## 2022 Enterprise Person Of The Year: Allcorn Is A Dedicated, 'On The Scene' Community Volunteer

Benton County's Person of the Year for 2022 selected by the Benton County Enterprise is Charles E. "Chuck" Allcorn, market president for Hawthorn Bank in Warsaw.

Allcorn moved to Warsaw 11 years ago when he went to work for Hawthorn Bank as a vice president loan officer. He quickly immersed himself in the community by starting off as the Jubilee Days carnival chairman.

"I came to Jubilee Days with the Ararat Shriners Club and rode my motorcycle in the parade," said Allcorn. "I was so impressed with the enthusiasm of the crowd at Jubilee Days that I thought if I ever get the chance I am going to move here and get involved with this celebration."

His first year in Warsaw he saw a notice about a Jubilee Days committee meeting and he attended.

"When I walked in, someone asked why I was

## Warsaw Will Hear Public Comments On Fluoridation Of It's Water System



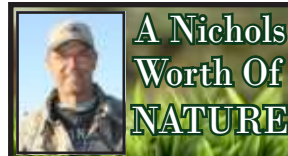

Jessica Burdick and Gwen Sullentrup and two other persons, visitors to the city's January 3 meeting, suggested that the city determine public support for fluoridation of city water, through a 90 day comment period. Aldermen, who had recently declined to move forward with a previous suggestion for fluoridation, agreed to ask for a 90 day public meeting on the subject. There were a few negative remarks about fluoride in city water, suggesting that some sources of information might not be reliable.

The meeting opened at 6:10 PM, with Aldermen Rob Coskey, Lou Breshears, Reba Slavens, Eric Flores present. Aldermen Doug Hedrick and Adam Howe were absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided; City Clerk Jessica Kendall recorded. First actions by the group were to approve the evening's agenda and minutes of its November 28 meeting, then agree to pay bills presented.

Visitor Tracey Spry then spoke of her wish to conduct a February 2 Project Graduation fundraiser using the Community Building's Harbor Room, at which wine would be served. The group approved her request, with advice that she obtain

## Talented Graffiti Artist Introduces Urban Art In Country Setting

Graffiti is considered a "street" art, or according to Britannica, "a form of visual communication, usually illegal, involving the unauthorized marking of public space by an individual or group." Often larger than life, incredibly detailed and 3D, it is still marking or painting on property without permission

and is considered by property owners and civic authorities as defacement and vandalism. Graffiti is a controversial art and millions is spent to clean it up.

However, graffiti is not always an anti-social, political statement or gang related: Paul Woronecki is HAVRE, a graffiti artist in Benton County, and he has developed his style of graffiti into an expressive form of art.

Paul and his wife Raquel pursued their dream of a

quiet life in the country in March of 2021, moving to Benton County from Columbus, Ohio. They are the owners of Havre Graffiti and the art focuses on portraying realism with graffiti. Havre Graffiti specializes in creating custom murals for homes, businesses, schools and barns, providing a wide variety of artistic styles and subjects.

Havre was lately commissioned to do an advertisement piece with his

## From Dream To Reality: Jelifish Lure Company Honors It's Founder

When the fishing in an area is good, really good, the creative get inventing. The excellent crappie fishing in the region with its star performer, Truman Lake, inspired fisherman Bailey Jelinek to create a "better way" to catch his favorite fish.

Creativity led him to develop the Crappie Bomb, an innovative lure that does

a better job of catching crappie. While anything from a minnow on a hook to a plain leadhead jig will catch crappies, the Crappie Bomb does it a little better, and if sales are any indication, it's a favorite with local fishermen.

