Hartzler's first stop was at the American Legion Hall where she addressed the veteran's concerns about health care.

"There is a shortage of doctors and nurses in the VA hospitals which we are trying to change," said Hartzler. "Private hospitals are able to recruit doctors while they are still working as residents; however, the VA Hospitals cannot compete

so they are unable to fill the positions we have. I am

sponsoring a bill to address this issue.' Several veterans voiced

their concerns about how long it takes to get an appointment at a VA Hospital. "We are investing hun-



The count on the batter is 0-2. Senior Kelli Wenberg, the little blond headed girl with the golden arm, takes a deep breath, gets the sign from Kreisel, winds up and delivers, a swing and a miss, strike three, the Warsaw Lady Wildcat's are now the 2010 State Champions.

Coach Steve Larson remembers,"Bottom of the 7th, 2 outs vs. Palmyra-Wenberg was swung on and missed for strike two. Coach (Jackie Downing) and I were out of the dugout leaning on the rail; she looks at me and says "what are you going to do?" I said "Stand right here and watch the girls celebrate."

The game is history but it lives on in the memories of Warsaw players, coaches and their many fans. They were 25-4 and lost only to Smith-Cotton, Liberty and to the much larger school Rock Bridge twice.







**HARTZLER** (Continued from Page 1) in the veteran's administration, but this will take time,"

Hartzler said. Missouri's Fourth District is home to a large concentration of veterans, Hartzler introduced H.R. 3754, the REHIRE Act, which would empower these hospitals with the flexibility to hire and compete with other medical providers. This measure will help improve Missouri's VA facilities and ensure that its veterans receive the highest quality and most responsive care

Hartzler commented that H.R. 3754 will allow veterans to see a local doctor if they are not able to see a VA doctor within 30 days.

Hartzler also spoke of the VA Mission Act; which will expand the 9/11 Caregivers Act to veterans of wars before 9/11.

Those who served in Korea, Vietnam and other conflicts deserve the same treatment as those who served after 9/11," Hartzler said.

After her forum with the veterans, Hartzler traveled to The Landing where she spoke to citizens in a forum sponsored by the Warsaw Chamber of Commerce.

Hartzler spoke to the Warsaw citizens about the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act which she said would give a typical middle-income family of four in Missouri's 4th District a tax cut of \$2,122.

Hartzler said the tax cut bill will allow a citizen to keep more of every paycheck by reducing tax rates at all income levels and nearly doubling the standard deduction to \$12,000 for individuals and \$24,000 for married couples.

Hartzler commented that the tax bill will help unleash the growth of jobs and paychecks by allowing all business to immediately deduct the full cost of new equipment which improves operations and enhances the skills of workers.

Another challenge facing the 4th district is the drug epidemic, which has reached startling proportions throughout the country. Hartzler launched the "Drug Free MO Initiative" to fight against drug abuse, working drug courts and talking to teenagers about the danger of drugs. Working with law enforcement, parents who lost their child to drug overdoses, and motivational speakers, she organizes high school assemblies where young people are challenged to be the generation which chooses to live drug-free. Informational resources are provided to help teens overcome opioid and drug abuse.

"We have to work with doctors to make them seek other forms of relief of pain so their patients do not become addicted," Hartzler

Hartzler also spoke of the need to have fewer people on welfare and instead put them to work. The Farm Bill which passed the House and Senate addresses that issue.

Congresswoman Hartzler made the following statement about the House's passage of the 2018 Farm Bill.

"Missouri farmers work hard every day to feed the world and they need the certainty this farm bill provides. This bill ensures the American consumer continues to enjoy the safest, most abundant food supply in the world by strengthening safeguards and improving public/private risk management programs vital to American agriculture. In addition, the Farm Bill makes significant investments in rural broadband, promotes trade, invests in research and development, and expands conservation acreage.

"This bill contains historic improvements to the SNAP program to help recipients break the cycle of poverty by improving work opportunities for able-bodied adults receiving federal nutrition assistance. This bill promotes

work and individual success while empowering those dependent on government assistance. These commonsense improvements will reduce unemployment and help people move from dependency to independence and self-sufficiency," said Hartzler.

Hartzler finished her tour of Warsaw by visiting Warsaw Police Chief Jason Wenberg.

Hartzler is scheduled to meet with Warsaw High School FFA members and their adviser Stan Adler on Thursday.



Archer was transported to Bothwell Regional Hospital by Benton County EMS with moderate injuries.

The accident was investigated by Tpr. R.J. Chapman of the Missouri Highway Patrol. Chapman was assisted by Tpr. D. A. Paulsen and Tpr. J. W. Miller and the Benton County Sheriff's Office.



As you travel about on our highways and county roads, I hope you have been enjoying the spectacular display of native wildflowers. Our native flora follows an ancient pattern of blooming schedules. Early in the spring the smaller short stemmed plants are the first to reach for the sun to flower and produce seed before the taller plants reach higher and shade them out. It's all about harvesting energy and different species occupy different niches to capture the sun's energy and propagate.

