Warsaw's Municipal Airport currently has 20 hangars that are at full capacity, with a waiting list of 11 potential clients. On August 6, Warsaw City Alderpersons approved a \$1.2 million project with B. Dean Construction to build eight additional hangars, making room for additional housing for small engine planes, and increasing the possibility of more air traffic operations.

Construction is estimated to begin in the early spring of 2019, with ribbon cutting anticipated for August 1.

The City of Warsaw has been putting aside \$150,000 yearly in MoDOT grants for the expansion, but will still be about \$219,000 short at

the completion of the project. It is expected that the City will obtain a MoDOT Star Loan to cover the shortage and will repay the loan within a couple of years with continued MoDOT grants.







(Continued from Page 1) port's repair shop by Warsaw City Alderpersons, Ashley Perkins of ChaseAero told the group that business at the airport is steady and increasing. ChaseAero was recruited by the City of Warsaw and has its business operation in a large hangar owned by the City. Dave Hadel, P.E., representing Burns and McDonnell Engineers, reported to the Alderpersons that increased sales of aviation fuel can be expected with additional aircraft flying in and out of the airport. The City saw a large increase in fuel sales this year with the addition of ChaseAero..

The City of Warsaw had the idea of a municipal airport in 1994. It partnered with the State of Missouri and the airport project became a pilot program where the State handled aspects of bidding and construction. The runway and tarmac were completed in October 1998 at a cost of approximately \$2.4 million. Ninety percent of these funds were provided by the federal government; five percent from the state, and five percent from the City.

In 1999, the City obtained a ten-year, low interest loan through MoDOT's Star Loan Program to construct ten hangars, a 24-hour selfserve fuel system and terminal. The hangars are Ful-Fab construction with bifold overhead doors that include walk-through doors for easy access. The terminal has a reception area, meeting room, pilot's lounge, restrooms and a full kitchen.

In 2004, planning began for a second ten-unit Thangar, and the project was completed in 2007. Future planning, after the eighthangar construction in 2019, includes the expansion of the apron where pilots park and tie their planes down. The current apron reaches capacity several times throughout the year.

The airport covers an area of 168 acres and has one runway with a 4,000 x 75 ft concrete surface. It is located five miles north of Warsaw on Hwy 65 and includes a tarmac tie-down area and Automated Weathr Observation System. The City has a courtesy car for pilots to use during their business stay in Warsaw.

(Continued from Page 1) County Presiding Commissioner David Dick, and SFCC President Dr. Joanna Anderson. Missouri Senator Sandy Crawford will present a resolution from the Senate, and Theatre instructor Eric Yazell will read a poem written for the event by Dr. Doug Kiburz.

In a press release from SFCC, Dr. Anderson said that students can now choose from more than 70 relevant degrees and certificates. She stated that celebrating 50 years is a significant milestone, growing from its humble beginnings as Plywood U to a beautiful campus in Sedalia and six other locations.

Many high school students in Benton County have benefitted from taking duel credit classes through State Fair Community College (SFCC) that have enabled them to enter college at an advanced level after high school graduation. Students have also had the opportunity to participate in SFCC's A Plus scholarship program that covers tuition costs at public community colleges for two years.

The college offers skills and professional certificates, Associate of Applied Science degrees and Associate of Arts, Associate of Fine Arts, Associate of Arts in Teaching, and Associate of Science in Chemistry or Engineering degrees for transferring to four-year colleges or universities. Continuing and community education programs and classes are offered by The Learning Force, and Adult Education and Literacy provides high school equivalency prepa-

ration coursework. English Language Learner classes assist students with brushup skills in reading, writing and math.

More than 2,350,100 students take advantage of SFCC's 260 online classes, and two degree programs are offered completely online Associate of Arts Degree and an Associate of Applied Science degree in Business Management.

Enrollment at SFCC in the fall of 2017 was 4,742. There were 2,316 full-time students and 2,426 parttime students. Sixty-two percent were female, 38 percent male, and the average age was 24 years. There were 327 faculty members, including 78 full-time and 249 part-time. Student to faculty ratio was 19:1. There were 1,030 dual credit students in 2017; 1,215 eligible A+ students, and 704 who were received into the A+ program. There are 16,000 alumni of SFCC.

