Thanksgiving love leftovers almost as much as the meal itself. So, I make sure there are plenty of mashed potatoes. After turkey sandwiches, mashed potato cakes are a favorite.

I use a standard recipe of 2 cups cold leftover mashed potatoes, 1 whole egg, and ½ cup flour. If you have a lot more potatoes, add another egg and some more flour. Mix the egg into the mashed potatoes with a fork until well blended then add the flour. At this point you can add any mix-ins that you prefer. Finely diced green onion, bacon bits, granulated garlic, grated cheese and so on.

Pour approximately 2 tablespoons of oil into a cast-iron skillet and heat over medium heat. Scoop out heaping tablespoons of mixture into the hot oil. (I like bacon grease!) Dip the back of a spoon into the oil and use to flatten the potato mixture to about 1/4-inch

thick. By dipping the back of the spoon into the oil, the spoon will not stick to the potatoes, making flattening them much easier. If you find it simpler, make the patties and then add to pan. Fry until golden brown and then flip and continue to brown the potato patty on the other side.

Remove to a paper towellined plate to serve.

(Continued from Page 1) local portion of the project and serves as the Local Transportation Authority. The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) has jurisdiction over the state portion. The project was completed in 2005, and by January 2020 all project costs and debts had been satisfied with the revenue collected by the TDD. The scope of the state audit was to evaluate the financial status of the district during part of 2021 and the period from January through June 30, 2022. The methodology of the audit included reviewing financial records and other pertinent documents, interviewing various personnel of the district and certain external parties. The audit also assessed risk that illegal acts, including fraud, and violations of applicable contract, or other legal provisions could occur. The audit was conducted in accordance with the standards applicable performance audits

Auditing Standards. From inception through June 30, 2022, the TDD received \$3,723, 178 in sales tax revenues from

a ½-cent sales tax on all taxable sales inside the district's boundaries. It paid \$1,905,534 in project costs and \$1,079,268 in interest costs. The 1/2-cent sales tax will no longer be collected once the TDD is abolished, but there has been a delay in steps taken to bring about the abolishment and there has been approximately \$700,000 in unnecessary sales taxes collected through the end of September.

"Since the completion of the project, the City Mayor, City Planner and City Alderpersons have reached out to TDD to convene a meeting for the purpose of requesting a state audit that was necessary before moving for a dissolution," said City Attorney Cale Haddock. "There was some interference in convening the meeting until 2022."

Now that all outstanding project costs and debts have been satisfied, and after the district's final costs and professional fees are paid. the remaining balance of more than \$600,000 will be distributed to the City of Warsaw under state law.

Pogue said the remaining balance from the TDD should be available to the City of Warsaw by the end of this year. The funds will be in a restricted account and are to be reinvested for road improvements at the intersection of Polk and Commercial Streets. An Engineer is already at work designing the improvements from the intersection back to the Truman Dam Access Road. It is expected that an additional lane will be created to help with some of the traffic backups occurring near McDonalds.

(Continued from Page 1) visitor Kim Pearcy then reported on a December 3 Warsaw event, "A Hallmark Christmas", to take place in the city's downtown. She mentioned that some Main Street parking will be unavailable during the event, which will feature (among other positives) a hay ride, and a Christmas parade starting at 6:00pm. Visitor Tiffany Jaegers with Winter-Dent, the city's insurance representative, discussed 2023 renewal of health insurance for city employees and their families. Steve Tade, also with Winter-Dent, discussed 2023 renewal of property insurance, including flood and liability insurance coverages for the city. Those matters will soon be discussed by the group, probably when they deal with the 2023 budget.

Aldermen then approved ordinances: (1) contracting between the city's financial contribution toward a candidate's law enforcement training in exchange for a commitment by the candidate to maintain employment with the city for a definite term; and (2) authorizing a contract with "Go Gov" for emergency notifications to citizens, at a cost of \$3,900/year, allowing timely notification of problems, They also approved resolution a approving a continuing agreement between the city and People Service ... for the city's annual maintenance/ repair and (non-capital) expenditures increase, and monthly compensation increase and base amounts for chemicals used. Some increase in costs, going into the new year, is expected. In last business, Administrator Pogue was approved to write a Community Revitalization Grant which may see bike and pedestrian pathways installed in the Eastgate area of Main Street. A discussion followed on that matter.

The meeting closed about 6:56pm to go into executive session. These open sessions are usually held on 1st and 3rd Monday eves; visitors are welcome.

Ladycats Top Cole Camp In Overtime

In the first tilt for both teams last Monday night, the Ladycats earned their first win of the season, 61-53 in overtime over the visiting Cole Camp Lady Bluebirds in front of a good, early season crowd.

