Local Pastors React To Texas Church Shooting

The deadly attack which took place at the First Baptist Church of Sutherland Springs, Texas, on Sunday, November 5, was the most deadly shooting at a church in recent years. At least 26 people died and 20 were wounded. It appeared the lone gunman was after his in-laws who attended the church.

Church shootings are particularly shocking because

they happen in places that are supposed to be sanctuaries; where one can seek peace and love, and worship in freedom. Churches are expected to be the last place where violence takes place. Some local pastors have shared thoughts about the possibility that such an occurrence might happen here.

Reverend Drew Heurion, Assistant Pastor at Cedar Grove Baptist Church in Warsaw, said churches may need to think about security measures more now than in the past. But he said it is wise to plan for any type of emergency which could

include a fire or bad weather.

"The first thing we should do is to pray for this and other churches because we believe we are one in Christ," said Heurion. "We are like one body. If part of our body mourns it affects the whole body and we all mourn. The second thing is not to let fear paralyze us and keep us from gathering with fellow believers. We have internal security through Christ, though that doesn't mean we can't be hurt on the outside. But the internal security is the most important."

Heurion said the third

thing is we need to maintain perspective. According to statistics from the Gospel Coalition (for the period of the 1990s to the present), the chances of a church in the U.S. being attacked by a shooter is one in six million.

Reverend Tyler Poppen, pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church and Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Cole Camp, said the latest news was the shooting in Texas was one person targeting one individual church member. He said this could happen anywhere.

"It is tough!" he said. See Church on Page 3

Winter Warning-- Space Heaters Major Cause For Death

Linda Sinnett, of Warsaw, has a centrally-heated home, but uses an infrared space heater in her chilly basement sewing room. She is cautious around the heater because of the proximity of fabric which could catch fire if it gets too close to the appliance.

Sinnett, a board member of the Warm House, said the organization used to give out space heaters (portable heating units that can be

placed in any room and are commonly operated by electricity) to clients who needed help warming their homes, however they discontinued the practice because of the possibility of liability if any of the heaters were connected to fires. Sinnett had a friend whose small child caused a fire by throwing a blanket over a space heater. Interviews with other Benton County residents told similar stories.

"Several years ago, when I lived in Kansas City, a

neighbor with a small house and kids had a fire when one of the children put clothing on a running space heater," said Michelle from Edwards. "The child was watching a TV program and couldn't hear it because the heater was too noisy. When we bought a house three years ago, it had a furnace that was pricey because it was too large for the size of the home. So we heated our bedrooms with space heaters; but then tried a pel-

A cemetery tucked among the cedars in southern Benton County, Bethel is one of the older cemeteries in Benton County. In the past, week long camp meetings were held at the site and later when a church was erected, services were

"A church is a sanctuary, a place of safety where we receive what God gives us. These things do not surprise me. The church in America has had a good run. We had our heyday in the 1950s and 1960s. Jesus said in this world we are going to have trouble. Jesus said to 'Take heart because I have overcome the world.' When things like this happen, we strengthen people because we are going to keep on doing what we do. There will be no sentinel at the door."

Poppen said that in the Lutheran Church, all of the churches have the same readings each Sunday, and on November 5th the (Bible) reading was from Matthew 5, The Sermon on the Mount. He said that Jesus told the crowd "Blessed are the peacemakers....rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in Heaven."

"My response to this shooting is this," said Poppen. "We will continue to be the Church -- a sanctuary. For those who do these terrible acts, Jesus forgives. I am not going to be carrying (a gun) anytime soon and I will not encourage anyone else to do so. We are continuing to be what we have been."

Rev. Loren Whitsell of the First United Methodist Church of Warsaw said his first reaction to the shooting was that he was heartbroken. "A sanctuary is a place of worship where people should feel safe," Whitsell said. "We recognize there is evil in this world, but when we come together in worship we expect to feel safe."

"Scripture says that we shouldn't live our lives in fear, but this brutal act is disturbing," Whitsell said.

"We of the Methodist Church will continue to open our doors to everyone," Whitsell said. "God's grace is for everyone. God did not cause this to happen but God gave us free will and so this man chose to do this evil act."

