

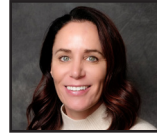

It's In The Water! Pros & Cons For The Fluoridation Of Warsaw

Lincoln Could Use Solar To Power Sign

The Warsaw City Council invited members of the community to an open forum on Thursday, March 9, on the issue of the reintroduction of fluoride into the City of Warsaw's drinking water.

On January 3, 2023, a request was made to the Board of Alderman by KATY Trail Health Center and the Department of Health and Senior Services to add fluoride back into the city's drinking water. The Board of Alderman agreed to a 90-day public comment period. On January 12, Mayor Eddie Simons signed the notification form starting the public comment period. The public hearing was part of the information gathering process.

Citizens were encouraged to speak at the open forum to let their opinions be heard and considered by the Warsaw City Council.



DEBATING the use of fluoride in Warsaw's water supply was on tap at a hearing last Thursday evening. The event took place at Community Building and hosted speakers, including Jessica Burdick from Katy Trail Community Health.

Katy Trail dental hygienist Jessica Burdick spoke to the city board about the need for fluoride for the sake of children.

"There are a lot of us here who have put in

time and effort into trying to urge Warsaw to re-implement community water fluoridation since it was removed in 2015 due to insufficient funding," said Burdick. "I want to

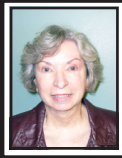
ask for the aldermen to do what is best for the entire community. Working daily in this community that does not have f2 water, I see community members of all ages that have to suffer due

to dental pain and lack of access to care."

"Warsaw only has two dental offices, and we are drowning trying to provide services to everyone we

Battle Lines Drawn As April 4 Election Looms In Benton County

Eighteen candidates have filed for 12 positions in the General Municipal Election to be held on April 4 in Benton County. Lincoln's East and West Alderman candidates, as well as candidates for Warsaw Alderman in Ward 2 and 3 are uncontested on the ballot.

Cole Camp R-1 School

District has three open positions and four candidates including Connie Berendzen, Pete Pierson, Kevin W. Harms and Curtis E. Oelrichs. All candidates except Curtis E. Oelrichs are currently members of the School Board and are running for reelection to three year terms.

Brian Paul and David Locke are running for one position as Cole Camp West Ward Alderman; and Diana M. Burdick, Klark Bohling and Jeremy Pirtille are running for one position

as Cole Camp East Ward Alderman. Both positions are for two-year terms.

In Lincoln, Barbara Hammond is running for the two-year position of East Ward Alderman. Philip Fisher is running for the two-year position of West Ward Alderman.

In Warsaw, Christina Springer, Paul L. Eason and Rick Fajen are candidates for two open positions on the Warsaw Fire Protection District. The positions carry six-year terms.

A Heart Touch Story To Tell: Birthday Blessings A Big Boost To Kids



DELIVERING SMILES, Shannon VonAllmen, Executive Director of Birthday Blessings, delivers care packages for a foster teen living in a residential facility. The non-profit sends these gifts out seasonally to add an emotional boost to these vulnerable kids.

"It's okay. I have been asked these questions many times," said Anie, whose name is changed to protect her identity. She is in Missouri state custody. "I don't mind talking about this stuff."

Anie and her younger brother entered foster care in another state when she was a small child. They were adopted and moved to Missouri with their 'forever family' when she was just six years old. After being abused by their adoptive parents, she and her brother entered the Missouri foster system when she was 11

years old.

Now, almost a decade later, she can effortlessly list the order of foster homes and residential facilities she has lived in. There were seven different placements in the first five years - each one requiring a move to a different community.

"At the first group home I went to, all the girls were older. There were a lot of them. I had just lost my parents. I was trying to fit in. I had very mixed emotions about all of it. It was really hard," she said.

"I went to another group home. They had a really

strict dress code for girls. Our knees couldn't show. We also weren't allowed to have any electronics. There were boys there, but in a separate area. They didn't have as many rules. They were allowed phones. I didn't think it was very fair," Anie recounted.

