### Possible Suicide In Warsaw Death



Michael Kephart, a 50-year-old white male, was found dead in the Cedar Gate subdivision near Warsaw on Monday.

According to Benton County Sheriff Eric Knox, Kephart had substance abuse problems and was staying with his mother in Cedar Gate awaiting a court appearance.

"It is a sad situation," said Knox.

Knox reported that the Kephart had died from an apparent self-inflicted gunshot to the head

### Vandalized Headstones At Historic Cemetery Restored

According to City Clerk Jessie Kendall, several stones were uprighted then sealed on Monday. Wommack Monument Com-

pany from Bolivar did the work with assistance from the Warsaw City crew.

"We will keep on repairing the stones until they all are back," said Kendall. "We don't want the stones to disappear."

Some of the stones were broken, so those will need more extensive repair. All the work is being paid for through donations.

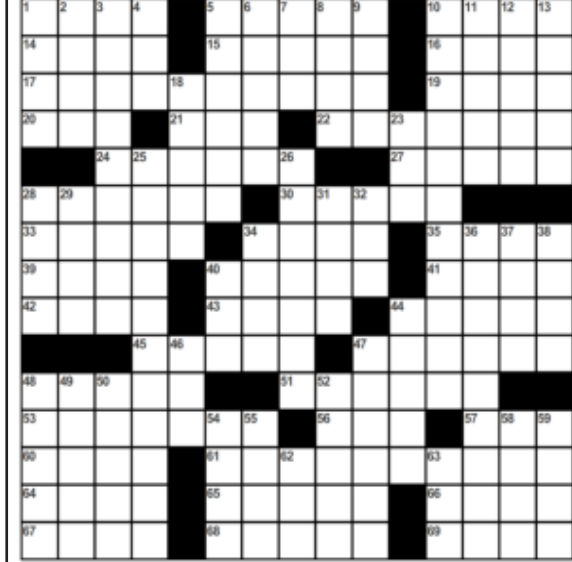

There was no old business, so the group next heard from several departments. Public Works Director Dustin Koll reported the City's No. 1 well has been capped and decommissioned, City hydrants have been flushed, and LED lights installed at City Hall. He added that a starter at the City's lift station needs replacing. The group authorized up to a \$3,000 expenditure for that purpose.

Under new business, Alderpersons heard a report that the City's overfilled recycling bins are not being emptied on a regular basis, resulting in the bins' extra trashy appearance. A repre-

sentative of Henry County Recycling replied that both of its recycling trucks are presently out of commission, but are expected to be fixed soon, ready for service. The group opened two bids for street crack filling and seal coating work. It awarded the low bidder \$59,939.55 contract to Higgins Asphalt Seal Coating & Striping.

In a last concern, before the group closed the meeting at 7:07 PM, the group heard that the Lincoln Chamber of Commerce will hold a town hall meeting, Wed. Aug 29, to explore how the City can become more involved in bike trails and business opportunities. 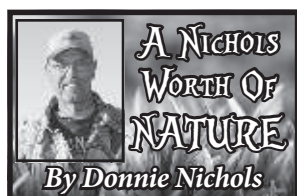

also have the A+ program. This facility is open 24 hours a day 365 days a year for specialty care, stabilizing students until they can be returned to their homes in the community.

Students are taught everything from manners volunteering in the community, giving back to the community, they are taught to deal with daily stress and use their time wisely. Keeping hands busy!

There are 20 locations in Missouri including centralized programs in Columbia, Kansas City, Mashall, Springfield, St. James and St. Louis.

I think it is really important to get kids interested and involved in our outdoor world and nature. The very future of our natural resources lie with them.

Now is a perfect time to get kids outside and introduce them to nature. Butterflies, moths and caterpillars are out in great numbers and are the perfect way to spike children's curiosity about our environment and nature. For example, our grandkids spend lots of enjoyable time outside collecting caterpillars and using their butterfly nets to stalk and capture a variety of butterflies and moths.

There are over 180,000 species of butterflies and moths worldwide, found on all continents except Antarctica. Butterflies and moths belong to the order Lepidoptera, from the Greek lepis "scale" and petron "wing". Butterfly wings, which are transpar-

ent, are made up of chitin, the same protein as exoskeletons of crustaceans, which make them related to crabs and lobsters. These wings are covered with tiny overlapping scales that resemble shingles on a roof. These scales, of which there are about 125,000 per inch, reflect light.

