(Continued from Page 1) clothes, so the committee began winter drives. Warm hats, scarves, gloves, coats, hoodies and winter boots are being collected at dropoff locations throughout the county. Drop off boxes can be found in Warsaw at Anstine Realty, Remax, Hawthorn Bank, J&D Pharmacy. State Farm, Community Warsaw Building, City of Warsaw and the Benton County Enterprise. Sites in Lincoln are Lincoln Inn, Shirley's, Community National Bank, Mozark Mocha and Vera Cruz 3. Cole Camp locations are at Handel Haus, Happy Feet and Rioak.

"We divide the clothing into three sections, one section for each district, and deliver it to contact persons at each school," said Cathy Wilson, member of the BCCP. "Then that person takes care of getting the clothing to appropriate children."

Time for tax-loss harvesting?

For a variety of reasons, such as higher interest rates, rising inflation and supply chain issues, the financial markets were volatile in 2022 — and this volatility probably showed up in your investment statements. Yet, while you may have been less than happy about your investment returns this year, the volatility and depressed prices may offer you some opportunities at tax time.

Specifically, you may be able to take advantage of tax-loss harvesting. Using this strategy, you sell securities at a loss to offset capital gains, which you may have if you've held some investments for years and they've greatly appreciated in value. And if your total losses exceed your gains, you could offset up to \$3,000 of ordinary income per year and carry over the rest to future tax years.

Tax-loss harvesting isn't just a tax issue — it also can be part of your investment strategy. What investments should you sell to take the capital gains? Which ones should be sold to take the losses?

To answer these questions, consider a few different

Diversification - Portfolio rebalancing is important for investors. If you have too many investments that have essentially the characteristics, your portfolio might be under-diversified — and diversification is necessary to help you achieve your long-term goals. If your assets are concentrated in a single asset class or a single stock, your portfolio could take a big hit during times of market volatility, but a diversified investment mix can reduce this impact. Consequently, when looking at ways to take advantage of tax-loss harvesting, you could consider selling an investment that's similar to several others you may own. (Keep in mind, though, that diversification can't prevent all losses or guarantee profits.)





Strong Show-Me-Select™ Replacement Heifer Program Sale **November 18 Near Carthage**

18 Show-Me-SelectTM (SMS) Replacement Heifer Program Sale at Joplin Regional Stockyards had a good turnout and active bidding on most lots," according to University of Missouri Extension Livestock Field Specialist Heifer Patrick Davis. demand was strong as shown by the 152 heifers selling for an average price of \$2,093 per head. This was the highest SMS Replacement Heifer Program Sale average for this sale location since the May 2016 sale.

"Longtime consignors had a strong showing in this sale," says Davis. The top selling lot was sold longtime consignor Nolan Kleiboeker Farms LLC of Wentworth, MO. This lot consisted of three head of black white face artificial insemination for \$2,700 per heifer to Richard Ewing of Fordland, MO. Furthermore, Nolan Kleiboeker Farms LLC of Wentworth, MO had the top sale average with 10 black white face heifers selling for an average of \$2,510 per heifer. Longtime and volume consignor John Wheeler of Marionville, MO had a strong sale where he sold 36 head of black white face AI bred heifers for the second highest sale average price of \$2,361 per heifer. Another longtime consignor Kathy Wheeler of Marionville, MO had a strong sale where she sold 14 head of black white face natural service bred heifers for the third highest sale average of \$2,342 per heifer.


"Doug McKinney of LaRussell, MO was the volume buyer and picked up 29 heifers for an average price of \$1,779 per heifer," says Davis. This farm's Cattle Company, Lamar, MO, Mast Farms, Lamar, MO, Dichotomy Cattle Company, Rocky Comfort, MO, Robert Miller, Aurora, Wheeler, MO, Kathy Marionville, MO, Hunter Lane Cattle Company, Pierce City, MO and John Wheeler, Marionville, MO.

