Warsaw Grants License Reprieve For Businesses

During a 5:45 PM Sep. 4 public hearing, to allow seven Warsaw business owners to come in and pay delinquent City business licenses, no delinquent business owner appeared. Alderpersons then decided that those owners would be given until close of business Wednesday Sep. 5 to renew their licenses. City Clerk Jessi Kendall said Sep. 10 that all seven business owners appeared at City offices before end of Wednesday and renewed their business licenses.

Airport Expansion Takes Flight

Warsaw's Municipal Airport currently has 20 hangars that are at full capacity, with a waiting list

of 11 potential clients. On August 6, Warsaw City Alderpersons approved a \$1.2 million project with B. Dean Construction to build eight additional hangars, making room for additional housing for small engine planes, and increasing the possibility of more air traffic operations.

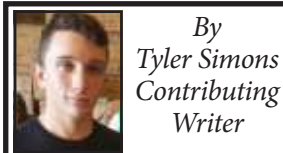
Construction is estimated to begin in the early spring of 2019, with ribbon cutting anticipated for August 1.

The City of Warsaw has been putting aside \$150,000 yearly in MoDOT grants for the expansion, but will still be about \$219,000 short at

the completion of the project. It is expected that the City will obtain a MoDOT Star Loan to cover the shortage and will repay the loan within a couple of years with continued MoDOT grants.

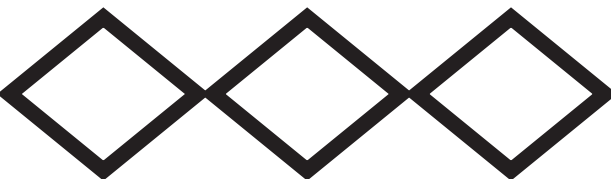

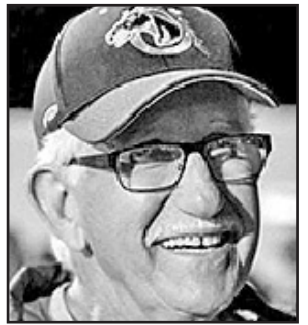

Consider Financial Gifts For Your Grandchildren

National Grandparents Day is observed on Sept. 9. If you're a grandparent, you may get some gifts or cards – or maybe even a phone call! But you might feel that it's better to give than to receive, especially when it comes to your grandchildren. And you can make a real difference in their lives by making a financial gift for their future.

For starters, think about your grandchildren's education. If college or some type of vocational school is in their future, you may want to help them meet some of the costs, which can be considerable. One common education-savings vehicle is a 529 savings plan. With this plan, earnings on withdrawals are tax free, provided they are used for qualified education expenses. (Keep in mind that 529 savings plan distributions not used for qualified expenses may be subject to ordinary income tax and a 10% IRS penalty on the earnings.) You also may be eligible for a state income tax incentive for contributing to a 529 savings plan. Check with your tax advisor about these incentives, as well as all tax-related issues pertaining to 529 savings plans.

A 529 savings plan's contribution limits are quite generous. And, as the owner of a 529 plan, you have flexibility in choosing where the money goes – if your grandchild decides against college or another type of advanced education, you can transfer the plan to another beneficiary. And due to recent tax law changes, the scope of 529 plans has been expanded to include qualified withdrawals of up to \$10,000 for tuition expenses per year per beneficiary at public, private or religious elementary or secondary schools. Be aware, though, that a 529 savings plan could affect any financial assistance your grandchild might receive. Although a 529 plan owned by a grandparent won't be reported as an asset on the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), withdrawals from the plan are treated as untaxed income to the beneficiary (i.e., your grandchild) — and that has a big impact on financial aid. So, you may want to contact a financial aid professional about the potential effects of any gifts you're considering.

A 529 savings plan isn't the only financial gift you could give to your grandchildren. You also might consider giving them shares of stock, possibly held in a custodial account, usually known as an UTMA or UGMA account. However, you only control a custodial account until your grandchildren reach the age of majority as defined by state law, at which time they take it over. They then can use the money for whatever they want – and their plans may not have anything to do with books or classes.

Still, your grandchildren might be particularly

interested in owning the stocks contained in the custodial account – many young people enjoy owning shares of companies that make familiar products. And your gift may even get your grandchildren interested in long-term investing.

No matter what type of financial gifts you give to your grandchildren, make sure your keep enough money to pay for your own needs. It's important to balance your personal savings needs with your desire to be generous.

Giving financial gifts can be rewarding – to you and your grandchildren. Consider exploring some possibilities soon.

