Weather Bomb, "Once In A Generation" Experience

On December 22, www.cnn.com reported that more than 100 million people across the U.S. were under winter weather wind chill alerts as a major winter storm was expected to bring what the National Weather Service called a "once in a generation type event." The Missouri Department of Public Safety State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) also reported temperatures that had dipped to below zero F. and predicted snowy days ahead.

"I believe that this weather system is just the first of a long winter," said Warsaw Police Chief Sean McCannon. "My advice is to stay at home, get some chili, cornbread or soup and hot coffee during this cold weather. If you do have to go out, be prepared with warm blankets, water and a charged cell phone. If you

get stranded, stay in your vehicle and put on your flashers. A good idea from Facebook is that if you get stranded in your car, and

your cell phone is almost out of charged battery time, go to settings and change your greeting to say that your battery can't be

charged, it is almost dead. Then, give your location and time of the message. That way if someone tries to contact you, they will have

that information. Of course, if your phone is charged but you are in an 'out of service' area, you can still dial 911. **COLD Page 3**

Golden Valley Memorial Healthcare (GVMH) held a groundbreaking ceremony for its new radiation oncology facility on December 21, 2022.

The state-of-the-art radiation oncology facility will have the most up-to-date radiation technology in Missouri and will be located near the Golden Valley Memorial Healthcare main campus in Clinton. It will allow patients to get expert cancer care, see familiar specialists and staff and help relieve the burden of traveling far from home to receive treatment. The center will be complete in approximately one year.

Arriving Soon! Personal Property Lists For 2023

Jim Hansen, Benton County Assessor, will mail approximately 12,000 personal property lists to Benton County residents shortly after the first of January 2023. All Benton County residents who own taxable personal property, as of January 1, 2023 must furnish the assessor a list by March 1, 2023, to avoid late penalties. Taxable personal property includes vehicles, boats, boat motors, airplanes, travel trailers, mobile homes, livestock, farm machinery, and all licensed trailers. If you have lifetime plates on your vehicle or trailer, you still need to list this.

If you do not receive a list in the mail by January 20, 2023, please call the assessor's office at (660) 438-5473 so that one will be sent to you. Office hours are 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM to 4:30 PM, Monday thru Friday.

Rural Broadband Expansion Efforts Continue In Benton County

If your electricity is provided by one of the five (5) Rural Electric Cooperatives serving Benton County you might have seen some activity recently with pole replacement or new fiber lines. They are working to bring high speed fiber to you. If you are interested in finding out more, keep reading.

In building out a fiber network there are multiple phases in the process. Engineering and design of each substation will take place followed by

contractors that will change out poles or make upgrades that are needed to accommodate the addition of a fiber attachment. After these steps have been completed, contractors will begin to hang the fiber on the poles and extend the backbone of the network throughout the system. Last, contractors will extend drops to the homes that have subscribed and install any necessary equipment.

Here's a look at what is happening in Benton County.

In a large part of the

Central Missouri Electric Cooperative service area-Charter-Spectrum will be building out to approximately 2,270 homes/businesses in Benton County. This will be a fiber to the home project. This area will get access to Gigabit high-speed internet as well as our television, telephone, and mobile services. Chief McCannon said this is his 28th year in law enforcement and he has worked in every kind of weather imaginable. He said protection from the cold for officers is provided by dressing in layers including thermal underwear, thick socks, a heavy coat, stocking caps and a chap stick to protect skin.

"We dress to be outdoors and can tolerate the cold a little longer than the average person," said Chief McCannon. "We get back to the car when needed and hot coffee is available at Dispatch and the Police Station. Of course, once we are dressed in layers and are driving in a patrol car, we turn the heater down and roll the windows down a little bit to keep us from sweating in the car. Sweating can make things worse for us once we get outside and hypothermia can set in."

Chief McCannon said that all patrol cars are in good maintenance, are working and are all-wheel drives. If needed, trucks from the Sheriff's Office are four-wheel drives. He said that he and his officers prepare ahead of time and make sure all are in working order. They clean out the light bar of snow so people can see them. There is no back-up generator at the Community Center where the Police offices are located, but Dispatch has generator back-up so that all vital functions can continue to be carried in case of an electricity blackout.

"We do most of our patrols at night when there is not as much traffic," said Chief McCannon. "But we still respond to calls during the daytime."

Keeping the streets of Warsaw maintained is not a job for the weak during the cold weather. Buster Young, City of Warsaw Street Forman, spent the end of last week keeping snow trucks pushing. He and his crew of seven work on streets as well as parks and recreational facilities. They also take care of Christmas lights, any street problems, debris, and trim the trees along roadsides. During the severe cold they try to do some indoor jobs.

