Downtown Bank Closing Stirs Memories Amid Industry Shift

Downtown Warsaw lost a historic business on Friday as Hawthorn Bank closed its downtown branch after serving their last customer at 1:00 PM. Subway owner Shana DeJaynes was that final customer in the building which had been a part of the Osage Valley Bank for many years.

According to Market President Chuck Allcorn, there wasn't enough business at the downtown location to justify keeping it open.

"So much of our business is done on-line now, so we don't have as much foot traffic at the downtown location," said Allcorn. "Hawthorn continues to be a hometown bank with our Warsaw branch having more transactions than any facility in the Hawthorn group. We have many retired customers and they still like to come to the

bank and take care of their banking in person."

Hawthorn bought the Osage Valley Bank in 2000 when Larry Beach was the

president. The North Town branch was built in 2005 with Betty Beach serving as president. Betty Beach retired in 2014 and Chuck

Allcorn took over as the president.

Dave Garnett, president of the West Central Region of Hawthorn Bank commented

on the closing of the downtown branch.

City Of Lincoln Adopts Balanced Budget For 2023

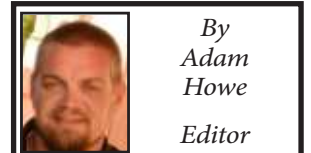

Under new business Monday eve, city aldermen adopted a 2023 budget, said by Mayor Glen Nelson to be a "balanced" one, although he indicated the city may have to dip into its reserves. He projected 2023 revenues to total about \$375,620, and expenses to come to \$358,000, with possible expenditures for several major projects. The 2023 budget also includes a three percent raise for city employees.

The meeting opened at 6:00 PM, with Aldermen Phil Fisher, Barbara Hammond, Jack Lietzke present. Alderman Janice Sweargin arrived at about 6:07 PM. Mayor Nelson presided; City Clerk Sabrina Brown recorded. First actions by the group were to approve the evening's agenda, minutes of its November 16 meeting, and agree to pay December bills. Mayor Nelson then read a letter from citizens John and Jenna Cox, thanking the city for recent Highway 65 repairs and for "Snowflake" **LINCOLN Page 3**

More Than The Mail: Local Carriers A Lifeline For Many

Though our word "mail" is of English descent, referring to a "male", or bag, the first documented use of organized courier services was over 4,000 years ago in Egypt. The pharaohs used the service to send written decrees throughout their vast lands: The oldest surviving piece of mail is from BC 225.

The United States Postal Service was established July 26, 1776, with Benjamin Franklin as the first postmaster general. Franklin put into place many aspects of the system that are still used today. He is credited with creating more efficient routes between towns and cities and having the weekly mail wagon travel both day and night using relay teams. He also developed the first mail rates chart, which standardized the cost of delivery by weight and distance.

Mail couriers are an integral part of life no matter where or when you live. They bring news, letters, products, postcards and...bills. Don't forget the packages!

Mitch Grace is a contract courier who delivers mail out of the Warsaw Post Office over a 67-mile route through 3 zip codes.

"From Black Friday to Christmas, our package deliveries double, at least," Grace said.

Tyler Throckmorton opened We The People Cattle Co. at 19509 Hwy 65 in Lincoln on December 1. He wanted to provide the public with quality meat coming from local livestock that had a stress-free and adrenaline-free life.

"I got tired of hearing about livestock having additives and being unsure about where our food comes

from," said Throckmorton. "I woke up one morning about 3:00 AM and decided to make a difference."

Throckmorton says that he takes real pride spending time with his cows, making sure they are happy. He says their happiness helps with tender meat and flavor. The company states on its website that in today's wholesale world of big box stores, meat is largely from overseas. Otherwise, cows are bought from sale barns to be shipped state to state, country to country, stressed from transportation

until meat is frozen before arriving on a dinner table.

Throckmorton and his wife, Diana, bought their farm a couple of months ago, moving to Lincoln from Savannah, Missouri where his parents grew up. They were both raised on farms and Throckmorton also has experience selling farm equipment. They both feel at home with their herds of 80 cattle and 25 hogs.

Business has been picking up since the store opened, and there are always at least 10 customers a day. **FRESH Page 3**

Change is hard and fond memories of the way it used to be fade slowly. especially proud of how our team in Warsaw has worked through this change in respecting the past while preparing for the future. Thank you for all you do every day in building relationships and serving the needs of our customers."

According to "The History of Benton County" by Kathleen Kelly-White and Kathleen White-Miles, the Osage Valley Bank was established in 1891. It's temporary quarters were next to the drug store.

J. P. Grissam served as the first president of the Osage Valley Bank. Directors included: J.P. Grissam, A. R. Failer, L. W. Lutman, G. W. Mowell, H. H. Freeman, B. J. Minter, N. P. Petts, E. F. Haynes, F. Boehmer, W. H. Gallaher, and W. S. Davis.

The Osage Valley Bank suffered a blow in 1919 when a fire destroyed the building on Main Street. According to "The History of Benton County", the volunteer fire department worked through the night to save the rest of the businesses on Main Street. The building was restored, but without the beautiful rounded steeple at the front.

When the Great Depression hit the country, many of the county banks closed, but not Osage Valley Bank.

"In March, 1933, President Roosevelt ordered that from Monday, March 6 to Thursday, March 9, a 'bank holiday' be observed by all banking institutions in the country."

"The Farmers and Traders Bank of Warsaw placed a notice on it's door Tuesday noon, stating that it was in the hands of the State Finance Department under the McCawley Act. In other words: it was closed."

"The McCawley bill permitted a bank to remain closed 66 days and, if a plan of reorganization was submitted meeting the approval of the State Finance Commissioner, the bank could reopen. If it failed to do so, it went into receivership."

"At the same time the Farmers and Traders closed, O.C. Crudginton, cashier

of the Osage Valley Bank, made this statement.

"We are ready to re-open immediately upon receiving instruction from the State Department. The Osage Valley Bank has no bills payable. We want to serve the people in this crisis. I feel certain we have things arranged so that we can take care of the situation," ("The History of Benton County" Volume 2 by White and Miles).

Crudginton, accompanied by John Ryan, drove to Kansas City on Wednesday of that week and exchanged gold coin and gold certificates for \$2,000 in dollar bills and change in order that Warsaw business house might have change during this restriction banking period; \$2,000 was in dollar bills and \$600 in silver.

State bank examiner George Freund announced that anyone having safe deposit boxes at Osage Valley would be notified when they could have access to them (White and Miles).

While many banks across the United States ended up closing, the Osage Valley Bank continued to do business.

According to Allcorn The historic building is under contract to be sold. He said the prospective owners have agreed to keep the ATM located on the building's Main Street facade.

Hawthorn Bank, located at 1891 Commercial Street, has 19 employees, and the two employees at the downtown branch, Sandra Darling and Janice Anderson are now working at the North Town location.

(Continued from Page 1) life of Grace, or most any mail carrier look like?

Couriers arrive at the Warsaw Post Office early each morning to sort and organize letters, magazines and packages for delivery along their route.

Once they have the day's mail in order, they set off on their route. They navigate back-country, gravel roads, lake communities and rural farmland. Both contract carriers and post office employees must supply their own vehicle for the job.

A difference between a contract carrier and rural carrier (the post office employee) is that the employee receives an EMA (equipment maintenance allowance) with their pay, while the contract carrier must consider all of that in their bid.

Jerry Spry has been a rural carrier for over 10 years.

"The biggest obstacle we face sometimes is just finding the right house," Spry said. "People don't know how important those

numbers on your mailbox or house are for us. Especially for a substitute courier, it can be a challenge."

Rain, snow or sunshine, mail is delivered 6 days a week. The weather doesn't play as much of a factor as one might think.

"You keep the heater working good and wear a coat," Grace said. "In my 22 years of delivering mail on this route, the post office has only called it off twice because of deep snow."

There are also animals on about every route of which carriers must contend.

"Dogs. Yea, there are some big ones out there. And they can be a problem," said Grace. "In all my years though, I have never been bit by a dog. I was once flogged by a rooster though."

