### Commissioners Look At Jail Const. Manager

The Benton County Commissioners discussed information received in interviews on June 28 for the jail construction manager position at their July 17 meeting. Telephone calls were conducted to references listed by applicants for the construction manager position for the jail project. A decision will be made soon in this matter.

In other business Attorney Jim Kjar met with the Commission concerning a petition for vacation of certain land located within the boundaries of First Addition to Friendly Towne, a subdivision in Benton County. Lawrence Pollard and Heather Hursey were also present.

District 1 Commissioner Dale Jr. Estes made a motion to vacate a portion of a platted road located in Friendly Towne 1st Addition. The motion passed. This property is described as the 50' alleyway between Lots 9-14 and Lot 16, Block 3, Tract 3 and Lot 1, and Lots 3-8,

### Pool Manager Balances Health And Safety

Swimming is a natural and inexpensive way to have summer fun, and is

also a healthy form of relaxation and exercise. The Warsaw Municipal Pool is a popular place to swim and cool off during the summer heat, and its staff members work many hours behind the scenes to ensure the health of visitors.

Pool Manager, Austin

McCall, supervises and trains 17 life guards at the pool and makes sure they are aware of heat related illnesses, are well supplied and ready to roll when swimmers enter the area. He also performs pool maintenance to keep the water clean and disease free.

"My day starts at 7 AM when I check chemicals at the pool," said McCall. Then I make rounds at the Community Building, returning to the pool at 11:30 to check chemicals again and make sure that the bathrooms are clean. I talk to

### Water Assoc. Claims Warsaw Sewer Reserves Are Inadequate

In early session, Monday evening July 16, Liz Grove, Missouri Rural Water Association Representative, speaking to Warsaw Alderpersons, said she had completed a rate study of the City's sewer fund. She found that, while the City's 2018 sewer budget accounts for ordinary expenses, it does not provide for unplanned but inevitable repair or replacement costs for sometimes expensive machinery. People Service Manager Mark Breshears supported Grove's assessment, noting that five of the Sewer Department's pumps have failed this year and needed expensive repairs or replacement.

Grove continued with comments that the City should create an approximate \$39,000 sewer reserve fund, and suggested several ways that fund could be created and maintained, but all plans could mean

lifeguards before the pool opens and help prepare them for their responsibilities. Every Friday from 10 to 11:45 AM, we have lifeguard boot camp when they do conditioning, learn what we need to improve on, and go into water skills training and CPR."

The alluring, sparkling blue waters of the pool don't occur naturally. McCall said that maintenance of the pool is an all day, every day procedure, which must be kept up to ensure the beauty, cleanliness and safety of the water. One of the most important responsibilities is backwashing where the water that falls into drains is filtered in the pump house. Clean water goes into a separate tank and is returned to the pool. If this is not done regularly, the pool chemicals will become unbalanced.

Chemicals in the pool are checked at the top of each hour beginning at 12 PM to make sure of a safe balance. A pH level (acid) is maintained at about pH 7.5 ph. If it goes below pH 7 the water is acid and can cause burning of the nose and eyes. Low pH levels in a pool can be caused by rainwater and other foreign particles getting into the water. A pH 7.4 is optimum since this is the same as the pH in human eyes and mucous membranes.

Chlorine is put into the water to kill bacteria and algae. Levels are maintained between 1.0 and 3.0. When it gets as high as 3.5, swimmers can get skin rashes.

"Chlorine is the most difficult to keep balanced because it varies depending on how many people are in the pool, the amount of sun, the use of sunscreen, and the fact that some children urinate in the pool," said McCall. "Cyanuric acid is used as a stabilizer for chlorine."

McCall said the pool is vacuumed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday for a basic cleaning. However, deep cleaning is carried out on Sundays. He said he has been told by a Red Cross training representative that the Warsaw Municipal Pool is the safest and cleanest in its rural area.

The Center for Disease Control website has a page devoted to healthy water in swimming pools which offers a few simple steps that aquatic managers and staff can use as a guide to assure the health of pool visitors. Some of the steps include operator and chemical handling training, enforcing cleanliness and safety of restrooms, showers, and diaper changing areas, enforcing bather load limits, instituting a preventative maintenance program to replace equipment or parts before they fail, providing disinfection guidelines for fecal accidents and body fluid spills, and educating pool users and parents about recreational water illnesses and appropriate pool use (i.e., no swimming when ill with diarrhea.)