She and her brother had been together until they moved to this facility. They were housed in separate areas and lived there for almost two years. They really wanted to be placed in a foster home together so they actively worked to get

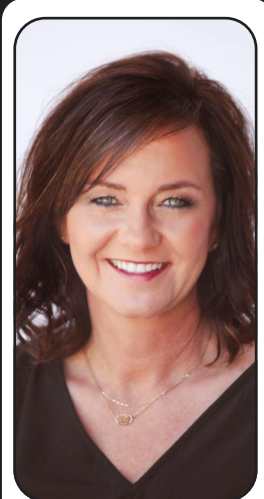

This cold snap makes me want soup and potato leek soup is among my favorites. You can build upon this

basic soup, adding any vegetable you like. I like turnips, diced tomatoes, carrots, etc.

2 large leeks, trimmed, cleaned, and cut up

1 tablespoon butter or olive oil

3 medium potatoes, any type, peeled and cut into

small cubes

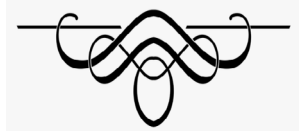
Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

4 cups stock; I like full flavored chicken, but you can use vegetable or beef



In a large deep saucepan, over medium heat, add butter or oil. When hot add the vegetables, salt and pepper, cook, stirring for several minutes. Add stock and cook until vegetables are tender, about 25 minutes.

can in this area that is in need. Fluoridated water can help us to begin to see some relief to our seemingly endless efforts."

"Cooking, ice cubes, water fountains, brushing our teeth and drinking the water are all ways to expose our community to the fluoridated water which will benefit every single person in our community."

"Water fluoridation is an effective and safe way to decrease cavities throughout our community," said Burdick.

Warsaw resident George McCannon questioned the cost of adding fluoride to the drinking water and wondered why bottled water does not contain fluoride.

Warsaw North Elementary teacher Crystal Boyd spoke in favor of fluoridation because she sees many children who are not seeing a dentist and she believes it would benefit the children in the long run.

Warsaw health professional Kathryn Porter addressed the city council about the drawbacks to fluoride, including health issues resulting from fluoride being added to the water.

According to a recent study by the University of Utah, excess amounts of fluoride ions in drinking water can cause dental fluorosis, skeletal fluorosis, arthritis, bone damage, osteoporosis, muscular damage, fatigue, joint-related problems, and other issues.

Warsaw City Administrator Randy Pogue commented that he has been working with PeopleService contractor Mark Breshears to determine the cost of fluoridation.

"We will have to purchase equipment to inject fluoride into the water and there will be upkeep as well," said Pogue.

Breshears said that his company would be responsible for the installation and maintenance of the fluoride equipment.

"Warsaw had fluoride in the drinking water in the past but negative reaction from the public led to the city removing the fluoride from the water supply," said Breshears.

An anticipated date for the Board of Alderman to make a decision is May 1. Up to that date the public comment period will remain open.

Jenn Bradshaw and Reba Slavens are candidates for one position as City of Warsaw Alderman Ward 1 which has a two-year term. Lou Breshears is the lone candidate running for Warsaw's Alderman Ward 2 position for a two-year term. Eric Flores is the only candidate running for Warsaw's Alderman Ward 3, which also has a two-year term.

A future article is planned to allow opposed candidates an opportunity to state why they are running for a particular office. Those who would like to be included in the article may submit a one paragraph overview of their candidacy to judykramer@bentoncountyenterprise.com by March 18, or drop their document off at the Benton County Office c/o Adam Howe.

A number of offices in Benton County have openings equal to the number of candidates running to fill the positions. In cases like this, RSMo 115.124, Subsection 3 (provided by County Clerk Susan Porterfield) states that "The governing body of any city, town or village with two thousand or fewer inhabitants may submit to the voters, a question to adopt the provisions of subsection 1." Porterfield said that Subsection 1 is the statute that states that if the same number of candidates file for the same number of

positions available, then no election will be held for that district. However, Ionia City is the only city in the county that has voted such an ordinance.