"Buyers paid more money on average for AI bred heifers over natural service bred heifers," says Davis. Seventy-two AI bred heifers sold for an average price of \$2,229 per heifer compared to eighty natural service bred heifers that sold for an average of \$1,970 per heifer. One benefit of purchasing AI bred replacement heifers is they will be bred to calve early in the calving season. Their calves could be older and heavier at weaning time leading to improved pounds of calf at sale time compared to natural service bred heifers. Another benefit of purchasing AI bred heifers is the accuracy and higher quality genetics in the heifer progeny compared to natural service bred heifers. This improvement in AI bred heifer progeny genetics should lead to improved progeny performance compared to natural service bred heifer progeny. Davis

Here's one of my favorite December topics:

You can easily attract a wide variety of birds and provide hours of entertainment in easy viewing range by putting up a bird feeder. My good friend and buddy, Larry Walthall, has a feeder just outside his window at Lincoln Community Care Center. Backvard bird feeders are a great place for children (and adults) to learn about and identify different species of birds. Kim and I always keep a yearly list of all birds that we identify at

our feeders.

Backyard bird feeding is the second most popular hobby in the United States, surpassed only by gardening. Over 55 million people in the United States feed wild birds, spending \$3 billion on feed and over \$800 million on feeders, birdbaths and other feeding accessories.

The history of bird feeding in America dates back to 1845 when Henry David Thoreau fed wild birds at Walden Pond. For the next 100 years or so, wild bird feeding gradually increased but generally only the affluent could afford to do so. The post-WWII decade of the 1950s became a prosperous one. Incomes increased, suburbs proliferated across United States and backyard bird feeding increased.

After the 1962 publication of Rachel Carson's "Silent Spring", an expose of the impact of DDT on birds, bird feeding took on added importance as a way to help protect birds. In the 1960s, scientists first started looking at the impact of backyard bird feeding.

There was increased survivorship, improved nutritional status and range expansions of species. Today about 1/3 of the adult population feeds wild birds. A wide variety of seeds can be used to bring birds to your feeder but three stand out as best to attract the most species: 1) black-oil sunflower seed (not the more familiar striped variety) attracts the widest variety of birds that eat seeds, 2) white millet appeals to doves, sparrows (there are many species of sparrows), juncos (snowbirds) and other birds that feed on the ground, 3) Niger (thistle) is a very small seed usually placed in a cylindrical feeder equipped with perches and small holes to extract seed. American goldfinches and purple finches are especially expensive but fewer species eat it: consequently it lasts longer. It's best to avoid buying bags of colorful mixed seeds. They often contain common cereal grains such as milo, wheat, oats, and rice that few birds will eat. Cracked corn is good to spread on the ground under your feeder for doves and sparrows. Squirrels also eat corn and it helps to keep them off your feeder. Suet cakes are devoured by both insects and seed eating birds and a most valuable food source. It is more calorie rich than carbohydrates or

The typical backyard bird does not weigh as much as two nickels. Birds spend most of their waking hours searching for food and consume 15% of their body weight overnight just keeping warm enough to

Species most numerous at feeders such as goldfinches, house finches, mourning doves, cardinals, and tree and house sparrows for example, aren't wed to a particular winter territory. They'll move about if someone else has a better lunch counter. The woodpeckers, nuthatches, chickadees, titmice and to some extent, bluejays, are more likely to defend a territory around a particularly good feeder

Unfortunately, most of our songbird populations are plummeting, some seriously, so backyard feeders are great places to enjoy and help our feathered friends.

A cautionary note about Many scientific cats: research studies show cats are the biggest killers of wildlife. Just in America, it is estimated that cats, both pets and strays, kill 1.4 billion to 3.7 billion birds

MDC Sets Deer And Turkey Hunting **Dates And Proposed Deer Regulation Changes For 2023-24 Seasons**



Some counties will have two new firearms deerseason portions and additional antlerless permits.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) recently set turkey and deer hunting dates for the 2023-2024 seasons along with regulation changes for the 2023-2024 deer-hunting season. The regulation changes include a new firearms early antlerless portion, a new firearms CWD portion, and changes to firearms antlerless permit numbers in most counties. The hunting dates and regulation changes were approved by the Missouri Conservation Commission at its Dec. 2 open meeting in Jefferson City.