Whitsell came to Warsaw from a large church near St. Louis where they had training sessions of what to do in case of a dangerous situation, however, Missouri excludes churches from the conceal and carry law.

"We pray for the people of this congregation and I especially pray for the pastor of the congregation who was absent on that particular Sunday," Whitsell said. "He not only lost members of his congregation but his daughter."

Under Missouri Senate Bill 656, permit holders will not be authorized to carry in the following public buildings (but if they do it will not be a criminal offense): police departments, polling places, prisons, courthouses, government buildings, bars, airports, daycares, churches, sports arenas and hospitals. Under the new 2017 law, permitless carrying will continue to be illegal in these buildings.

On Sunday, the New York Times put out a list of recent church shootings starting with the one in Texas. On September 24 of this year, a gunman carrying two pistols opened fire as Sunday services were ending at the Burnette Chapel Church of Christ in Antioch, Tennessee. He killed one person and wounded seven others. On June 17, 2015, nine people at a Bible Study at the Emmanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, South Carolina, were shot and killed. On May 31, 2009, in Wichita, Kansas, a gunman shot and killed an usher in the foyer of the Reformation Lutheran Church as he handed out church bulletins after services.

Other mass shootings have been reported in the news in recent years including those in schools. Some of these heinous acts are attributed to mental illness, but one report from www.berkeleywellness.com suggests that gun availability

may be the problem.

let stove that did not warm all the rooms. We eventually went back to using the furnace, and meanwhile are building a new house with mini efficient units."

The National Fire Protection Association reports on its website that 79 percent of fatal home heating fires are caused by space heaters. It also reported that half of fatal home space heater fires started because something was too close to the heater and ignited.

Southwest Electric Cooperative (SWEC), serving 11 counties in Missouri, addressed space heaters on the back page of its Rural Missouri publication in November, stating that members should be cautious of claims that a space heater will slash electric bills. It also reported space heaters result in far more fires and losses than central heating devices and have higher risks relative to usage. The article entitled "The truth about electric space heaters" included safety tips for those with space heaters.

- Keep the heater at least three feet from flammable items such as curtains and furniture;

- Choose a heater certified by a nationally recognized testing institution such as Underwriters Laboratories;

- Select a space heater with a guard around the heating element;

- Be sure the heater has an automatic shut-off switch if it tips over;

- Keep children and pets away from heaters; and

- Never leave a space heater unattended.

SWEC suggested that keeping warm in winter months can be enhanced by adding insulation and caulking, dressing in layers, and using an electric blanket at night. Energy can be saved by installing an HVAC system such as ground-source or dual-fuel or mini-split heat pump that provides year-round comfort.

In 2014, 6.4 percent of turnouts made by Missouri fire departments or districts were for fires, compared to 4.9 percent for the nation. The bulk of dispatches were for Emergency Medical Services at 63.2 percent. Missouri reported 2,610 wildfires in 2016, putting the state in the number seven position in the nation. However, the 32,134 acres burned was far less than other states like Texas, California, Arizona and Idaho.

Benton County 911 dispatch reports that the Warsaw Fire District responded to an estimated 75 fires in 2016, and 77 through October of 2017. Warsaw Fire Chief Rob Lane said the fire district responded to 161 total calls in 2016 and has already been dispatched 161 times as of early November. (The last day of November will be the end of reporting for this fiscal year.) He said the calls included fires, car accidents, and false alarms, and that some of the fires were related to space heaters. He advised that no extension cords be used on these heaters.

Lane said when he first began serving in the fire district, there were only about 50 calls a year.

"More people have moved into the area in recent years, so there are more calls dispatched to us," said Lane. "There was a time when no building codes were required when structures were built, so older houses and buildings are more prone to have fire safety issues. However, there are currently more restrictions when building new structures such as national electrical codes."

Mike Rambo, Fire Chief in Lincoln, said they respond to a total of 80 to 100 calls a year, including grass and wild fires, vehicles accidents and extractions and structures. Structure fires make up about one third of the calls. Rambo reported they haven't had any space heater fires to respond to

lately. Lincoln has agreements with Cole Camp and Warsaw Fire Departments to assist each other with manpower and equipment when necessary.