McCall is on duty Monday through Friday, and is on call on weekends. He is a certified Life Guard Instructor, has had management training and is certified in quite a few other pool related areas. One of the requirements of his employment was to swim 600 meters.

Pool hours are 12 to 7 PM Monday through Saturday, and 12 to 5 PM on Sundays and holidays. The last day the pool is open during the week is August 13, because students begin the new school year on August 14. However, the pool will be open on weekends until Labor Day. The pool is located at 929 W. Jackson and pool staff can be contacted at 660-428-2199. Check the pool's Facebook page for closings due to inclement weather.

who wanted to have fun and avoid a New York Excise tax in 1867. As membership grew, some members saw the vision to become more helpful in the community and that group moved forward with their ideals.

Today, the BPOE is involved in many nationwide service projects including the Drug Awareness Program (DAP).

"It is the only surviving drug program in the nation," said Dennis Schoen, President of the Benton County Elks Lodge 2783. "We work with Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and other government agencies to provide drug awareness and education. Our national organization just received a grant of \$85,000 from DEA to use for the program. We have a local drug trailer that we take to the town square when events associated with kids take place there. There are two trailers in the district."

The Drug Awareness trailer was recently part of the Jubilee Days parade on June 9th.

Schoen said there is also a Missouri Elks Dental Van program supported by all 74 Elk Lodges in the state. There are two vans outfitted with dental offices, and one of them visited Warsaw last year.

Schoen said that there is a yearly scholarship program where students are given a specific theme to write about. Their essays are submitted for chances of scholarships at the state and national level.

"Locally, the Benton County Elks Lodge is working with Adults with Disabilities, sponsored by Human Services in Sedalia," said Schoen. "We plan four events a year for them including a St. Patrick's Day/Mardi Gras party, a summer picnic, a yearly bowling party, and a winter ball where they have dancing and receive Christmas gifts."

Schoen said the local Elks Lodge supports the weekend backpack program for school children and also distributes school supplies where needed. They support the Veteran's Home in Warrensburg and is presently planning an Oktoberfest there. The Elks work with a rest home in Lincoln where they have provided iPods and headsets, recliners, Christmas presents, dining room tables and chairs.

The Elks are not limited to regularly scheduled projects. When the opportunity to do a good deed arrives, they jump in and take action. In March, the Lodge donated funds needed to send a person with Autism to a special camp in June. Without assistance, it wouldn't have been possible. In April, they delivered thousands of preschool and elementary grade workbooks and CDs to the Warsaw Library, Cornerstone Academy and North Elementary. They were rescued from a storage area and were to be used as part of the summer school program in Warsaw. In May, Lodge members sent 44 holiday gift packages to U.S. Armed Forces service members who were stationed overseas.

"We are a solid, old volunteer organization and have people with big hearts," said Schoen.

Elks Lodge 2783 will celebrate its 25th anniversary next February.

that allows optimal dental care designed for each unique need and desire.

The dental office, located

at 1631 Commercial Street in Warsaw, provides implants, dentures, same day dentistry, crown/bridges, clear correct (aligners), routine dental cleanings, root canals, teeth whitening and extractions. The office acquired an Orthophos SL panoramic x-ray machine a year ago that does three dimensional imaging as well as two dimension. The machine is used before an implant to make sure there is sufficient bone in the jaw for a successful procedure. It maps out roots of adjacent teeth, nerves and sinus cavities ahead of time to help prevent complications during surgery. It rotates, and provides x-rays of all angles of the mouth so the dentist can determine the amount of space available, and the type of implant to use. It allows a thorough diagnosis of a patient's teeth. About 1,000 Truman Lake Dental patients have experienced the panoramic x-ray in the past year.

The Orthophos SL x-ray can also be used for bite wings, and is a painless procedure for patients who have large boney growths (tori), or reflux gag issues. The cost to the patient (or insurance company) for this type of x-ray is the same as for bite wing x-rays that are taken with cardboard edged film placed in the mouth. The two dimensional x-rays are able to reveal what is going on between the teeth. Most insurance companies cover one panoramic x-ray every three to five years, and one bitewing x-ray a year. This panoramic x-ray equipment is the only one convenient to Benton County patients. It would otherwise be necessary to travel to dentists in Springfield or Kansas City for this service. All of the staff has been trained on the Orthophos SL equipment.

