New Hopes For Old Lumberyard As Property Readies For Sale

Another historic Warsaw building is being advertised to sell as the old Warsaw Lumber Company building goes on the block as 2022 draws to a close.

The present building on Seminary Street has been owned by the Bloess family since the 1920's. The Bloess family had lumberyards in Sedalia, Hughesville and Lincoln.

"At one time the land was used as a livery, but when my family bought it, then a lumberyard was built," said present property owner Randy Bloess.

The first Warsaw Lumber Company was built in 1926 and was leased by two brothers with the last name of Fristoe. Bloess's great grandfather Leo Bloess and K.N. Kiefer bought the business from the Fristoe brothers and operated it until the late '30's when Bloess bought Kiefer out. Well-known Warsawian

Gene Bibb was the manager for many years. Randy's grandfather Herman Bloess, Sr. was a part of the business during the 40's.

The next manager of Warsaw Lumber Company was Randy's uncle and aunt Issac "Mac" and Selma McDonald.

After Mac retired, Herman "Bud" Bloess, Jr. moved to Warsaw to run the lumberyard. Randy worked for his dad after graduating

from college in 1975. Randy started teaching art in Knob Noster '81 then moved back to Warsaw in LUMBERYARD Page 3

On the 231st anniversary of the United States Bill of Rights ratification, Cornerstone Academy of the Ozarks is proud to announce that brothers Ben and Seth Spencer are runners up in the Herzog Foundation's Bill of Rights Essay Contest in the middle school and high school categories respectively. Ben and Seth were among over 150 students who participated in the nationwide writing contest.

"Too many young people are losing sight of the civic values that characterize American democracy," said Herzog Foundation President Darrell Jones.

"Many families and schools even shy away from celebrating our country and founding documents. This is unacceptable. At the Herzog Foundation, we want to reward the students and schools that not only recognize our fundamental American beliefs, but celebrate them as well."

Bothwell Regional Health Center Receives Grant For Healing Arts Center

Bothwell Regional Health Center has received a nearly \$1.1 million grant from the federal Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Rural Residency Planning and Development Program. Funds will be used to create a single site for Bothwell's three Sedalia family medicine clinics, as well as for medical student and resident teaching, at Bothwell's Healing Arts Center.

Bothwell Family Medicine Associates, the health center's largest family medicine practice, will move

from its current location at 3401 W. 10th Street to the Healing Arts Center at 3700 W. 10th Street, and join Bothwell Family Health already located at the center. Bothwell Eldenburg Family Practice, currently at 700 S. Limit, will also move to the center. All three clinics will combine to become Bothwell Family Medicine.

Bothwell's Chief Medical Officer Dr. Phil Fracica said the grant application was made in coordination with the University of Missouri School of Medicine and BOTHWELL Page 3




'89 and started teaching art at Warsaw High School in 1990.

The big boom in the lumber business came during the development of the Lake of the Ozarks and all of the resort areas around the Ozarks. During that time, the Bloss family was sending truck loads of lumber and materials out every day all over this end of the Lake of the Ozarks.

"We were selling a great deal of lumber in the '50s and '60's as housing was booming," said Bloss.

Then big box stores started taking business from the smaller independent stores like Warsaw Lumber Company.

"Dad cut back on the lumber and he and I started adding rental spaces in the late '70s," said Bloss. "He still sold hardware and paint but he was adding rental spaces during that time."

Bloss and his dad used the storage space to make room for more rentals including the space under the old lumberyard. Later in the 90's, Bloss decided to close the lumber business and expand the rental business into little shops where lumber storage used to be.

Present residents in the old building include: The Sweet Tooth Fudge Factory, We'll Be Back Antique store, Sis and I Jewelry, Cat's Meow, and a tutoring service by Holly Helms.

The Warsaw Lumber Company also used to include what is now a cabinet shop.

"We used to employ a lot of teenagers to stack lumber and drive trucks," said Bloss.

While there are no definite plans for the building, present renters are continuing to use the space.

is a continuation of efforts between Bothwell and the university to increase the number of family medicine physicians serving rural and underserved Missouri.

"Dr. Robert Frederickson has worked with the university's School of Medicine for years to attract new physicians to Sedalia," he said. "Shortly after I began working at Bothwell in 2015, we were able to formally establish Bothwell as a training site for MU medical students through the MU Rural Training Track program under the direction of Dr. Kathleen Quinn, MU School of Medicine associate dean for rural health.

The funding is the latest in an ongoing successful collaboration between Bothwell and MU to enhance the rural physician workforce in Missouri. In June 2017, Bothwell received \$40,000 in salary support to be a Rural Training Track site for third-year medical students assigned to the health center for their core clinical training. In 2018, the university received a \$1 million grant from HRSA over three years to start a Rural Family Medicine Residency program, the first of its kind in Missouri. MU selected Bothwell as the first site for the program, and the first two resident physicians started this past July. In three years, there will be six resident family medicine physicians practicing at Bothwell caring for patients.