If you are out and about and see a mail carrier, throw your hand up, wave and say "hi". Their day started early and you never know what kind of day it's been . . . or if they've been chased by a dog or flogged by a rooster!

Some fun mail facts: The U.S. Postal system delivers 212 billion pieces of mail per year with 40,000 post offices, to 144 million homes and businesses. -The first post office in the Americas was allegedly established in 1639 in a Boston tavern that sold "strong water". -Recipients of mail used to be responsible for payment of postage stamps. This was a problem, obviously, as people could refuse the mail and it would have to be returned at the post office's expense. In 1847, prepaid postage stamps became the norm. -The postmaster general is the second highest paid federal government employee with a salary of \$276,840 per year.

The business has about 1,200 square feet and has a bakery with pies, cookies, fudge, cheese biscuits and cinnamon rolls. There are smoked and fresh meats, as well as take and bake meals such as enchiladas and lasagna. The family has recently acquired a dairy cow and has a bottle calf named Lucy who will be able to provide fresh milk in about eight months. Throckmorton said that he is raising money to redo a corner of his store to make a mini-Walmart. He will then sell cheeses, cereals, and boxed goods.

Not all the excitement for Throckmorton takes place at the store. Recently he was transporting hogs and cattle in a trailer when one of the hogs lifted a 150-pound gate. He had to pick up the gate from under a 700-pound cow, and while he was doing that, he had to fight five hogs that weighed about 350 pounds each

while they fought with each other.

The Throckmorton's farm is a Restoring Hope Foster Home for three children who will stay with the family as long as they want or need to. The family also includes three biological children.

"I feed hay and take care of animals in all kinds of weather, because it is our responsibility just like we take care of our children," said Throckmorton. "I am with this constantly and one day I will change the way the world buys our food and bring it back to the way it was when people could afford to eat healthy food. I am tired of chemicals that jeopardize our health."

Christmas decorations which are now repaired and displayed along city streets.

Benton County Economic Development Director Jo Ann Lane reported that the firm "We The People" opened on December 1, business is good, and there will be a ribbon cutting in January. She said that "Premium Auto" will open it's doors in January, and added there will be an entrepreneurial workshop presentation next September in state.

Under old business, Mayor Nelson reported that two proposed water and sewer grants have been denied; that a contractor bid for a Municipal Airport culvert repair has been denied because of a proposed substandard pipe. He noted that the Airport will remain closed until the culvert has been repaired and indicated that bids should be obtained for such repair before the ground is frozen. And lastly, Mayor Nelson suggested that, since the Police Department has been unsuccessful in obtaining new officers to replace its losses, the city should consider offering a relocation incentive to prospective applicants. An Alderman suggested a \$1,500 incentive payment to applicants, if it would help hire officers. The group agreed to do so.

And in Reports from Department heads: Police Chief Jason Wenberg furnished a written report,

accepted by the group. Public Works Director Josh Cole reported that all Snowflake ornaments are up and his Department is working with DNR on wastewater problems.

In new business, Chad Mullins, with Mike Keith Insurance provided information on 2023 property/liability insurance renewal, at a cost which is up about \$3,000 from 2020. The group approved his proposal, also okayed a no increase 2023 Benton County Tourism proposal and a County Economic Development Contribution proposal. In last business, Alderman Lietzke suggested the group might wish to consider a recreational marijuana sales tax. Mayor Nelson replied that it is doubtful that the city would have a sales agency for such purpose, but also said aldermen should await further information on the matter.

The meeting closed about 7:17pm. These sessions are usually held on 2nd Monday eves; the public is welcome.