Last year Truman Lake Dental also acquired the ability to put a crown on a patient in one day. The procedure is possible through the CEREC (Chairside Economical Restoration of Esthetic Ceramics) method. It involves a digital impression from the office's Omnicam that takes a scan of the mouth and transfers this information to the milling unit, which then produces the crown. The process of this computer-aided equipment allows dentists to construct, produce and insert individual ceramic restorations directly at the time of treatment in a single appointment. There is also the capability to put an implant with a crown on top, all within a three hour period.

A visiting endodontist sees patients once a month at Truman Lake Dental to perform root canals. This saves those with a need for this treatment from traveling long distances to large cities for the service.

Truman Lake Dental is a full service family general dental office, and has been serving the Warsaw area for 39 years. Dental services are provided by Dr. Patrick R. Lancaster, DDS; Dr. Lucas Carpenter, DDS; and Dr. Brenda Herman, DDS.

Reports were received from the City's departments, boards and commissions, without comment. There was no old or new business for discussion, other than the sewer matter, so the group went into executive session around 6:35 PM. These meetings are usually held on 1st and 3rd Mondays. 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## Benton County Democratic Club



The Benton County Democratic Club met July 18th at the Warsaw library with a standing room only crowd. We even had some floor sitters because of our growing membership. We opened with the pledge of allegiance and then talked about the August 7th Primary Election Ballot. In the U.S. 4th Congressional District Renee Hoagenson and Hallie Thompson will be running against each other. Claire McCaskill has several candidates running against her for the United States Senate. The winner in these two primary races will be on the November ballot along with Chase Crawford, candidate for Missouri's 125th Legislative District and Joe Poor, candidate for Missouri's 28th Senate District.

Proposition A will also be on the August 7th ballot. The proposition is considered nonpartisan as it affects Missourians no matter their political affiliation. Our main speaker for the night was Robert Larm, a retired union carpenter, who spoke on the difference between a right to work state and a state that doesn't have what Prop A is trying to mandate for Missouri. Several others contributed to the explanation after a few members had questions about their understanding of Prop A.

There are thousands of working places that have union representation in Missouri, including stores, pharmacies, manufacturing, automotive, truck driving, and many technical trades. Even Russell Stover candy that first started in Kansas City is represented by the Bakery, Confectionery, Tobacco Workers and Grain Millers' International Union. The advantages of a union are numerous. Wages, working hours, medical insurance, safety and training, working conditions, and retirement benefits are all part of collective bargaining. An individual worker doesn't have power to ask for fair benefits, but a union representative working for

a group can more easily ask for prevailing wages and benefits.

By law unions are required to work for and represent all workers on a job. If workers choose not to join a union that is available at their job, they pay a fee that covers the collective bargaining that is given, but they are not required to pay full union dues. None of this partial payment goes to a political candidate.

If Prop A passes these non-union workers won't have to pay for these collective bargaining services they are receiving. By unions not getting these extra fees, unions will be spending money supplied by union members for non-union workers. This will weaken unions. Robert reported according to the U.S. Census Bureau and U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, families in "right-to-work" states on average earn \$8,740 less than in non-right-to-work states. This means a cut in pay of more than \$4 an hour! This cut in pay affects all workers, not just union workers because companies pay wages according to prevailing rates. Along with wage cuts, medical insurance, retirement, all benefits are also reduced. It is very important for all Missourians to vote no on Prop A. This proposition will be on the ballot August 7th, not in November.

In other business thank-yous were given to members who had attended rallies, parades, and candidate speeches outside of Benton County. Dates of upcoming events were also discussed. The club will be in the State Fair parade August 9th and Benton County will be in charge of the State Fair Democratic booth August 12th. The next Benton County Democratic Club meeting will be August 15th, 6 PM, at the Warsaw Library. There will be a speaker telling about the Clean Missouri initiative scheduled to be on the November ballot.