The Crappie Bomb is a jigging spoon, but unlike the usual run of such lures, it has a high-quality reflective finish—12 of them at present count. It is made only in quarter-ounce sizes. What is different from most jigging spoons is that it is rigged with a single,

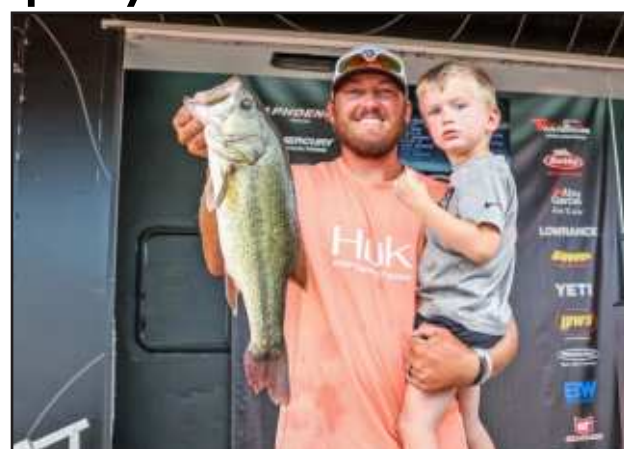
long-shank Aberdeen-style hook. And it's the hook that gives the lure its biggest advantage.

As a rule, jigging spoons are rigged with a treble hook. However, when fished around brush, trees or downed wood, a three-pronged hook will end up

Warsaw Senior Housing, president of the Warsaw Lion's Club, secretary of the American Legion, a member of the Elks Club, the Masonic Lodge, a member of the Warsaw Shrine Club, an ambassador of the Aviatr Shriners in Kansas City, a Board member of the Warsaw Area Chamber of Commerce, and a member of the Marine Corp League. "This week, I have a meeting every evening," said Allcorn.

Allcorn looks at his volunteer jobs as a way to give back to the community. "If it weren't for this community, I wouldn't have a job because we wouldn't have a bank here," said Allcorn. "Plus, I believe if everyone would give back to the community, we will have a better community."

Allcorn came from a large family which gave a great deal to the communities they lived in. Allcorn was the fifth child of Dr. Donald and Joyce Allcorn of Sedalia. He graduated from Smith Cotton High School in 1979, however, much of his early life revolved around his father's practice and moving from place to place.

Allcorn was born in Columbia, MO. The family moved to Flint, Michigan where his father served his medical residency. Later the family moved to Crown Point, New Mexico, where his father gave medical care to the Navajo tribe living on the reservation. It was there that the Allcorn family adopted a boy who had been abandoned.

"My youngest brother had Down's syndrome, but with my mother's care he learned to walk and talk," said Allcorn. "He was my best buddy."

While in New Mexico, the Allcorn family took in two other children who needed a place to stay, so for several years they were a family of eight children.

The family went back to Flint, Michigan, and then eventually back to Columbia and the University of Missouri Medical system.

Finally, the family settled back in Sedalia near Allcorn's grandparents who lived in Sedalia and Smithton. Dr. Allcorn started his own practice in Sedalia and worked there until his death.

Allcorn has held many jobs in his lifetime. After graduating from high school, he entered the U.S. Army and served at Fort Dix in New Jersey, Fort Eustis in Virginia, Ft. Hood in Texas and then was stationed in Korea working on helicopters. After three years in the Army, he served for ten years in the National Guard and two years as a reserve.

After his service, he went home to Missouri and attended the University of Central in Missouri earning his bachelor's degree in accounting. At about the same time his mother decided to finish her degree in English, so he helped her with math and she helped him with English.

While finishing his degree, Allcorn flipped hamburgers at Hardees, worked at Cash Hardware and the Buena Vista Nursing Home where he cooked and did the laundry.

"I made a deal with the nurses that I would kill the snakes in the basement if I didn't have to handle poopy diapers," said Allcorn.

After college, Allcorn went to work at Union Savings Bank then later worked for the government before returning to Union Savings. He came to Warsaw October in 2011 and succeeded Betty Beach upon her retirement.

Hawthorn employee Kathy Arnett was not surprised that Allcorn was selected as the Person of the Year.

"I've worked with Chuck for eleven years and his commitment and dedication

to the community is unbelievable. He's always willing to lend a helping hand to any organization," said Arnett.

Hawthorn Residential Lender Corbin Cain agreed with Arnett. "Chuck has been a staple in our community events for over ten years now and we appreciate all he does," said Cain.

Hawthorn Assistant Vice President Jennifer Honea said Allcorn was very deserving of the award. "Chuck is so outgoing, personable and knows no stranger," said Honea. "If he is not at the bank, he is out in the community volunteering. Chuck has been such a great supporter for so many groups and organizations around Warsaw. He has always been so good about making sure everyone knows about the next activity coming up in town and how to support it. No matter the event you mostly likely will see Chuck there either driving a golf cart, announcing or serving somehow. Chuck has been a great asset to our community as I am sure he will continue to do so."