"Cole Camp came to play a tough, physical game," Ladycats coach Matt Henderson said. "It's always good competition."

As is typical in many games that come early in

the schedule, both offenses had trouble getting things going from the tip. Cole Camp used success from beyond the arc to nail three 3-pointers in the first frame to take an 11-6 advantage after one.

In the second quarter, Warsaw used a barrage of field goals and balanced scoring to surge ahead, 25-20 at halftime.

The Ladycats matched Cole Camp, 11-11 in the third period and led 36-31 at the end of the third.

In the fourth, Warsaw led by as many as 9, but the Lady Bluebirds defense

forced timely turnovers down the stretch and converted on many, using a 21-16 advantage in the fourth to tie things up at 36-

The Ladycats owned the overtime period, taking the frame 9-1 and the 61-53 win in overtime.

COLA is sweet for Social Security recipients

If you receive Social Security, you've probably already heard that your checks in 2023 will be bigger considerably bigger, in fact. How can you make the best use of this extra money? Here's what's happening: For 2023, there's an 8.7% cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for Social Security benefits – the largest increase in 40 years. Also, the monthly Medicare Part B premiums are declining next year, to \$164.90/month from \$170.10/month, which will also modestly boost Social Security checks for those enrolled in Part B, as these

premiums are automatically deducted.

Of course, the sizable COLA is due to the high inflation of 2022. as the Social Security Administration uses formula based on increases in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). So, it's certainly possible that you will need some, or perhaps all, of your larger checks to pay for the increased cost of goods and services. But if your cash flow is already relatively strong, you might want to consider these suggestions for using your bigger checks:

• Reduce withdrawals from vour investment portfolio. When you're retired, you will likely need to withdraw a certain amount from your portfolio each year to meet your expenses. A boost in your Social Security may enable you to withdraw less, at least for a year. This can be particularly advantageous when the markets are down, as you'd like to avoid, as much as possible, selling investments and withdrawing the money when investment prices are low. And the fewer investments you need to sell, the longer your portfolio may last during your retirement years.

• Help build your cash reserves. When you're retired, it's a good idea to maintain about a year's worth of the amount you'll spend from your portfolio in cash, while also keeping three months' of your spending needs in an emergency fund, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account. Your higher Social Security checks could help you build these cash reserves. (Also, it's helpful to keep another three to five years'

worth of spending from your portfolio in short-term, fixed-income investments, which now, due to higher interest rates, offer better income opportunities.)

• Contribute to a 529 plan.
You could use some of your extra Social Security money to contribute to a tax-advantaged 529 education savings plan for your grandchildren or other family members.

• Contribute to charitable organizations. You might want to use some of your Social Security money to expand your charitable giving. Your generosity will help worthy groups and possibly bring you some tax benefits, too.

While it's nice to have these possible options in 2023, you can't count on future COLA increases being as large. The jump in inflation in 2022 was due to several unusual factors, including pandemicrelated government spending, supply shortages and the Russian invasion of Ukraine. It's quite possible, perhaps even likely, that inflation will subside in 2023, which, in turn, would mean a smaller COLA bump in 2024.

Nonetheless, while you might not want to include large annual COLA increases as part of your long-term financial strategy, you may well choose to take advantage, in some of the ways described above, of the bigger Social Security checks you'll receive in 2023. When opportunity knocks, you may want to open the door.

MDC Reports 197,724 Deer **Harvested During** November Firearms Deer Season

data from Preliminary the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that deer hunters in Missouri harvested 197,724 deer during the November portion of firearms deer season, Nov. 12-22. Of the 197,724 deer harvested, 102,633 were antlered bucks, 16,929 were button bucks, and 78,162 were does.

Top harvest counties were Franklin with 4,175 deer harvested, Texas with 3,607, and Callaway with 3,416. Last year hunters checked 188,928 deer during the November portion firearms deer season with 102,054 being antlered bucks, 16,537 being button

"It would have been hard to ask for much better weather during the November portion than what hunters experienced this year," said MDC Cervid Program Supervisor Jason Isabelle. "To have sustained temperatures that were well below average for nearly the entire season portion was quite remarkable."

Isabelle noted that the weather likely resulted in increased deer movements, contributing to this year's higher harvest total.

MDC reported one nonfirearms-related hunting incident during the November portion of the firearms deer season. It was self-inflicted and occurred in Bollinger County.

Missouri's archery deer and turkey season resumes Nov. 23 through Jan. 15, 2023. The late youth portion of firearms season runs Nov. 25-27. The antlerless portion of firearms deer season runs Dec. 3-11 (in open counties) followed by the alternative methods portion Dec. 24 through Jan. 3, 2023.