In 2019, Bothwell was chosen as the community partner to collaborate with MU to develop and implement a new curriculum for training third-year medical students. Bothwell subsequently received additional funds for that initiative as well as for facilities improvements at the hospital that support medical student lectures and conferences.

Fracia said when the university approached Bothwell about the new grant opportunity, they decided to "think big" and submitted a request to completely build out and equip unfinished space at the Healing Arts Center.

"Bothwell Family Medicine Associates' current space is adequate for four physicians, but the expansion of our medical education activities has resulted in growth of our full-time physicians at that clinic from three to six," he said. "That growth along with the addition of two resident physicians and two to three medical students on site each year meant more exam rooms are needed. In addition, two other family medicine physicians will be supervising the resident teaching in the clinic, so room is also needed for them and those teaching activities."

Specifically where the three clinics will be inside the center and the renovation timeline are still under development. Fracia said Bothwell is grateful for the grant funding, which will allow the health center to better meet physical clinical needs and accommodate anticipated growth.

"We also are optimistic about the prospects for future collaboration with MU in the rural health education arena," he said. "In the current environment of labor shortages, the access to health care in rural areas has become and is expected to remain a top priority for federal funding incentives, and MU cannot get these grants without a reliable rural health care partner. We have made it a priority to become that reliable partner."







(John) Jack Harris



A BLESSED LIFE – Jack Harris, age 82, reached the final destination of his lifelong road trip on November 24, 2022, no doubt with his front shirt pocket securing precisely one pen; three lottery tickets; and two folded pieces of paper littered with handwritten notes about iBonds, travel logistics for his next hastily planned trip to Chicago or Las Vegas or Kentucky or Florida, plus a reminder to pick up more cookies from Costco.

As a matter of course, Jack's notes were always printed in all-caps. Never shouting; simply emphasizing the importance of the snippets he saw fit to spill onto paper. And full disclosure, there were actually five things Jack avoided at any cost:

lowercase letters, shorts, seafood, pocketless shirts, and boastful chatter.

To that last point, Jack's source of satisfaction came from within. Thus his finest moments were deliberately anonymous, typically only known to whomever helped facilitate the generous act. However, in the days following Jack's passing, friends and family are finally at liberty to share his kind gestures, painting a fuller picture of the richness of his heart.

Spoiler: Jack's boundless altruism towered over his modest presence.

At age 77, Jack added his name to the donor waiting list for a man who needed a kidney. He never met the man. Jack was #7 on the list and unlikely to qualify for the donation, but he approached the situation as if he would be the donor. He wrote: "Everyone does things that make them feel good and this makes me feel good. So in a way you could say I am a very selfish, self centered person. All in how you look at it."

When visiting his youngest grandson's Book Fair event at school a few years ago, Jack privately established a tab with the teacher once he noticed several kids without money. Jack insisted that all kids, regardless of means, should experience the joy of picking out a book to take home that day.

While some of Jack's gifts were spontaneous, others were well-considered. For a number of years, Jack would present his oldest daughter with an envelope containing a large amount of cash and the following instruction: Find someone who's down on their luck and perhaps needs a break. It doesn't matter if you know the person or not. Give them this envelope. Do not reveal where you got it. Watch them open it and appreciate their happiness.

And the stories continue: He donated his prized heirloom firefighter garments to small-town volunteer firefighters who had limited supplies, bartered or set up payment plans for his tax clients when anyone was tight on funds, made multi-hour road trips with large quantities of hygiene supplies that he hoped to distribute to those in need, assisted friends in his retired living community with technology know-how and delivered their newspapers, and continued to drive 2-10 hours on a moment's notice to comfort a hospitalized friend or relative, or anyone grieving a death. Jack did these

things until the very end.

Words that family and friends have used to describe Jack: humorous, helpful, joyful, a light to everyone, comforting, a kind soul, caring, supportive, and the guy you'd want to have a beer with. Plus, truest of all: he made life better.

As a young man, Jack graduated from Lewis University, a private Roman Catholic university in Chicago, Illinois, with a BS in Accounting. Following graduation, he put in the hard work to follow in his father's footsteps as a firefighter with the Chicago Fire Department, Engine 23 (D-389), from 1970 to 1977. It was during this period that Jack entered his only marriage and started a family.

In 1977, Jack moved his family to Warsaw, Missouri, and transitioned to a more predictable life behind a calculator, as the owner of Harris Accounting & Tax Service. He personally prepared 650+ taxes each year from 1977 to 2014.

