Lincoln Police Will Receive **Bulletproof Vests**

Under new business Monday eve. Oct. 8, Lincoln Police Chief Bobby Greene reported his Department will receive a \$1,063.50 grant to purchase two bulletproof vests for the two officers who presently serve the City. The vests have to be custom fitted. In a related matter, the group agreed to give those officers time-anda-half overtime, for hours worked over 86 in a two week pay period.

The meeting opened at 6 PM, with Alderpersons Janice Swearngin, Katie Hollis, Phil Fisher present. Alderman Glen Nelson was absent. Mayor John King presided; City Clerk Ruth Eckhoff recorded. First business conducted was to approve the evening's agenda and minutes of the September meeting, then agree to pay bills presented.

Sex Offenders Registered With County

According to www.ktts. com, the Missouri Sheriffs Association has accused State Auditor Nicole Galloway of a rush to judgment in her report that raised troubling concerns about oversight of sex offenders. The Auditor's report was released last week and stated that nearly 1,300 sex offenders were unaccounted for, including hundreds who fall into the category of Tier III offenders, the worst kind. Benton County Jail Administrator, Greg Wenberg, who registers sex offenders, states that there is not currently a problem with local non-compliant sex offenders in Benton County.

"There are 72 offenders spread out in Benton County," said Wenberg. "And, 56 out of the 72 (about 80%) are Tier III offenders. But, they are accounted for and our office is 100% compliant at this time. The Missouri State Highway Patrol (MSHP) issues letters to offenders every 90 days and **SEE OFFENDER Page 4**

Party-goers were adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities from Benton, Hickory, Dallas, and Polk counties. They receive services from CHS, headquartered in Sedalia, that include helping them find resources and programs in their counties to help them have lives without limitations. Adults aged 16 and older have a total of five or six social events each year, including the Halloween party. There is a picnic/ice cream social, a winter ball where they dress up and have a catered meal, bowling games and an event in March that sports different themes.

"Everyone at the Halloween party had fun," said Chanisty Lambert, Training Coordinator and Social and Leisure Coordinator with CHS, "Food included hamburgers and hot dogs from the Shriners, and cookies from Subway. I acted as the DJ for the dancing that took place from 6 to 8:30 PM, and we had contests for dancing, mummy wrapping, and costumes. (Continued from Page 1) trains a lot of our guys, including me, and tells a lot of stories and jokes."

Summers had a regular job driving a truck for 33 years, and flagged race cars for 21 years in Topeka and Kansas City, Kansas, as well as in Odessa, Missouri. He said he was usually home every night, but gone on weekends.

Summers volunteered with the fire department in Munsy, Kansas for 15 years until the city took over the department. He had a cabin in Edwards, Missouri, so he also spent about 12 years helping out at the Deer Creek Fire Protection District. He retired from truck driving in 1989 after moving to Turner, Kansas, and moved to Warsaw in 1990, joining the fire department there in August of the same

"I remember some traumatic fires and wrecks where people were killed,' recalled Summers. "But there were times when I was happy because we were able to save lives. I remember a car accident nearby several years ago where it took us an hour to cut a young lady out of her car. Her children were in the back seat and were okay, but we didn't know if she would make it. Fortunately, she is walking and doing fine today."

He said that the fire department was also able to save Cedar Grove Baptist Church when a fire broke out there. Summers was working the phones at the fire station at the time, and when the call came in he drove to the church and took water to the firefighters. He says that the department manages to have a helicopter standing by during some calls in case victims need to be airlifted for medical treatment.

"There have been plenty of calls in the past, but only three this September," said Summers. "Of course, we are also busy with training, especially the new guys. One of the things I teach is how to use the pumper."

Summers said that in his 55 years with fire departments, he has never had one of his firemen killed on duty. Summers also said that he had not been hurt badly during his fire fighting career.

"When we get a call, I pray, saying 'Lord, you have to be with us!'

Summers has been married for 66 years to his wonderful wife, Jo Ann, and they raised five children and three grandchildren. He has a nephew in Arkansas who has been a volunteer fireman for 15 years and Summers concedes that he might have inspired his younger relative to follow in his footsteps.

Main were discussed, but no action was taken. The group was also informed that a \$3000 grant for police radios will be received from the MO Highway and Transportation Commission Safer Roads Program.

Police Chief Greene reported a need for additional Police Officers, and Public Works Director Dustin Koll said his Department has been busy with general maintenance. He added the Dept. has hooked up a bulk water system, and has performed additional work for the recent fly-in and rock swap. He concluded that Higgins Asphalt has finished its road repair work in the City. City Clerk Eckhoff reported that 15 UTV licenses have been issued to date, adding that the City broke even, in revenues vs. expenses, at the recent fly-in.

(Continued from Page 1) these people are required to return the letters to the Sheriff's Office so I can scan them into the system. If a letter is not returned, then a check is made to see if the offender has moved without notice. A courtesy call is made first, and if there is no response, then a warrant is issued for failure to register. Sometimes a letter is not returned because of a mishap, and not failure to register.'

Wenberg said that MSHP maintains a data base on sex offenders who are responsible for following rules and restrictions on the MSHP website. One of the restrictions for offenders is that they cannot live or be within 1,000 feet of a public or private school, or a day care center. MSHP also maintains a map with locations of sex offenders in the state. Wenberg sometimes gets calls from offenders who want to move to the area and he looks at the map to guide them as to the location of schools and day care centers. The map can be accessed online at http:// www.mshp.dps.mo.gov.