Chad Hammond, Deputy Fire Chief of the Deer Creek Fire District, said most of the calls made in his district are for medical reasons, but that 400 acres were burned last year. He said house or structure fires are due mostly to neglect, or due to unsafe construction or design flaws because of insufficient building codes to adhere to in this area. His own home burned down two years ago when his microwave shorted out while heating popcorn.

"A lot of fires are caused by burning of leaves in the fall and spring that spread when the wind blows," said Hammond. "There are also cases of arson."

Hammond said although there have not been recent reports of fires in the Deer Creek District caused by space heaters, care must be taken when using them. He said coils can get a dust build-up that may ignite when the heater is first turned on in cold weather. He said ceramic heaters were probably the safest because there is no open element. The ceramic becomes hot and then heats the surrounding air. He said space heaters should not be left on overnight. Besides the fire danger, they dry out skin and nasal passages.

He offered advice on other fire safety measures such as keeping chimneys clean of creosote which can build up from green or damp wood.

Hammond said that there is help when an emergency occurs in a fire district that is too large for local manpower and equipment.

"We have agreements with the Warsaw Fire District, so we assist them when they are undermanned or need more equipment, and they do the same for us," said Hammond. "There are also cases like South Elementary School that is in the Warsaw school district, but is physically located in the Deer Creek Fire District. Since we are closest to the school, we automatically respond to calls at that location. The same goes for vehicle accidents on Hwy 7 South. We automatically help with traffic control."

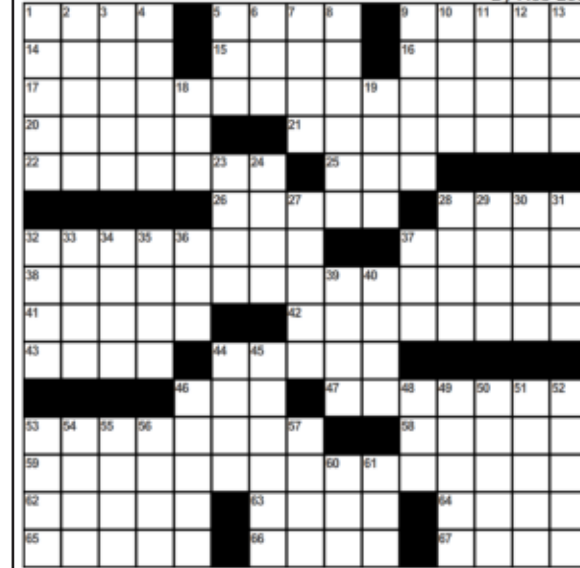

The meeting opened at 6 PM November 6, with Board members Lou Breshers, Terry Marshall Sr., Eric Masoner, Dave Williams, Adam Howe, Eric Flores present. Mayor Eddie Simons presided; City Clerk Jessica Kendall recorded. First business conducted was to approve a revised agenda and minutes of a previous Council meeting, then agree to pay bills presented. In early session, visitor Lynette Stokes, President, Benton County Tourism and Recreation (BCTR), provided a brief summary of BCTR's 2017 activities, which included multiple billboards promoting events in Cole Camp, Lincoln, Warsaw; sponsorship of the Ozark Cigar Box Music Festival,

tival, Movie Night at Lumpe Field, Tour of Trails Poker Run, and the Girlfriend Get-away. Additionally, BCTR did radio, television and newspaper advertising, including www.visitmo.com and others.

Planned 2018 activities by BCTR include development, promotion and planning of a county-wide trail system and continuation of tourist-related events throughout Benton County; also sponsorship of a September 26-29 Crappie Masters Tournament, to include organization and promotion of that event at Drake Harbor, and perhaps an anglers' appreciation dinner. BCTR also offers a grant program to local non-profits for promotion of visitors to attend tourism events and activities. BCTR is and will continue to be involved in much more tourism related activities.