Now is the time of the yellow explosion. Though there are still plenty of white native plants blooming; different species of beardtongue (Penstemon), horse nettle, poison and water hemlock, Indian plantain, Indian hemp, white indigo, daisy fleabane and others plus the non-native Ox-eyed daisy and Queen Anne's lace (wild carrot) but it is the time of the yellow flowers. Tickseed and tall coreopsis, gray headed and yellow coneflowers, brown and black-eyed Susans, compass plant, prairie dock and numerous varieties of sunflowers plus others dominate the landscape. Scattered among this wave of yellow is the orange butterfly milkweed. Some of the pink and purple species are also beginning to bloom. Common milkweed, wild onion, tickseed trefoil (stick tights), lead plant, ironweed, glade and purple coneflowers and several species of liatris, thistle (we have "good" na-

tive thistle) and others. Unfortunately, in most of these areas, there is an energy thief, sericea lespedeza (Lespedeza cuneata), a non-native legume native to eastern Asia. It has no biological controls, is flood tolerant and likes fire. This perennial upright forb is 1-3 feet tall with alternate 3-leafed clustered leaves, usually green with a whitish underside. It flowers in August producing clusters of 1-3 pea-like yellowishwhite blooms with purple to pink markings.

Sericea lespedeza was first introduced to the United States in 1896 by a North Carolina agriculture experimental station. There was little study or use until 1924 at a USDA experimental farm in Virginia. It was planted in part to control soil erosion, forage for livestock and cover and food for wildlife. Research has proved it is only utilized by grazers in the early stages of development. It contains tannins which increase as it grows and makes it unpalatable. Four inch sericea lespedeza contain 6% tannins with 21% at 36 inches. Its benefits to wildlife has not been supported by research. Deer will utilize sericea if it is kept short by mowing or grazing. Quail may

consume seeds in fall and

early winter but the energy content is low and will not sustain them in harsh conditions. Sericea lespedeza has spread widely across the nation and its ability to thrive under a variety of conditions and its tendency to crowd out other species, plus the fact that it is allelopathic (exudes chemical compounds in the soil from roots or shed parts that inhibit germination and/or growth of other species). It is devastating to our native species. Sericea is a prolific seed producer. Individual stems produce an excess of 1000 seeds and there are

over 350,000 seeds in a pound.

On July 1, 2000 in the state of Kansas, sericea lespedeza became the first federally listed forb crop to be designated as a noxious weed, and may soon be confirmed as such in Missouri, Nebraska and Oklahoma.

Unfortunately, sericea seed is still sold in some southern states.

If you have sericea on your property, now is the time to spray - within the window of June 15 - August 15, prior to flowering it can be killed using Remedy or Pasture Gard HL. Be sure to follow label recommendations. It may take a few years but if you are persistent it can be eliminated.





But when we went up to Bethany where my Great grandparents were farmers, we met several people who remembered them and decided I was from there. Now I'm from here. We decided after trekking about for over 6 months. The physical beauty of the area along with the small town atmosphere was most appealing, so we chose to make Warsaw and Benton County our home.

There were two features sealing the deal for us. One was a great cup of coffee in town and the other was the library. And our library is a community jewel. Bright, clean and inviting with a staff that is welcoming, helpful and has never made me, a book worm to the max, feel like the electronic klutz I am. So what does the above have to do with my food column? Nothing; but I am overwhelmed with cucumbers so sitting and writing this column is a break. I planted 5 different types and they are all producing at top speed. I am still moving at slow speed with this tick disease. So most of the cukes are peeled, very thinly sliced and put into my favorite quick pickle solution.

Peel and slice cucumbers very thinly, take out seeds if old or bitter. Sprinkle with salt, toss, place into a colander and let drain for bout an hour. Add to pickle mis and refrigerate.

**Basic solution:** 

½ cup sugar 3/4 cup white vinegar

Mix and add cukes. I put sprigs of tarragon into the mix, use your herb of choice, onions, etc, whatever you

I want to inform Missourians that Vote No on Prop A is just as important in spite of the Supreme Court case, Janus v. American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees. In this ruling government or public workers who choose not to join unions may not be required to help pay for collective bargaining. This overturned a ruling 41 years ago in 1977, Abood v. Detroit Board of Education. The 1977 ruling said no money would be collected to spend on unions' political activities, but a fair share fee could be used for collective

bargaining. The recent Janus ruling applies to only public sector unions such as teacher unions, police and firefighter unions. It doesn't apply to private unions like United Auto Workers, Carpenters, Cement Masons, Painters, Laborers, Teamsters, Garment Workers, Electricians, Textile Workers, Meat Cutters, etc.

Missouri's Prop A, "Right to Work", will be voted on August 7th because the General Assembly changed it from November 6th to the August election. The Missouri Legislature passed "Right to Work" but there was an uprising by concerned people across the state who collected over 310,000 signatures to have this voted on by the Missouri people. Vote No on Prop A is important. Unions are required by law to provide services and represent nonunion workers. Collective bargaining includes contract negotiating and

administration, working for fair wages, number of hours worked, training, benefits and other conditions of employment.

