beth Halsey as she wrote her first book after retiring from her job from the University of Central Missouri.

Fifty years after they graduated from Warsaw High School, Larry and Beth (Downing) Halsey decided to come home to

Benton County to enjoy retirement in the country.

"Larry loves to fish so we decided to build a home near the water," said Halsey.

While the Halsey home had always included pets, they had never had an indoor dog so they decided to adopt a dog to live with them in their new home.

"Since we were new at caring for an indoor dog, Otis more or less trained us to let us know what he needed," said Halsey. "So, I started sharing the adventures of Otis on

Facebook."

Halsey's friends on Facebook enjoyed hearing about Otis's adventures, so when she didn't report about what Otis was up to, she would receive messages asking about him.

"I didn't consider myself an author, however, when I received so many messages asking about Otis, I decided that maybe there was a book in these messages," said Halsey.

Lawn Jockey Brings Smiles For Miles To Main Street

Everyone has seen Al, the lawn jockey? He lives on Main Street in Warsaw, in front of Alice Pethel's house and has become a Warsaw icon as he is almost always attired in seasonally themed costumes.

"When I repainted him, his face came out looking very white, almost albino. That's how he got the name, Al," Pethel said.

Pethel has been dressing Al since moving to Warsaw in 2017.

"I started just playing around a little bit, then got more into it, then I started ordering costumes for him," she said! "Now in my attic, I have a whole alcove dedicated to his costumes, hats and accessories. I must have 15 or more complete outfits for him. November is a busy month for Al. There is voting, Veterans Day, and Thanksgiving," stated Pethel.

Al's costumes are not easy to put on. With one arm

straight out holding an iron ring, and the other folded back, most of his attire must be pinned on. The wind also poses a challenge.

"People said his outfits would be stolen, but the only thing that has ever been taken was when I had him dressed for a day at the lake, and somebody took the floating ring from around the base," Pethel said.

Lawn jockeys were originally a welcoming symbol to guests and provided a place to tie a horse.

Dear Editor,

Less than a week into the 2023 MO legislative session, Missouri Republicans have introduced a dozen bills to make it harder for Missouri voters to approve constitutional amendments which undermines our direct democracy. Missouri citizens can initiate constitutional changes through the petition process. These petitions are created by Missouri voters that will be placed on the ballot to be voted on.

Two resolutions — MO House Joint Resolution 2 and MO House Joint Resolution 28 — both would make it harder to get a citizen-led petition onto the ballot. In an even more extreme and unprecedented requirement — MO House Joint Resolution 6, MO

House Joint Resolution 18, and MO House Joint Resolution 29 — would raise the bar by requiring 67% of voter signatures from "each" eight congressional districts. Currently, it is just below 50%. Don't forget folks. The petition process allowed you to vote on the very popular amendment to legalize marijuana.

As a side note, the MO Democrats proposed changes to house rules: activities streamed live and archived for public viewing; allow MO citizens to voice their opinion remotely; ensure Missourians can submit their input before lobbyists or out-of-state folks give their 2 cents; ensure ALL bills get public hearings. Each one was shot down by the MO GOP.

The MO GOP keeps voting to concentrate power more into the hands of a few, and against transparency and accessibility for all Missourians.

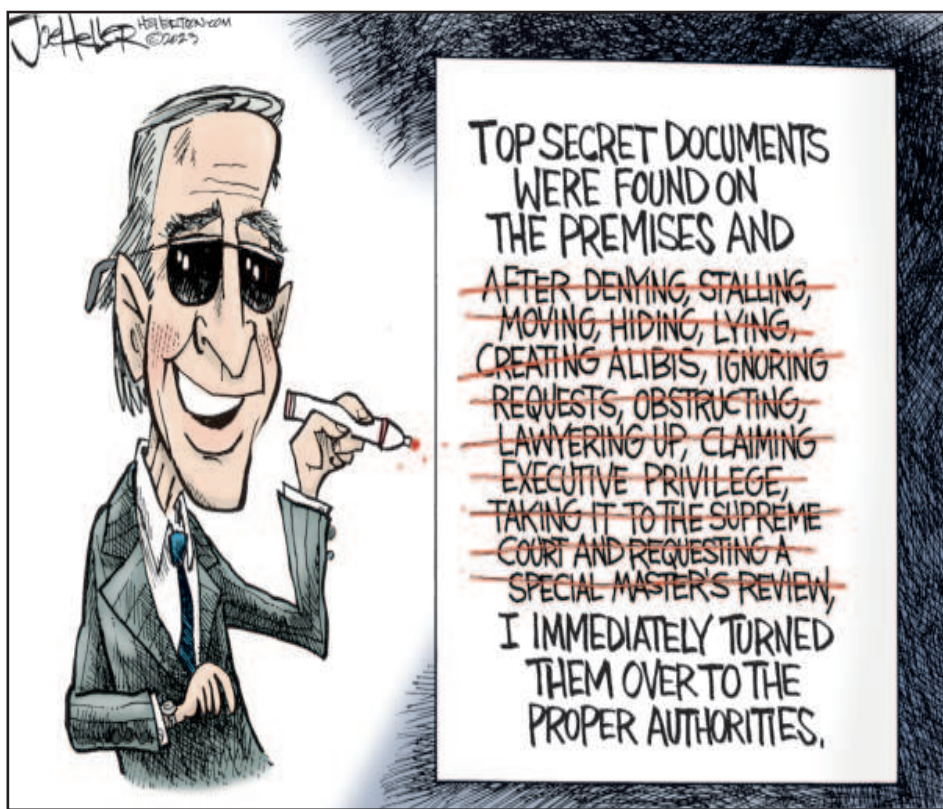
Worried about inflation? Consider these moves