"Our trucks are heated, and the city supplies us with safety clothes, including heavy coats, and plenty of water," said Young. We keep an eye on each other and if we see a need we get crew members inside a place of warmth. We try not to stay outside for long, don't overdo work or get sweaty. We are careful, but occasionally a truck might slip into the ditch. The winds, 30 to 40 mph over the weekend, are the worst working conditions."

Benton County resident, Shane Reimund, currently works for Union Pacific Railroad as a track laborer and travels a lot for his job. He is presently working in many areas of Missouri and Texas repairing rails with new ties. He said that machines do some of the work and employees do the groundwork. They protect themselves from cold weather with personal protective equipment including gloves, face masks, stocking masks and

cleats over snow boots.

"Everywhere I go at this time it is snowing, except parts of Texas," said Reimund. "We joke about the weather saying that it doesn't snow or rain between the rails. I keep everything I might need in my car. There are about 60 people in my working group, and we keep a watch out for each other. Every morning, it is routine to have a briefing telling us where the nearest hotel is and a game plan for whatever situation might come up. Our trains are running a lot of freight this time of the year - like crazy!"

Aaron Harms, does a lot of construction and maintenance on equipment for Every Electric. Since all substations he works on do not have buildings where a break can be taken to get warm, his company provides winter gloves and an allotment for clothes that he uses to layer up with long johns, overalls and stocking caps to wear under his helmet. During inclement conditions he said that he and other crew members try to do more inside work unless there is an emergency. He said that when your hands or toes get to a certain point, you get in the truck and someone else helps with the job.

"We have small crews of two to four people," said Harms. "Every truck has a first aid kit and AED. With days like today (December 22) we don't have a lot going on. We are on call 24/7."

How Should I Dress?

Wear layers of loose-fitting, lightweight, warm clothing, and a hat. Mittens, snug at the wrist, are better than gloves. Cover your mouth to protect your lungs from extreme cold. Try to stay dry and out of the wind.

MSHP Reports Three Traffic Fatalities Over Christmas Holiday Weekend; No Drownings Or Boating Fatalities



Colonel Eric T. Olson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, provides the following preliminary statistics related to the Christmas holiday weekend: Three people died in traffic crashes during the 78-hour counting period, which began at 6 p.m. Friday, December 23, 2022, and ended at 11:59 p.m. Monday, December 26, 2022.

2022 Christmas Holiday Traffic Statistics

Troopers investigated the following:
Traffic Crashes — 306
Traffic Crash Injuries — 84
Traffic Crash Fatalities — 3
DWI — 52

[Note: Last year during the 78-hour Christmas counting period, there were 881 traffic crashes statewide. In those crashes, eight people were killed and another 401 were injured. During the 2021 Christmas holiday, troopers investigated 227 traffic crashes which included four fatalities and 99 injuries. Troopers arrested 67 people for driving while impaired in 2021.]

There were no boating crashes or drownings over the 2022 Christmas holiday counting period.

Of the three fatality traffic crashes investigated by troopers, two occurred in the Troop F, Jefferson City, MO, area, and one occurred in the Troop D, Springfield, MO, area.

There were no traffic fatalities on Friday, December, December 23, 2022, during the holiday counting period.

There was one fatality on Saturday, December 24, 2022. Kristan R. Price, 26, of Florence, MO, died when the vehicle she was operating traveled into the westbound

lanes of U.S. Highway 50 and struck a vehicle before returning to the eastbound lanes, then skidding back into the westbound lanes, and striking another vehicle. Price's vehicle then overturned. It is unknown if Price was wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash. The first vehicle Price's vehicle struck skidded off the roadway; the driver was wearing a seat belt and was not injured. The driver of the second vehicle Price's vehicle struck was not wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash; he sustained minor injuries. The crash occurred in Morgan County on U.S. Highway 50 west of Lewis Drive. Dr. M.B. Jones pronounced Price dead at the scene. The Morgan County Sheriff's Department also responded to the scene.

One fatality occurred on December 25, 2022. Samuel M. Mitchell, 63, of Joplin, MO, died when the vehicle he was driving traveled off the right side of the road and struck the concrete cap of a vertical culvert. The crash occurred in Newton County on Apricot Road south of Joplin, MO. Three passengers in Mitchell's vehicle sustained serious injuries, one passenger sustained moderate injuries, and one passenger sustained minor injuries in the crash. No one in the vehicle was wearing a seat belt. Dr. Gross pronounced Mitchell dead at Mercy Hospital in Joplin, MO.