In addition to his work in the banking industry, Allcorn is also a very proud father and grandfather. His daughter, Kristen, 32, is a family practice doctor in Ozark and his son Zachary, 31, owns his own welding business in Lincoln.

Allcorn also has three grandchildren Colt, 5, Nickolas, 4, and Rebecca, 2. "I love the people in Warsaw," said Allcorn. "The people here are hard-working, dedicated people. I was shocked at receiving this award because there are many volunteers who are very worthy. Warsaw is home to me."

(Continued from Page 1) art, and you can see it from highway 65 in the valley as you head north.

"I have always loved art, always been into it," said Havre. "There was a train yard next to my house in Ohio, and that's how I got started with graffiti. Now I have a 27-foot wall at my home on W highway outside of Lincoln, and I change it every month."

The word graffiti is derived from the Italian word Graffio, meaning "scratch". Graffiti has a colorful history. It has been found in ancient ruins on different continents, including Rome and the remains of the Mayan city Tikal in Central America. Through the centuries, graffiti was etched and written on rocks, buildings and public places where it would be seen by the masses. The invention of spray paint in 1949 gave color and depth to graffiti. Though seen by many as a nuisance to be cleaned up, the vibrance and impact of graffiti has stood the test of time.

As a graffiti artist, Havre dedicates hours to each project.

"The prep work takes the longest," he said. "Preparing the surface, sketching the design and then adding all the layers. White is the only color I don't really like. I go through shelves and shelves of paint."

Paul Woronecki chose "Havre" as the name of his business because it means "safe haven" in Norse. His dream is to provide just that to aspiring graffiti artists, giving them legal space to develop their art.

(Continued from Page 1) snagged in wood frequently. And too often that leads to breaking off the jiggling spoon.

The single-hook Crappie Bomb obviously has two fewer points the snag. But the design of the spoon, its weight and the gape of the hook make it possible to shake the lure free.

There is a short video on the Jelifish website (www.jelifishusa.com) that demonstrates the shaking technique. "The key thing is to get right over the snagged lure," said Brad Jelinek, Bailey's brother, "and then give it some slack and shake it."

And if that doesn't work, a direct pull can straighten the hook, which can be re-shaped with a pair of needle-nose pliers.

For fishermen, the quality of the lure and the way it fishes is enough, but the Jelifish story is much more than a better angling mousetrap.

Bailey Jelinek is the inventor and founder of the company, but it's his brother, Brad, and his mother, Jennifer Snyder, who are running the company now.

Bailey was killed in a crash caused by a driver in the wrong lane on March 14, 2021.

After the accident, the two decided to continue the company in Bailey's memory but also because the products were selling well. "We even had an order for 40,000 Crappie Bombs just before the accident," Jennifer said.

"We are getting orders and signing up new stores. In fact, we recently added a store in McCordsville, Indiana, the first in that state. We have 20 stores in Missouri and some in Illinois, Texas and Arkansas."

She also added that they are getting orders from their website from New York and California.

Clinton's Everharts Outdoor Store and Warsaw's Cody's Bait and Tackle both stock the Jelifish products. "We sell a lot of the Crappie Bombs," said Cody Vanattan. "They are really popular."

Currently, two finishes are out of stock on the Jelifish website, due to shipping delays and other Covid-related situations. The company imports the packaged Crappie Bombs, and normally the time from order placement to receiving the products is four-to-six weeks.

However, the clothing and hat line are locally produced, so shipping isn't an issue. The Minnow Man bait bucket and holder also are available on the website.

As for the company name, "It started when the kids were little," Jennifer Snyder said. "They would go visit their dad, and it helped me get through the day thinking of them, and I just started calling them 'my Jelifish'. It seemed natural that Bailey would name the company that."

Both Brad Jelinek and Jennifer Snyder are the only employees, blending their other jobs with company responsibilities. Snyder is a real estate agent based in Lee's Summit, and Jelinek is a fishing guide and professional bass fisherman based in Warsaw. "Brad is going to run the company,"

his mother said, "and I'll handle the marketing and social media side of things."