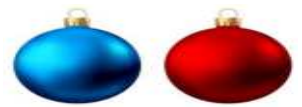

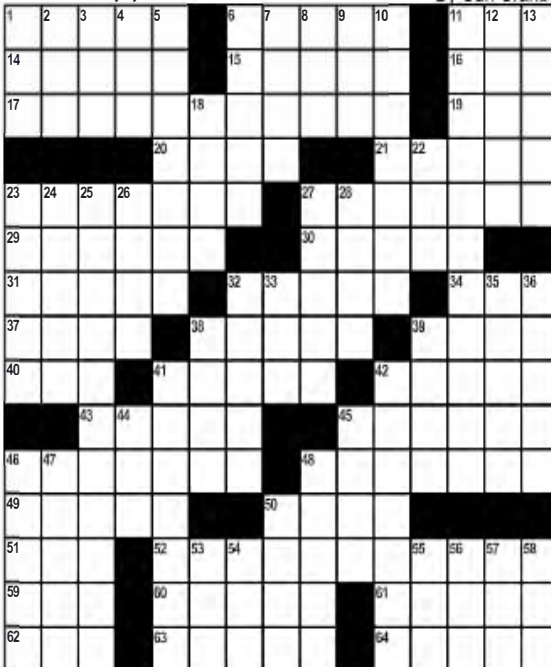

Advice can help when making charitable gifts

Now that it's the holiday season, gifts are probably on your mind – and you might intend for some of those gifts to go to charities. Although your intentions are good, you could be shortchanging both your recipients and yourself with your method of giving. Again, assuming you can itemize, you can deduct the full fair-market value of the asset, up to 30 percent of your adjusted gross income, and your contributions can be invested in mutual funds or similar vehicles. The contributions have the opportunity for growth,



and distributions to the charity are tax-free. You can then decide, on your own timetable, which IRS-qualified charitable groups you would like to receive the money. Furthermore, if you donate stocks that have risen in value, you won't incur potential capital gains taxes that you would have when you eventually sold the stocks. These taxes can be considerable, especially if you've held the stocks for a long time. (You'll want to consult with your tax advisor on how charitable gifts can affect your taxes, especially if you're thinking of using a donor-advised fund.)

These charitable donation methods are not secrets, and they are available to many people – you don't have to be wealthy to employ them. Yet, here's an interesting statistic:

Those who work with a financial advisor on charitable strategies are

more than three times as likely to donate non-cash assets such as stocks than those who contribute to charities but don't work with an advisor, according to an August 2022 survey from financial services firm Edward Jones and Morning Consult, a global data intelligence company. These findings suggest that many more people could be taking advantage of tax-smart charitable giving moves – if only they had some help or guidance.

Also, by getting some professional financial assistance, you may find it easier to implement your charitable giving decisions within your overall financial strategy, which is designed to help you meet all your important long-term goals, such as achieving a comfortable retirement.

Your instinct to help support charitable groups

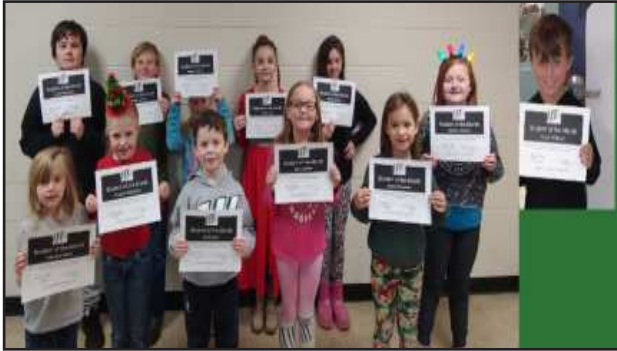

Project Title:
Main Street Improvements

Project purpose: The proposed improvement consists of widening Main Street along the north side of the road to add a center turn lane, a bike lane, curb and gutter, an enclosed storm sewer, sidewalks, reconstruction of driveways, landscaping and LED lighting from west of Hackberry Street to Gunstock Drive. The proposed project is Phase I of complete street improvements for the Main Street corridor.

Estimated Cost: The total project is estimated to cost \$788,157. CDBG funding is \$488,157. The local cash contribution is \$300,000, which includes \$207,000 for construction, \$15,000 for the Environmental Assessment, \$53,000 for engineering design, and \$25,000 for construction administration.

Phase II improvements will include similar infrastructure for the north side of Main Street, extending easterly to Walnut Drive, and adding a bike lane westerly to Jackson Street. These improvements are funded through FHWA Transportation Alternatives Program and are not related to the request for release of funds.