Also under new business, the group approved a \$59,975 contract between the City and Cook, Flatt & Strobel Engineers in connection with the design of the influent lift station at the City's sewer plant. In late session, City Planner Randy Pogue discussed a recent presentation he gave at a MODOT Southwest District Prioritization meeting, at which a multitude of possible projects was considered. He said there is presently no state money for some major projects, but suggested some engineering studies on smaller local projects should be done so when money does become available the studies will have been completed. And lastly the group approved an ordinance providing guidelines for the Police Department, when selecting new officers for lateral movement from other police departments to the Warsaw PD.

The open session ended at 6:30 PM to go into executive session. These meetings are usually held on 1st and

3rd Monday evenings; visitors are welcome.

and the Commission has no power to vacate a roadway in this case. An order has been drafted for Commission signatures stating that because the Commission has no jurisdiction of the subject matter of the petition, the petition is denied. District 1 Commissioner Dale Jr. Estes made the motion to sign the order denying the road vacation. The motion passed.

District 2 Commissioner Jim Hansen stated that asphalt overlay on Old 65 Avenue is complete and implementation of speed limit signs on this road has become necessary. Legal counsel was consulted to determine measures to be taken in order to post speed limit signs to insure safe conditions on county roads. Sheriff Eric Knox and Prosecuting Attorney Karen Woodley met with the Commission to discuss the door locks and heating/cooling issues at the Hawthorn Bank building. Woodley also reported that renovations continue to insure handicap accessibility.

Mark Richerson met with the Commission to discuss possible LEPC fund expenditures.

(Continued from Page 1) one father's desire to increase male involvement in his children's school. With the help of the school, teachers and administration, WATCH D.O.G.S. was created in 1998 at George Elementary in Springdale, AR. Since then, the program has spread to more than 5,348 schools in over 47 states and other countries abroad.

Studies by the U. S. Department of Education have

demonstrated that a positive adult male role model will have a uniquely positive impact on the development and educational success of a child. This impact dramatically increases the child's likelihood of graduating and getting mostly A's along the way, while at the same time dramatically decreasing the likelihood of that child living in poverty, getting involved with drugs and alcohol and avoiding potentially devastating choices that result in a criminal record or a teen pregnancy. The U. S. Department of Education has identified the WATCH D.O.G.S. program as an effective way to increase male involvement in the nation's schools.

Each school year thousands of men volunteer to work at least one day in their child's school through the WATCH D.O.G.S. program. These men work alongside the educators to help as crossing guards, car/bus rider facilitators, hallway monitors, library assistants, lunchroom helpers, classroom and homework tutors and playgrounds/gymnasium coaches. The possibilities are endless. Every school year these men have a positive impact on the lives of hundreds of thousands of kids.

Students gain a positive male role model. Some students do not have a father figure present in their home and the number of male teachers has been steadily declining in recent years. More positive male role models are needed in the school setting.

Schools gain an extra set of eyes and ears. The presence of WATCH Dogs

(Continued from Page 1) ents Charles and Opal Burnfin are buried at Bethel and he wanted to share a special writing by his father about Bethel.

"My main purpose was to encourage those who view this monument to 'Glorify the Father through your works'," Burnfin said.

While the Burnfins were originally from Benton County, Ray Burnfin grew up in Holden. "I remember coming to Memorial Day services here at Bethel. We would bring a picnic and visit with family and friends," Burnfin said.

When his father wrote the article in 1968 that appears on the monument, he was encouraging the Cemetery Board to use their money wisely and only use the interest to maintain the cemetery. At that time donations were made every Memorial Day for the preservation of the cemetery.

"I have been told that the members of the present Board are worried that they will not have the funds to maintain the cemetery," Brunfin said. "I have bought plots for myself and my wife and I have also made a donation to the cemetery but we need others to help as well."

Bethel (which means "Surely the Lord is In this place") was established near Edwards in 1850. A log building with a huge fireplace was erected for winter use while an arbor nearby served during the warm weather. The "Thursday before the third Sunday in August" was set apart for the beginning camp meeting, which soon became an annual event. It was supposed to last three weeks. The participants would bring vegetables, deer, pork and beef for the entire camp meeting to eat. They would live in tents during this camp meeting.

Three services were held—forenoon, afternoon and at "early candle lighting time." Lanterns were considered luxuries.

