## The Stomach Bug Norovirus Wallops Schools

As of Monday, December 4, students were returning to Benton County schools. It was a week of low attendance and school closures due to a highly contagious and fast moving illness.

Kevin Smith, superintendent of Lincoln's R-2 School District, ordered schools to be closed on Thursday, November 30 and Friday, December 1, due to the illness of 146 (30%) of its students. The day was **In Warsaw--**

spent disinfecting school facilities, this reduces the chance of further illness through contact with infectious counters, bathrooms and other surfaces.

On Thursday, student absences in the Warsaw School District were about normal for this year, but Friday, saw a sharp increase in absentees.

"Our attendance was in the low to mid 90 percent level on Thursday," said Dr. Shawn Poyser, Superintendent of the Warsaw District. "But we were hosting a basketball tournament with eight schools including Lincoln, and we were

struggling to keep everyone healthy by cleaning sinks, floors, chairs and benches in the gym. However on Friday, our attendance fell to 86 percent at the high school, 65 percent at North Elementary (70 plus absent), and 82 percent at Ruth Mercer. South Elementary was the only school with normal attendance at 95 percent. If this had happened on Thursday, I would probably have closed down schools in the district. But with the weekend beginning the next day, there was the possibility attendance would improve on Monday."

One teacher in the War-

saw School District said the schools were to be "bombed" with disinfectants over the December 2nd through 3rd weekend.

Fortunately, Cole Camp Schools were not affected by the illness that's spread so quickly in other districts. Lincoln's school attendance was much better on Monday, with only about 35 out in the whole district Dr. Poyser reported attendance in Warsaw was back up in the 90s percentage rate after the weekend.

The Benton County Health Department (BCHD) is assuming the majority of illnesses in Lincoln and **See Bug on Page 3**

## Fugitive In Custody After Hours Long Standoff

Benton County deputies were called to Headwaters Motel south of Warsaw at 9:20 AM on Monday, December 4. They received a report that a wanted man was staying in a room there.

Mark Tousignant, 63, was wanted in Saline County for a parole violation. Tousignant had been charged with weapons and explosives

violations.

The Benton County Sheriff's Office was alerted that Tousignant was residing at Headwaters Motel. Cpl. Corpening of the Sheriff's Office and a Missouri Highway patrolman went to the motel and attempted to talk to Tousignant. When Tousignant barricaded himself in the room, the Missouri Highway Patrol SWAT team was called in to assist.

After several hours of attempted negotiations, the Swat Team shot pepper balls through the windows. When

there was still no response from Tousignant, the Swat Team shot tear gas canisters into the room through the windows. At that point Tousignant surrendered to the authorities.

Tousignant was treated by medical personnel for minor abrasions and taken to the Benton County Jail where he was transported to the Department of Corrections.

According to Benton County Sheriff Eric Knox, the standoff lasted about seven hours, with traffic **See Fugitive on Page 3**

## Brodersen Tosses His Hat In The Ring For Collector



**DECLARING HIS CANDIDACY** for the 2018 Benton County Collector position, David Brodersen currently serves in the Assessor's Office. The well known area resident has been in that position for eleven years.

David Brodersen, Field Appraiser in the Benton County Assessor's office for 11 years, has announced his plans to run for the office of County Collector. If elected he would replace Donna Hart, who expects to retire from the Collector position in March of 2019. If Brodersen wins the August 2018 primary election, he will be on the November ballot.

"Donna Hart's husband retired in March of this

year," said Brodersen. "About a month later, she decided that she would retire in 2019. I saw this as an opportunity to pursue a step up to the Collector's position. Friends and people I work with have encouraged me, and support me in this endeavor."