The Conservation and Environment report was on the Jewell Weed plant. It is a Missouri native and it has been used to treat Poison Ivy and other types of cuts and scrapes. It grows along creeks in Missouri from June to September. You can use the jell inside the plant's stem on the skin directly, or it can be made into a salve. It has been called nature's medical plant.

We discussed the great success of the FGCM convention. The Stepping Stones garden club hosted two workshops. One

workshop was the making of beautiful sun catchers and the other workshop was decorating boxes with beautiful dried flowers. Both workshops had great attendance. Preheat oven to 425 degrees

One long loaf of French bread

Equal measure of olive oil and butter, amount depending on bread size

Garlic to taste, I use a microplane to grate or you can finely mince

I use about 5 large cloves of garlic per 1/4 cup oil and 1/4 cup butter

Dried oregano, 1/4 teaspoon, rub between your palms to crush and release the oils

Red pepper flakes  
Parmesan or cheese of choice, grated

Slice bread lengthwise and then across to form pieces for serving

Melt olive oil and butter in small shallow pan, add garlic, oregano and pepper flakes. Take off heat, dip cut side of piece of bread into mix, place on foil lined cookie sheet. Top with grated cheese, bake until golden.

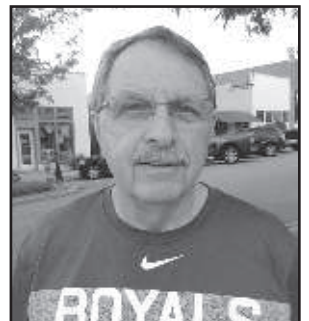

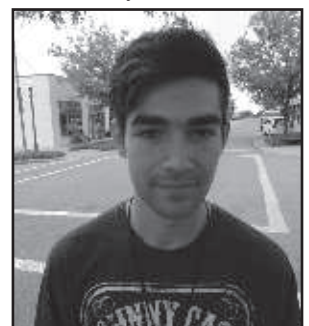

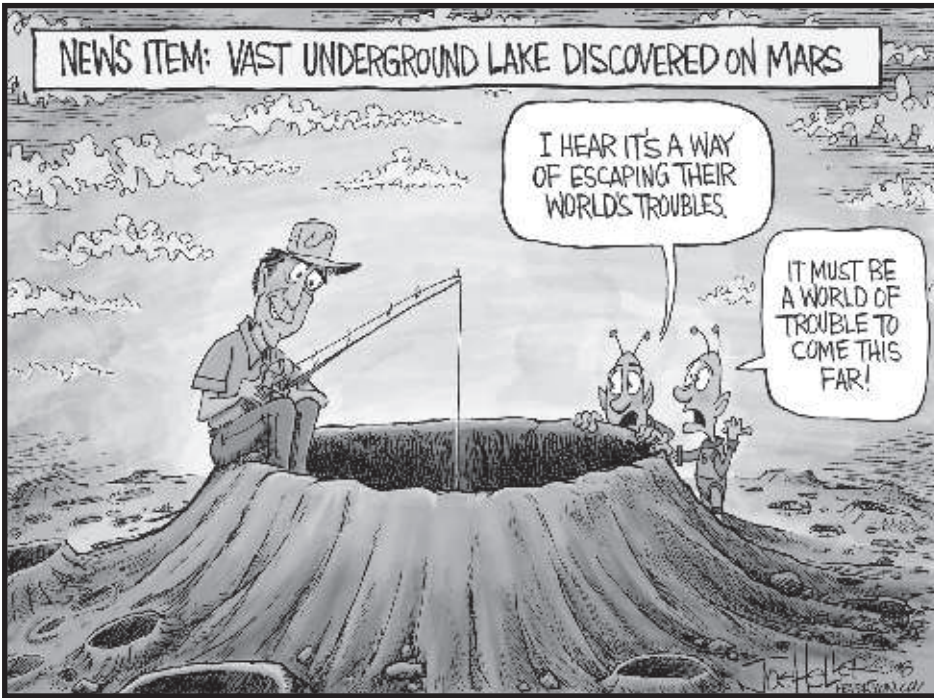

It's very important to vote August 7th. Many people wait for the November election to vote their opinion, but this year there is a crucial issue that will shape Missouri's future for years. Proposition A wants to put "Right to Work" into affect in Missouri. This is bad news! Vote NO! Previously I wrote about how "Right to Work" (RTW) states lose an average of \$8740 per year in income for all middle class families, whether you have a union member or not, and CEO's in these states earn 361 times as much as the average middle class family.