Those offices in the county where the number of candidates equal the number of positions available include the City of Ionia Board Members, Cole Camp Ambulance District Board Members, Warsaw-Lincoln Ambulance District Board Members, Good Samaritan Nursing Home Board Members in Cole Camp, Lincoln Community Nursing Home Board Members, Lincoln Fire Protection District Board Member, Benton County Health Department Board Members, Cole Camp and rural Fire Protection District Board Member, Cole Camp Special Road District Board Member, Ionia Special Road District Board Member, Brandon Special Road District Board Member, Benton County R-II Board Members and Warsaw R-IX School District Board Members. Therefore, these offices are not on the Benton County Election Ballot for April 4, 2023.

kicked out.

"I acted out a lot. Granted, I had no stability. I was trying to get foster parents. They kept trying to place us in group homes. We wanted to stay together," Anie said. While they were successful in getting kicked out, they were never placed together again due to lack of space in foster homes.

She stated some of the traditional foster homes weren't much better. She recounted a move to one house that was overcrowded. She had accumulated several trash bags of belongings during her years in care. Her foster dad told her she couldn't keep it all. She was given one tote to put as much as she could in. The foster dad took everything else she owned to a thrift store.

"Out of everything, switching schools was the hardest. That, and trying to bond with new foster parents," the college student stated. "I had to grow up a lot faster. Plus, I felt like I didn't protect my brother."

The siblings entered care in an area where Birthday Blessings had just started operating. The nonprofit strives to add hope and cheer to the lives of kids in care, while also targeting physical and emotional needs. They collaborate with Children's Divisions, Court Appointed Special Advocates and other advocacy organizations for maximum impact in the foster community.

"We send items like duffel

bags, backpacks, school supplies, new books, bedding, and toys to kids in care. Our volunteers spend a lot of time tailoring services to the needs of each child," said Shannon VonAllmen, Executive Director of Birthday Blessings. "We really want the kids to know someone spent time thinking about them. You can't place a value on making a lonely child feel loved and seen."

"We are turning 10 on April 1st! We have served thousands of kids in the last decade, and we really wanted to do something to honor them. Anie was an obvious choice to feature. She has overcome so much and is now a functional young adult," said VonAllmen.

Anie believes support from the nonprofit added happiness to the instability of frequent moves and other stresses of life in care.

"When I was in sixth grade, the foster parents I was with were not into celebrating. Someone dropped a Birthday Blessings bag off. I was so happy! As soon as they left, my foster mom and I started baking the birthday cake together. It's one of the best memories I have of being in that home," the young adult said.

Fortunately, at age 16, her life changed for the better. She moved to a foster home where she felt loved and valued. As she got older, she started helping her foster mom with the other kids in care.

"I hit it off with my new foster mom. I have been with her for four years. Even though I don't live with her anymore, she is still my mom," she said. "When I turn 21, she is going to adopt me."

The stability of a functional home environment was just what Anie needed. She graduated from high school and moved to an apartment that same day. She enrolled in college and got a job. She attributes her motivation to breaking the cycle of abuse in her biological and adoptive families.

"I do a lot to make sure I don't end up like them. I am working on an Associate's degree in criminal justice. I want to join the Missouri State Highway Patrol and eventually become a detective," she said. Soon she is starting a second job. Her goal is to save enough money from that job to put a down payment on a home of her own.

Birthday Blessings serves foster kids Bates, Benton, Henry and St. Clair Counties. They are supported in part by a grant from Truman Lake Area Community Foundation through Community Foundation of the Ozarks.

Birthday Blessings will

continue supporting kids in care. They are having a 10th Birthday Donor Match Event. Vickie Witthaus, a Hannibal resident, will be matching up to \$10,000 in monetary donations March 27th through April 1st. Benton County basketball 2022-23 saw two boys teams win their districts. Lincoln ended up with an amazing 28-1 record, losing in the Class 2 sectionals and Cole Camp went 22-8 and made it to the Class 3 quarterfinals.