The result is that the company has office addresses in both Lee's Summit and Warsaw.

As for the future of the company, the plans are to add more finishes of the Crappie Bomb in the near term and look at the future product offerings that Bailey had considered.

Under new business, Aldermen approved three ordinances: (1) Updating the city's personnel manual, bring it "up to standard," nothing major; (2) Amending the 2022 estimated operating budget to actual adjusted ending balance for all funds within the city, said to be an auditor requirement; (3) authorizing the city to execute a contract between the city and Tectroniq, LLC for operation and maintenance of city computers, IT service and support per agreement. This was said to be a budgeted item.

Also on the agenda were a proposed Municipal Airport capital improvement plan and a Southwest District prioritization plan. But City Administrator Randy Pogue suggested the matters be postponed to next meeting, in the absence of a full Board of Aldermen at this meeting. There was no closed executive session, and the meeting closed about 6:50 PM.

These sessions are usually scheduled on 1st and 3rd Monday eves. Visitors are welcome at open sessions.

(Continued from Page 1) society, proposed that they go afield and count birds rather than kill them. He and twenty-nine other birders conducted twenty-five bird counts across the United States. Every year since, between December 15 - January 5, in what has grown to thousands of sites in which tens of thousands of people participate, is now known as the Audubon Society Christmas Bird Count (CBC). This year, 2022-2023, is the 123rd year and is the oldest running citizen science project in North America.

The Cole Camp area, because of its diverse habitats of prairies, lakes, woodlands/forests, pastures and crop fields, is considered an Audubon IBA (important bird area). On December 28, 2022, we conducted our 14th annual CBC. Each site across the United States is a circle with a 15 mile diameter. The center of our area is located on Drover's Prairie, just west of the intersection of highways 65 and 52 forming a circle with a radius of 7.5 miles.

This is the sixth year Ryan Steffens, a Missouri Master Naturalist and Missouri

Department of Conservation employee from Cole Camp, has coordinated the logistics for our count. We survey the same area each year which is divided into eight sections. Ryan assigns personnel to each section providing them with maps and data sheets. Each group has at least one experienced birder. With the help of binoculars and spotting scopes, the goal is to count every bird and to identify each species seen in all sections from dawn to dusk.

My wife, Kim, and I are assigned each year to section 1A which is north of Highway 52 and west of Highway E. By dusk, we had been out 9.25 hours, traveled 61 miles, counted 3,232 individual birds, and identified 47 different species in our section.

This year there were 24 participants from across the state. Each group's recorded data from their section was turned into Ryan, who compiled information submitting it to the Audubon Society.

The total number of birds for this year's count was 14,237 with a total of 63 different species. Bird numbers were down by 2,819 and species were down twelve from last year's survey. Strong winds and high gusts kept sparrows and other species somewhat hunkered down. The effects of the Arctic blast prior to this year's count froze water on ponds and small lakes resulting in eliminating any duck species we normally encounter.

The most noticeable absence of individuals this year was the lack of American robins. Another sad count was Eastern bluebirds with only four sections reporting a combined total of 24 bluebirds. On a high note, at least 30 trumpeter swans were reported.

Our data, along with data from other counts across the state and nation, will be compiled and compared to past surveys to obtain a long term view of the health and status of bird populations in North America and provide a picture of how the

continent's bird populations have changed in time and space. The long term perspective is vital for conservationists to protect birds and their habitats and help identify environmental issues.

Almost all our native bird species are in decline, some perilously so, especially grassland species. The biggest contributing factors are fragmentation and loss of habitat, followed by chemical use that directly affects birds or moves up the food chain also affecting bird populations.