Butterflies and moths range in all colors and sizes, with wing size of less than 1/2 inch to over twelve inches. Weighing only as much as two rose petals, they are capable of flying thousands of miles at speeds up to five miles per hour.

A butterfly's life cycle is one of complete metamorphosis. Four distinct stages: ovum (egg), larva (worm or caterpillar), pupa (chrysalis) and adult. The larva is the only stage in which growth occurs. Ovum, pupa, and adults do not grow. Little butterflies do not grow into big butterflies.

Many species of butterflies and moths live only a few days to a few weeks. Some species of adults actually lack mouth parts and cannot eat. Their goal is to mate, lay eggs and continue the cycle. Some of the species that over winter, the monarch and morning cloaks for example, live as long as nine months.

Butterflies and moths, especially in the caterpillar stage, are enormously important to terrestrial food webs. Ninety-six percent of all bird species depend on insects to feed their young.

After collecting caterpillars or butterflies and moths (which with a little patience can be done with little or no damage) it is very rewarding when our grandkids ask Granny or Grandpa to please get the butterfly or caterpillar books so we can try to identify what species they captured.

Go buy or make a butterfly net, get a couple of reference books, take your children or grandkids outside and introduce them to nature. Help instill in them the wonders and importance of our natural environments. It will depend on this generation of children to ensure that future generations have the opportunity to enjoy our native flora and fauna.

## MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds hunters that migratory bird hunting starts Sept. 1 with the opening day for dove, snipe, and rail, followed by waterfowl hunting with teal season starting Sept. 8.

Mourning doves, Eurasian collared doves, and white-winged doves may be taken from Sept. 1 through Nov. 29 from one half hour before sunrise to sunset with a combined daily limit of 15 and a combined possession limit of 45 for all species. MDC provides numerous conservation areas around the state for dove hunting, including many planted with crops of sunflower, corn, millet, wheat, and buckwheat to attract the popular game birds. Find conservation areas for dove hunting and dove-field maps online at [nature.mdc.mo.gov/discover-nature/places/dove-hunting-areas](http://nature.mdc.mo.gov/discover-nature/places/dove-hunting-areas).

Wilson's snipe (common snipe) may be taken from Sept. 1 through Dec. 16 from one half hour before sunrise to sunset with a daily limit of 8 and a possession limit of 24.

Sora and Virginia rail may be taken from Sept. 1 through Nov. 9 from one half hour before sunrise to sunset with a combined daily limit of 25 and a com-

bined possession limit of 75 for both species.

Blue-winged, green-winged, and cinnamon teal season runs Sept. 8 - 23 from sunrise to sunset with a combined daily limit of 6 and a combined possession limit of 18 for all species.

American woodcock season runs Oct. 15 through Nov. 28 from one half hour before sunrise to sunset with a daily limit of 3 and a possession limit of 9.

Duck and coot season is divided by three geographic zones with hunting allowed one-half hour before sunrise to sunset. The North Zone season runs Nov. 3 through Jan. 1, 2019; the Middle Zone Nov. 3 through 9 and Nov. 15 through Jan. 6, 2019; and the South Zone: Nov. 22 through 25 and Dec. 3 through Jan. 27, 2019. The daily bag limit for ducks is 6 and the possession limit is 18 with daily bag limit species restrictions of: 4 mallards (no more than 2 females), 3 scaup, 3 wood ducks, 2 redheads, 2 hooded mergansers, 2 pintails (new limit), 2 canvasbacks, 2 black ducks, and 1 mottled duck. Coot limits are 15 daily and 45 in possession.

Waterfowl youth hunting days for those 15 years of age or younger are Oct. 20 and 21 in the North Zone and Middle Zone, and Nov. 17 and 18 in the South Zone.

Canada goose and Brant goose season runs from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset Oct. 6-14 and Nov. 11 - Feb. 6, 2019, with a daily limit of 3 for both species combined and a possession limit of 9.

Snow goose and Ross's goose season runs one-half hour before sunrise to sunset Nov. 11 through Feb. 6, 2019, with a limit of 20 blue, snow, or Ross's geese daily and no possession limit.