I want to focus on health and health care this week. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), RTW states earn less per year on average, as well as, are less likely to be offered health insurance. When health insurance is offered, RTW states are more likely to pay higher premiums. Missouri Health Care for All states, "If Prop A passes August 7th, over 75,000 workers could lose access to employer sponsored health insurance and over 3/4 of those workers would have children in their homes who would lose access as well."

Besides losing health insurance and paying higher rates, BLS reports that fatalities in the workplace are 54% higher in states with RTW laws. In Missouri

and other non-RTW states training is emphasized which has been proven to increase workplace safety. Less pay brings in more outsiders which also contributes to work place injuries. Jobs that aren't inspected often and aren't up to code can mean inferior construction, again creating unsafe conditions and later the safety of people using the buildings, bridges, roads, food preparation, pharmacies, airline baggage handling, sprinkler system makers, autos, and thousands of other jobs that union presence keep safe. Again, you don't have to be a member of a union for this to affect you.

The United Health Foundation publishes Health Rankings for each state. Personal behavior choices are factored in, but there is a definite correlation between RTW laws and poorer health for workers and their families. When workers' paychecks shrink and they don't have reliable affordable health care, there are major problems. They are also less likely to choose healthy diets with less income a Harvard study reports. The difference between a healthy and unhealthy diet is about \$1.50 per day per family member. For a family of four, that is about \$180 a month.

You've heard the phrase, or have seen the signs and bumper stickers that say, Right to Work means Right to Work for Less. But it's not just the right to work for less pay. Right to Work also means Right to Work in unsafe conditions and the right to poor health for workers and their families. Be sure to vote on August 7th and Vote NO on Prop A.

Someone once said, "A pessimist sees the difficulty in every opportunity; an optimist sees the opportunity in every difficulty."

Any team that loses several all-state players like the Lincoln Cardinals did last season and lose their starting quarterback to an injury would have to admit they are in somewhat of a rebuilding year. Yet, the Cardinals under new Head Coach Kevin LaFavor are optimistic about the coming season. Their goals are the same as before. They want to win their conference, win district, win sectionals, and go on to the final four. Pretty simple stuff on paper anyway.

Coach LaFavor was an assistance at Lincoln the last two years after coming over from Osceola. Athletic Director Adam Curtis remains as an assistant after a year at the coaching helm.

Curtis commented, "I like being an assistant and last year was just something I felt I needed to do after our head coach resigned."

Even with high hopes, the Cardinals are realistic enough to know that powerhouse running back Derek Stephens is gone along with speedster Dominic Simmons. Some of their big bad people on the line also graduated, leaving some big holes to fill. So it will be a different team and maybe a different style and a somewhat different approach to the game.

Their starting quarterback Junior Jackson Beaman is injured and out for the season. Junior Bo Kroenke will take over the QB duties and may be more mobile in the pocket. Whether they throw the deep ball much remains to be seen. Bo is the younger brother of Boone Kroenke, who reached almost legendary status around Lincoln in football, basketball and golf.

Public 1A schools just don't reload every year like private schools do but Lincoln should have enough returning talent to win some games this season.

Lincoln had around 30 kids out for their evening football camp last week. Yes, the weather co-operated for all of the football camps in the area as temperatures hovered around the 80-85 mark instead of the recent 90 plus surge.

Lincoln's secret weapon is Sophomore Kicker Devon Parrott. He booted one from 48 yards the other day in practice and gives Coach LaFavor an option some 1A teams just don't have. However, he may not be much of a secret anymore as he nailed one last year against Lockwood in a game they lost that would had sent the Cardinals back to the final four. So the opposing coaches are fully aware that Lincoln has a talented kicker and apparently Par-

rott has the grit and the savvy needed for pressure situations.

Another bright spot will be at running back. Gage Kahler didn't receive many carries behind Stephens and Simmons but should do a capable job this time around and will be the main go-to-guy in the backfield.

