Revised Bed Tax Deemed More Fair For Benton County

The Benton County Commissioners passed revisions to the county's guest tax ordinance on Monday. Benton County voters approved the tax for Benton County to collect a lodging tax on all hotel, motel and cabin room transient guest rooms in Benton County at a rate of 3% of the total lodging room rentals on an April 3, 2010 ballot.

The transient guest tax applies only to transient guests, meaning a person or persons who occupy a room for thirty one days or less during any calendar quarter. Section 67.1003 of the Revised Missouri State Statutes authorizes communities the ability to approve up to 5% per occupied room per night. Mainly visitors to Benton County lodges,

largely out of town or out of state visitors would pay this tax. Benton County Commis-

sioners issued an operating resolution for Benton County Tourism & Recreation (BCTR) to manage the transient guest funds since is inception. BCTR provides an annual plan to the Commissioners for approval and updates are

given on a semi-annual basis. These funds are used for tourism development and promotional projects to increase tourism in Benton County. The Annual Marketing Plan can be found

Jeannie Arnold, also a board member, said that the group was saving up to purchase a pickup to help them deliver and pick up food.

"Our mission is to provide food and related products for residents in need in Benton County and the surrounding area. We are currently open Monday thru Thursday from 9 AM until noon and then 1 PM until 3 PM," said Arnold. "All of our staff are volunteers. Any money we receive goes to purchasing food to help those in need."

In 2018, The Food Pantry gave 990,449 pounds of food to individuals and families in Benton County from the Food Bank in Columbia. That number does not include the donations from local people or donaand realizing their dreams. Hare began her career in real estate when she was coowner of Lakeside Resort on Cole Camp Creek.

"There was really nothing else around Lakeside and many of our customers would ask about resort homes to purchase," Hare said.

Hare researched what she needed to do to become a real estate agent, took a class in Kansas City then took the test to become an agent and then a broker.

Local real estate agent Paul Shinn owned Osage Realty at the time and Hare wanted to work in the business. Shinn then brought Re/ Max to Warsaw and Hare went to work as a sales agent.

Krysti Woods bought the business from Shinn and she and Hare worked together. Hare then bought the business from Woods in 2003.

Presently, Re/Max has four licensed agents: Hare, Krysti Woods, who has 24 years of experience, Danielle Baker and Renee Mainprize, who is also the office administrator.

Hare is most proud of the many awards her office has won over the past two decades. Those awards represent the work her agents out into Re/Max as they have been one of the top ten agencies in the Mid States Region. This past year Re/Max of Warsaw had the third highest average number of transactions per associate in an agency with one to five associates. "Being in the real estate business is hard work," Hare said. "We come in early and stay late. When I started in this business we would have maybe one page of documents. Today it is seven. There is a tremendous amount of paperwork involved in a transaction." Hare said one the most rewarding aspects of her job is being able to help a first time home buyer realize the dream of owning a home. "My advice to any home buyer is to make sure his or her credit score is between 650 and 800 and to take care of any bills he or she might have," said Hare. 


Starting center Junior Logan Strunk stated, "I will just say it. We are 4-0 out of the gate."



at www.visitbentoncomo. com along with the annual budget and line items.

According to BCTR the need for revisions included verbiage to include all shortterm rental properties. The previous ordinance did not include any "bed and breakfast, tourist home or house, apartment house, public or private club, mobile home, house trailer at a fixed location, river craft or barge or other short term rental or nightly rental property" per the revised Ordinance.

"With the rising increase in short-term rental homes in Benton County, the requirements to pay the transient guest tax should be the same for all operators renting whether it is a motel or a lake house, " said Lynette Stokes BCTR Director.

Other reasons given for the revised Ordinance include ensuring there is verbiage for all non paying lodges to be held accountable, including stricter penalties and fines and a request for personal information from operators if a lawsuit or liens are necessary to be filed. The ability to review tax records for purposes of verifying accurate income was also cited, which eliminates any Operator submitting false transient guest forms with inaccurate information.

"We currently have over a dozen known individual rental properties that we are not receiving revenue from with nightly rental rates ranging from \$50.00 to \$250.00. In addition, a few of the lodges that have been paying are paying late with no interest or penalties. There have been several lodges that have allegedly falsified their lodging tax information. This is not fair to the ones paying and it's not fair non-payers get the same benefits such as marketing, as the ones who pay on time. The revised ordinance covers all of this so there are no grey areas," commented Stokes.