Lincoln beat both Warsaw and Cole Camp twice and was one of the two best defensive teams in Class 2.

The Warsaw boys struggled, going just 1-25. The Lady Wildcats finished at 6-22, losing in the district semifinals to perennial powerhouse, Skyline after eliminating Cole Camp in the opening round. Cole Camp finished at 10-18, losing twice to Warsaw, once in their season opener,

and again in their last game of the season.

Lincoln finished at 8-17 overall and beat Warsaw in their lone regular season matchup and split two games with Cole Camp.

Stats don't always tell the story. So we didn't use many. Consider that Lincoln's pace and benching in blowouts will effect their post season honors. And games lost to Covid in 2020 robbed some Benton County seniors of possible 1,000 point careers. We want to thank all of the players. We appreciated your talents and dedication to your teams. You will not soon be forgotten in Benton County basketball folklore.

But without further adieu, let's get to this year's selections!

Boys First team
Connor Lynde, 6'0" Sr; Lincoln - Lynde was

the catalyst to their 27-1 team. Best defender in the area. Great leaper and speed merchant. Their unselfishness and Coach Tyler Burke's willingness not to blow teams out and to play his JV kept their scoring averages down. All three Lincoln players here averaged 11-12 points a game, but every one of them also wanted the ball when game was on the line.

Kyle Eckhoff, 6'2" Sr; Lincoln - Scored his 1,000th point this season. Could play all five positions. He got hot shooting threes at the end of the season. At 6'2", played bigger than his size. Bombed threes to break open close games.

Mack Hesse, 6'4", Sr; Lincoln - When he played inside he was unstoppable at times. Learned to block shots without fouling. Could put on a shot blocking exhibition. Could have had

a couple 30 point games but sat out the second half in blow outs to give JV playing time.

Ethan Shearer, 6'0", Sr; Cole Camp - Was All-State a year ago. Played different positions this season. Clutch shooter. Left his mark on Cole Camp basketball with game-winning buzzer beaters. When he struggled, the team struggled. When he was on his game, they were hard to beat. Great player to interview.

Gentry Dieckman, 6'5", Jr; Cole Camp - Maybe the most improved among the five. Long and lanky, brought the house down with his dunking ability. Could run the floor and was hard for teams to match up against. Should be the best player in Benton County next season.

Second team
Kaleb Mundy, 5'9", Sr; Lincoln - Most improved player in Benton County. Could handle the ball and pop a three. Great assist player. Very unselfish. Learned to read defenses and drive the middle. Hit big free throws late in games.

Reid Harrison, 5'11", Jr; Cole Camp - Was injured a third of the season. We have yet to see his best ball. Good ball handler and fast up and

down the court. Started hitting threes late in season. Can be as good as he wants to be next season. In a run and gun offense, and a full court press, he could average 20-30 a game with 10 steals.

Owen Ives, 5'11", Sr; Cole Camp - Defensive specialist. Smart, unselfish and crafty. Played beyond his athleticism. Great kid, positive attitude and great teammate. Was a big time defensive player late in games.

Ross Johnson, 6'0", Sr; Lincoln - Rebounder and defensive player. Looked for open man. Would sneak in for a layup when overlooked. An extremely physically strong and well conditioned athlete.

Michael Wissman, 6'4", Sr; Cole Camp - Was double-teamed because of his size. Strong rebounder and defensive player. His bulk caused problems for teams down low. Unselfish and team player. Foul trouble plagued him his entire career.

Logan Gemes, 6'2", So, Warsaw - Just a sophomore and our only underclassman on the boy's side. Fans would think that his length is his best attribute, but he's a pure shooter. Single-

handedly kept Warsaw in some games. Will be fun to watch mature over the next 2 seasons and should help lead Warsaw's program for both of those.

Karley Thayer, Sr; Cole Camp - One of their better ball handlers. Brought ball up the court. Stepped up when others struggled. Could hit the open shot. She could hurt you from the premier.