White-fronted goose season runs one-half hour before sunrise to sunset Nov. 11 through Feb. 6, 2019, with a daily limit of 2 daily and a possession limit of 6.

Light Goose Conservation Order runs one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset Feb. 7 through April 30, 2019, with no daily or possession limits.

Get more information on related regulations, seasons, species, permits, limits, and more from MDC's "Migratory Bird and Waterfowl Hunting Digest 2018-2019," available where hunting permits are sold.

Youths who participate in the clinic will also get a chance to hunt doves with MDC staff or volunteer guides at a site in the Clinton area on Sept. 1 and Sept. 2.

This program is an excellent opportunity for youths interested in hunting to get expert training in basic dove hunting skills and firearms safety. MDC will provide shotguns and shells, or youths can bring their own shotgun. The clinic will include instruction on dove ecology, conservation, hunting tips, firearms safety, and hunting regulations.

Advance registration is required. Youths must be accompanied by an adult. They must attend the clinic to participate in the dove hunts. Directions to the hunting site will be provided at the clinic.

### Blue Skies - Block #7 (Make 2)

**Tip: When first setting up to sew your blocks each month, be sure to double check your 1/4" seam and measure completed units to ensure accuracy throughout the block construction.**

Finished Block size: 12" x 12" (unfinished 12.5" square)  
Use an accurate 1/4" seam allowance for construction:  
Sq.—Square, QST—Quarter Square Triangle, HST—Half Square Triangle

**Cutting Instruction (2 Blocks):**  
**Background Fabric (B)**  
-Cut (1) 2 1/2" x WOF" strip.  
-Cut (2) 5 1/4" sq. Cut each sq. diagonally twice. Makes (8 QST).  
**Light Fabric (L):**  
-Cut (2) 4 1/2" sq.  
-Cut (2) 5 1/4" sqs. Cut each sq. diagonally twice. Makes (8 QST).  
**Medium Fabric (M):**  
-Cut (4) 4 7/8" sq. Cut each sq. diagonally once. Makes (8 HST)  
**Dark Fabric (D):**  
- Cut (1) 2 1/2" x WOF" strip.

**Assembly Instruction for 1 Block: (Make 2 Blocks)**  
Refer to diagram for piece placement when assembling each unit. Each unit measures

**D/B Unit: (Makes 4)**  
Place (B) 2 1/2" WOF strip right sides together with (D) 2 1/2" WOF strip and sew along long side.  
Press towards (D). Sub-cut strip into (8) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" pieces. Sew 2 pieces together to make a 4 1/2" sq.

### How Can You Help Your Kids Pay for College?

It's still summer, but we're getting close to a new school year. One day, though, "back-to-school" will mean "off to college" for your children. Will you be financially prepared to help your kids cope with the costs of higher education?

Your first step, of course, is to know what you're up against, so here are some numbers: For the 2017-18 academic year, college costs (tuition, fees, room and board) were, on average, nearly \$21,000 for in-state students at four-year, public schools and nearly \$47,000 for students attending private colleges or universities, according to the College Board. And you can probably expect even bigger price tags in the years to come.