SFCC has one of the most affordable tuition rates in Missouri. About 75 percent of students who choose SFCC receive financial aid, and the average aid package for all students (scholarships, grants, loans) is \$5,233.

SFCC welcomed its first 436 students on September 16, 1968. They attended classes in one building with six modular units connected by a hallway. Today, the Sedalia campus has nine buildings totaling more than 328,000 square feet. The college has campuses in Boonville, Clinton, Eldon, Lake of the Ozarks, Warsaw, Whiteman AFB in Knob Noster as well as in Sedalia.

Dedicated Sedalia Jaycees worked hard lobbying for three years to bring higher education to the area, and voters approved the creation of the Junior College District of Sedalia on April 5, 1966. The founding president was Fred E. Davis. The Automotive Technology Building, the Charles E. Yeater Learning Center and the Marvin R. Fielding Technical Center were built under his watch, and an additional 113 acres were purchased for future growth.

Dr. Marvin Fielding was president from 1984 to 1997 and oversaw the construc

tion of the William C. Hopkins Student Services Center, the Stauffacher Center for the Fine Arts, and the Potter-Ewing Agriculture Building. Dr. Steve Poort served as president from 1997 to 2003 and expanded the college's service area to cover 14 counties. Two more buildings were also dedicated during this time the Fred E. Davis Multipurpose Center and Daum Museum of Contemporary

Dr. Marsha Drennon took over as president in July 2003 and launched a capital campaign that resulted in construction of the Heckart Science and Allied Health Center, and saw enrollment grow to more than 5,000 students a semester. In 2013, Dr. Joanna Anderson become SFCC's fifth president who continues to move the college forward through the 2020 Vision Strategic Plan and Campus Master Plan, both of which focus on meeting the changing needs of the students and communities that the college serves.

#### Lincoln Fly-In Rescheduled

In late session Monday eve September 10, Lincoln's Board of Alderpersons selected a September 22 alternative date for the City's annual fly-in; which had been previously canceled due to recent rains which soaked the grass strip municipal air field.

The meeting opened at 6 PM, with Alderpersons Janice Swearngin, Katie Hollis, Glen Nelson, Phil Fisher present. Mayor John King presided; City Clerk Ruth Eckhoff recorded. First business conducted was to approve the evening's agenda and minutes of the August meeting, then agree to pay bills presented.

Under old business, the group discussed the problem of unlicensed dogs running loose in the City, and will continue that discussion at the October meeting of Alderpersons. Police Chief Bobby Greene then said that officer Colten Shapley has resigned effective September 25 to pursue other opportunities. He also presented a monthly Departmental activity report and indicated MO Highway Patrol was presenting a seminar on cyber-bullying at the Lincoln school, September

In the absence of Public Works Director Dustin Koll, PW employee Nathan Lines furnished a departmental activity report, which included information that PW has been doing a lot of mowing and fixing potholes, also has recently cleaned the City's compost pile. He added that PW recently replaced the soft starter on the east lift station, and that parts and labor for the project had been under estimated costs. Lines also reported Higgins Asphalt is in town, working on City streets, that PW has recently moved a fire hydrant, and that the east lift station has a defective pump, which the Department will pull. Lastly, he said City Hall will host a water and wastewater "math" class on October 30.

City Clerk Eckhoff reported that 12 utility task vehicles have been licensed in the City, since recent passage of related regulations. She also said the City has received a \$320 rebate from KCPL, relating to recent replacement of old lighting in City Hall with more efficient bulbs, then said the City has received a deed to the property at 108 East Main, formerly known as "The Paper Place." And finally, she reported that City attorney Cydney Mayfield has left her old law firm, which had contracted with the City for legal services. The group decided to stay with Mayfield, for legal services.

In late session, Alderwoman Swearngin reported that a Lincoln fall market will be held September 14 and 15 in a City park. The event will be sponsored by the Lincoln Chamber of Commerce. The open session closed at 6:49 PM to go into executive session. The open sessions are usually held on 2nd Monday eves. 





