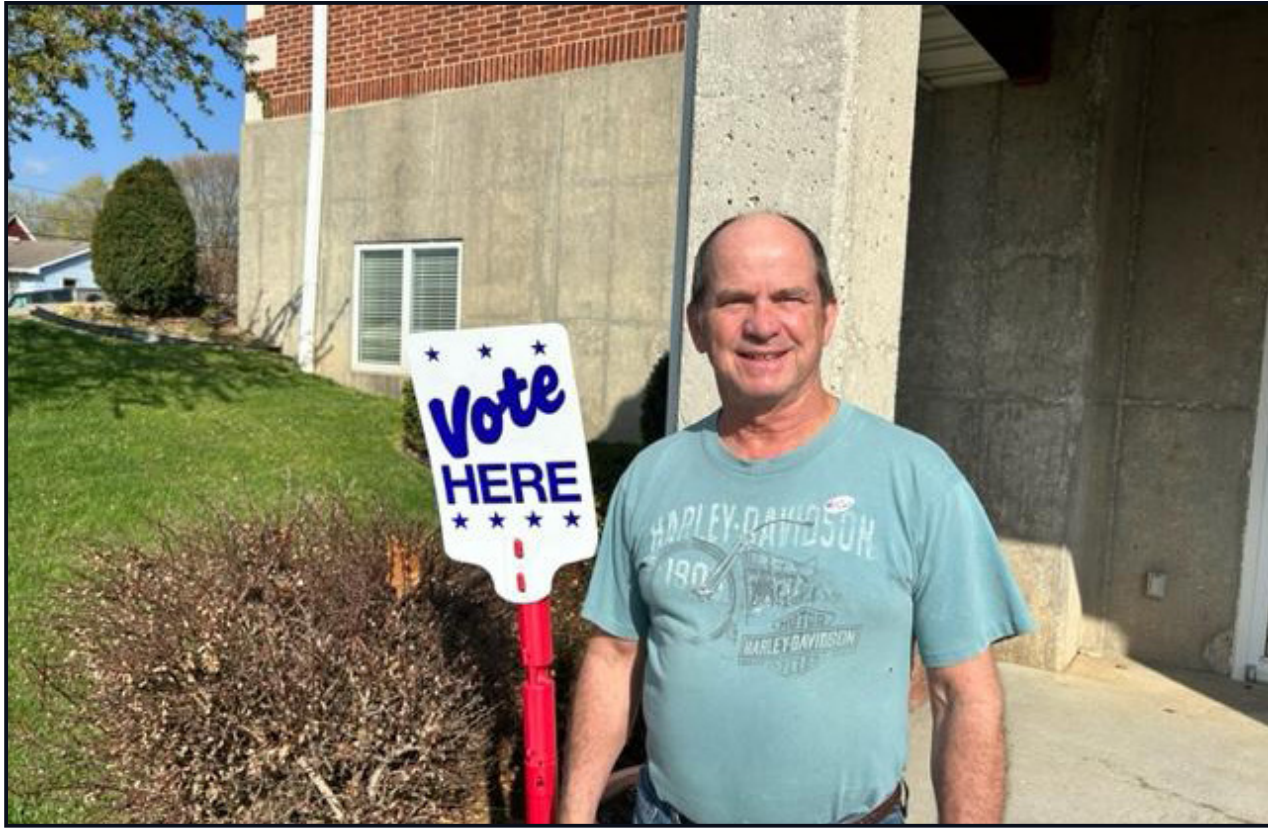

Bothwell Receives CuddleCot Cooling Device For Pregnancy Loss

The Blake Wagner Foundation recently donated a CuddleCot cooling pad and Moses basket to the Women's Health and Newborn Care unit at Bothwell Regional Health Center. The portable device provides families who have experienced pregnancy loss the opportunity to spend additional time with their baby.

Pregnancy loss includes miscarriage, which is the loss of a baby before the 20th week of pregnancy, and stillbirth, which is the death or loss of a baby occurring between 20 and 40 weeks of completed pregnancy or during delivery. Last year, 66 patients at Bothwell Regional Health Center experienced pregnancy loss. The CuddleCot is used to cool the baby with a soft flexible cooling pad and attached cooling unit. with the cloves, inserting one at the intersection of each crosshatch. Brush the entire surface of the ham generously with the glaze and return to the oven. Cook the ham for another 1 1/2 hours, brushing with the glaze at least 3 times.

