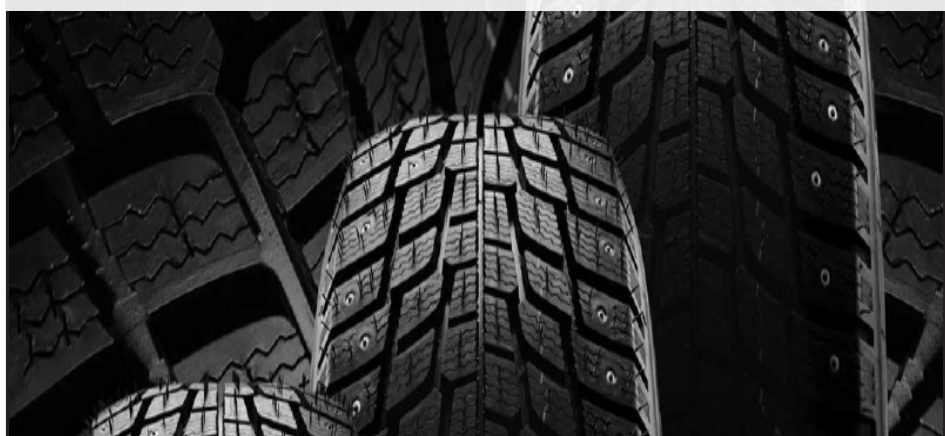

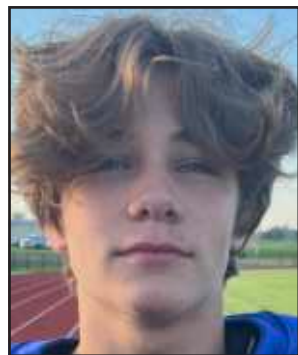

After finishing with just one win last season, the Warsaw Ladycats volleyball program will look to continue their rebuild with yet another new coach this season in Kelsi Brosnahan. Brosnahan assumes the role after being the Ladycats assistant for last year's team.

"These girls are resilient," the first year coach said. "They have dealt with a lot of adversity but they are working so hard to show everyone how much they have improved. Their willingness to put in the work and just ask questions about the game has heightened their knowledge."

Seniors Ellie Murrell (Sr, Setter), Ashlyn Laue (Sr, Middle Hitter), Grace Comer (Sr, Outside Hitter/Defensive Specialist), Jazz Swisher (Sr, Outside Hitter) and Janie Kilgore (Sr, Defensive Specialist) will be key leaders. Murrell has worked hard

to come back from an injury her sophomore year, but has persevered and will be one of the main setters on the varsity floor.

"Ellie is not only a stellar setter, but she can read the court very well and that will be a big factor for us," Brosnahan commented.

According to Brosnahan, Laue has really developed throughout the summer and will be called upon on both sides of the net.

"Her ability to read the hitter on the net has really come along and her blocking will come up big for us," the coach said. "Ashlyn's ability to place the ball directly down the other side of the net will definitely help too."

Comer is described as a "strong player all-around".

"Gracie just does whatever we need her to do. She'll be a good leader and a good player on both sides of the net. She

just does it all," said Brosnahan.

Swisher has been working on a new position and has been making the transition throughout the summer and camps.

Brosnahan commented, "Jazz's willingness to switch positions for us and her positive attitude in doing so has really helped her develop into a player that we're going to be able to count on."

Kilgore, a transfer from Orrick, comes to the Ladycats with plenty of experience and has been a leader in early practices.

"Janie is new to our team this year and she is doing an amazing job stepping into the defensive spot," Brosnahan said.

Brosnahan will look to employ a 6-2 with Murrell and Laney Arnett (So) as setters, Laue and Haylee Cobb (So) at middle hitter, Comer and

Senior Laden Wildcats Look To Continue Climb To The Top

In their third consecutive .500 season, the Warsaw Wildcats had a huge coming-out party in 2021, finishing 9-2.

Now entering the sixth year at his alma mater, Warsaw head coach Ryan Boyer understands all too well that his team cannot rest on its laurels and simply expect to repeat last year's success in 2022.

Despite 20 returning lettermen, Coach Boyer and his staff will be working hard to impress upon this Wildcats team that it will take more work this season to surpass the accomplishments of the team a year ago.

"We had a lot of success last season," Boyer stated. "We had a good balance of seniors and underclassmen contributing to that. A lot of them played a lot of downs last year and a lot of them even started."