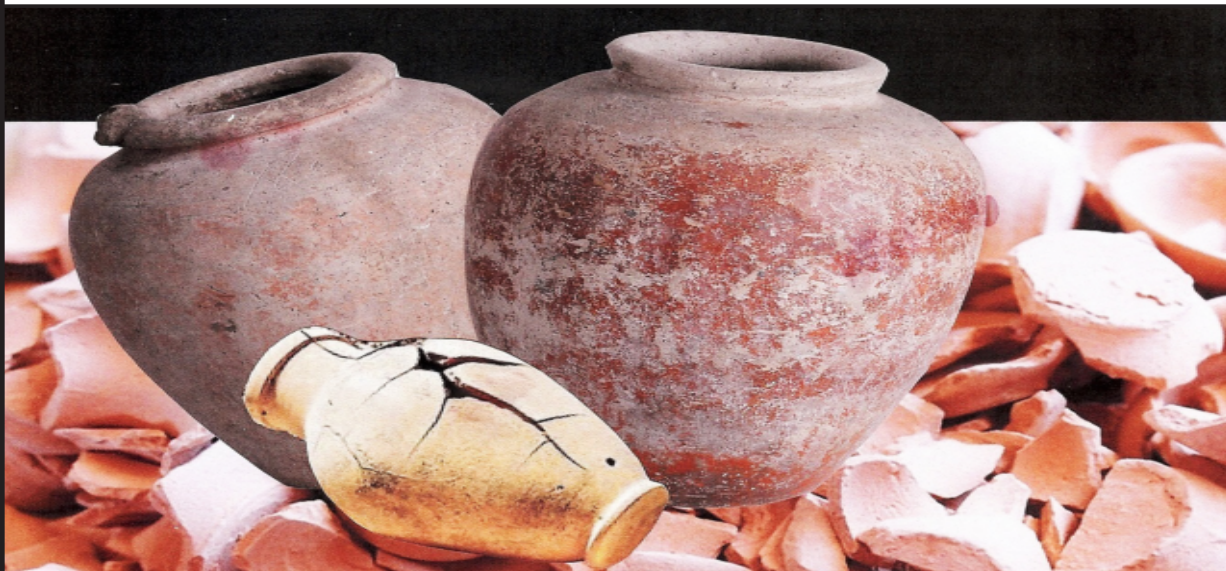

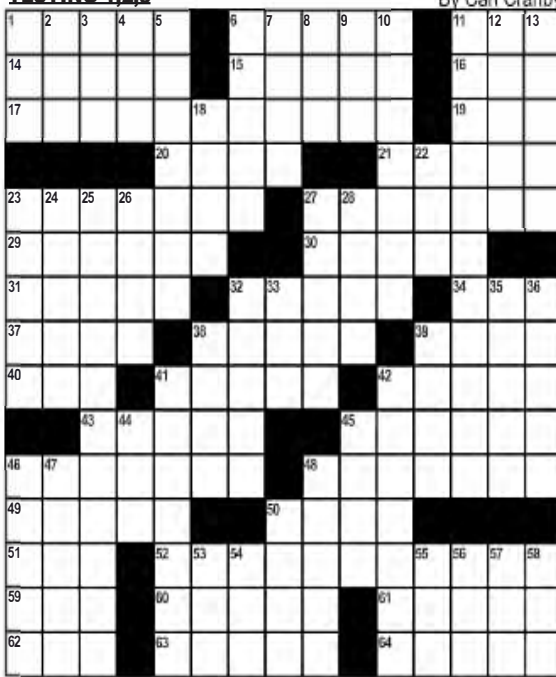

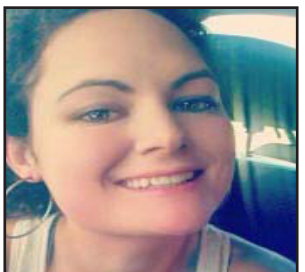

Are you ready to 'unretire'?

Have you recently retired but are now thinking of going back to work? If so, you aren't alone, as many people are choosing to "unretire." But if you do reenter the workforce in some capacity, what opportunities might be available to you? And how will your renewed employment affect your financial outlook?

For starters, though, what reasons might motivate you to go back to work? For many people, the primary cause has been inflation, which has presented a huge challenge to retirees living on a fixed income. In addition, the volatile financial market of 2022 caused many people's investment portfolios to decline in value — a real problem for retirees who needed to start selling investments to supplement their income.

But non-financial factors could also be driving you to unretire. Like other retirees, you may miss the chance to use your work experience to engage with the world, and you may miss the social interactions as well.