A worker doesn't have to join a union. If they choose not to, they don't pay a full fee to the union. Instead they pay a much smaller fee if they are on a union job. This fee can't be used to support political activities. The fee is used for collective bargaining, and remember, unions are required by law to provide these services. No other entity is required to provide services without charging a fee. Can you imagine Bank of America or Wells Fargo providing services without charging a fee?

When other states have become "Right to Work" states, household income has dropped an average of \$8740. This drop in income per family includes all middle and lower class, not just union families. The unions' collective bargaining has kept income up for everyone because of comparative wages and hiring of local people, not people from out-ofstate. In these "Right to Work" states, CEO's make 361 times as much as the average worker! We need the union representatives to keep part of that money in the middle class, not just

let the rich get richer. Voting No on Prop A is important for all of us to keep wages up, provide proper training and to have bargaining powers. A worker at Budweiser or Hiland Dairy wanting higher wages or more benefits wouldn't stand a chance individually, but the UFCW, United Food and Commerce Workers could more easily work with CEO's (Chief Executive Officers). Prop A, "Right to Work", would cut union funding and all workers would lose out. It is important to vote August

assist with their finances now - for day-to-day assistance and protection from scammers - and later, should they become incapacitated. Again, you will need to employ some sensitivity when discuss ing

•Check references of caretakers. As mentioned above, some caretakers are, unfortunately, dishonest. Before you hire one, check out this person's references. And eve n when you do, be careful - scam artists have been known to use accomplices as references, so you will need to be thorough in your research and questions.

•Get to know your family members' financial advisors. If possible, become acquainted with your older family members' financial advisors. Any reputable connection with their clients' loved ones. And if you are involved in any estate plans, this multigenerational relationship will prove beneficial for everyone.

•Ask to meet any new "friends" they have met online. When someone is lonely, they become vulnerable to online friendships. Sometimes, these new friends make promises of meeting, but never show - and then they

suddenly need money for one reason or another.

It can be challenging to guard against all threats posed by the scammers of the world. But by staying alert and taking the appropriate preventive actions, you may be able to help safeguard your loved ones financial security.

## Statutory Measure

To be submitted to the qualified voters of the State of Missouri at the Special Election to be held on Tuesday, the 7th day of August, 2018.

PROPOSITION A [Referendum ordered by Petition]

Do the people of the state of Missouri want to adopt Senate Bill 19 ("Right-to-Work") as passed by the general assembly in 2017, which prohibits as a condition of employment the forced membership in a labor organization (union) or forced payments of dues in full or prorata (fair-share); make any activity which violates employees' rights illegal and ineffective; allow legal remedies for anyone injured as a result of another person violating or threatening to violate employees' rights; and which shall not apply to union agreements entered into before the effective date of Senate Bill 19?

State and local government entities expect no costs or savings.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as

Section A. Chapter 290, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 290,590, to read as follows.

290,590, 1. As used in this section, the following terms shall mean: "Employer",

individual, organization, partnership, state agency, political subdivision, corporation, or other legal entity which employs or has employed one or more individuals performing services for the entity within this state; and

(2) "Labor organization", any organization of any kind or agency, or employee representation committee or union which exists for the purpose in whole or in part of dealing with employers concerning wages, rates of pay, hours of work, other conditions of employment, or other forms of compensation.

2. No person shall be required as a condition or continuation of employment to:

(1) Become, remain, or refrain from becoming a member of a labor organization;

(2) Pay any dues, fees, assessments, or other similar charges however denominated of any kind or amount to a labor

organization; or (3) In lieu of the payments listed under subdivision (2) of this subsection, pay to any charity or other third party any amount equivalent to, or on a pro rata basis, any dues, fees, assessments, or other charges required of members of a labor organization.

Any agreement, understanding, or practice, written or oral, implied or expressed, between any labor organization and employer that violates the rights of employees as guaranteed under this section is unlawful, null and void, and of no legal effect.

4. Any person who violates or directs another to violate any provision of this section shall be guilty of a class C misdemeanor.

5. (1) Any person injured as a result of any violation or threatened violation of this section shall be entitled to injunctive relief against any and all violators or persons threatening violations.

(2) Any person injured as result of any violation or threatened violation of this section may recover any and all damages of any character resulting from such violation or threatened violation including costs and reasonable attorney fees. Such remedies shall be independent of and in addition to the other penalties and remedies prescribed under this section.

6. The prosecuting attorney or circuit attorney with jurisdiction over the location where a violation or threatened violation of this section occurs or the attorney general of this state shall investigate complaints of violation or threatened violation of this section, prosecute any person violating this section, and use all means at their command to ensure the effective enforcement of this 7. This section shall not apply:

(1) To employers employees covered by the federal Railway Labor Act;

(2) To federal employers and

employees;

(3) To employers and employees on exclusive federal enclaves;

(4) Where this section conflicts with or is preempted by federal law; or

any agreement between an employer and a labor organization entered into before the effective date of this section but shall apply to any such agreement upon its renewal, extension. amendment, or modification in any respect after the effective date of this section.

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in hold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in bold-face type in the above bill is proposed language.