He went on to say, "We have a lot of experience coming back and every one of our kids work their tails off, doing everything that is asked of them."

While the offense features six returning starters, the group graduated some key players. Filling those positions of need will be important for Warsaw's continued success after seeing it improve in each of the last few seasons.

"The guys in those skill positions are the experienced ones," Boyer explained.

Last season, the Wildcats "O" averaged almost 400 yards per game (293 rushing and 106 passing), but that was with third team All-Stater Brady Slavens under center, who posted 32 total touchdowns.

Tayten Boyer (Sr) now steps into that role and will run the Wildcats Pro/Wing T offense, a scheme that has proved very successful for Warsaw. Boyer was a second team All-Conference selection last season when he lined up mostly at tight end. There, he hauled in 10 receptions for 130 yards and 1 touchdown. Taking minimal snaps for the Wildcats, he also completed 8 of 16 passes for 180 yards and 2 touchdowns.

"Tayten has done a great job making the transition to quarterback for us this year and we have a lot of experienced offensive weapons to compliment him," said Warsaw offensive coordinator Danny Morrison.

The Wildcats backfield will boast two returning starters who will help share the rushing duties. Nick Bagley (Sr) and Gage Whitaker (Sr) were both named to All-Ozark Highlands Conference teams last season. Bagley posted a line of 558 rushing yards with 6 touchdowns while Whitaker ran for 538 yards and 9 scores. Each back also caught 1 touchdown through the air. Bagley is probably Warsaw's most physical runner and does his best work between the tackles while Whitaker, who can also gain some tough yards, may exhibit a touch more explosiveness.

On the outside, wide receiver Cameron Seevers (Sr) is back for his final campaign in the green and black. Seevers went for 740 yards receiving and 11 total touchdowns last season en route to picking up several post-season honors. He was, undoubtedly, the Wildcats most prolific downfield threat.

Others to watch in the Warsaw offense could include Jayce Depriest (So, TE), Ty Williams (So, RB) and Nate Banfield (So, WR).

Success in the Wildcats offense requires an offensive line that can open holes and move defenders around, if only for a blink. That line will be anchored at center by its only returning member in Devon Boul (Jr). But Coach Boyer is confident in his unit's ability to do their jobs and execute.

"We're young up front, but they're a hard working bunch," Boyer said.

Other players who may see time on that line include: Hudson Karr (Sr), Austin Schibi (Jr), Elliot Kowal (Jr) and Riley Taylor (Jr). At times, any may be charged with protecting a Wildcats offense that can punish opposing defenses through the air or on the ground.

A ton of talent makes its way back on the Wildcats' defense. Bagley will lead the unit from his linebacker position, along with Whitaker, Depriest and Boyer. Boyer's athletic skill set, however, will allow defensive coordinator Leon Miller to play him at different levels of his 3-4 defense.

Seevers will be the leader in the Wildcats' defensive backfield. He picked up 6 interceptions last season for a team that ended up +12 in the turnover battle. Wil-

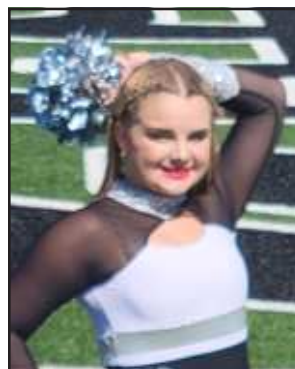

liams was also a starter last year as he has shown the ability to close a gap on opposing receivers in no time at all. For an underclassman, Williams totes all the tools to eventually be a lockdown defender. Banfield will also see plenty of time in the secondary after taking over early last season after an injury to James Kellner.

The defensive front of Warsaw will feature Wyatt Gemes (Jr) who is long and can cause some real mismatches for opponents. Taylor could see time at multiple positions, but will mostly play down for the green and black defense as they look to improve even more after surrendering just a stingy 16 points per game last year. Hoping to join those two on a hopefully disruptive front will be Boul, Schibi and Karr.

"On defense, our motto is 'fast and physical'," Boyer said. "And these kids have done a great job of buying into that."

The offense has continued to show consistent improvement over the last few seasons and there is no reason to expect anything different this year. The Wildcats return plenty of talent and have the ability to move the football up and down the field, putting many points on the board along the way. If the Warsaw defense can build on last season, and they have the talent and experience to do exactly that, there is no reason that 2022 can't be even better.