#### Consider Financial Gifts For Your Grandchildren

National Grandparents Day is observed on Sept. 9. If you're a grandparent, you may get some gifts or cards - or maybe even a phone call! But you might feel that it's better to give than to receive, especially when it comes to your grandchildren. And you can make a real difference in their lives by making a financial gift for their future.

For starters, think about your grandchildren's education. If college or some type of vocational school is in their future, you may want to help them meet some of the costs, which can be considerable. One common educationsavings vehicle is a 529 savings plan. With this plan, earnings on withdrawals are tax free, provided they are used for qualified education expenses. (Keep in mind that 529 savings plan distributions not used for qualified expenses may be subject to ordinary income tax and a 10% IRS penalty on the earnings.) You also may be eligible for a state income tax incentive for contributing to a 529 savings plan. Check with your tax advisor about these incentives, as well as all taxrelated issues pertaining to 529 savings plans.

A 529 savings plan's contribution limits are quite generous. And, as the owner of a 529 plan, you have flexibility in choosing where the money goes - if your grandchild decides against college or another type of advanced education, you can transfer the plan to another beneficiary. And due to recent tax law changes, the scope of 529 plans has been expanded to include qualified withdrawals of up to \$10,000 for tuition expenses per year per beneficiary at public, private or religious elementary or secondary schools. Be aware, though, that a 529 savings plan could affect any financial assistance your grandchild might receive. Although a 529 plan owned by a grandparent won't be reported as an asset on the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), withdrawals from the plan are treated as untaxed income to the beneficiary (i.e., your grandchild) — and that has a big impact on financial aid. So, you may want to contact a financial aid professional about the potential effects of any gifts you're considering.

A 529 savings plan isn't the only financial gift you could give to your grandchildren. You also might consider giving them shares of stock, possibly held in a custodial account, usually known as an UTMA or UGMA account. However, you only control a custodial account until your grandchildren reach the age of majority as defined by state law, at which time they take it over. They then can use the money for whatever they want – and their plans may not have anything to do with books or classes.

Still, your grandchildren might be particularly

End of the tomato season and I had a miserable one. I love tomatoes of all types and unfortunately for me this year was a bust. All my starts looked good; with 20 different varieties. One of my favorite presentations is a platter of multi colored tomatoes drizzled with a pesto sauce. Not this year. Between losing my hoop house roof to a micro burst (I still think it was a tornado) and dealing with a debilitating tick disease, the loving care usually lavished on my plants was just not there. However, one type did produce. Baker Creek called it Terra Cotta. My husband called it baby poop. I have to say I agreed with him, a very unappetizing color. I tried several different ways of presentation but no way! The chickens didn't seem to care, so along with the tomato hornworms they feasted on Terra Cotta tomatoes.

My go to tomato when all else fails is the Roma; they are meaty and usually tasty. The following tomato tart is easy and satisfying.

#### **Ingredients**

1 sheet (1/2 pound) frozen puff pastry

1 tablespoon Dijon

mustard 1 shallot, minced

1 cup (about 4 ounces) shredded Gruyére cheese

1 pound Roma tomatoes 1/2 teaspoon fresh thyme leaves or 1/4 teaspoon dried Salt and ground pepper Directions

Preheat oven to 375°. Remove puff pastry sheet from package and unfold if necessary; let stand at room temperature until pliable. Roll into a slightly larger rectangle, about 10-by-11 inches, flouring your work surface a little if it sticks. Roll pastry around rolling pin, and then unroll it onto a large baking sheet. Spread the mustard in a thin layer over the pastry with a spatula. Sprinkle the shallots, then the cheese over mustard, leaving a 1/2-inch border around the

edges. Slice tomatoes about 1/8-inch thick and arrange slices over cheese in three or four rows, overlapping as necessary and leaving a 1/2inch border. Sprinkle thyme, and salt and pepper to taste, over tomatoes. Fold border of pastry just over edges of tomatoes (don't worry if it's not perfect). Bake until

pastry is puffed and golden brown, 25 to 30 minutes. Cut into squares and serve