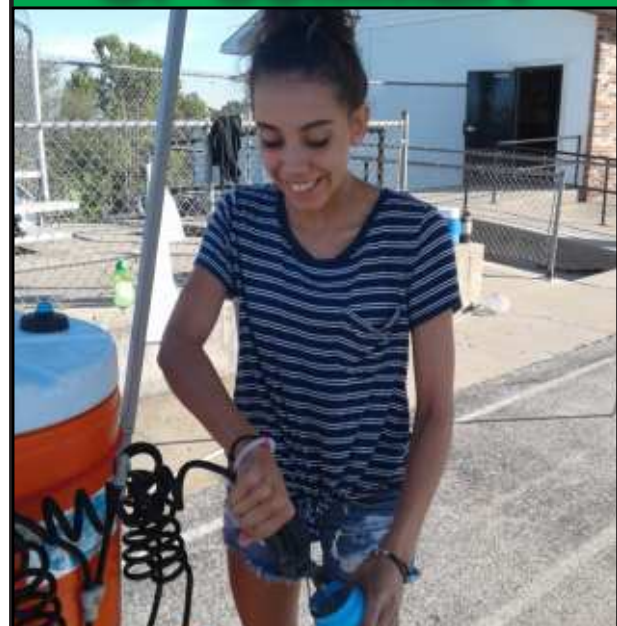

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## Faded Glory

Chapter Nine- Game Day Coming

Victoria Sinclair sat down beside the coach. She was in charge of the school newspaper and wanted a quote about the upcoming game with Viper. The game would be bigger than anyone in the diner thought as reporters from Kansas City, St. Louis, The Torre Times and yes, a reporter from 2018 would be there.

Victoria never looked at Tom as she jotted down what the coach said. She did smile at him as she got up and went back to her girlfriends at a booth near the back of the diner.

Then Billy Tobias sat down. Tom would soon find out another reason why Torre won games. There were no timeouts and no coaching from the sidelines. Coach Morgan would send in instructions to Tobias, the captain of the team, everytime he subbed. Coach Morgan explained to Tobias before every game his game plan down to the letter. So Tobias usually stayed on the court for the entire contest. This kid was smart and the others players liked him and followed him.

This team had all of the parts. Tatum had the speed, Starks, the height, Gotch, the complete player, Torch, the shooter, Timmerman, the best free throw shooter in the state, Doyle the muscle and Tobias, the brains. They were 17-0 and only a couple of teams had come within five points of them.

Many wondered how they would match up with the undefeated college team, 18-0 Viper University? That was a question which would be answered tomorrow. Tom knew the answer, he just couldn't tell anyone. Although he knew the outcome he didn't know everything or every detail about the game. There was no box score ever printed.

The two teams actually had a common opponent in Westmore College. Viper beat them early in the season 45-25 while Torre played them two weeks later and came out with a 27-24 win. Thorhagen had 22 points against Westmore and Coach Morgan was worried that they couldn't stop him. Goal tending wasn't a factor until 1944 when George Mikan came along and swatted everything down. A good six foot plus player was rare in those days and most guys couldn't play above the rim anyway. However, occasionally Thorhagen could block one on the way down. Starks at 6'5 could too but it was rare.

The town was quiet but it wouldn't be tomorrow. Farmers and others would come to town and some would stay for the game. The barber shop talk would center on the big game. There was nothing else going on in town. There was no movie theater and no nothing. So this game on a Saturday night would attract a huge crowd for a town in 1927 with just 500 people. There was no TV. invented yet and few actu-

ally had a radio. The Torre Times recorded that over two hundred fans would be turned away at the door. Fire Marshall Jerry Webb would shut the doors at 6:30 PM, fifteen minutes before the 7:00 PM. starting time. Tom would hand count 136 people crammed into the little gym.  
The game was a big deal for this little town in 1927 but the story was forgotten and unknown to almost everyone around Torre in later years. History and time had buried it. However, one reporter in 2018 was obsessed with the game and was there and he was about to watch it live and in person. It was unbelievable. The coach had order a ten o'clock curfew for his players. Tom couldn't sleep that night awaiting the big game. To be continued...

Greetings, My Fellow Missourians!

I have spent the last several days attending my third Southern Legislative Conference (SLC) which

was hosted by Missouri this year in St. Louis. The 72nd Annual Meeting of the SLC joined together more than 1,300 legislators, staff, and guests from 15 Southern states to discuss regional and national policy issues. The SLC was established in 1947 and is non-partisan with the mission to encourage cooperation and sharing of effective policy solutions to better serve constituents. I serve on the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee as well as the Energy and Environment Committee.