If elected to this position, Brodersen says that he will definitely consider making a change in the way county taxes are paid, **See Candidacy on Page 4**

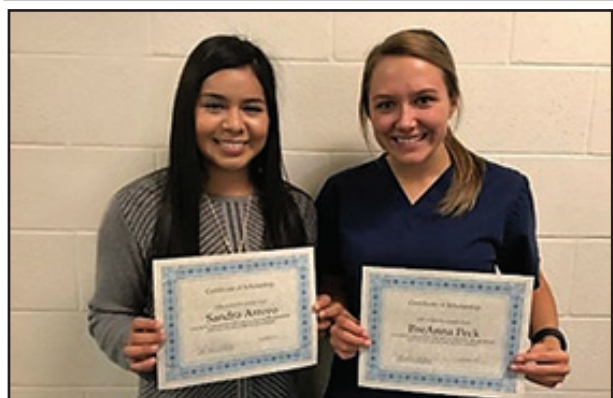

Warsaw are caused by the Norovirus, since a lot of the local symptoms are diarrhea, throwing up, nausea and stomach pain are common with that virus. This disease also goes by the names of stomach flu and gastroenteritis which can involve fever, headache and body aches.

"These local illnesses are highly contagious and spread rapidly," said Barb Schroder, Public Health Nurse at BCHD. "Symptoms usually develop 12 to 48 hours after being exposed to Norovirus and last from one to three days. Children should not return to school until they have been symptom free for 24 hours."

School children aren't the only ones being affected by this virus. Denise Reno, substitute coordinator in Warsaw schools, reported last Thursday that teachers were "dropping like flies." Julie Parker, a Reading Recovery teacher in Warsaw said her nine-month-old son, Brock, began having diarrhea and was throwing up on November 29. Heather Johnson, a student nurse from Clinton Technical School who is interning at BCHD, said her daughter's day care center had to close because of illness. Johnson had to call on a relative to take care of the little girl.

Monday morning a bulletin regarding the local illnesses was issued by Barb Schroder and has been reprinted below.

"Good Morning! This is Barb Schroder, Public Health Nurse, here at BCHD. I've responded to several Facebook posts, on parents with sick children and parents themselves, who are suffering with nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Unfortunately, the Noro Virus "stomach flu" is now affecting students at the Warsaw Schools, along with Lincoln schools. I feel it is warranted to go over some tips to help keep this illness, at a minimum if possible.

Norovirus is an enteric (stomach) illness. It is not affiliated with Influenza, which is a respiratory illness affecting the lungs. It is very contagious, as has been witnessed, sweeping through several area schools. The virus is spread through contaminated surfaces, touching areas, and then hand to mouth. Symptoms are nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal cramps and fevers. Symptoms can last 1-3 days, but the virus can continue in stools for up to 2 weeks. So just because a person is feeling better, they are still contagious.

There is no medication treatment. What is absolutely necessary is plenty of clear fluids. Dehydration occurs with vomiting, diarrhea and fevers. These fluids have to be replaced or hospitalization can occur. Clear fluids can include water, Pedialyte, Gatorade, clear sodas, iced tea, Popsicles, broth and Jell-O. Anything you put in a glass and can see through. No milk products. Don't be concerned if there is no appetite. Our bodies need the fluids, first and foremost. Small children and the elderly are the highest risk for dehydration. Children that are not having any wet diapers, dry tongue and no tears, should see their Doctor. Otherwise, plenty of fluids are recommended.

To keep this illness at a minimum, handwashing is a MUST. Hands should be washed after each vomiting and diarrheal episode. Wash for at least 20 seconds with warm soapy water. Hand

sanitizers can be used, but should not replace handwashing. All surfaces need to be cleaned with a bleach product. This includes countertops, toilets, toilet handles, sinks, faucets and door knobs. The virus can stay on surfaces for a long while, so bleach often. Lysol can be used in addition. Linens should be washed in hot water. People who are experiencing any of these symptoms should stay home. There is no reason to go out and spread illness in the community. Avoid going to public places, medical facilities and nursing homes if you feel ill. Norovirus can spread before symptoms even start. Students are able to return to school once they are symptom free for 24 hours.

I hope this has been informative."

January 15.

The meeting opened at 6 PM, with Alderpersons Lou Breshears, Eric Masoner, Terry Marshall Sr, Adam Howe, present. Alderman Eric Flores was absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided; City Clerk Jessica Kendall recorded. First business conducted was to approve the evening's agenda, minutes of the group's Nov. 6 and 13 meetings, then agree to pay bills presented.