"There are sometimes complaints from residents when they find out that a sex offender lives in their neighborhood," said Wenberg. "But I remind the residents that the offender has certain rights like every

Wenberg said that there have been times when an offender just didn't want to register, and that an offender has been found at a school bus stop. He said that there are deputies that can be sent out if there is a concern about any of the offenders, but he advised that parents and guardians always be aware of their surroundings and keep track of their children, especially at school bus stops.

The Missouri Sheriffs Association (MSA) executive director, Kevin Merritt, was reported by www.ktts. com, as stating that some offenders cited in the state Auditor's Report as being unaccounted for, were actually in prison, had died, moved out of state, or are under investigation for noncompliance. The Auditor's office responded by stating that some sheriffs must not have been making updated information to the sex registry. The MSA reported that it had contacted all sheriffs in Missouri who, in turn, stated that they were not contacted by the Auditor or her staff to discuss the issue of registration of sex offenders. www. ktts.com also reported that other counties have information that refutes the Auditor's false claim that these offenders are simply hiding in Missouri without a trace.

Fall is definitely here, the time of year when casseroles become king. As soon as it gets chilly, warming and comforting food starts to take center stage. Fall is often an extremely busy time, especially for those with school age children. For those of us with mono who fall asleep when looking at a recipe, an easy casserole is a life saver.

Several years ago the Bubble-up casserole craze was flooding the recipe exchanges. If you've never tried a Bubble-up casserole, they make a meal easy as it is delicious. Simply combine cut-up biscuits with the ingredients of your choice and bake. In no time at all you'll have a wonderful bubble up-casserole. Hundreds of variations are on the internet, from main dishes to desserts.

The basic combination principle is: canned refrigerated biscuits cut into quarters.

Savory uses cooked protein, sauce of choice, ranging from canned soup to jar of gravy, sweet uses canned fruits, pie filling, etc. You need a shallow baking dish, usually 9x12 so the biscuits "bubble up" and get brown. I once used a deep dish and the result was more like a doughy dumpling in places.

The following are two of my chicken favorites. Bubble- Up Ranch

Chicken Casserole 2 cups cooked chopped

chicken 1 (10.75-oz) can Cream of

Chicken Soup 8-oz sour cream

1 cup shredded cheddar

cheese 1-1/2 Tbsp Ranch dressing mix, (dry, not the

F. Lightly spray a 9x13-inch pan with cooking spray. Set aside.

3. Pour chicken mixture into prepared pan. Bake for 25-30 minutes, until bubbly and biscuits are golden brown.

at least \$15 an hour. In Missouri, the \$12 per hour wage increase by 2023 is at least a start in the right direction. By slowly increasing the wage over several years, businesses can adjust slowly to the increases while experiencing the benefits of increased consumer spending, cost savings from fewer employee turnovers, increased productivity, and happier customers.

I've heard people protest that prices of everything will go up. But that's not what the experts are finding out. People who already have high wages usually save their pay increase, but lower wage earners spend it. As they are paid more, they spend more and stores and restaurants have increased business. All of this generates needed taxes for schools, police, government and many other tax supported jobs. It's been projected that Prop B will result in \$1 billion in consumer buying power across the state involving thousands

of workers. Mary Faucett, owner of Bambino's Café in Springfield said, "When wages are raised at the bottom, money goes right back into businesses and the large community. When all businesses, including the large chains, have to pay a decent wage, it will level the playing field for us little guys and help us grow our business.





Ruminate On This...

Agriculture Leases

Fall is generally a time when farmers and ranchers begin thinking about next year's business decisions. During the fall, farmland and pasture leases are typically agreed to for the following year. We generally field several questions on this topic so a discussion on some resources to help with the decision making process is in order.

One of the most common questions is "What does crop or pasture land rent for?" Unfortunately, there is no short answer to this question, other than the standard reply of "It depends." Pasture leases can be extremely variable, depending on what different parties bring to the table. If the landlord basically provides a place for animals to roam around during the summer, rental rate should be relatively low. The more the landlord provides, such as fertilizer, working facilities, high quality pasture, high quality fencing, multiple water sources, management or labor assistance, etc., the higher the rental rate should be.

Dr. Ray Massey, Extension Professor and agriculture economist at the University of Missouri, recently completed a statewide survey of rental rates. The information is contained in MU Guide G427 entitled "2018 Cash Rental Rates in Missouri". Rental rates for cropland as well as pastureland are reported in this publication.

Dr. Massey has also recently completed the 2018 Missouri Farm Land Values Opinion Survey. Survey respondents included ag lenders, rural appraisers, and farmers.

A third source of information that may be helpful in developing ag leases is the "MU Custom Rate Survey", MU Guide G302. The most recent survey was completed in 2016.

These publications can be accessed on the following MU websites: crops. missouri.edu, beef.missouri. edu, or agebb.missouri.edu.

Once some idea of prices is obtained, the next step is to get the lease written down. AgLease101. org is a website that was developed by the North Central Farm Management Extension Committee and contains information on lease agreements as well as sample lease forms.