During the event, members of the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee went on an agricultural technical tour on the Mississippi River. One 15-mile section of the river is known as the Agricultural Coast of America. It can handle up to 500 barges per day. Each tugboat pushes a group of 15 Barges transporting grain, coal, fertilizer, and much more. One barge has the capacity of 1,500 tons, 62,500 bushels, or 453,500 gallons of products. The typical 15-barge tow is capable of hauling 22,500 tons or 767,500 bushels; that figures out to be 950 semi-truckloads!

## MO DEPT. OF CONSERVATION CWD SAMPLING EFFORTS FOR 2018 DEER SEASON:

From MDC-Jefferson City: If you harvest a deer from certain counties in the CWD Management Zone during Nov. 10 or 11, 2018, you must take your deer (or the head with at least 6 inches of the neck in place) on the day of harvest to one of the following designated CWD sampling stations: MDC CWD Sampling Stations (You may take your deer to any station on this list.) For questions about CWD sampling stations in Cedar, Hickory, and St. Clair Counties, please call the Conservation Department's Southwest Regional Office at 417-895-6880.

The 31 counties for mandatory sampling are: Adair, Barry, Bollinger, Cape Girardeau, Cedar, Cole, Crawford, Franklin, Grundy, Hickory, Jefferson, Knox, Linn, Macon, Madison, McDonald, Mercer, Moniteau, Ozark, Perry, Polk, Putnam, St. Charles, St. Clair, St. Francois, Ste. Genevieve, Stone, Sullivan, Taney, Warren, and Washington.

MDC confirmed 33 new cases of CWD following the testing of nearly 24,500 free-ranging Missouri deer through its sampling and testing efforts last season. The new cases were found in Adair, Cedar, Franklin, Jefferson, Linn, Macon, Perry, Polk, St. Clair, and Ste. Genevieve counties. These new cases bring the total number of free-ranging deer in Missouri confirmed to have CWD to 75. Learn more at [mdc.mo.gov/cwd](http://mdc.mo.gov/cwd).

The CWD Management Zone consists of counties in or near where cases of the disease have been found. The 48 counties are: Adair, Barry, Benton, Bollinger, Boone, Callaway, Cape Girardeau, Carroll, Cedar, Chariton, Cole, Cooper, Crawford, Dade, Franklin, Gasconade, Grundy, Hickory, Jefferson, Knox, Linn, Livingston, Macon, Madison, McDonald, Mercer, Miller, Moniteau, Morgan, Osage, Ozark, Perry, Polk, Putnam, Randolph, Schuyler, Scotland, Shelby, St. Charles, St. Clair, St. Francois, Ste. Genevieve, St. Louis, Stone, Sullivan, Taney, Warren, and Washington.

To help limit the possible spread of CWD, MDC encourages hunters to process deer as close as possible to where harvested and to properly dispose of carcass parts by leaving or burying parts on site, or bagging parts and placing them in trash containers.

ALSO: According to the Wildlife Code of Missouri,

the placement of grain, salt products, minerals, and other consumable natural and manufactured products used to attract deer is prohibited year-round within counties of the CWD Management Zone. Exceptions are feed placed within 100 feet of any residence or occupied building, feed placed in such a manner to reasonably exclude access by deer, and feed and minerals present solely as a result of normal agricultural or forest management, or crop and wildlife food production practices.

## MISSOURI CATTLEMEN'S ASSOCIATION

### 47 Missouri Counties Placed Under Drought Alert

As the drought continues to worsen, the Missouri Cattlemen's Association (MCA) is in the process of pulling together agencies and organizations to streamline efforts. MCA supports Governor Mike Parson's call to the Missouri Department of Natural Resources to activate the Drought Assessment Committee and drought-impact teams. Governor Parson has been vocal about the impact this drought has had on the cattle industry.

"Missouri farmers are resilient, but with no control over Mother Nature, this year's drought has been difficult to battle," said Governor Parson.