Lynette Stokes, Executive Director, Benton County Tourism & Recreation, provided an update on BCTR's proposed 2018 activities: first noting that she anticipates her group expects better collection results next year on monies due BCTR from the "bed tax." She added that BCTR intends to again financially support a Hwy 7 billboard, with assistance from the county's city. She also spoke of a planned tourism marketing video to include the Benton County Museum, and a press and media tour, plus a BCTR presence at four sports shows and the Missouri State Fair. And last, she asked the City for \$20,000 in financial support for BCTR activities. Alderpersons wanted to know how Cole Camp and Lincoln are supporting BCTR, but approved Stokes' request.

Susan Comer, the City's Recreation Director, then detailed a planned Christmas on the Harbor event, with a parade to begin about 5:30 PM. She said the event will require closure of several downtown streets for a period, to allow for a parade, following a 4 PM performance of a Christmas cantata in the Community Building. Steve Guthrie, a People Service Manager, then asked for a five year extension of a contract between the City and People Service, for operation and maintenance of The City's water and wastewater facilities. Mayor Simons commented that the City has a "great relationship" with People Service. Then under new business, the group approved an ordinance extending the contract.

In late session, the group also approved an ordi-

nance outlining estimated 2018 revenues of about \$4,342,000 and expenditures of about \$4,216,000, a revenue plus of about \$125,000. And in last business, People Service Manager Mark Breshears reported a few complaints about recent water bills, also added the sewer system has been experiencing several pump problems. He said that American made sewer pumps, while perhaps a bit more expensive than foreign made pumps, are easier to get repair parts for.

The meeting closed about 6:40 PM to go into executive session. The open meetings are usually held on 1st and 3rd Mondays; visitors are welcome.

After leaving the meeting, I drove down past Drake Harbor Christmas light exhibits, which have been enhanced each year since this seasonal event began. The Riverboat exhibit, reflecting this area's steamboat history, was particularly beautiful.

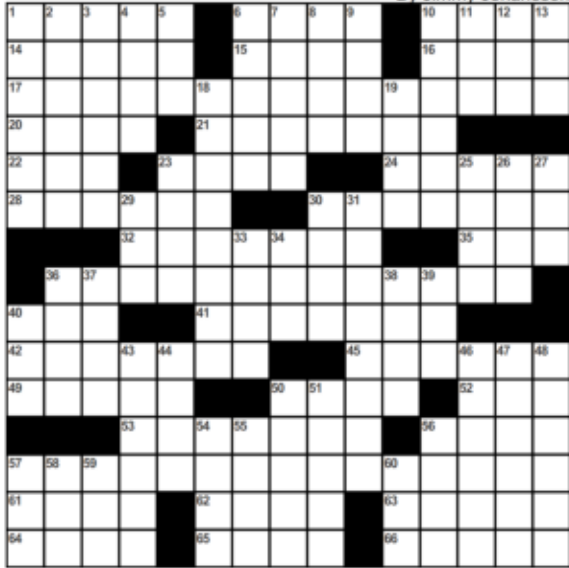

(Continued from Page 1) offering the choice of paying monthly, quarterly or semi-annual. Currently, taxes are paid once a year. His preference would be quarterly or semi-annual, but he would have to research how to make this computer feasible.

"I don't intend to make major changes," Brodersen said. "I just want to work hard for the citizens of the county and proceed as economically as possible since money is tight."

Brodersen grew up north of the local area, graduating from Otterville High School near Old 50 Hwy. He and his wife, Suzie, and sons Ben and Blake, moved to Benton County in 2000 when Suzie took over the State Farm Insurance Agency. He started working in construction for a while, then other part time jobs until he was hired in his present position as Field Appraiser in 2006.