As you know, inflation was big news throughout 2022. But will it continue in 2023? And looking even further ahead, how should you account for inflation in your long-term plans?

In regard to the first question, many experts predict that inflation will cool off this year, though there are no guarantees. The high inflation of last year is thought to have been caused by some unusual factors, such as a spike in the demand for consumer goods as the world came out of the COVID-19 pandemic, which led to supply chain issues. Also, the war in Ukraine drove up oil prices, increasing the cost of manufacturing and shipping and driving up the price of wheat and other commodities.

In any case, last year reminded us that inflation needs to be reckoned with as you work toward your financial goals. But how you respond to inflation will depend somewhat on your stage of life. So, here are some suggestions to consider:

- If you're still working . . .**
- *Contribute more to your retirement plans.* If you can afford to put more money away in your IRA and 401(k), you may want to do so. The more resources you'll eventually have available in retirement, the better protected you are against the rising cost of living.
 - *Adjust your portfolio objectives with your financial professional.* Using tools such as "hypothetical" illustrations, a financial professional can show



you some different paths you might take with your investments, given different rates of inflation. So, for example, if you feel that inflation may be higher for a longer period than you once thought, you could request a hypothetical showing how you might need to adjust your investment mix to achieve your long-term goals, given your risk tolerance and time horizon.

If you're already retired . . .

• *Consider part-time work or consulting.* Once you retire from your career, it doesn't mean you can never do any paid work again. If you've accumulated years of experience and expertise, you could use your skills as a consultant. Also, many part-time jobs are available for retirees. With the added income from employment, you may be able to delay taking withdrawals from your retirement accounts

and other investments, possibly extending their longevity. (Once you turn 72, though, you will need to begin taking money from your 401(k) and traditional IRA.)

• *Delay taking Social Security.* You can begin taking Social Security when you're 62, but your monthly checks will be substantially bigger if you wait until your full retirement age, which will likely be between 66 and 67. (You could even wait until 70, at which point your monthly benefits will max out.) Of course, the ability to delay taking Social Security depends on whether you can afford it, but it may be possible if you work longer than you once planned or if you work part time in retirement. But even if you do need to take Social Security before your full retirement age, your payments will be adjusted annually for inflation — in

fact, for 2023, benefit checks will rise 8.7% over 2022.

We'll always have to deal with some level of inflation — so it's a good idea to be prepared.

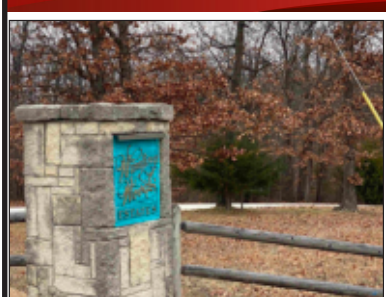

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK JOHNNIE J. LOGUE

**Study to shew thyself approved Into God, a workman that needeth not be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of Truth.
-2 Timothy 2:15**

The above scripture was written by a veteran preacher, Paul, to a young preacher named Timothy. Both first and second Timothy and Titus have to be taken and read in that context to understand the original meaning.

Above anyone else, therefore, according to that scripture, a preacher should study the Bible. Often people tell me that you don't need to go to a Bible college to preach. Absolutely, true.

However, the advantages of graduating from a good Bible College totally outweighs the alternative. You can't preach what you don't know and the fear is always there of wrongly preaching the Word of God. So you go to Bible College and in every course you learn something about Bible interpretation. In soteriology, in hermeneutics, and homiletics, in pneumatology, in eschatology, in ecclesiology, in the life of Christ, in the life of Paul, and so on, you gain valuable insight of how to interpret scriptures.