End of the tomato season and I had a miserable one. I love tomatoes of all types and unfortunately for me this year was a bust. All my starts looked good; with 20 different varieties. One of my favorite presentations is a platter of multi colored tomatoes drizzled with a pesto sauce. Not this year. Between losing my hoop house roof to a micro burst (I still think it was a tornado) and dealing with a debilitating tick disease, the loving care usually lavished on my plants was just not there. However, one type did produce. Baker Creek called it Terra Cotta. My husband called it baby poop. I have to say I agreed with him, a very unappetizing color. I tried several different ways of presentation but no way! The chickens didn't seem to care, so along with the tomato hornworms they feasted on Terra Cotta tomatoes.

My go to tomato when all else fails is the Roma; they are meaty and usually tasty. The following tomato tart is easy and satisfying.

Ingredients
1 sheet (1/2 pound) frozen puff pastry
1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
1 shallot, minced
1 cup (about 4 ounces) shredded Gruyère cheese
1 pound Roma tomatoes
1/2 teaspoon fresh thyme leaves or 1/4 teaspoon dried
Salt and ground pepper
Directions
Preheat oven to 375°. Remove puff pastry sheet from package and unfold if necessary; let stand at room temperature until pliable. Roll into a slightly larger rectangle, about 10-by-11 inches, flouring your work surface a little if it sticks. Roll pastry around rolling pin, and then unroll it onto a large baking sheet. Spread the mustard in a thin layer over the pastry with a spatula. Sprinkle the shallots, then the cheese over mustard, leaving a 1/2-inch border around the edges.

Slice tomatoes about 1/8-inch thick and arrange slices over cheese in three or four rows, overlapping as necessary and leaving a 1/2-inch border. Sprinkle thyme, and salt and pepper to taste, over tomatoes. Fold border of pastry just over edges of tomatoes (don't worry if it's not perfect). Bake until

pastry is puffed and golden brown, 25 to 30 minutes. Cut into squares and serve warm.

Terry Marshall Sr. present. Aldermen Eric Flores and Adam Howe were absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided; City Clerk Kendall recorded. First business conducted was to approve minutes of the Aug. 20 council meeting and minutes of an executive session which followed.

Police Chief Jason Wenberg then presented a citizen commendation award to Michael Henderson, who recently assisted the Chief to subdue a person with whom the Chief was in a fight. Henderson kicked the gun away from that person, thereby possibly saving the Chief's life. Henderson said he thought almost anyone would have done the same.

There was no old business, so the discussion moved into new business, with a discussion of a possible ordinance to set minimum square feet of primary residences in the City. The proposed ordinance will be reworked and returned to the next meeting of this group. Alderpersons then approved an ordinance levying a general revenue tax for 2018 for the City, said by some to be no increase over 2017.

In late business, the group discussed several possible locations for playground equipment already paid for but not yet delivered, then eventually authorized an expenditure of not more than \$8,500 for an analysis which could determine best location. City Manager Randy Pogue said the expenditure is in the Parks & Rec. budget.

Reports were received from the City's Departments, Boards and Commissions, with no comments from the group. The session closed at about 6:25 PM. These sessions are usually held on 1st and 3rd Monday eves, and visitors are welcome. But check with the City offices (438-5522) for up to date information.

Benton County Commission Adopts Tax Rate

The Benton County Commission voted to accept the proposed tax rates for the 2018 tax year at their August 28 meeting. The tax rate will be \$.1350 for General Revenue and \$.2232 for Road and Bridge, per \$100 assessed valuation.

In other business, the Commission met with Attorney Jim Kjar, who presented a petition for a road vacation described as the roadway which lies east of Lots 8 and 9 Block 2, Hazel's Addition to Scott's Pom-Osa Heights, a subdivision in Benton County. Others in attendance were Dennis Hurlley, Joseph Harvey and Pete Boehm. Opposition was expressed to the proposed road vacation; therefore, the Commissioners will give further discussion to this matter as directed by Missouri Statute.

Emergency Management Director Mark Richerson met with the Commission to note that the 2018 Emergency Management Performance Grant has been approved.

County Clerk Susan Porterfield submitted the audit report from McBride, Lock and Associates for the independent audit that is required due to expenditure of federal awards in excess of \$750,000. This audit has been completed for the years ending 2016 and 2017. Bills were also presented for approval and payment.

The bid opening was held for Road District #2 for hot mix asphalt. Two companies were contacted with bid specifications; however, only one bid was received for this service.

District 2 Commissioner Jim Hansen made a motion to accept the bid for Road District #2 for hot mix asphalt from Capital Paving at a cost of \$75.05 per ton. The motion passed.