Transfer to a cutting board or platter and let rest about 30 minutes. Carve and serve warm or at room temperature.

Note: If using half a 15-lb. bone-in ham (7 to 8 lbs), halve the glazing ingredients and cook for half the time.



Easter is almost here and I love the feeling of renewal and hope it brings. (It's also the only time of year when you can put all your eggs in one basket) Along with the hope and joy comes the traditional ham. This is a great recipe which

everyone appreciates. You need an inexpensive bone in ham, cheapest you can find. So don't waste money on a fine aged ham; use, as I do, a plain old bone-in, pre-packaged, even "water added" supermarket ham.
1 (15 pound) smoked bone-in ham (not spiral-cut)
1 1/2 cups orange marmalade
1 cup Dijon mustard
1 1/2 cups (packed) dark brown sugar
1 rounded tablespoon

whole cloves
Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Set the oven rack on the lower-middle level. Cut off and discard the tough outer skin and excess fat from the ham. Put it in a large roasting pan and, with a long, sharp knife, score it, making crosshatch incisions about 1/2 inch deep and 1 inch apart all over the ham. Roast for 2 hours. Remove the ham from the oven and increase the heat to 350. For the glaze, stir together the marmalade, mustard and brown sugar. Stud the ham

The foundation's goal is to supply Missouri hospitals with CuddleCots to give grieving parents of stillborn babies the gift of time. Each CuddleCot placement costs about \$3,000. The cost of Bothwell's CuddleCot was donated by Keith and Angie Hayes, Janice Wieberg, Parker Hayes and Danielle Beltz, the family of Victoria Susan Lucille Hayes, who was stillborn in 1994.

**NHTSA and Law Enforcement
Remind Drivers:
U Drive. U Text. U Pay**



Local Law Enforcement is teaming up with the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Region 7, which includes Arkansas, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, and Nebraska for the national U Drive. U Text. U Pay. high-visibility enforcement campaign. From April 3-10, 2023, law enforcement officers will work together to enforce texting and distracted driving laws.

According to NHTSA, 32,483 people died in distraction-affected crashes over the ten-year period from 2011 to 2020. In 2020, there were 3,142 deaths linked to driver distraction or 8% of all motor-vehicle

crash fatalities. This is a slight increase in fatalities compared to 2019.

Research shows that younger drivers, particularly in the Millennials and Generation Z cohorts, are the most distracted drivers, often using their cell phones to talk, text, and scroll through social media while driving. According to NHTSA research from 2017, young drivers 16 to 24 years old have been observed using handheld electronic devices while driving at higher rates than older drivers since 2007. In 2020, 7% of drivers 15 to 20 years old involved in fatal crashes were reported as distracted.

"Distracted driving is a leading cause of vehicle crashes on our nation's roads, and most of this distraction is attributed to texting while driving," said Regional Administrator Susan DeCourcy. "People know texting and driving is dangerous and often illegal, but they do it anyway, and it puts others at risk. Beginning April 3, drivers will see increased law enforcement efforts across the country and throughout our region. Law enforcement officers will be enforcing state-based texting laws to reduce distracted driving. If you drive and text, you will pay," she added.

Many drivers are guilty of a "double standard" when it comes to distracted driving. In its 2018 Traffic Safety Culture Index, the AAA Foundation reported that while nearly 96% of drivers believed it was very or extremely dangerous to read a text or email while driving, 4 out of 10 drivers admitted to doing so within the previous 30 days. The actual rates are likely even higher.

Drive Safe Every Trip

Local law enforcement and NHTSA Region 7 urge drivers to put their phones away when they are behind the wheel. If you absolutely need to text, pull over and do not drive while doing so. If you are the driver, follow these steps for a safe

driving experience:

If you are expecting a text message or need to send one, pull over and park your car in a safe location. Once you are safely off the road and parked, it is safe to text.

Ask your passenger to be your "designated texter." Allow them access to your phone to respond to calls or messages.

Enter all device navigation coordinates before putting your car into drive. If you need to alter your trip, ask a passenger to make adjustments or pull over to a safe location and put your car in park first.

Do not engage in social media scrolling or messaging while driving.

MDC Offers Spring Wildflower Hike April 15



The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) will host a guided spring wildflower hike from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday, April 15, at the Big Buffalo Creek Conservation Area southeast of Cole Camp. Join MDC biologists as they look for early blooming wildflowers such as Dutchman's breeches, Jack-in-the-Pulpit, and many others. The area has a variety of wildflowers with more than 20 spring ephemerals. Flowering dogwoods may be blooming on the forested hillsides.

MDC biologists will answer questions about wildflowers and the area's forest and woodland ecology. Big Buffalo Creek, a small Ozark stream with clear water, flows through the area. The hike will also showcase how MDC manages the variety of natural communities found in the hilly, 3,612-acre conservation area. The conservation area is part of the larger Big Buffalo Creek Priority Geography, where MDC staff works with private landowners and on public land to enhance natural communities and preserve stream water quality in the watershed.

The spring wildflower hike is open to all ages. Hiking will be on terrain with moderate difficulty. The area does have some steep uphill grades to traverse. Participants should dress for the weather and bring cameras, sturdy hiking shoes, tick repellent, and water.

Space is limited to 30 participants. The hikers may split up into three guided groups after the start. Registration is required. To register, visit <https://short.mdc.mo.gov/4Mj>.

It was a cool and gusty day but the Ladycats took full advantage of being on the field by whipping the competition on their way to a championship finish at the Buffalo Lady Bison Invitational on Saturday.

In their first game of the day, the Ladycats (5-2) defeated Seymour with a 16-0 final as Brylee Brewster and Hailey Ferguson combined to complete the shutout.

Warsaw drew first blood by plating 5 runs in the first, giving the pitching staff all the support they would need. Tanna Howe, Brewster, Jaylen McCullick, Faith Tharaldson and Carly Price

all had hits in the inning. The Ladycats tallied 8 runs in the second frame off of hits by Howe, Adison Sherrill, Sadie Chapman and Haylee Cobb to stretch their lead to 13-0.

Warsaw pushed across 3 more runs in the third to round out the 16-0 final.

Brewster got the win in the circle by pitching just 1 inning. She gave up 0 hits, 0 walks and struck out 2. Ferguson took over in the second. She yielded just 1 hit, 2 walks and struck out 2.

Howe paced Warsaw with 3 hits in 4 at-bats, including 2 doubles. Sherrill and Cobb both had 2 hits for the Ladycats, one of Sherrill's also being a two-bagger.

In their semifinal matchup with Morrisville (MCE), Brewster threw a complete

game shutout for Warsaw (6-2), beating the Lady Panthers, 1-0.

Base runners were at a premium in this one as both pitchers toeing the rubber controlled the entire game.

Morrisville managed their only hit in the top of the sixth, then drew a 2-out walk in what would be their best chance to push a run across. Brewster, however, would not be denied as she added to her strikeout total for the third out of the inning.

In the bottom of the sixth, Chapman bunted and reached on an error when the third baseman spiked the ball to the first baseman. Howe moved Chapman to second with a single up the middle and they both moved up one more base on an infield hit by Sherrill to load the bases. With 1 out, Brewster powered a ball to the third base side, Chapman raced home on the fielder's indecision and the Ladycats escaped with a 1-0 victory.

Howe, Sherrill and Brewster's hits in the sixth were the only ones in the game for Warsaw.

Brewster went all six innings for the win. She gave up just 1 hit, walked only 2 and tallied 18 strikeouts.

Brewster threw a gem in the championship game as

the Ladycats bested Ava by a score of 8-0.

She earned the victory in the circle, allowing 4 hits and 0 runs over 7 innings, striking out a school record tying 20 opposing batters and walking 0.

and Brewster when she reached on an error, giving Warsaw the 3-0 lead.

The Ladycats (7-2) pushed across 1 more run in the second on an RBI single by McCullick that scored Cobb to make it 4-0.

The excitement stalled through the fifth inning, but Warsaw would tally 4 more runs in the sixth, led by hits by Price, Janie Kilgore, Sherrill and Brewster. Howe, Sherrill and Brewster

all had RBI's in the inning for the Ladycats, giving them an 8-0 lead.

Brewster struck out the first two batters and got a pop-up to Cobb at shortstop to secure the championship win.