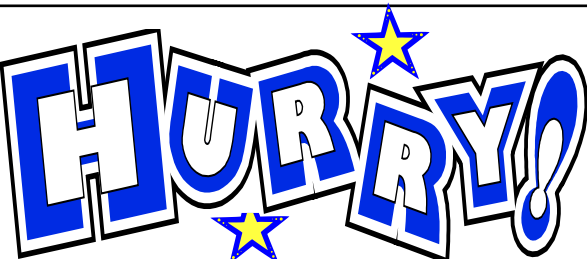

## Hawley Urges Support For Conceal-Carry

Jefferson City, Mo. Missouri Attorney General Josh Hawley led 23 other states in urging Congress to enact national concealed-carry reciprocity legislation. In a letter to Congress, the attorneys general ask representatives to support the Constitutional Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017 (S. 446) and the Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017 (H.R. 38).

"We share a strong interest in the protection of our citizens' Second Amendment rights to keep and bear arms, and we are committed to supporting federal and state policies to preserve that constitutional right," the attorneys general wrote in the letter. "These bills, if enacted, would eliminate significant obstacles to the exercise of the right

to keep and bear arms for millions of Americans in every State."

The proposed legislation would allow law-abiding citizens to carry concealed weapons in states where they do not reside, which some state laws do not allow. The attorneys general argue that, beyond being a basic constitutional right, states that do not allow non-residents to carry concealed weapons leave these citizens in danger and with no real option for self-defense in instances of gun violence.

"States should not be able to deny citizens of the United States the basic constitutional right to self-defense," Hawley said. "Missouri has chosen to respect the rights of residents and non-residents to carry arms for self-defense. I ask Congress to protect these same rights for law-abiding Missourians as they travel throughout the United States."

The states signing the letter are: Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, North Dakota, Ohio, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming.

## Law Enforcement Grant Approved For Benton County

Benton County Sheriff Eric Knox met with the Benton County Commission on November 16 to discuss the costs and payment options of bullet-proof vests for deputies. The Commissioners had committed money toward this purchase due to the absence of grant funding. However, after some investigation, it was discovered that the application for the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant was approved in the amount of \$7,589.59 pending requested revisions.

Per the Sheriff's Office as of November 14, donations raised for the purchase of vests total approximately \$13,000. With these estimated amounts, funds should now be available for this expenditure.

Deputy Storm Walker met with the Commission to report that the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant has been approved pending revisions in the amount of \$7,589.59. Grant funds should be available after January 1, 2018. Discussion was also given to Court-house security issues and renovations that might be necessary.

Consider These Year-end  
Tax-Smart Financial  
Moves

With the holiday season upon us, you may be getting pretty busy. But once the holidays are over, you'll enter into a new season - tax season. The filing deadline for the 2017 tax year is April 17, 2018, but until that date - and especially before the end of the calendar year - you may want to explore some tax-smart financial moves.

Here are a few to consider:

- Boost your 401(k) contributions. If you're like most people, you probably don't usually contribute the maximum amount to your 401(k), which in 2017 is \$18,000, or \$24,000 if you're 50 or older. Unless you have a Roth 401(k), your contributions are made with pre-tax dollars, so the more you put in, the lower your taxable income. Ask your employer if you can increase your 401(k) contributions in 2017. Also, if you receive a bonus before the year ends, you may be able to put that toward your 401(k) too, thus deferring the taxes you'd have to pay on this extra income.

- Add to your IRA. You have until the April 17 deadline to contribute to your IRA for the 2017 tax year, but the more you can put in now, the less you'll have to come up with at the filing deadline. Contributions to a traditional IRA are generally deductible, but the deductibility is phased out if your income rises above certain levels. For 2017, you can put up to \$5,500 into your IRA, or \$6,500 if you're 50 or older. (Roth IRA contributions are never deductible.)
- Contribute to a 529

plan. When you contribute to a 529 college savings plan, your earnings can grow tax-free, provided the money is used for qualified higher education expenses. (However, 529 plan distributions not used for these qualified expenses may be subject to income tax and a 10 percent IRS penalty.) Furthermore, your 529 plan contributions may be deductible from your state taxes.

- Be generous. It's certainly the season for giving, and when you make charitable gifts, you can give and receive. By sending cash to a qualified charity, you may get a tax deduction, but if you look beyond your checkbook, you might gain even bigger benefits. Specifically, if you donate appreciated securities you've held for more than one year to charity, you may be able to deduct the value of the securities, based on their worth when you make the gift.