As part of Phase 1 of Missouri's Drought Plan, the Department of Natural Resources' Climate and Weather Committee has been monitoring and logging drought conditions since early January. As drought symptoms continue, the Committee has enacted Phase Two which puts 47 counties under Drought Alert due to severe conditions.

"The drought in Missouri is becoming serious for cattle producers state-wide. Phase Two of Missouri's Drought Plan is essential to addressing worsening conditions. In order for producers to get the help they need, the actual condition of their land needs to be recognized," MCA President Greg Buckman said. "I applaud Governor Parson and the Department of Natural

Resources for making the situation known."

The association continues to call upon its members affected by drought conditions to submit reports to the National Drought Mitigation Center at the University of Nebraska in order for local conditions to be accurately identified.

### MCA Supports Modernized Endangered Species Act

Missouri Cattlemen's Association (MCA) supports the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) and the Public Lands Council in their campaign to modernize the Endangered Species Act. The campaign is focused on educating the public on the importance of ranching on maintaining and protecting the ecological systems of grazing lands.

The process of improving the Endangered Species Act (ESA) has included roundtables with many wildlife, environmental, ecological, and sportsman groups to emphasize the role the cattle industry has in conservation.

"This campaign will help ranchers tell their stories about how ESA impacts their operation and draw that connection for their elected officials on Capitol Hill. This is particularly important as the Endangered Species Act Amendments of 2018 are considered by the Senate," NCBA President Kevin Kester said.

MCA is excited to see this update completed because it will tell a positive story for the ranching family and could improve regulatory conditions in the future. It is important the public, as well as elected officials, understand the need for updated regulations.

"Educating our lawmakers is a constant effort, one that is vital to the industry's success. It is our hope the updated ESA will show ranching's positive role in species rehabilitation and conservation to the public," said MCA President Greg Buckman. "We are excited for the new and improved ESA, as it could provide immense relief to Missouri producers."

Missouri's Cattlemen Foundation Scholarship Program

Missouri's Cattlemen Foundation (MCF) offers an annual scholarship of \$1,000 to 20-30 high school seniors and college students. This year, the top five finalists will be asked to interview. The interview will be held on Saturday, January 5, 2019, in Columbia, Missouri, at the Holiday Inn Executive Center during the Missouri Cattle Industry Convention & Trade Show. During the interview, the panel of judges will select the top two to receive an additional \$2,000.

In the past, applicants have been asked to submit three letters of recommendation as part of their application. This year, one of their letters must be from a Missouri Cattlemen's Association member. MCF Chair Teresa Carlson said the scholarship program is one that MCF values highly. "It is a major priority of the foundation to support the future generation of farmers and rancher and in providing this scholarship, it hopes to make higher education possible for more young people," said Carlson.

Oxygen exclusion is key to silage preservation. Chopped corn silage can be piled on the ground, placed in bunker or upright silos, or put in bags. If using bunker silos or piling on the ground, the chopped material must be thoroughly packed to exclude oxygen. It is almost impossible to overpack si-

lage piles. Building some type of "bunker" out of hay bales is not recommended, because it is extremely difficult to pack the silage effectively, especially the edges of the pile. Improperly packed silage may not exclude enough oxygen and is subject to poor fermentation, mold and other deterioration, resulting in a loss of feed quality. The whole point of chopping silage is to provide a quality feed. Attempting to store silage in this manner defeats the purpose of chopping silage.

Piles and bunker silos should be covered with plastic as soon as possible to prevent excess spoilage due to oxygen exposure and rainfall soaking into the pile. Harvesting corn silage at the correct moisture, and oxygen exclusion are the two keys to successfully harvesting and storing silage. Chopping and piling on the ground or putting the silage in bags or bunker silos provides the best opportunity to conserve a high quality feed that can be fed in appropriate amounts to all classes of beef cattle. There is a \$130.00 registration fee, which covers all expenses and provides the books and materials needed for the school. If a spouse/operator would like to attend with you, there would be an additional fee of \$70. This covers everything except for the materials. The only item the participants will need to bring is an aerial photo of the property they will be completing the system on. Sample grazing systems will be worked up during the school. These photos can be received from the USDA Service Center.

The \$130.00 registration fee is required in advance and will hold a spot for you at the school as space is limited and will be on a first come first serve basis. If you are interested, please contact our office. The deadline for registering will be August 15th.