Dylana Stoppel, Sr; Cole Camp - Their best defensive player. Guarded top scorer. Good leaper. Deflected shots. Played hard every second on the court.

Rachel Henderson, Jr; Warsaw - Warsaw's force down low. She can be a rebounding machine. More consistency on the offensive side may have put her on our first team. An injury late in the season kept her off the floor, but look for a strong senior campaign from her next year.

Luebbert Earns All-American Honors With 4th Place Throw For Missouri S&T At DII Championships

Jacob Luebbert (Warsaw, MO/Warsaw HS) had a throw in the opening round of the weight throw Friday afternoon to put him into the finals of the event at the NCAA Division II Indoor Track & Field Championships, then had his second-best throw of the season in the final round to move up to fourth place to earn All-America honors in the event.

Luebbert had a throw of 65-11½ to begin his day, which put him into second place after the first round of the second flight was completed. He dropped to fifth after round two and entered the finals in that same position. But after a throw of 65-6.25 in the fourth round and a foul in round five, Luebbert uncorked a throw of 67-8.75 in the final round to move up one spot in the final standings.

The sixth round throw was just one-quarter of an inch off of his school record set earlier in the season.

The fourth place finish, which earned Luebbert his first All-America award as he was competing at the national meet for the first time, was the highest finish by a Miner at the NCAA's indoor championships since 2009, when Jordan Henry took second in the pole vault.

Missouri Southern's Peyton Barton won the weight throw title with a mark of 72-2.5.

Luebbert is a 2019 graduate of Warsaw High School and is now a senior at Missouri S&T, majoring in Chemical Engineering.

He is the son of Randy and Michelle Luebbert.