One fatality occurred on

Monday, December 26, 2022. Susan C. Graham, 73, of Arcola, MO, died when another vehicle crossed the center of the roadway in front of the vehicle in which she was a passenger. After striking the other vehicle, Graham's vehicle rotated and traveled off the right side of the roadway and came to rest. The crash occurred in Camden County on U.S. Highway 54 west of Tangle Drive. Dr. Cooper pronounced Graham dead at Lake Regional Hospital in Osage Beach, MO. Graham was wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash. The driver of the vehicle was wearing a seat belt; he sustained moderate injuries. The driver of the vehicle that crossed in front of Graham's vehicle was not wearing a seat belt and he sustained serious injuries in the crash.

NOTE: The fatality statistics in this news release could change if late deaths occur, if other departments report fatalities after this news release was sent out, or if a fatality is determined to be caused by a medical condition rather than a traffic/boating/drowning incident.

Too many people die in traffic crashes each year in Missouri. The choices you make when you're behind the wheel matter. Make good choices, so you'll never have to say, "If I could just go back."

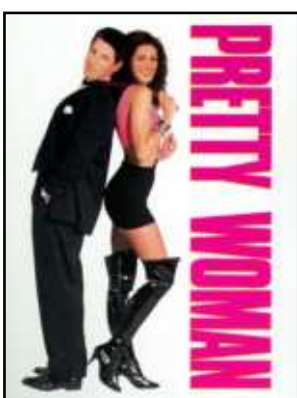

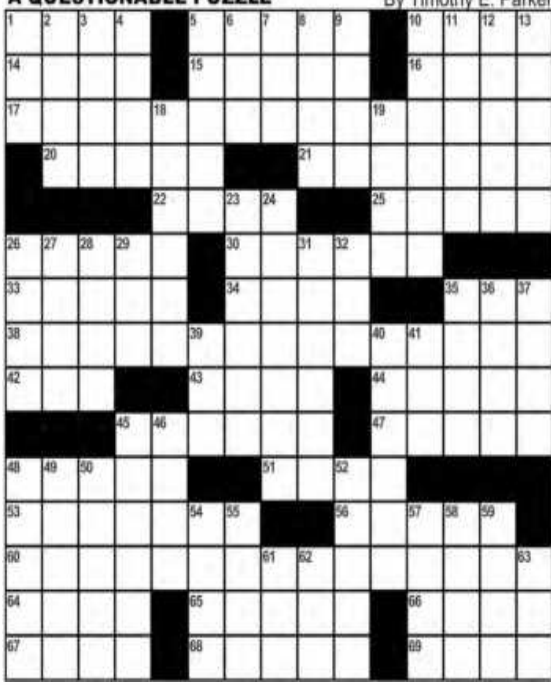

What To Do If You're Behind On Your Mortgage

-Research housing assistance programs. Nonprofits and government agencies at both national and local levels support individuals struggling with mortgage payments. Homeowners can check out the Fannie Mae website

to find information and possible resources for assistance.

-Consider a refinance. Exploring a refinance on your mortgage could potentially make your payment more affordable either through a lower interest rate or extending the timeline to pay off your balance.

-Seek legal help. Depending on the severity of your situation, you may want to find legal assistance to act on your behalf with your lender and negotiate any potential agreement to resolve the issue.

-Get it in writing. Document all your communication with your lenders, banks or servicers. You'll also want to request any agreements you come to with them in writing. Properly documenting everything will help you if a dispute arises.

-Seek nonprofit housing counseling. If your situation is overwhelming, nonprofit housing counseling agencies, like Take Charge America, can provide you with one-on-one guidance and tailored resources to help you determine the best path forward.



Passing assets through a trust: What to know

As the year winds down, your thoughts might drift to the future. And, as part of that future, you may be thinking of where your financial assets will end up. You've worked hard to accumulate them, and you'll certainly need some of them to support your retirement, but what about the rest? What's the best way to pass them on to your loved ones?

There's no single path for everyone to follow. But you might consider establishing a trust, which offers some key benefits. For example, your estate can avoid the time-consuming, and highly public, process of probate. Plus, you can be highly specific about how your assets will be distributed.