Attending Bible college also tests your resolve. Every freshman class is told to look to the guy on your right and the guy on your left because one or both won't be there at the end of the year or at the end of four years. They were right in most cases.

Pastor's Theology teaches you to think like a pastor. There is a huge difference in being a good preacher and in being a good pastor. I would take the latter everytime. Preachers are a dime a dozen but a good pastor is special.

What prompted this article? Being on Tik Tok, Facebook, Twitter, watching TV preachers, talking to people, t-shirts with scriptures taken out of context and other things.

Also, a friend of mine called the other day and asked me what a pulpit committee should look for in a pastor. He was nominated to the committee

and said he didn't have a clue what to do. I told him to do a background check and that preaching from the pulpit was the last thing I would look for in a pastor.

Spurgeon tells the story of a young missionary candidate coming to see the head of the missionary board. He tells the young man to meet him at the church at 4:00 AM. The pastor arrives at 8:00 AM. He asks the young man what is 2+2 and if he can spell "dog" and "cat". Then the preacher sends the young man on his way.

At the hearing, the preacher shows up and heartily recommends the young man to be a missionary. He said he had patience, respect and humility. Also, he added that he could spell dog and cat and he knew what 2+2 was.

Sounds cruel? Maybe, but pretty much tells the story.

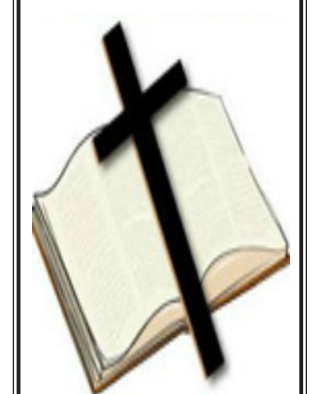

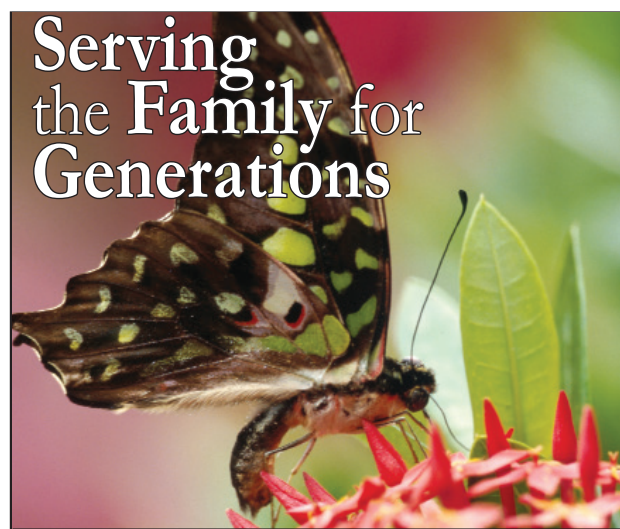

The next step involved contacting Amazon to have her book "My Forever Homestead Home A Rescue Dog's Story" published.

In the forward of her book, Halsey (who refers to herself as "Nana") writes, "In light of social media becoming increasingly negative in our culture, the positive Facebook posts of the adventures of Otis resulted in the creation of this book. What began as something to make people smile and laugh came to life in this story of a rescue dog named Otis. This book is sure to resonate in the hearts of readers, young and old alike," Otis and Nana (Beth Halsey).

Halsey said that she was scrolling through Facebook and saw a post that an elderly gentleman with cancer was looking for a forever home for his beagle. He wanted to pick out the people that would give her a new home. Halsey contacted the man but he had already found a home for his dog. However, a woman saw the post and contacted Halsey that she and her husband had recently found a beagle and were searching for someone to take him.

As soon as the Halsey's saw Otis, they knew he was their forever dog. They agreed on the name of Otis because they thought he looked a lot like the Otis character on "The Andy Griffith" television show.

Even though having an "indoor" dog was not part of Larry's plan for retirement, he became a companion for Larry as well as Beth.

"First thing Papa (Larry Halsey) and I do every morning is patrol the homestead to see what critters have been out and about overnight. We have deer, turkey, raccoons, bobcats, opossum, skunks, armadillos, squirrels and rabbits that live in our woods. Some mornings the smells are strong and plenty, other mornings not so much but I always check. If I find something I really like I bark and then follow the trail. If I lose the scent trail, I go back to where I first found it and start again. I can entertain myself for hours doing that," (Halsey wrote).