In any case, if you do decide to rejoin the working world in some fashion, you may have several options. For example, if you enjoyed the work you did for your



former employer, you might want to see if you could go back on a part-time basis. Or you could use your skills to join the "gig" economy by doing some consulting or freelance work in your former industry. You might also consider going to work for a nonprofit organization, as many of these groups lost employees during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic and are now facing labor shortages.

Going back to work, even part time, can improve your cash flow, which helps cover the cost of regular expenses. Furthermore, the added income can possibly help you delay or reduce withdrawals from your investment accounts. And it's important to increase the longevity of these accounts considering you may spend two, or even three, decades in retirement. (Once you turn 72, however, you will have to start withdrawing certain amounts from your 401(k) and traditional IRA.) But your earnings can affect another source of your retirement income — your Social Security benefits.

If you return to work before your "full" retirement age, which is likely between 66 and 67, the Social Security earnings limit in 2023 is \$21,240. For each \$2 earned over that amount, Social Security will deduct \$1 from benefits. If you reach your full retirement age in 2023, the earnings limit is \$56,520; Social Security will deduct \$1 from your benefits for each \$3 earned over this amount until the month you turn your full retirement age. But in all future years after you've reached your full retirement age, you can earn as much as you want without losing any benefits. Social Security will then recalculate your payments to give you credit for the months your benefits were reduced or withheld due to your excess earnings. Be aware, though, that your earned income can potentially result in higher taxes on your Social

Security benefits at any age. Returning to work can be rewarding, both financially and emotionally. And you may get more out of the experience when you're aware of the issues involved.

8. Most of all, I believe the Lord Jesus Christ died on the cross for the sin of the world and that heaven awaits the believer.