Cobb led Warsaw with 2 hits while 1 each was contributed by Howe, Sherrill, Brewster, McCullick, Tharaldson, Price and Kilgore.

Cole Camp left 12 men on base.

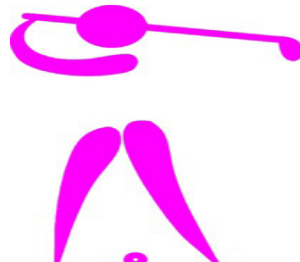
George Bain pitched six innings allowing two runs. Tanner Damlo finished the contest for the Gremlins.

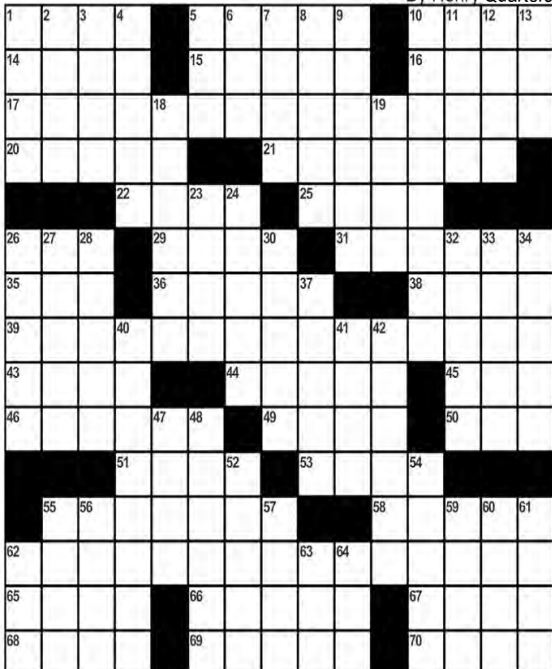

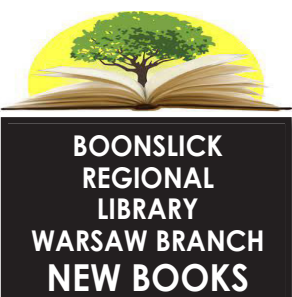
Colbert April 3rd, Gracie Colbert April 11th and my great-granddaughter Mesa Welch on April 14th.

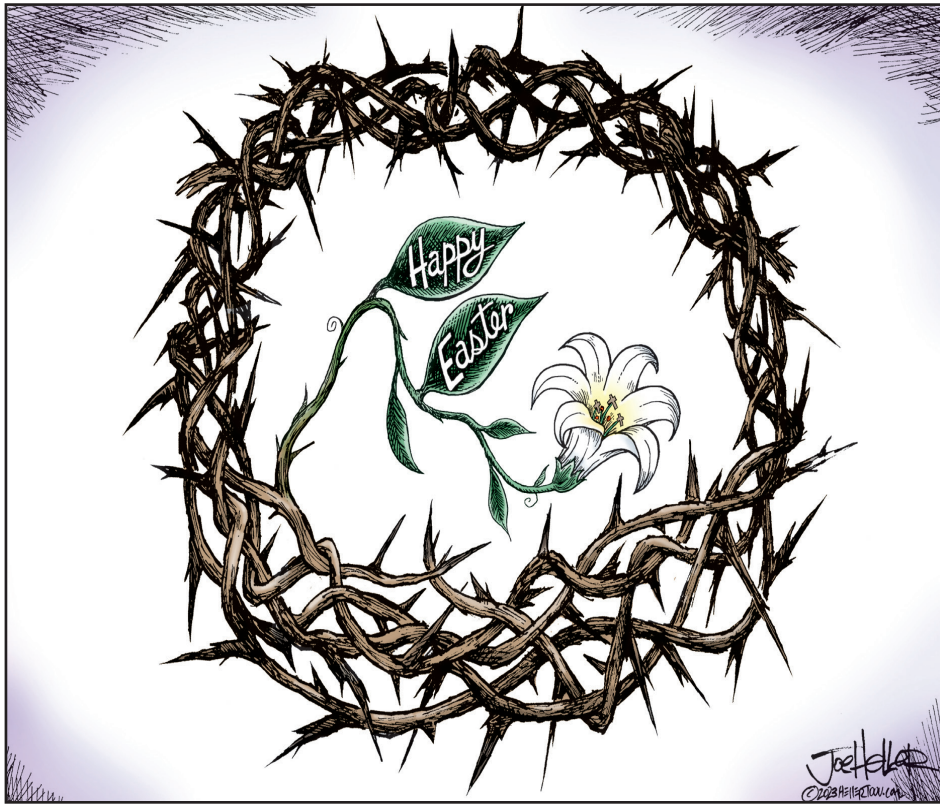

During your working years, you generally know how much money you're bringing in, so you can budget accordingly. But once you're retired, it's a different story. However, with some diligence, you can put together a "paycheck" that can help you meet your income needs.