To establish a trust, you will need to work with a qualified estate-planning attorney. And while you'll discuss many issues, here are three key questions that will certainly need to be addressed:

Who will serve as trustee of the trust? As the grantor, or creator, of your trust, you will pick the trustee – the individual or corporate entity that will manage the trust's assets and carry out the purpose of the trust. You could choose a trusted loved one, but this individual might not have the knowledge or experience to manage the responsibilities of a trustee. As an alternative, you could choose a corporate fiduciary, such as a bank or trust company. These entities are typically regulated by outside agencies and provide significant public



matter expertise. Of course, they charge for their services and often have account minimums.

When are distributions made? As the grantor, you can choose when assets will be distributed to the beneficiaries you've named. You could decide to keep the assets in the trust until a beneficiary reaches the age of majority; note that the age of majority is not the same in all states. Or you could choose to "phase in" the distributions at particular ages – e.g., 30, 35, 40 – or after a certain number of years. You could even hold assets in the trust for the lifetimes of the beneficiaries. These types of choices will depend on several factors, such as your feelings for how responsible a beneficiary might be in managing money.

For what purposes can the trust assets be used? In addition to choosing when

your trust should make distributions, you can decide how these assets should be used. You could designate some broad categories, such as health, education, maintenance and support. A beneficiary's request for distributions in these areas is usually granted. But you could also structure the trust to provide mandatory income, perhaps once a year, or include a provision that provides incentives, such as distributing certain amounts of money once the beneficiary has achieved a milestone, such as finishing a degree or purchasing a first home.

One final note: Although you clearly have great control over what your trust can accomplish, its effectiveness will also depend, to a great extent, on its asset level. With this in mind, you'll want to pay close attention to your investment decisions

throughout your life and your withdrawal strategy during retirement. The better your choices in these areas, the more options you'll have with your trust – and the greater the potential benefits for your beneficiaries.



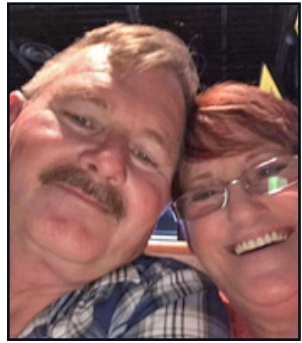

MDC Offers Free Native Winter Seed Sowing Class In Warsaw



Class at Lost Valley Fish Hatchery will teach winter native plant seedling growing methods

Start the new year knowing you'll have native plant seedlings to add to flower beds when spring arrives. The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) will offer a free Winter Seed Sowing class from 1-2 p.m. on Thursday, Dec. 29, at the Lost Valley Fish Hatchery in Warsaw.

Participants will learn how to use materials such as plastic milk jugs to make mini greenhouses to grow native wildflower and grass seedlings, and how to stratify seeds for spring planting. Wildflowers planted in containers can be transplanted into flower gardens in spring. Seeds work too, but some native plant species need winter cold to prepare them for spring germination.

Kara Entrop, MDC community education assistant, will teach Winter Seed Sowing methods and discuss the benefits that native wildflowers and grasses can provide in home gardens. Besides beauty, natives benefit wildlife such as songbirds or pollinators such as butterflies. MDC will provide all materials and seeds for wildflowers such as Missouri evening primrose, purple coneflower, and blue sage.

For stratifying seeds, participants will learn how to partially cut a container like a milk jug so soil and seeds can be added. Then the container is taped shut again. Gardeners can then set them outside till spring. The cold will help stratify the native seeds that need winter to prepare for germination. In spring, the containers can be opened and the seedlings transplanted.

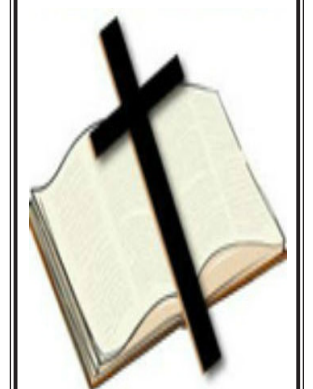

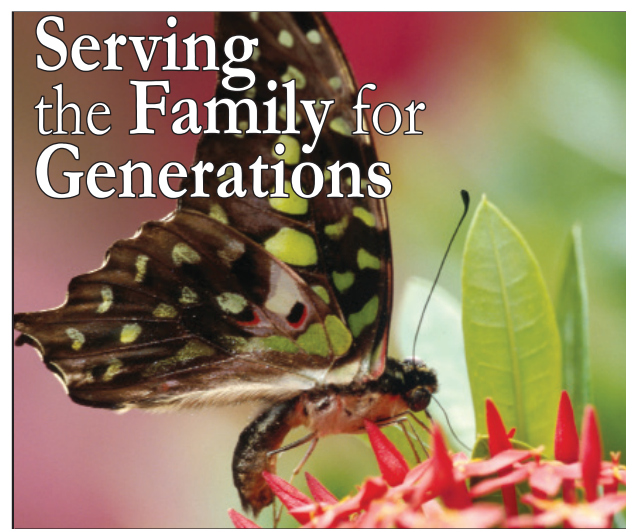

MSHP Talks Show-Me Zero Fatality Reduction Effort



The Missouri State Highway Patrol and the Missouri Department of Transportation are tag-teaming on a special education and enforcement campaign which is aimed at reducing fatalities on Missouri's highways. The Show-Me Zero Fatality Reduction Effort began in April and it focuses on drivers who are impaired, distracted, speeding, and not wearing seat belts.

The Show-Me Zero Fatalities campaign looks at major interstate corridors in St. Louis and Kansas City with the highest numbers of traffic violations and crashes. Those areas have been targeted since April

2022 in a focused effort on education and enforcement.

“So we identified those areas that have a lot of traffic violations, particularly egregious speeding violations where vehicles are traveling substantially over the speed limit,” according to Captain John Hotz with the Missouri State Highway Patrol. “We also looked at the areas where they were having fatal crashes as well as injury crashes. The overall effort is to, through enforcement and education, reduce the number of traffic violations. If we can do that, we know that we can eventually reduce the number of traffic crashes that take place in those locations.”

This joint effort between MoDOT and the Missouri State Highway Patrol, as well as local agencies, continues through Spring 2023. It will, then, be reevaluated to see if it needs revisions or moved to additional highway corridors across the state of Missouri.

“This is kind of just the last really big travel season weekend of the year and, unfortunately, we’ve also seen, for example, last

year, we had twelve people killed and 540 people injured on crashes just over the Thanksgiving holiday period,” according to Hotz. “We know there’s going to be a lot of traffic out there, but unfortunately there are a lot of traffic crashes. We are doing what we can to urge people to, number one, make sure the vehicle is in good condition, but also make sure they are in good condition. We just have to accept the fact there’s going to be additional traffic out there.”

While the campaign is aimed at specific corridors, drivers all across Missouri are reminded to drive sober, obey the speed limit, put the cell phone down while driving, buckle up, and obey the traffic laws.

Hotz adds, “The traffic patterns are going to be affected. It’s going to take us a little more time to get to where we are going, but if we can be courteous and we can allow ourselves a little bit of extra time; follow the simple rules we always talk about – obey the speed limit, drive sober, pay attention and then make sure everybody is properly restrained – we can actually see a reduction in those number of crashes out there on the roads.”

The Missouri State Highway Patrol and MoDOT are developing a dashboard report to help provide real-time information on speeds in segments of major highway corridors to help make sure the enforcement efforts are focused on the most needed areas of Missouri. Additionally, the Show-Me Zero Fatalities campaign is available in presentation form for schools, businesses, and civic groups.

MSHP: Bring In The New Year Safely



Colonel Eric T. Olson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, encourages everyone to make good decisions regarding their New Year's celebration. No one wants to start 2023 with a traffic crash or DWI arrest. During the 2022 New Year's period, one person was killed and 331 injured in 1,045 traffic crashes in Missouri.

The 2023 New Year's holiday counting period begins at 6 p.m. Friday, December 30, 2022, and ends at 11:59 p.m. on Monday, January 2, 2023.

If your plans to welcome the new year include alcohol, please designate a sober driver or utilize a ride share service or taxi to ensure you arrive home safely. The roadway is no place for a driver under the influence of drugs or alcohol. If you kill or injure someone, you'll pay the price for the rest of your life.

If you plan to drive this New Year's, remember to buckle up and make sure all your passengers do the same. Pay attention, obey all traffic laws, and when in doubt, yield the right-of-way. Be sure to use your turn signal to communicate your intentions. Remember: The posted speed limit reflects the roadway's classification and is not a suggestion! Download the MoDOT Traveler Information app to your smart phone, and check road conditions before you travel. Allow extra time during inclement weather or consider staying home. Missouri law states if you're using your windshield wipers, your headlights must be turned on.

The public is encouraged to call the Patrol's Emergency Assistance Number (800) 525-5555 or *55 on a cellular phone if they witness criminal activity or

experience an emergency. These emergency numbers are operational for both highway and water emergencies. We're here to help.

Too many people die in traffic crashes each year in Missouri. The choices you make when you're behind the wheel matter. Make good choices, so you'll never have to say, "If I could just go back..."
