Pregnancy loss includes miscarriage, which is the loss of a baby before the 20th week of pregnancy, and stillbirth, which is the death or loss of a baby occurring between 20 and 40 weeks of completed pregnancy or during delivery. Last year, 66 patients at Bothwell Regional Health Center experienced pregnancy loss. The CuddleCot is used to cool the baby with a soft flexible cooling pad and attached cooling unit. love the feeling of renewal and hope it brings. (It's also the only time of year when you can put all your eggs in one basket) Along with the hope and joy comes the traditional ham. This is a great recipe which

1 1/2 cups (packed) dark brown sugar tablespoon 1 rounded

large roasting pan and, with a long, sharp knife, score it, making crosshatch incisions about 1/2 inch deep and 1 inch apart all over the ham. Roast for 2 hours. Remove the ham from the oven and increase the heat to 350.

For the glaze, stir together the marmalade, mustard and brown sugar. Stud the ham with the cloves, inserting one at the intersection of each crosshatch. Brush the entire surface of the ham generously with the glaze and return to the oven.

Cook the ham for another 1 1/2 hours, brushing with the glaze at least 3 times.

Transfer to a cutting board or platter and let rest about 30 minutes. Carve and serve warm or at room temperature.

Note: If using half a 15-lb. bone-in ham (7 to 8 lbs), halve the glazing ingredients and cook for half the time.

NHTSA and Law Enforcement Remind Drivers: U Drive. U Text. U Pay

Local Law Enforcement is teaming up with the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Region 7, which includes Arkansas, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, and Nebraska for the national U Drive. U Text. U Pay. high-visibility enforcement campaign. From April 3-10, 2023, law enforcement officers will work together to enforce texting and distracted driving laws. According to NHTSA, 32,483 people died in distraction-affected crashes over the ten-year period from 2011 to 2020. In 2020, there were 3,142 deaths linked to driver distraction or 8% of all motor-vehicle

crash fatalities. This is a slight increase in fatalities compared to 2019.

Research shows drivers. that younger particularly in the Millennials and Generation Z cohorts, are the most distracted drivers, often using their cell phones to talk, text, and scroll social through media while driving. According to NHTSA research from 2017, young drivers 16 to 24 years old have been observed using handheld electronic devices while driving at higher rates than older drivers since 2007. In 2020, 7% of drivers 15 to 20 years old involved in fatal crashes were reported as distracted.

"Distracted driving is a leading cause of vehicle crashes on our nation's roads, and most of this distraction is attributed to texting while driving," said Regional Administrator Susan DeCourcy. "People know texting and driving is dangerous and often illegal, but they do it anyway, and it puts others at risk. Beginning April 3, drivers will see increased law enforcement efforts across the country and throughout our region. Law enforcement officers will be enforcing state-based texting laws to reduce distracted driving. If you drive and text, you will pay," she added.

Many drivers are guilty of a "double standard" when it comes to distracted driving. In its 2018 Traffic Safety Culture Index, the AAA Foundation reported that while nearly 96% of drivers believed it was very or extremely dangerous to read a text or email while driving, 4 out of 10 drivers admitted to doing so within the previous 30 days. The actual rates are likely even higher.

Drive Safe Every Trip

Local law enforcement and NHTSA Region 7 urge drivers to put their phones away when they are behind the wheel. If you absolutely

driving experience: If you are expecting a text message or need to send one, pull over and park your car in a safe location. Once you are safely off the road and parked, it is safe to text.

Ask your passenger to be your "designated texter." Allow them access to your phone to respond to calls or messages.

Enter all device navigation coordinates before putting your car into drive. If you need to alter your trip, ask a passenger to make adjustments or pull over to a safe location and put your car in park first.

Do not engage in social media scrolling or messaging while driving.

Cell phone use is habitforming. Struggling to not text and drive? Activate your phone's "Do Not Disturb" feature, or put your phone in the trunk, glove box, or back seat

MDC Offers Spring Wildflower Hike April 15



The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) will host a guided spring wildflower hike from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday, April 15, at the Big Buffalo Creek Conservation Area southeast of Cole Camp. MDC biologists Join as they look for early blooming wildflowers such as Dutchman's breeches, Jack-in-the-Pulpit, and many others. The area has a variety of wildflowers

MDC biologists will answer questions about wildflowers and the area's forest and woodland ecology. Big Buffalo Creek, a small Ozark stream with clear water, flows through the area. The hike will also showcase how MDC manages the variety of natural communities found in the hilly, 3,612acre conservation area. The conservation area is part of the larger Big Buffalo Creek Priority Geography, where MDC staff works with private landowners and on public land to enhance natural communities and preserve stream water quality in the watershed.

The spring wildflower hike is open to all ages. Hiking will be on terrain with moderate difficulty. The area does have some steep uphill grades to traverse. Participants should dress for the weather and bring cameras, sturdy hiking shoes, tick repellent, and water.

Space is limited to 30 participants. The hikers may split up into three guided groups after the start. Registration is required. To register, visit https://short. mdc.mo.gov/4Mj.







Social Security benefits should replace about 40% of one's preretirement earnings, according to the Social Security Administration, but this figure varies widely based on an individual's circumstances. Typically, the higher your income before you retire, the lower the percentage will be replaced by Social Security. Private pensions have become much rarer in recent decades, though you might receive one if you worked for a government agency or a large company. But in any case, to fill out your retirement paycheck, you may need to draw heavily on your investment portfolio.