Halsey will be at Harbor Village on January 26 from 4 to 7 for a book signing. The book sells for \$7.99

and can be purchased on Amazon or from Beth Halsey halseyb72@gmail.com. A portion of the proceeds will be donated to the Warsaw Senior Center. Since Otis is an older guy, he will not be at the signing.

It is Halsey's hope that the book will encourage other retirees to try something new. In addition to rescuing Otis, Halsey has started beekeeping and selling honey. Her husband enjoys fishing and home brewing.

Halsey has evolved from being a stay-at-home mother to her two boys Will who is 47 and lives in Seattle, Washington, and Craig who is 46 and lives in Miami, Florida. After her boys went to school, she went to work for the University of Central Missouri as the assistant director of facilities. She is also a grandmother to two teenagers, Campbell, 17, and Creighton, 15, who live in Miami, Florida. Now, she can add published author to that list. Her first book is listed 173 on the Best Seller's List and she is working on her second book about Smokey, a barn cat.

Those Who Get MDC Landowner Deer And Turkey Permits May Need To Reaffirm Or Update Their Property Info

Landowners who applied using the MDC Landowner Permit Application in 2020 will need to reaffirm or update their property information in 2023.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds Missouri landowners who get no-cost or reduced-cost deer and turkey landowner hunting permits through its Landowner Permit Application process that it may be time to reaffirm or update the property information they submitted to MDC.

Under the MDC Landowner Permit Application process, Missouri landowners with at least 20 acres who want to receive free or reduced-cost landowner deer and turkey permits for their qualifying properties must submit information to MDC for those properties. Landowners must also reaffirm or update their property information every three years to continue to receive the free permits.

Landowners who applied in 2020 will need to reaffirm or update their property information before receiving permits for 2023.

MDC will be emailing landowners who enrolled in 2020 with information and instructions on reaffirming or updating their property information. Landowners without email will receive a letter from MDC with information and instructions on reaffirming or updating their property information.

Landowners can complete the simple reaffirmation process online at mdc.mo.gov/buypermits. Once logged in to Manage Your Account, click Manage My Landowner Permit Application and select the Reaffirm or Remove button for each property listed. Landowners can also add newly acquired or other qualifying property not previously included.

Once all property has been reviewed and saved, landowners will be able to request their landowner permits as soon as they become available for the season.

According to MDC, more than 90 percent of land in Missouri is privately owned and many landowners play a key role in maintaining healthy deer and turkey numbers by providing

essential habitat. In appreciation, MDC offers resident landowners with 20 or more contiguous acres and nonresident landowners with 75 or more contiguous acres no-cost or reduced-cost deer and turkey permits for hunting on their property. Landowners must submit their property information using the MDC Landowner Permit Application to receive the permits.

The Landowner Permit Application provides MDC and permit vendors with secure records of landowners and members of their households who qualify for the free and discounted permits, along with proof of land ownership and boundaries of the properties for which the free and discounted permits apply.

Native Americans and pioneers utilized deer tallow for home comforts, and modern hunters can, too. The Missouri Department of Conservation will offer free classes in Clinton and Warsaw on how to use tallow from harvested deer to make candles and heel balm.

Classes will be offered from 2 to 3:30 p.m. and from 5:30 to 7 p.m. on Monday, Feb. 6, at MDC's Clinton Office. To register for the 2 p.m. session, visit https://short.mdc.mo.gov/4Gr. To register for the 5:30 p.m. session, visit https://short.mdc.mo.gov/4GH.

At Warsaw, classes will be offered from 10:30 a.m. to noon and 1 to 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 7, at MDC's Lost Valley Fish Hatchery. To register for the 10:30 a.m. session, visit https://short.mdc.mo.gov/4GV. To register for the 1 p.m. session, visit https://short.mdc.mo.gov/4Gj.

The tallow used for candles and balm comes from the hard, waxy fat found from around the back and the kidneys, said Ginger Miller, MDC conservation educator. Participants can bring tallow they saved from deer they harvested. MDC will also provide tallow to demonstrate techniques. Wearing old clothes, rubber gloves, and a washable apron are advised. Participants will take home finished samples of heel balm, a candle, and a fire starter.

MDC Offers Free Virtual Class About Native Plants For Winter Beauty

Natives can also provide winter food and shelter for wildlife

Native wildflowers and grasses can add beauty to winter gardens and benefit wildlife such as songbirds. The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC)

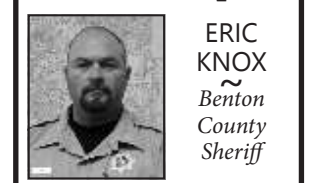