While in Warsaw, Jack was a civic standout. He enthusiastically served as member of the Chamber of Commerce, Treasurer of Warsaw Industrial Development, Board Member of the Warsaw Fire Department, Treasurer of both the Truman Lake Association and Warsaw American Legion, volunteer with Warsaw Heritage Days, Board Member of Warsaw Jubilee Days, and congregant of Faith Lutheran Church.

Once Jack finally retired, which was his third attempt at retiring, he settled into active living and a sense of purpose at Novel Place, a senior living community in Overland Park, Kansas. There he met new friends who shared his vigor for life, leaned into his lifelong addiction to 500- and 1000-piece puzzles, pivoted toward a renewed purpose for helping others, and dispatched plenty of quarters into the pockets of fellow residents when he joined the weekly poker meet-ups.

Jack was preceded in death by his loving parents, Patrick and Lillian Harris; his oldest sister Shirley Caponigri; and his treasured brothers-in-law, Don Knize, Bill Aumann, and Roy Coates.

He is survived by daughters, Holly Cornelius of Overland Park, Kansas, and Jackie Smith (Sam) of Goshen, Kentucky; adoring grandchildren, Ainsley Cornelius, Preston Smith, and Colton Smith;

sisters, Patricia Knize, Gerry Aumann, and Kathleen Coates; brother, Jim Harris (Mar); and dozens of cherished nieces and nephews who have expressed that they were blessed to know Uncle Jack.

To all of you, friends and family, thank you for being a piece of Jack's all-caps TRULY BLESSED life.

In true Jack fashion, it was his firm request in his final days that his family forgo funeral services which may create a burden on others to gather from great distances, and instead he desired to "be everywhere" himself. Thus, his remains, currently in the process of being preserved as Parting Stones, <https://partingstone.com>, will be distributed and celebrated accordingly in all of the spaces he adored.

The kids' challenges vary. Some cannot use their hands effectively at all. Some can only move their heads or necks. The cars are customized to be driven according to each child's specific needs, up to and including the most complex optical sensors that track and respond to only a child's head movement.

Rebecca Kidwell, president of LEARN Geeks for Kids, described Jack as "nurturing, capable, loving, problem-solving, and funny." She also noted that he was darn good at project management when he oversaw her logistics assignments at their Delivery Day event earlier this year.

A prayer for our Dad, Grandpa, brother, Uncle, and friend – Dear God, please make sure Jack finally gets his order of "eggs medium over easy" that none of us could ever figure out. Then heads-up that he'll be 2+ hours early for every appointment, can easily be bribed to

sit for any meal if jello-cake, meatloaf, or Pepsi is served, and he'll forever be at peace if you pledge to leave your heavenly TV on the Hallmark Movies channel. His memory lives on, and WE LOVE HIM SO MUCH. Amen.


Dean McMillin







Be Extra Vigilant When Driving In Inclement Weather

Missouri's weather forecast indicates snow and snow showers are expected. This will be the first snow of the season and whether it's a dusting or several inches, it will affect travel. Be sure to increase your following distance as you drive, stopping quickly on wet, snowy, or icy roads can be hazardous or impossible.

Troopers with the Missouri State Highway Patrol urge everyone to pay attention to weather conditions and make smart decisions regarding travel. If conditions dictate, avoid driving on Missouri's roadways. When you travel, make sure your vehicle is completely clean of snow, use your headlights to increase visibility, and reduce your speed when the roadway appears wet, or snow is present.

During inclement weather, driving the speed limit is not "exercising the highest degree of care."

Missouri law (Section 304.012 RSMo) states the responsibility of exercising the highest degree of care while driving rests on the driver's shoulders. Please adjust your speed to the weather. Do not use cruise control and increase your following distance.

Troopers suggest keeping your fuel tank at least half full. In preparation for winter weather, place an ice scraper, battery booster cables, blankets, extra coats, gloves, water, non-perishable food, first aid kit, flashlight, small shovel, and a bag of sand or cat litter in your trunk now, before an emergency occurs.

Before you travel, make sure your cell phone is fully charged and keep it with you. Do not use your cell phone when you are driving; park your vehicle well off the roadway or in a parking lot before placing a call. The Missouri State Highway Patrol emergency number is 1-800-525-5555 (or *55 on a cellular phone).

Motorists are encouraged to check road conditions before driving to help determine if the trip can be completed safely. Missouri's Road Condition Report is available at 1-888-275-6636 or MoDOT's Road Condition Map at http://traveler.modot.org/map/.

Please remember to buckle up, pay attention, be courteous, and obey all traffic laws. When weather conditions make driving hazardous, drive only when absolutely necessary.

Report on the Financial Statements Opinions