BCTR cited one area motel that has been in default since 2017 and currently owes nearly \$2,000 in back taxes that does not include the past two years

This old world is full of mysteries, isn't it? Some of them are right on our doorstep. There are a series of fascinating rock carvings around Truman Lake and the Osage River. There is one that sits on the shore at Shawnee Bend. Now that the water is going down, it can be seen again. No one can be found who knows anything about it. A number of people who have looked at it believe the face is that of a Native American. Others feel it's European in nature. A friend who has connections going back many years states there are many other carvings, some perched above what used to be remote valleys which are now on the shores of Truman Lake. Are these from antiquity or modern times? European traders are believed to have been in Benton County as early as the 1500's. This might explain the European features on the Shawnee Bend carving. The Enterprise archives contain a report that says "the great stone face" on Mt. Jackson where the Middle Swinging Bridge once stood in Warsaw, was carved in 1932 by Joe Bennett. He was building rock gardens at the time and was on the slope of Mt. Jackson looking for small shells. Bennett spotted an outcropping of rock that resembled a man's face and he went to work on it during his spare time. When it was finished, the face measured 24 inches in length and 14 inches in width, with a prominent nose and chin. The left side portrays a happy, carefree individual, while the right is more severe. Who made the other carvings and when, we'll probably never know. There are petroglyph (rock





or months depending on attorney legal maneuverings. This is unacceptable to me, and you need to know the issues that will affect you.

I want to visit with you about the ankle monitoring program the state is forcing on the counties. In my humble opinion, it's another state mandated program that is not going to be funded by the state but thrust upon the counties to try and pay for, manage, and laughably... enforce. It's intended to be a pre and post-trial monitoring program to help keep people out of jail. I will share more on this subject in the future, but please feel free to research everything I've written about.

I'm going to change gears on you. I want to talk to you about installing address signage at the entrance to your property or on your house if you live in an area with multiple properties in close proximity. Those tiny numbers we plaster on our mailboxes work great for our mail man (or woman) to get those bills to us but are lousy for emergency responders. When seconds really count, we find ourselves backtracking looking for those tiny numbers, trying to find the right house to potentially save a life. This goes for all critical services. Central Dispatch (911 building) offers high-quality, high visibility, reflective signage for a mere \$15.00 (cost) in two colors, brown or blue. They measure approximately 24 inches by 6 inches with 3-inch letters. Now, I don't care where you purchase your sign, but please buy a quality reflective sign that emergency personnel can see on the fly, in the dark, at a glance. It may save your life.

I promised you transparency when I became your Sheriff and that's what I've brought to the Office. I have made changes within the Office to better serve you. We have better equipment, better training and supervision on every shift, where before, there was very little. I have done all I can to improve your Sheriff's Office, within our budgetary constraints. I can't fix the issues I've discussed with you, without your help. Jefferson City is where we must go for positive change. We must contact our representatives and our Governor's Office to make our wishes known! My Sheriff counterparts testify every session on some outlandish proposal that would be detrimental to our way of life and I will be there as well. Please, talk to your prospective representatives and let them know how you feel. Hello Benton County,

I wanted to give you a short follow up to last week's dispatch. There are still a few issues you need to know that are going to affect all of us, but I did not want last week's dispatch any longer or abuse the generosity of our local papers, who graciously print this for me.

You need to know that law enforcement no longer has the ability to send repeat offenders (or any offenders for that matter) that are on parole, back to the Department of Correction (DOC) for violating the conditions of their parole. In the recent past Probation and Parole Officers would adopt law enforcement's probable cause statement and petition the court for a warrant to have the suspect remanded back to DOC while awaiting local court proceedings. Not anymore! Now the powers to be (the DOC) will refuse admittance. The process now will require said offender to be released back on the street (due to the recently discussed bail issues) and participate in our judicial process which can take months or even years! If found guilty, a parole board will convene and decide if the parolee will be re-incarcerated. I can tell you that our local P&P folks are just as unhappy as our law enforcement!

In the past, the offender would be sent back to DOC almost immediately to continue serving out the previous sentence. The offending suspect would be brought back from DOC on a writ (if the DOC even held them after delivery) and then participate in court proceedings. They would then be returned to DOC while awaiting their next court date, which could be weeks