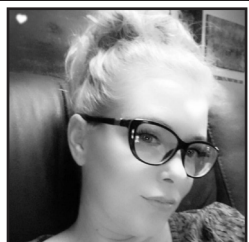

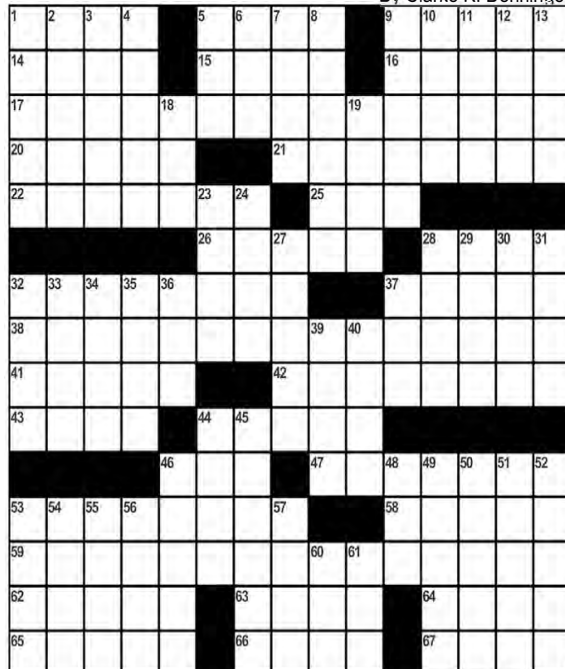

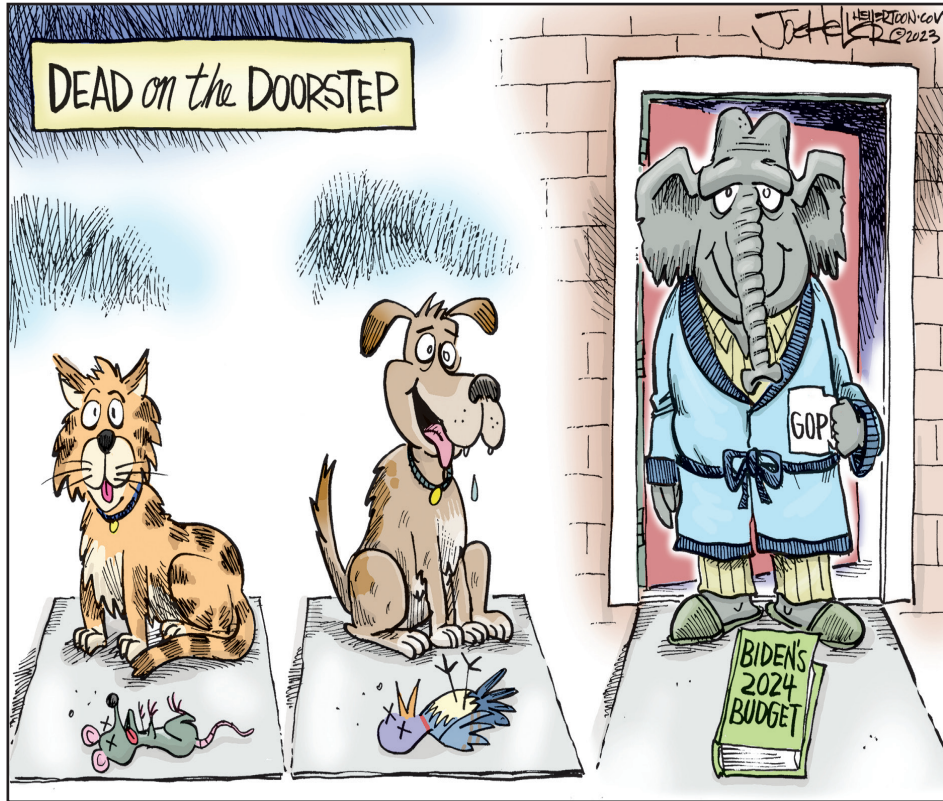

And if you are retired, it's especially important to maintain this larger emergency fund so you can avoid dipping into your investment portfolio to pay for any unforeseen costs and daily expenses. 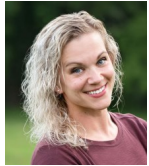

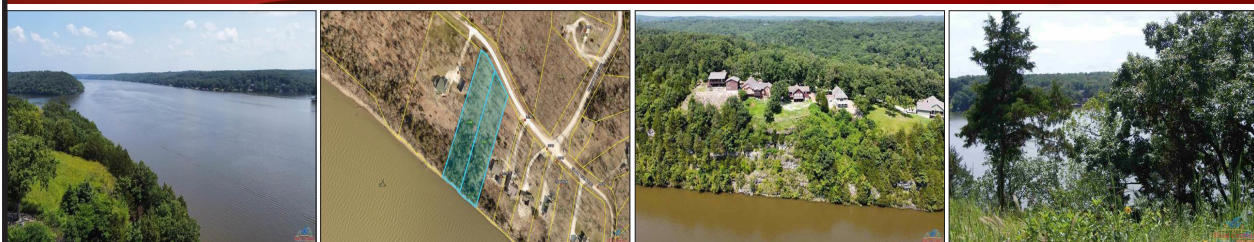



Bothwell Meets Standards To Provide Timely Heart Attack Care



The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS), Time Critical Diagnosis Unit has designated Bothwell Regional Health Center as a Level III Missouri ST-elevation myocardial infarction (STEMI) Center.

STEMI is a serious type of heart attack where one or more of the heart's major arteries that supply oxygen-rich blood to the heart is completely blocked.

As a Level III STEMI Center, Bothwell meets multiple standards to provide definitive and timely treatment for patients suffering a STEMI attack. The standards ensure patients are diagnosed and treated quickly at Bothwell and transferred to a higher level center with a Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory (Cath Lab) to reopen the blocked artery.

Michele Laas, RN, BSN, MSN, Bothwell's Chief Nursing Officer, said the health center has a partnership with Boone Health in Columbia that ensures a smooth transition of care from Bothwell to

their Cath Lab.

"We have ongoing open lines of communication with Boone Health where most of our STEMI patients are transferred," Laas said. "In addition, our relationship with Dr. Marquez with Missouri Heart Center's Sedalia office and our own outpatient Cardiac Rehabilitation program allows patients to return home for follow-up care."

Since Bothwell was first designated a Level III STEMI Center in March 2021, the Emergency Department team has treated 68 patients for STEMI attacks.

Laas said achieving the designation a second time is an indication of the health center's commitment to caring for its community.

"In heart attacks, minutes count," Laas said. "The state requires stringent standards of timely care, and our entire team has practiced and worked hard to cover all our bases. This designation ensures that when someone is having a STEMI attack and they arrive at our door, we are providing them the highest level of emergency care."

According to the Missouri DHSS, there are four levels of hospital designations in the state's Time Critical Diagnosis System. Currently, there are 25 Level III STEMI Centers that play an important role in providing access into the system and essential patient care in non-metropolitan areas.

"Bothwell is a rural hospital serving a rural community," Laas said. "Our role as a STEMI center is critical to improving heart attack care and saving lives."

I'm extremely proud of our team for working together to achieve this designation."

In the event of someone showing signs of a heart attack, 911 should be contacted immediately. These signs can include pain or discomfort in the chest, arm or shoulder, shortness of breath, feeling lightheaded, nausea or vomiting, or jaw, neck or back pain.

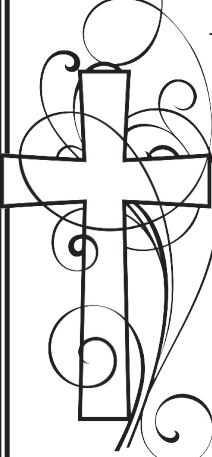

Dear Editor,
For better or worse, Missouri voters legalized the sale of marijuana in November. The ballot initiative gave Missouri cities and counties authority to establish a local 3% tax on the sale of marijuana, subject to voter approval. This decision faces many Missouri voters in April.

When consumption of a product is known to impose an unusual cost on society, a tax like the one voters are considering can serve three purposes: it can reduce consumption of the good through higher prices, it can generate funds to be used to address the harm done by use of the product, or it can simply be used to increase local tax revenue.

Those who oppose the tax may be generally critical of new taxes or worried

by the effects of the price increases. Both concerns are valid. The first could be addressed by a plan whereby this tax replaces a more economically harmful one rather than simply adding to local coffers. Taxes will never go away, but we could demand more accountability in how and to what extent the government taxes us.

Those concerned about the effect of the tax on the price of marijuana should remember that the sale of alcohol and cigarettes also have a special tax that aims to mitigate the risks associated with their use. These taxes can provide extra support to law enforcement or health care providers who will have to deal with the inevitable negative consequences for consumers who now have easy access to the good.

Ultimately, the decision rests in the hands of voters, who should weigh the pros and cons of the tax relative to the circumstances of their own community and vote

on what they deem best in April.

In February, the Missouri Department of Public Safety was awarded a \$5.4 million grant from the U.S. Dept. of Justice as part of a crisis intervention program.

Missouri's Crisis Intervention Advisory Board will allocate the funds to state, county and local courts, law enforcement, supervision agencies, prosecutors, public defenders, and behavioral health organizations in their effort to prevent or reduce crime and violence with a particular focus on gun violence. It will fund programs that target the risk factors that lead to gun violence and would enhance Missouri's red flag laws. Red flag gun law is a gun violence law that permits police and family members to petition a state court to order the temporary removal of firearms of a person who may present a danger to the public or themselves.

And yet, the MO GOP wants to undercut the funding by trying to pass legislation that eliminates our red flag laws. The legislation will also eliminate an abused or victimized Missourian's ability to get a gun violence restraining order. In the same breath, they're trying to place the blame on the high rate of gun deaths by presenting legislation that would allow the governor to replace a duly elected prosecutor if homicides are too high within their jurisdiction. 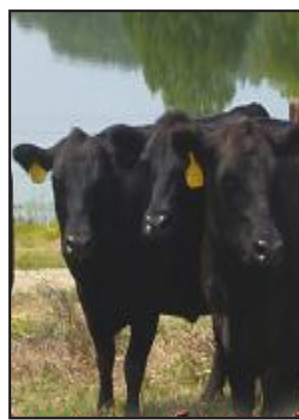

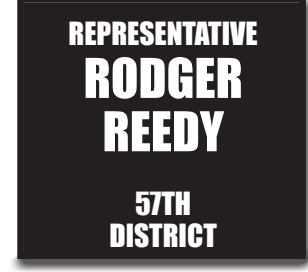

The first half of the Legislative Session has gone by quickly. We have spent our time here at the Capitol working hard for Missourians and we will continue to do so when we return on March 20th from the spring break next week.

Lawmakers Conclude Highly Productive First Half of Session

As the 2023 session reached its midpoint lawmakers headed into their brief break from legislative

action with a long list of accomplishments. From vital public safety legislation to measures that would improve access to healthcare to a bill that would expand educational opportunities, House members gave their stamp of approval to legislative proposals that would positively impact Missourians from all walks of life in all parts of the state.

House Speaker Dean Plocher praised his colleagues for the work they did in the first half of the legislative session. He said, "We began the session with an ambitious agenda focused on building a more prosperous Missouri with opportunities for all. Our members have made good on that promise by working diligently and deliberatively to advance commonsense reforms and solutions that will ensure a quality education for our children, grow our economy, and keep our streets safe. I'm proud of the work we've done and ready to work with the Senate and Governor Parson to make sure these proposals make their way into law."

Legislators begin their one-week break with 30 House Bills sent to the Senate including one piece of legislation truly agreed to by both chambers and signed into law by the governor. Lawmakers will have until Friday, May 12 to have their legislative priorities approved by both the House and Senate and sent to the governor's desk. Some of the priority bills approved during the first half of the legislative session include:

- Promoting School Choice - HB 253
-Curbing Violent Crime - HB 301

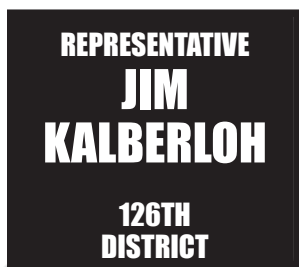

To the Constituents of the 126th District,

We are now halfway through the 102nd Session! It has been busy and time has flown by, and I feel we have produced some good legislation for the people of Missouri. We will be on Spring Break this coming week, so I will be in the district, if anyone would like to visit on any matters, please feel free to contact me. I had visitors this week from Hospice Care that works out of GVMH. It was great to visit with them and thank them for the awesome job that they do!

Listed below is a few of the major caucus priorities that we have passed so far this session.

Curbing Violent Crime - HB 301 is a wide-ranging public safety bill that includes a key provision that would allow the governor to appoint a special prosecutor in areas of the state with an excessive homicide rate.

Supporting Law Enforcement - HBs 702, 53, 213, 216, 306 & 359 will take the politics out of policing by placing the St. Louis Police Department under the control of a state-appointed board of commissioners, which will stabilize the department so it can perform the basic job of law enforcement.

Promoting School Choice - HB 253 would establish the Public School Open Enrollment Program to improve quality instruction and increase parental involvement, provide access to programs and classes, and offer opportunity by allowing students to attend a public school in a nonresident district.

Protecting the Constitution - HJR 43 is designed to protect the state constitution from the influence of out-of-state interests by allowing voters to decide if the state should raise the threshold to modify the constitution in the future.

Providing Property Tax Relief - HB 713 would change current state law that requires assessors to determine vehicle values by using the National Automobile Dealers' Association Official Used Car Guide.

Protecting Missouri Farmland - HBs 903, 465, 430 & 499 is a critical national security bill that would protect fair competition and limit foreign ownership of Missouri farmland by defined enemies of the United States of America. The bill approved by the House would limit foreign ownership of Missouri farmland to 0.5%, from the current restriction in statute of 1%. The bill also would prohibit a foreign business from purchasing any land in the state. Nations on the "Restrictive Country" list in the bill are defined as China, Russia, Iran, North Korea, and Venezuela.
