#### Page 2 Septagon Set For **New County** Jail Construction

The Benton County Commission voted to negotiate a contract with Septagon Construction to be hired as the construction manager for the jail project at their July 24 meeting. Applicants were scored based upon guidelines received from legal counsel. The Commissioners also spoke to Adam Kuehl, architect with HMN Architects, for advice. References and past business associates were also contacted before a final decision was reached.

In other business, Martin Equipment representative Rowdy Cannon met with the Commission to discuss current prices for grader blades and other equipment.

E-911 Director Susan Canfield spoke to the Commission concerning procedures in her department. She also indicated that it will be necessary to update the 911 mapping system in the future.

District 1 Commissioner Dale Jr. Estes made a motion to accept the bid from War-See JAIL Page 7

## Music And BBQ Waft Through Warsaw

The tantalizing aroma of hot ribs and chicken filled the air at Drake Harbor on August 4th during the First Annual Taste of the Ozarks Kansas City Barbeque Society (KCBS) Sanctioned Backyard BBQ Competition. Twenty teams with one to six members competed to win an overall prize pot of \$1,000. They traveled from Desoto, Excelsior Springs, Overland Park, Kansas; Jefferson City and Republic, to name a few.

Twenty-eight judges picked ten winners in the Chicken category, five of which won prizes ranging from \$25 to \$100 each. The top five were 1) Miller's Barnyard BBQ, 2) Big Creek BBQ, 3) Condition One BBQ, 4) Crystal BBQ, and 5) Double Barrel

## **Warsaw Airport Set For New Hangar Facility**

Under new business, Monday eve August 6, City Alderpersons, meeting at the City's Municipal Airport, approved a \$1.2 million project with B. Dean Construction to build an 8-unit hanger at that Airport. A start to construction is estimated for early spring 2019, to be completed within about 130 calendar days, allowing an anticipated Aug. 1, ribbon cutting. Warsaw has been squirreling away \$150,000 yearly MODot grants for a few years, and will use all those saved dollars, but will still be about \$219,000 short, upon completion of that project. The City anticipates obtaining a MODot "Star Loan" to cover the shortage and repay the loan within several years, with continued MODot grants. This meeting was preceded by a tour of the Airport's repair shop, where Aircraft Mechanic Ashley Perkins explained that business is steady and increasing. Dave Hadel, representing Burns







**Pro Wrestling Memories** 

The recent death of Brian Christopher Lawler has turned my attention back to professional wrestling for a moment. I watched him on Memphis TV for years. He was a hero to those fans and wrestled his father Jerry Lawler on numerous occasions.

There have been several wrestlers over the years to commit suicide and die of overdose. I think of the Von Erich family, Brian Pillman and Jerry London, among others. The Chris Benoit tragedy is another one that comes to mind.

The life of a pro wrestler has not always been an easy one. In my day, they made very little money unless they were one of the top stars. I actually feel like I saw some of the very best of all time in Danny Hodge, Lou Thesz, Jack Brisco, Bill Watts, the Assassins and many more.

I saw Harley Race and André the Giant in their primes.

Jim Ross says Danny Hodge was the toughest wrestler he ever met. Hodge actually lived for awhile in Springfield in a mobile home on the north edge of town in a trailer park. Hodge was an amateur wrestling legend in college. Hodge could break a pair of pliers and an apple with his bare hands.

I understood the wrestling game as a boy of nine. The first match I ever saw live was a Texas Death Match between Fritz Von Erich and Dick the Bruiser in St. Louis, MO. I thought it was real until I put on their holds in the backyard with my friends and I knew something was wrong. However, I loved it for that reason. It was a show and I tried to outguess the promoters.

I don't watch it much anymore. Once in awhile l go back and watch an old time match or an interview on YouTube but the new stuff is something I stay away from.

Wrestling was part of my childhood and I have some great memories of going to the matches in Springfield MO with my father. I also had to stay up late on Saturday night to watch it on TV. Kids today don't have a clue about how far wrestling has come.

I still have some old newspaper clippings of matches in Springfield. Very few papers wrote up the results of the matches like the Springfield News and Leader did in those days.

So yes, I have some good childhood memories of the wrestling matches at the Shrine Mosque.

Hey, I got to go find a game to watch.

Meats could not be precooked or pre-marinated prior to arriving at the contest and the inspection. The meats consisted of wild or farm-raised chicken, Cornish game hen and Kosher chicken. Pork ribs could be spare ribs, St. Louis cut pork ribs, or baby back ribs, and they had to include the bone. Country Style ribs were prohibited. Fires had to be of wood, wood pellets or charcoal. No use of any tobacco products was al-

lowed while handling meat.

Chicken turn-in was at 3 PM and pork at 3:30 PM.

Running concurrently with the BBQ competition at the Harbor, but lasting a day longer, was the Second Annual Ozark Cigar Box Guitar Music Festival. People from all over Missouri and other states such as Mississippi, Pennsylvania, Washington and Illinois attended the event, many of them staying in local lodging overnight. Lynette Stokes said that there were double the attendees this year as there were last summer, or about 2,000 plus people.

Nine musicians played at the event including two nationally-recognized headliners Lazer Loyd and Travis Bowlin, who brought in their own followers. Listeners heard all genres of music over the weekend.

Vendors at the festival included 11 unique food vendors. Two sold BBQ, and others offered Italian ice, funnel cakes, kettle corn, fried treats, gumbo, root beer and more. All eight retail vendors were required to sell handmade musical instruments. One of them brought 18 guitars and sold 14.

There was a Builder's Contest (Build-Off) with five prizes awarded for Best Electric, Best Acoustic, Best Overall Handmade Instrument, Best in Show, Best Three-String and Best four-String. Sound was provided by DB Audio out of Sedalia.

"We want to thank our sponsors of the event," said Stokes. "They were City of Warsaw, Main Street Spirits, Sterret Creek Marina, Campground and Motel, Casey's General Store, State Farm Insurance, Statuary Gardens, C.B. Gitty and Hawthorn Bank, with special thanks to Ye Old Treasure Chest and Bill's Repurpose. These sponsors made it possible to have a free event."

Stokes also thanked the volunteers who gave their time working in the heat making the festival run smoothly.

'We couldn't have a successful event without fantastic volunteers," said Stokes. The volunteers included

I want to thank the City of Warsaw and Benton County Tourism for supporting the small dream that I had to bring the Cigar Box Guitar world to Warsaw."

The meeting opened at 5:55 PM, with Alderpersons Lou Breshears, Terry Marshall Sr., Eric Masoner, Adam Howe, Eric Flores, Dave Williams present. Mayor Eddie Simons presided; City Clerk Jessi Kendall recorded. First business conducted was to approve a revised agenda and minutes of a previous meeting, then okay payment of bills presented. Also under new business, the group approved a bill to allow the City Attorney, or his representative, to enter and inspect buildings which are in conditions that may violate City codes.

without discussion from City Departments, Boards and Commissions; then the group went into executive session about 7:05 PM.






3. People are deceived in believing they do not reap what they sow. (Galatians 6:7,8)