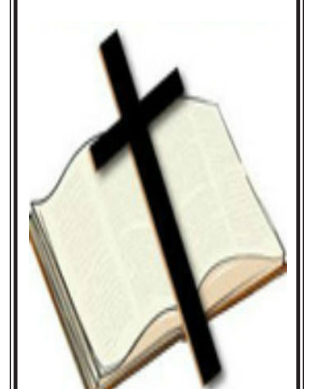

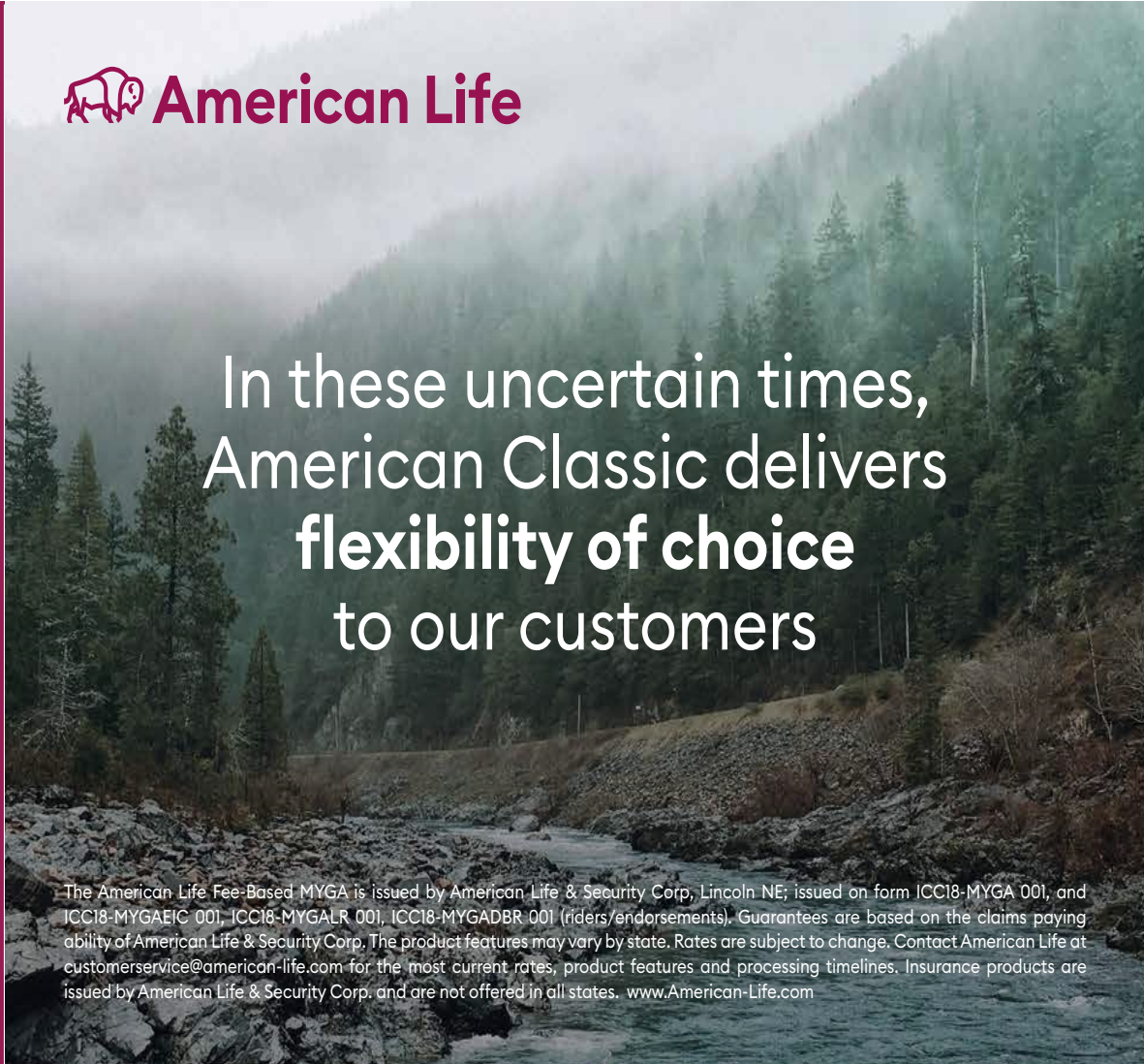

## Lincoln Agrees To Allow 15 Mile Living Radius For Police Officers

In new business Monday eve, Lincoln Aldermen passed an ordinance to allow its police officer employees to live as far as 15 miles from the city, replacing its present radius of 10 miles. The change would allow an officer living in some areas of Warsaw and other areas out of Lincoln to gain employment by this city, and is part of an ongoing effort to aid the city's efforts to employ police officers.

The meeting opened at 6:00 PM January 9, with Aldermen Jack Lietzke, Janice Sweargin, Phil Fisher, Barbara Hammond present. Mayor Glen Nelson presided; Deputy City Clerk Kerrie Casey recorded. First actions by the group were to approve the eve's agenda and minutes of its December 12 meeting, then agree to pay bills presented.

Benton County Economic Development Director Jo Ann Lane reported that the We The People company has opened its doors and will hold a ribbon cutting at noon January 20. She added that Premier Auto will open its doors in January, but has set no date for a ribbon cutting. She concluded there will be an Economic Development forum in the city on January 18, for all in the county who wish to attend.

Under old business, the group reaffirmed a previous decision, which was also approved by Cydney Mayfield, to provide a relocation incentive in hiring new police officers.

Police Chief Jason Wenberg reported he has one, possibly two persons interested in being hired. Mayor Nelson discussed a possible marijuana sales tax, saying that "It's a complicated issue," requiring some study by the group, but added that he believed present restrictions in sales locations allowed by the state may eventually be loosened. Alderman Lietzke expressed a belief that restrictions will likely be loosened sooner, rather than later. Mayor Nelson concluded his remarks about old business with the thought that a proposal to provide rear driveway access to the city's DG Market could be quite expensive, if that access allowed use by heavy trucks which unload there. He suggested that the city presently provide rear driveway access to only the store's customers, for their personal use. That suggestion will be studied.

Under reports, Police Chief Wenberg reported that his Department's "Christmas With Kids" project went well, benefitting 12 children, and \$150 was spent on each child. Public Works Director Josh Cole said his Department is still working with Evergy Electric Co. on a project, that they repaired several water lines during recent cold weather, and they continue to repair street potholes. He concluded his Department still needs to fix a Municipal Airport runway culvert.

In last action under new business, the group approved "An ordinance establishing salaries and the payment thereof for city employees." The meeting closed about 6:40 PM. Open meetings are usually held on 2nd Monday eves; visitors are welcome to open meetings.