The first grave at Bethel was that of a three year old girl who died during one of the camp meetings. Quintilla Minner was a victim of the measles and was buried there in 1858.

Memorial Day was very special at Bethel. According to "History of Benton County" by Kathleen Miles and Kathleen White, there are more soldiers buried at Bethel than any cemetery in Benton County. Veterans of the Civil War used to lead the Memorial Day procession, laden with flowers, visiting the graves of their comrades and decorating graves with flags and flowers.

The 2016 football season at WHS was probably one of the lowest times in the history of the program. Head Coach Paul Thomas would resign after going 2-28 and losing 25 in a row. Needless to say, the confidence level of the players and even some of the fans was at a all time low.

In his last two acts as Athletic Director, Billy Daleski would pull not one but two rabbits out of his hat. First, he would hire Head Coach Ryan Boyer, former Warsaw star quarterback away from Sedalia Smith Cotton. Boyer would also replace Daleski as the WHS Athletic Director.

Then in a somewhat stunning move, Mr. Daleski, who took over the reins as principal in the middle school, brought in Lincoln Coach

Danny Morrison, who started and built the Lincoln program to a final four birth to be an assistant coach. Morrison, also a former WHS quarterback, would also replace Daleski as the WHS assistant principal

It goes without saying that both coaches wanted to come home. Their first job was to be build confidence in their players after two winless seasons. Boyer's first meeting with his players was in the WHS gym with former players Daleski, Jimmy Miller and Adam Howe, among others in attendance. Boyer spoke about how proud he was to have grown up in Warsaw and play for the Wildcats and Head Coach Randy Morrow. He spoke of tradition, pride and excellence. Some 40-50 boys began to show up in the weigh room and to summer voluntary practices and seven on seven scrimmages.

Pigskin Magazine predicted the Wildcats to be 2-8 on the season. Looking at the schedule, most fans thought there was three games the Wildcats could or should win.

The first two games with Clinton and Cole Camp are natural rivalries and the kids were keyed up. So they would beat Clinton 14-12 at home. Then they defeated Cole Camp on the road 28-22 in O.T. They barely lost to California on the road 12-8. From their they faced their biggest test to date and lost to Osage 38-0. They rebounded well and beat Versailles 28-21.

Running back Eli Hawkins, who was on the cover of the BCE Sports Edition, was injured and played sparingly the rest of the season. Someone needed to step up and Junior Kieon Davis was given the opportunity and would put on a show for the rest of the season.

Warsaw would lose in one of the highest scoring games in Missouri high school history at Eldon 82-48. Then they pulled a mild upset in defeating Hallsville 40-33. The next game was the long drive to Southern Boone and a chance to move up in district seeding and not play Lamar until the third game of district play. It wasn't to be as they lost 47-12.

They finished the regular season at home against the second ranked team in Class 3 in Blair Oaks and lost 64-6. Then they won their first district game in several years with a home win over Cole Camp 44-14. Yea, Lamar was next and they

lost 57-6.

So they ended up at 5-6 and most people around town were very pleased.

Junior Quarterback Matt Luebbert improved and was 105-506 rushing and 67-159 for 109 in the air with six interceptions and nine TD's.

Senior running back Keegan Glenn was 155-992 yards rushing and six TD's. Davis ended up 114-803 and ten TD's. Senior Jayden Schepker had 27 catches for 383 yards and three TD's.

Next season looks promising with Luebbert and Davis back. A healthy Hawkins would help on both sides of

the ball. A young line gained experience this season and should improve.

We say goodbye to the seniors, Ryan Spouse, Glenn, Rayne Faulconer, Logan Neth, Cole Branson, Daryl Meldrum, Jesse Andrews, Schepker, Nate Fauquier, Tommy Robitsch and Ryan Franklin. They dealt with coaches changes, losing seasons and they never quit. Thanks guys!

Warsaw Girls Ready For Hoop Action

Coming off a 5-21 record, Head Coach Cody Morgan is optimistic about the upcoming season. His prize player, All-Ozone Freshman team player Aubrie McRoberts has been battling softball injuries and has gotten off to a slow start in practice. However, make no mistake, for she will be a force to reckon with this season.