Where will this paycheck come from? Social Security benefits should replace about 40% of one's pre-retirement earnings, according to the Social Security Administration, but this figure varies widely based on an individual's circumstances. Typically, the higher your income before you retire, the lower the percentage will be replaced by Social Security. Private pensions have become much rarer in recent decades, though you might receive one if you worked for a government agency or a large company. But in any case, to fill out your retirement paycheck, you may need to draw heavily on your investment portfolio.

Your portfolio can provide you with income in these ways:

- Dividends – When you were working, and you didn't have to depend on your portfolio for income to the extent you will when you're retired, you may have reinvested the dividends you received from stocks and stock-based mutual funds, increasing the number of shares you own in these investments. And that was a good move, because increased share ownership is a great way to help build wealth. But once you're retired, you may need to start accepting the dividends to boost your cash flow.
- Interest payments – The interest payments from bonds and other fixed-income investments, such as certificates of deposit



(CDs), can also add to your retirement income. In the years immediately preceding their retirement, some investors increase the presence of these interest-paying investments in their portfolio. (But even during retirement, you'll need some growth potential in your investments to help keep you ahead of inflation.)

• Proceeds from selling investments – While you will likely need to begin selling investments once you're retired, you'll need to be careful not to liquidate your portfolio too quickly. How much can you sell each year? The answer depends on several factors — your age, the size of your portfolio, the amount of income you receive from other sources, your spouse's income, your retirement lifestyle, and so on. A financial professional can help you determine the amount and type of investment sales that are appropriate for your needs while considering the needs of your portfolio over your lifetime.

When tapping into your investments as part of your retirement paycheck, you'll also want to pay special attention to the amount of cash in your portfolio. It's a good idea to have enough cash available to cover a year's worth of your living expenses, even after accounting for other sources of income, such as Social Security or pensions. In addition, you may want to set aside sufficient cash for emergencies. Not only will these cash cushions help you with the cost of living and unexpected costs, but they might also enable you to avoid digging deeper into your long-term investments than you might like.

You may be retired for a long time — so take the steps necessary to build a consistent retirement paycheck.

Dear Editor
After giving corporations another huge tax break, the Missouri GOP took opposite steps in making working families lives a little better and our kids a little safer. The proposed cuts: \$357 million from K-12 education; \$79 million from childcare providers; \$56 million from pay for early education, and Rep. Cody Smith (R) followed through with stripping public libraries of state funding. And if those aren't bad enough, they voted against \$15 million in federal funds for school safety such as metal detectors, school

resource officers and mental health support. To help put this in perspective, they voted against the school safety funds a day after the shooting at The Covenant School in Tennessee. Ironically, the funding was allocated by Congress in the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act passed in June 2022 in response to the school shooting in Uvalde, Texas.

They also moved \$187M from general revenue and replaced with lottery funds, proving lottery money was never going to be extra funds for education. For those who may have forgotten, in 1992, Missouri voters agreed to earmark lottery ticket proceeds to help fund public education.

A bright spot - the MO GOP Senate finally recognizes the doctor-patient relationship must be respected and left alone by lawmakers — as long as the doctor is a veterinarian, and the patient

is a cat. That's right folks, Republican state senators feel "it's inappropriate for lawmakers to decide what's medically necessary or not if it interferes with the patient-client relationship between a vet and the owner of a pet."

The GOP continues to prove they have no interest in making our lives better.