"The changes to deer hunting regulations for the 2023-2024 deer season were motivated by increasing deer numbers throughout much of Missouri and in response to changes in the distribution of chronic wasting disease (CWD) in the state," said MDC Cervid Program Supervisor Jason Isabelle. "With a growing deer population in most Missouri counties, we're increasing opportunities for hunters to harvest deer both within and outside of the CWD Management Zone next year."

permit numbers. "Like they are in most of the state, deer populations are increasing in most CWD Management Zone counties," said Isabelle. "Because higher deer densities can increase the rate of CWD spread, additional deer harvest in the CWD Management Zone is needed to prevent further increases in deer numbers and help minimize the spread of the disease."

He added that the timeframe of the CWD selected portion was because it occurs during the tail end of the primary rut, or breeding season, when deer activity is typically high and when hunter interest remains strong.

"When looking for the best time to provide hunters with more opportunity in CWD Management Zone counties, we considered a number of factors including the potential for good deer movement, level of hunter interest, and potential conflict with other hunters," said Isabelle. "The late November timeframe avoids peak archery hunting weeks and occurs during a time when deer movement is generally good, and when hunters are eager to be in the woods."

Changes to Firearms **Antlerless Permit** Numbers

MDC has also increased the number of firearms antlerless permits hunters can fill in most counties, including allowing hunters to fill a firearms antlerless permit in Butler, Carter, Scott, and Wavne counties. MDC has also increased the number of firearms antlerless permits from two to four in 82 counties.

"Prior to 2014, firearms antlerless permit numbers were unlimited in 74 counties," said Isabelle. "However, following the severe hemorrhagic disease outbreak that occurred throughout much of the state in 2012, we became much more conservative with firearms antlerless permit numbers to allow the deer population to rebound."

He noted the deer population has steadily increased during the last decade, necessitating the liberalization of antlerless harvest opportunities to slow population growth and keep the deer population at desired levels.

MDC Seeking

Public can submit comments through Dec. 31. In partnership with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) is seeking public comment on a draft Generic Environmental Assessment (EA) regarding the public lake and stream access program in Missouri.

MDC strives to construct new, renovate, or relocate existing boating access areas on Missouri's public lakes and streams in order to provide adequate access for recreational boating and fishing. MDC has used federal aid in Sport Fish Restoration (SFR) funds, which are administered through the USFWS, to construct and improve fishing and boating accesses Missouri's rivers, on streams, and lakes since 1991. The SFR requires states to allocate 15-percent of their allotment for the acquisition, development, renovation, improvement, or

operations and maintenance

of boat accesses.

The purpose of this project is to aid the USFWS decision on whether to implement the EA to expedite and reduce the cost for a National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) review of some boating access project activities.

"Over time, new and improved boat accesses are necessary to help meet increasing demand generated by increased boat ownership and leisure time," said MDC Fisheries Programs Supervisor Laura Ruman. "Accesses are frequently damaged during flood events and may require closure until the damage is repaired or the access is relocated."

explained Ruman expediting the NEPA review process under this EA would allow for more timely repairs. New and relocated public access sites also need to be properly sited and protection of the environment needs due consideration when sites are developed and maintained.

The CBC is an early-winter bird census where thousands of volunteers across the U.S.. Canada, and many countries in the western hemisphere go out over a 24-hour period on one calendar day to count birds. Christmas Bird Counts are held annually between Dec. 14 and Jan. 5 to gather data on winter bird populations and to track the long-term status of species and large-scale trends.

Each CBC has a coordinator who assigns portions of a 15mile diameter count circle to participants to count all birds seen and heard over a 24-hour period. Missouri hosts about 20 CBCs, some of which are:


