

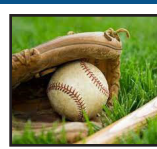

Who Is Lisha Douglas? WHS Athletic Trainer, Serving From The Sidelines

A player goes down on the field! Who is the first one out there to assist? For Warsaw High School, it is athletic trainer Lisha Douglas. Douglas is on the sidelines for every home game, football, volleyball, basketball, baseball and softball. She also travels with the football team for away games. It is her job to care for injured players and even at times to prepare them to be transferred to a hospital.

A 1992 graduate of Smith-Cotton High School, Douglas studied athletic training at the University of Central Missouri. She graduated with her bachelor degree in 1996 then received her master in athletic training from UCM in 1997. She went to work for Central Methodist University where she taught and also worked as an athletic trainer. WHS football coach Ryan Boyer was one of her students.

"Lisha plays a vital role in

Douglas came to Warsaw as a part of an outreach contract with Bothwell Medical Center 18 years ago. Last year she was

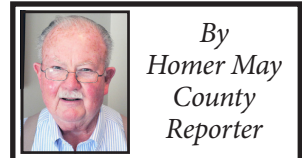
offered a contract with the Warsaw R-9 District as a science teacher and athletic trainer. She teaches physical science and is the athletic trainer for the district.

Warsaw Runs Low On Water Pressure



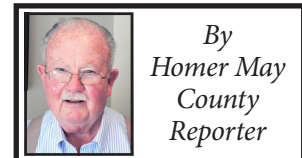

In mid-session Monday evening City Administrator Randy Pogue discussed low water pressure problems experienced by some city residents, saying that the two water towers presently in service are not tall enough to provide adequate pressure for some residents and will not support future needs of the city. He said MO DNR has approved construction of a 3rd tower, which will be financed through a bond issue, and DNR's representative will soon inspect a proposed site for suitability.

Superintendent Says Cole Camp In Need Of Tax Levy Increase

In early moments at the City's March 16 Board meeting, Cole Camp R-1 Supt. Steve Hubbard discussed plans to put a 50 cent tax levy increase before voters in the upcoming election. He cited a need for Cole Camp schools to stay competitive in staff salaries, and assured listeners that such an increase would go only to staff. He concluded that City schools operate with the lowest levy allowed by law, and informed listeners that a 6:30 PM March 28 town hall meeting will be held in the middle school gym, to further discuss the matter.

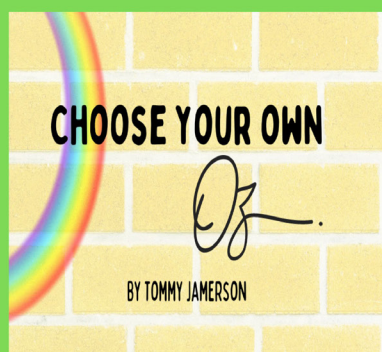

Ozark Foodie

One of the first cakes I made was called a Wacky Cake. There are different names for this easy (one 8x8 pan) cake, but it seems wacky to not mix everything together in a bowl. However, it comes out great every time, easy to make if you need a cake fix. Ever 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
 3/4 cup granulated sugar
 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa
 1 teaspoon baking soda
 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
 1/2 cup canola oil

1 tablespoon distilled white vinegar
 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
 1 cup water (I now substitute with 1/2 cup cold coffee and 1/2 cup water)
 Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Sift flour, sugar, cocoa, baking soda and salt into an ungreased 8x8 pan, spreading mixture evenly. Make one large well and two small wells in mixture. Carefully pour oil into large well, vinegar into small well and vanilla into remaining small well. Pour liquid evenly over mixture, stir everything together using a fork until well combined. Bake 25 or 30 minutes, until toothpick inserted in middle comes out clean. Pour the following frosting recipe over cake while still warm, top with chopped pecans if desired.
 Frosting: Cook 1/3 cup butter, 1/4 cup milk, 3 Tbs. unsweetened cocoa over

Cole Camp's Head Basketball Coach Kevin Shearer has been named Class 3 District Eight Coach of the Year along with the Central MO Media All-District Coach of the Year honors.

Cole Camp ended up at 22-8 and made it to the MSHSAA state quarterfinals, losing to eventual state runner-up Lutheran North.

I had the opportunity to interview Coach Shearer and get his perspective on the season, his players and next season's teams.

JL-How do you feel about the Coach of the Year awards?

Coach Shearer-Anytime you receive an award from your peers, it make you feel good, but players make good coaches. I had a wise old coach teach me "Its not a coaches job to win, its a coaches job to not let them lose."

JL-I have been around you enough to know you love all your kids, which is probably the greatest compliment anybody could ever give you. This though, has to be a special class of seniors for you to graduate. There

is your son, Ethan, who has more determination and grit than most. Then you have Owen Ives, just a quality young man and Mike Wissman, another great kid among others. Care to comment?

Coach Shearer-I have been with this group since they all started playing in 1st grade football, through Upwards basketball and so on. I will miss them as people and competitors. They will always have a special place in my heart, as all my players do. The program always talks about "Its Early Now But It Gets Late Quick". Finishing in the program means you are part of the Shearer family and these boys are definitely part of the family.

JL-Next season you have Reid Harrison, who you've called the best athlete you've ever coached, and Gentry Dieckman another superb athlete. How good can you be?

Coach Shearer-Football will need some people to fill some holes, but could sneak up on some people.

Basketball will return 5 young men who got to play quality minutes, so could be another great year.

JL-What life lessons do you try to pass on to your players?

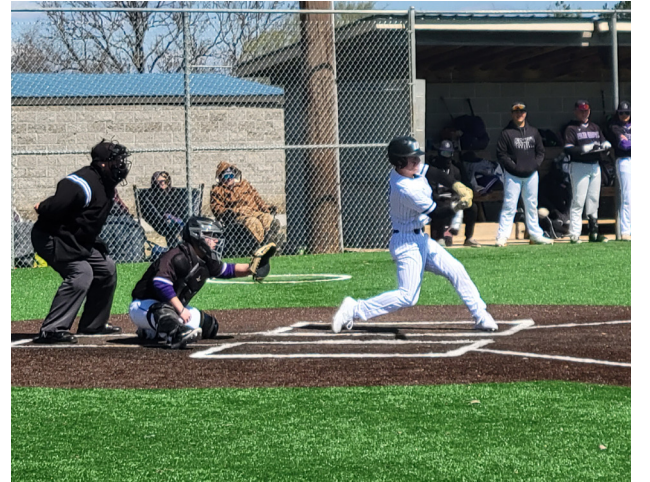

Ladycats Prepared To Ride Pitching, Youth In 2023



After a season in which she garnered second team All-State honors as a freshman, Warsaw will ride Brylee Brewster's pitching in what the Ladycats are hoping will be another successful season.

Brewster appears primed for a stellar sophomore campaign after leading Warsaw to a 13-2 record a year ago, when she posted a 0.79 ERA and struck out 156 batters in just 80 innings of work.

"Brylee puts in work all year long," head coach Megan Daleske said. "She plays for KC Peppers-Wallace 18's throughout the summer and continues individual work with pitching lessons and workout regimen in the winter."

She went on to say, "Brylee's best asset as a pitcher is her ability to control multiple pitches. She moves the ball around very well and constantly keeps batters guessing."

lessons with Brewster to help develop chemistry for the battery.

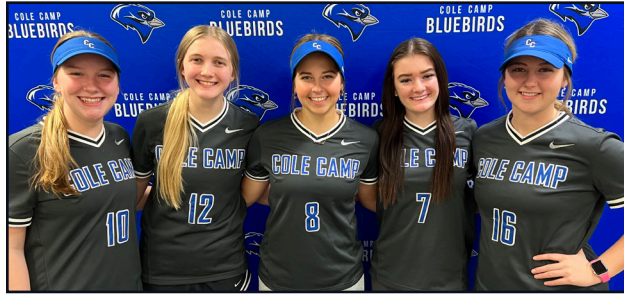

The Wildcats posted 14 wins in 2022 and they return seven starters from that team, looking to make another run into the Class 3 playoffs.

Senior catcher Nick Bagley earned first team All-State honors behind the plate a year ago and he'll be responsible for helping to mentor a young pitching staff.

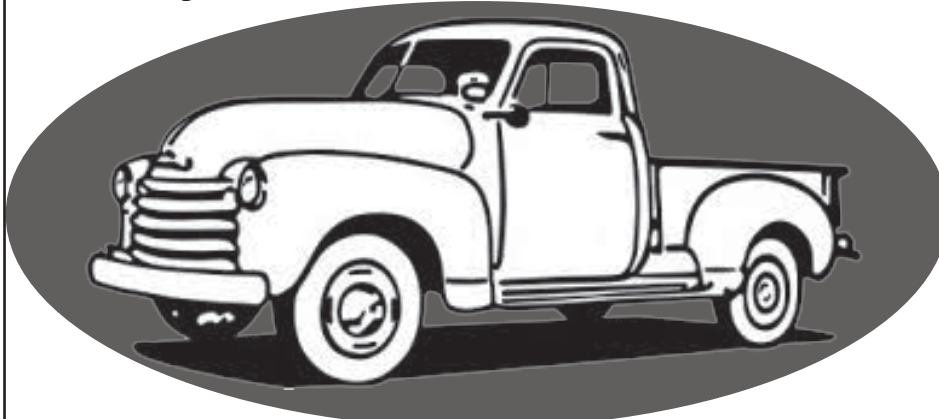

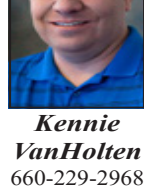

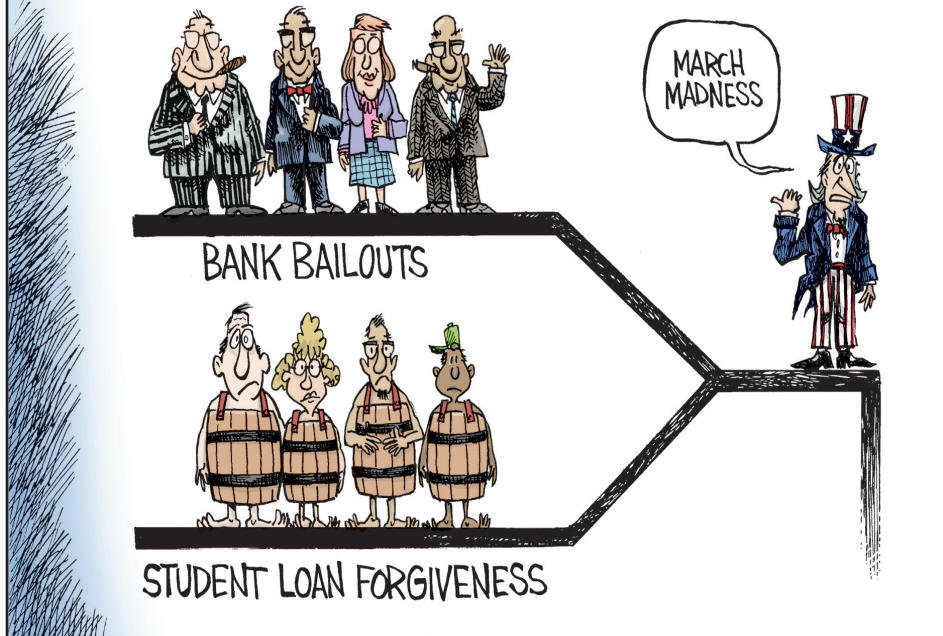
Ran across a Netflix documentary about some

But there's another key advantage to owning CDs: They can help diversify a portfolio of stocks and stock mutual funds that are generally more susceptible to movements in the financial markets. A portfolio that contains CDs, as well as bonds and government securities, can help reduce the effects of market volatility. Keep in mind, though, that diversification can't guarantee profits or prevent losses in a declining market.

While adding individual CDs can be valuable, you might get a greater benefit from a more strategic approach known as laddering. You can build a CD ladder by buying a series of CDs that mature at different dates in the future — perhaps one month, three months, six months, nine months and 12 months out, or an even longer-term ladder of one to five years. In either case, as one CD matures, you can use the money if you need it or reinvest it to another "rung" on your ladder. If interest rates are up, the reinvestment option might be appealing, but if the available CD rates are lower than your maturing CDs, you could find better uses for your money. And you'd still have your longer-term CDs, possibly paying higher rates, working for you. You must evaluate whether a CD ladder and the securities held within it are consistent with your investment objectives, risk tolerance and financial circumstances.

The amount of space occupied by CDs in your portfolio should depend somewhat on your stage of life.