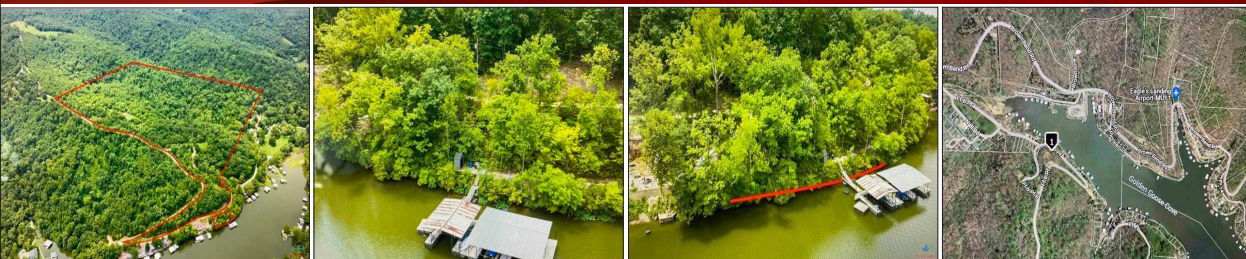

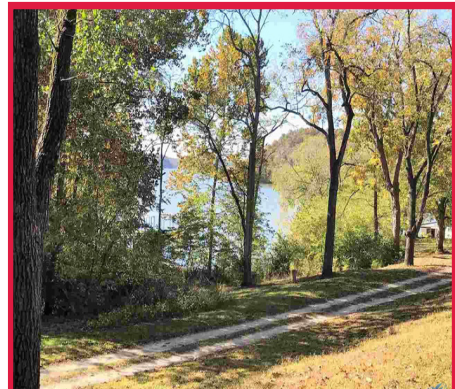

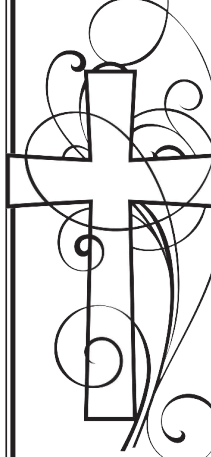

Members of the Missouri House gave bipartisan support to a legislative proposal that would legalize sports wagering in the state.

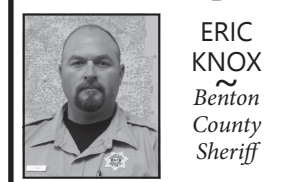

Top harvest counties were Osage with 71 birds harvested, Miller with 65, and Texas with 64. Young hunters checked 2,881 birds during the 2022 spring youth weekend.

"The cool, windy weather on Saturday made for challenging turkey hunting conditions," said MDC Turkey Biologist Nicholas Oakley.

"Fortunately, hunters stuck with it and Sunday's weather was more conducive to harvesting a turkey."

Missouri House Approves Fiscal Year 2024 State Operating Budget (HBs 1-13)

The members of the Missouri House of Representatives this week approved a \$45.6 billion state operating budget for the upcoming fiscal year that begins in July.

With the FY 2024 state budget plan, House members are making an enormous investment in the both the K-12 and higher education systems.

With the approval of the state budget, House members also showed their strong support for law enforcement and public safety. The spending plan now on its way to the Senate would provide a 20% pay increase for the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Capitol Police.

Budget Highlights \$9.7 billion in funding for the state's system of K-12 education which includes full funding (\$3.6 billion) for the school foundation formula.

\$55.1 million in funding for Close the Gap grants that will help Missouri families address the learning loss that occurred as a result of the pandemic.

\$56 million recommended by the governor to expand pre-kindergarten options to all four-year-old children eligible for free and reduced priced lunch at no cost.

\$31.9 million to expand the Teacher Career Ladder Program.

Full funding for state scholarship programs such as Bright Flight, Access Missouri, and A+.

20% pay increases for the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Capitol Police to help attract and retain quality officers.

\$50 million for school

safety grants for Missouri schools to make physical security investments on their campuses, develop safety plans, establish school resource officer programs, and increase active threat trainings.

\$20 million to support Missouri's veteran's homes.

\$72.9 million in new funding for nursing home rate increases to help ensure homes can continue to provide quality care to some of the state's most vulnerable Missourians.

\$78.5 million to expand childcare access, improve facilities, and help employers increase staff wages.

\$24.8 million to reform and rebuild the Children's Division including adding caseworkers and adding prevention workers to keep children out of foster care.

\$4.3 million to the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services to implement its new maternal mortality plan.

\$1.3 million for grants to increase access to drug addiction treatment.

\$10 million for autism research.