With just two returning seniors in Gabby Flores and Hannah Chapman, Coach Morgan will rely on several juniors to lead the way. Jessie Glenn could be a big help this season as she has shown signs of improvement over last season. Jordan Plybon will be expected to hit some threes to help McRoberts in the scoring column. You can figure around 16-20 points from McRoberts and maybe 10-12 or more from Plybon. Juniors Kamryn Yach and

Megan Mantonya should be able to step up their game and help out.
Newcomer Senior Kylee Creach will add height and depth to the center position and could be a huge factor underneath the basket.
Six freshmen in Kylee Fajen, Taylor Spry Aspen Whitaker, Lea Mebruer, Megan Cooper and Jeslyn Krueger round out the team and could gain some varsity playing time.
Chapman improved as the season went on and along with the freshmen, speed shouldn't be a problem.
Coach Morgan is working on the team's passing skills as turnovers were a huge problem last season.
Again, Warsaw will be undersized in most games and will have to find a way to contend with the height disadvantage. We are several weeks away from their first game and things should be interesting.

Test For Chronic Wasting Disease This Season

The appearance of Chronic Wasting Disease is a growing problem in Missouri which should concern us all, not just hunters. Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) is a deadly illness in white-tailed deer and other members of the deer family, called cervids. CWD kills all deer and other cervids it infects. The disease has been found in Missouri and is slowly spreading. CWD is a contagious neurological disease which causes a characteristic spongy degeneration of the brains of infected animals resulting in emaciation, abnormal behavior, loss of bodily functions and death.

Jake Strozinski, a representative of the MDC who recently relocated here from Livingston County, explained the following plans to monitor CWD.

To help find and limit the spread of chronic wasting disease or CWD, the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) needs the help of deer hunters who harvest deer in the areas close to where the disease has been found. Hunters who harvest deer during the opening weekend of firearms deer season (November 11 and 12) in any of the counties in or next to a county where CWD has been found are now required to present their deer for CWD tissue-sample collection. Hunters must take their deer on the day of harvest to one of MDC's CWD sampling locations throughout the 25 CWD Management Zone Counties.

Deer must be presented by the hunter who harvested the animal. Sampling locations will be open Saturday and Sunday (November 11 and 12) from 7:30 AM until at least 8 PM. Hunters can get free test results for their deer after samples are processed. Hunters also have the option of presenting just the deer head with about six inches of neck attached. Hunters should have their deer telechecked and have their permits ready before going to a sampling location. Hunters need to also know the location where they harvested their deer.

The CWD Management Zone counties in our area include: Benton, St. Clair, Hickory, Cedar, Polk, and

Dade. Pick up a 2017 deer hunting booklet at any permit vendor to see a map of the CWD Management Zone counties, a list of the CWD sampling locations, and other deer hunting information. Early detection of chronic wasting disease is critical because once the disease is well established in an area, it is impossible to eradicate.

Hunters who harvest a buck that will be taxidermied should inform MDC staff. MDC workers will complete paperwork and inform the hunters about participating taxidermists taking CWD tissue samples. The best ways a hunter can help limit the spread of CWD is to get their deer tested and to avoid transporting their deer carcass across county lines if the deer was harvested in a CWD Management Zone County. MDC's CWD-testing efforts are critically important to protect a treasured wildlife species that about a half-million hunters pursue each fall.

Have I Got A Line For You!

Time sure scoots along, doesn't it? We "fell" back an hour on Sunday and closed the door on daylight savings time. Winter will officially open its door on December 21. Thanksgiving is two weeks away and Christmas is waiting in the wings. We will spring forward again.

Required Withdraws From Retirement Plans: What Should You Know?

You may spend decades contributing to your IRA and 401(k). But, eventually, you'll need to use this money. Before that day arrives, you'll want to be familiar with the rules governing withdrawals - and you'll want to know just how much you should take out.

To begin with, withdrawals from traditional employer-sponsored retirement plans like these fall under the Internal Revenue Service's "required minimum distributions" (RMD) guidelines. (You aren't required to take these distributions from a Roth IRA.)