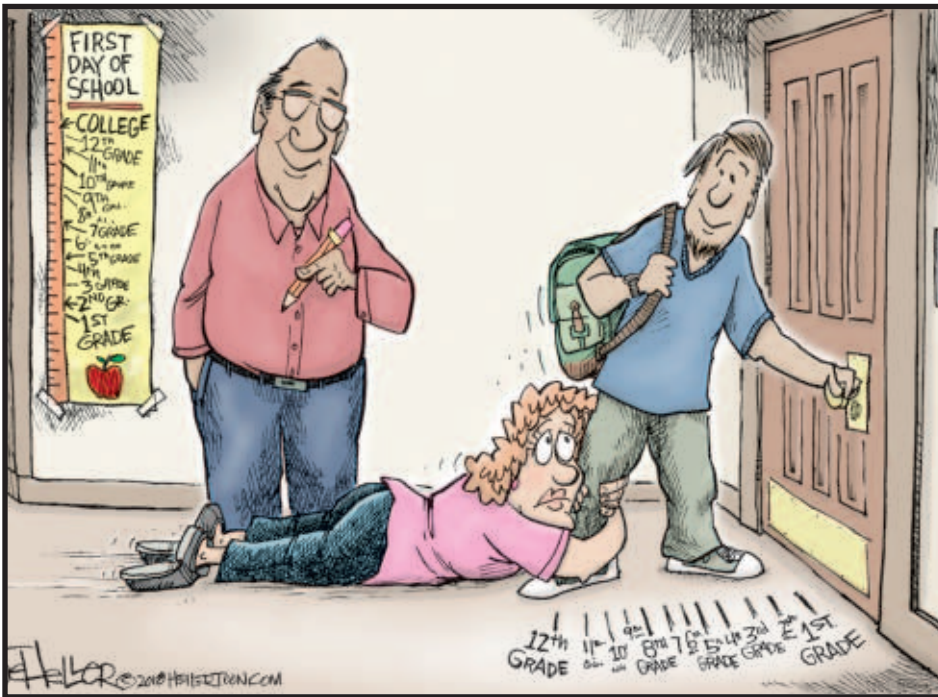
To help prepare for these costs, you might want to consider putting your money in a vehicle specifically designed to help build assets for college, such as a 529 education savings plan. All withdrawals from 529 plans are free from federal income taxes as long as the beneficiary you've named uses the money for qualified college, trade school or graduate school expenses. Withdrawals for expenses other than qualified education expenditures may be subject to federal, state and penalty taxes on the earnings portion of your plan. (However, tax issues for 529 savings plans can be complex, so please consult your tax advisor before investing.)

You can generally invest in the 529 savings plan offered by any state, but if you invest in your own state's plan, you may be able to claim a tax deduction or receive a tax credit.

By starting your 529 plan early, when your children are just a few years old, the investments within the plan have more time for potential growth. Plus, you can make smaller contributions each year, rather than come up with big lump sums later on.

A 529 plan is not the only education-savings tool you can use, but it has proven effective for many people. Yet you may also want to consider ways to keep college costs down in the first place.

For one thing, your children may be eligible for various forms of financial aid. Some types of aid depend on your family's income, but others, such as merit-based scholarships, are open to everyone. But you don't have to wait until you get an offer from a school's financial aid office – you can explore some opportunities on your own. For example, many local and national civic and religious groups offer scholarships to promising young people, and your own employer may even provide some



types of grants or assistance. Plus, your state also may offer other benefits, such as financial aid or scholarship funds. It can certainly take some digging to find these funding sources, but the effort can be worthwhile.

Here's another option for reducing college costs: Consider sending your child to a local community college for two years to get many of the "general" requirements out of the way before transferring to a four-year school for a bachelor's degree. Community colleges are typically quite affordable, and many of them offer high-quality programs.

A college degree is costly, but many people feel it's still a great investment in their children's future. And by taking the appropriate steps, you can help launch that investment.

Still reeling from mono, I don't feel like doing much in the kitchen. So the following recipe, which may seem strange to some, is a savory and delicious easy pasta sauce. It is a quick, no cook sauce and a favorite of my husband.

### PASTA SAUCE: EASY WEEK NIGHT SAVORY

This uncooked sauce is made in a large bowl, then add the cooked hot pasta, toss, adding a little of the pasta water if it needs it.

1-1/2 cups chopped fresh Italian flat leaf parsley\*

6-8 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1/2 cup chopped oil cured olives

2 ounces anchovies, very finely minced\*\*

3 tablespoons capers, rinsed and chopped

2-3 garlic cloves, very finely minced (I grate them on a microplane)

1/2 tsp. red pepper flakes

Mix together all the above in a large bowl, add cooked pasta, toss to coat and add cheese.

Spaghetti, 12-16 ounces Parmesan to taste

\*You can keep parsley fresh for a long time by cutting off about 1/3 inch of the bottom of the stems, place in a jar with cool water, cover top with plastic bag. I use a plastic quart soup container with a top, it works really well.

\*\*Yes, anchovies. They are a terrific flavor enhancer and you won't taste anything "fishy". They are packed in either oil or salt, if using salted ones, rinse before using. And if you think you don't like anchovies but you do like Worcestershire sauce, check the label; it is fermented anchovies.