- Offset your gains. If you own some investments that have lost value and may no longer be essential parts of your portfolio, you could sell them and use the loss to offset capital gains taxes on investments you've sold that have appreciated. If the loss from the sale was greater than your combined long-and short-term capital gains, you can deduct up to \$3,000 against other income, including your salary and interest payments. And if your losses exceed your capital gains by more than \$3,000, you can carry the remaining losses forward to future tax years.

Following these suggestions may help improve your tax situation for the year. So, give them some thought and consult with your tax professional to understand what actions are appropriate for you.

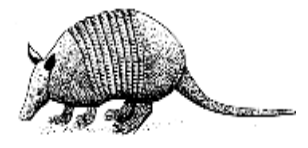

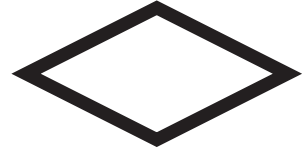
**MO Unclaimed Property Auction Earned \$185K +**  
Missouri State Treasurer Eric Schmitt today announced his office's Fall 2017 Unclaimed Property Auction earned over \$185,000 for account owners, a 23 percent increase over the last such auction. The auction was held in Columbia at the Hilton Garden Inn Conference Center on November 29 and 30. Close to 2,000 items were up for auction including coins, jewelry, sports memorabilia and a variety of other items. Auction items came from safe deposit boxes that have been turned over to the Missouri State Treasurer's Office after five years of inactivity or no contact from the owner. All proceeds from the auction are held until claimed by the rightful owners.  
"This auction will help us ensure we can continue to safeguard Missouri's Unclaimed Property for its rightful owners, which is an extremely important function of our office," Schmitt said. "I'm proud of the hard work our team put in to surpass the benchmark of \$185,000 earned in a single auction."  
Safe deposit boxes represent less than one percent of the more than \$900 million currently held in Unclaimed Property from 4.8 million owner accounts.  
Unclaimed Property can be quickly searched for and claimed on ShowMeMoney.com. Once a claim is filed, its progress can be tracked online at any time. Individuals may also sign up to receive an email notification when new Unclaimed Property arrives and matches their information.  
Since being sworn in, Treasurer Schmitt has returned more than \$40 million in Unclaimed Property to around 167,000 owner accounts. The State Treasurer's Office works to return Unclaimed Property through various means including advertising and direct outreach.

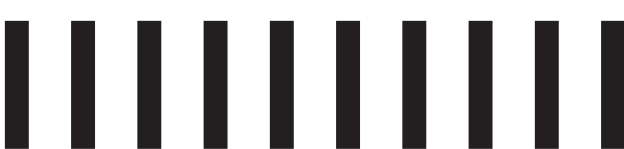

## Financial Aid Tip For Students

Avoid these common student financial aid mistakes

Many students spend more for college than they should by making some common mistakes when seeking financial aid. Follow these tips from KHEAA to make sure you get the help you need.

Some people don't bother to apply for financial aid because they don't think they'll qualify. But they should submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to find out if they're eligible for state and federal student aid programs. Not filing may hurt their chances of getting more free money for college.

Another common mis-

take is waiting until the last minute to apply for financial aid. Some programs have deadlines, while others have limited funds. Students and families should submit the FAFSA as soon as possible after Oct. 1 of each year.

Colleges send each student who has applied for student aid a financial aid package. Students and their families should look it over carefully. They should compare offers if they have received offers from more than one school to see which one is the best deal. Of course, students should also consider other factors, such as whether a school offers the academic program a student wants or if it meets other expectations.

Students who need loans to help pay for college must be good consumers. They

should apply for federal student loans before applying for private loans. Not all private lenders offer the same rates and benefits. Borrowers should pay close attention to what lenders call the back-end benefits: the interest rate and principal reductions offered when repaying the loan.

KHEAA is a public, non-profit agency established in 1966 to improve students' access to college. It provides information about financial aid and financial literacy at no cost to students and parents. KHEAA also helps colleges manage their student loan default rates and verify information submitted on the FAFSA.