Your portfolio can provide you with income in these ways:

• Dividends – When you were working, and you didn't have to depend on your portfolio for income to the extent you will when you're retired, you may have reinvested the dividends you received from stocks and stock-based mutual funds, increasing the number of shares you own in these investments. And that was a good move, because increased share ownership is a great way to help build wealth. But once you're retired, you may need to start accepting the dividends to boost your cash flow.

• Interest payments - The interest payments from bonds and other fixedincome investments, such as certificates of deposit

investments as part of your retirement paycheck, you'll also want to pay special attention to the amount of cash in your portfolio. It's a good idea to have enough cash available to cover a year's worth of your living expenses, even after accounting for other sources of income, such as Social Security or pensions. In addition, you may want to set aside sufficient cash for emergencies. Upon returning from the legislative spring break House members hit the ground running this week. Close to 30 House Bills were Third Read and sent to the Senate for their consideration. Committees continue to work diligently to hear and vet bills. My Committee, the House Committee on Rural Community Development has voted on and approved 4 bills and continues public hearings as we have bills assigned to us. The Senate filibuster broke on Tuesday and we are hoping that they will begin hearing some of the House Bills that have been sent to them. This week I presented one of my own bills, HB. 603, to the House Government Efficiency & Downsizing Committee. HB. 603 is Drivers Education mv Bill that I have previously filed, I was well received in committee. When we return next week our attention will turn to passing the state budget, this process always starts in the House and we are eager to get started. Here are a few highlights

from the week. Lawmakers Approve Historic Tax Relief Package (HBs 816 & 660) The Missouri House has voted to provide more than \$1 billion of tax relief to Missouri families, retirees, and businesses. By a vote of 111-48, House members approved HBs 816 & 660 to cut both the personal income tax and corporate income tax, and exempt social security benefits from state tax.

Members of the Missouri House gave bipartisan support to a legislative proposal that would legalize sports wagering in the state. By a vote of 118-35, lawmakers approved HBs 556 & 581 to allow Missouri to join the more than 30 other states that have already approved a legalized framework for sports betting.

These bills will all now move to the Senate for consideration.

Progress continues on an updated District 57 Directory, we are in the final stages of the process and hope to have it completed soon.


Young Hunters Took 2,550 Turkeys Over Weekend

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that young turkey hunters in Missouri harvested 2,550 birds over the past vouth weekend, April 1 and 2. Top harvest counties were Osage with 71 birds harvested, Miller with 65, and Texas with 64. Young hunters checked 2,881 birds during the 2022 spring youth weekend.

"The cool, windy weather on Saturday made for challenging turkey hunting conditions," said MDC Turkey Biologist Nicholas Oakley. "Fortunately, hunters stuck with it and Sunday's weather was more conducive to harvesting a turkey."

Missouri House Approves Fiscal Year 2024 State Operating Budget (HBs 1-13)

The members of the Missouri House of Representatives this week approved a \$45.6 billion state operating budget for the upcoming fiscal year that begins in July. 13 appropriations The bills passed by the House include full funding for the state's school foundation formula, funding increases for institutions of higher learning, additional support for law enforcement and school safety, and new funding for nursing homes

make physical security investments on their campuses, develop safety plans, establish school resource officer programs, and increase active threat trainings. Additionally, the budget provides an additional \$2 million to the Missouri National Guard to assist with recruitment. Budget Highlights

\$9.7 billion in funding for the state's system of K-12 education which includes

safety grants for Missouri schools to make physical security investments on their campuses, develop safety plans, establish school resource officer programs, and increase active threat trainings.

\$20 million to support Missouri's veteran's homes.

\$72.9 million in new funding for nursing home rate increases to help ensure homes can continue

House Passes Bill to Help Prevent Veteran Suicides (HB 132)

House members this week approved legislation aimed at improving the state's efforts to prevent suicide among its veteran population. Representatives voted 156-0 for HB 132, which directs the Missouri Veterans Commission to work with the Department of Mental Health to come up with recommendations on how Missouri can prevent veteran suicide.

House Gives Stamp of Approval to Legislation to Protect Property Owners (HB 909)

Lawmakers took action this week to prevent a potential landfill from being located near a residential area on the border of Jackson and Cass counties. With strong bipartisan support, the House approved HB 909 to create a one-mile buffer between landfills and neighboring municipalities. The House approved the bill by a vote of 139-16.

The budget this year is a little over 45 billion, yes that is billion with a "B", as there are still a lot of federal dollars from covid relief still going out. Below

With the FY 2024 state budget plan, House members are making an enormous investment in the both the K-12 and higher education systems. allocated The House approximately \$9.7 billion for the state's elementary and secondary education system. That number includes full funding for state's foundation the formula that is used to fund K-12 public schools. It also includes an additional \$233 million to provide a total of \$347 million to fully fund school transportation for the second time in as many years. The House Budget Chairman included another \$55.1 million in funding for Close the Gap grants that will help Missouri families address the learning loss that occurred as a result of the pandemic.

With the approval of the state budget, House members also showed their strong support for law enforcement and public safety. The spending plan now on its way to the Senate would provide a 20% pay increase for the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Capitol Police. 