Here are some of the key RMD points to keep in mind:

- You need to take distributions by age 70 1/2. You generally should begin taking RMDs in the year in which you turn 70 1/2. If you don't take your first RMD during that year, you must take it no later than April 1 of the following year. If you do put it off until April 1, you must take two distributions in one year.

- If you don't take your RMDs on time, you may have to pay the IRS a 50 percent penalty tax on the taxable portion of your uncollected distribution

- so make sure you know your dates.

- You can take more than the minimum. You can withdraw more than the RMD, but, as the word "required" suggests, you can't withdraw less.

- You may be able to delay RMDs in an employer's retirement plan if you are still working. If your employer's retirement plan permits it, you may not have to take RMDs if you are still working and you are 70 1/2 or older. However, this exception won't apply if you own 5 percent or more of your company.

To determine your RMD, you'll need to use either the Uniform Lifetime Table, which is based on your life expectancy, or the Joint Life Table, if you have a spouse who is the sole beneficiary and who is more than 10 years younger. Your tax advisor can help you make this selection.

So, now that you know the basic rules of RMDs, you'll need to consider their impact on your retirement income. As mentioned above, you can certainly take out more than the RMD, but should you?

If you need the extra money, then you'll have to take it. However, when determining how much you should take beyond your RMDs, you'll need to weigh some other factors.

For one thing, if you can delay taking Social Security, you'll get bigger checks, so you might be able to lower the amounts you take from your 401(k) and IRA.

Another factor to consider is the size and composition of your investment portfolio held outside your retirement accounts. If you have a sizable amount of investments, with some of them providing regular income, you may be able to afford to take out only your RMDs, or perhaps just slightly more. On the other hand, if your 401(k) and IRA make up the vast majority of your investment holdings, you might need to rely on them much more heavily.

In any case, though, you will need to establish an appropriate withdrawal rate

for all your investments to ensure you won't outlive your money. A financial professional can help you calculate this rate.

Do whatever it takes to maximize your benefits from your IRA and 401(k). They're valuable assets - so use them wisely.

Needed A Pick-Me-Up

There is a painting by Edward Munch entitled "The Scream", a source of countless parodies. However this week I felt like a caricature of his work. The battle against the green ladybug lookalike beetle was game on. I lost. They came by the thousands. I try to be organic in all things, but my fight against these home invaders turned deadly. There were so many of them they piled up in front of my doors and windows. Spraying them stopped those present, and then another invading army flew over from the woods. They flew into my hair, all over my jeans and the little demons bite! So screaming, spraying, stomping, I did the best I could. Then I had to vacuum up the winners who made it inside. Tired and cranky I made the following. Tiramisu is Italian for "pick me up". I never quite understood why they say eating something creamy, coffee and chocolate flavored would pick you up, but eating this certainly lifts my spirits and that's enough.

Icebox Tiramisu
2 cups heavy cream
1/2 cup sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
1 lb mascarpone cheese
1 tablespoon instant espresso powder (I use Medaglia D'oro)
1 box Nabisco Famous chocolate wafers (9oz)
cocoa powder

In a stand mixer or in a bowl with an electric beater, beat cream, sugar and vanilla until it holds

soft peaks. Gradually beat in the mascarpone, a few large spoonfuls at a time. Beat in the espresso powder until mixture is thick and light coffee colored.

In a 9- to 10-inch pie plate, arrange one third (about 14) of the chocolate wafers in a slightly overlapping pattern to cover the bottom of the pan (don't worry if the cookies are cracked or in pieces; it doesn't show when the cake is finished). Dollop one third of the cream mixture over the cookies, then gently spread out in an even layer with an offset spatula or the back of a spoon. Layer another third of the cookies over the cream then add another third of the cream. Repeat with a final layer of cookies topped with a final layer of cream. Invert a dinner plate over the pie plate to act as a cover and place pan in the freezer for one hour, then transfer to the refrigerator and chill until firm, about 5 hours or up to overnight.

To serve, dust lightly with cocoa powder and cut into thin wedges with a pie server.

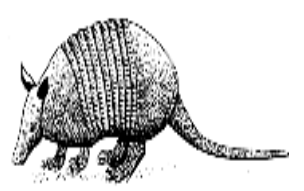
