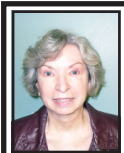

## Full Steam Ahead! Marinas Make Improvements For Summer Rush

Truman Lake, owned by the Corp of Engineers, is stocked full of fish and ready for the spring and summer season of 2023. The Missouri Department of Conservation reports that crappie fishing should be good across the entire lake this year as well as catfish and bass. Marinas started opening in March and are expecting large numbers of boaters, fishermen and tourists to begin visiting the lake within the next couple of weeks. Some of the marinas have new additions to their restaurant menus, as well as to their lodging, docks and rental boats.

Jason Reynolds and his mother Emily Reynolds are owners of Osage Bluff Marina which opened for the season on April 1 and will operate until November 1. Jason Reynolds says it is the oldest marina on Truman Lake. He and his family first opened a marina in Osceola in 1980, and then the current marina at 17393 Osage Bluff Road, Warsaw, in October 1982. It hosts numerous fishing tournaments and

group events for fishermen, sportsmen and families.

"It has been awfully windy the first weeks of this season," said Reynolds. "But we spent our time cleaning and stocking and are now putting some

boats out. We host church retreats, company get-aways, Wounded Warrior groups, and have hosted the Shriner's Tournament when other marinas couldn't accommodate them due to high water. We are elevated

enough that we can function in high water."

Reynolds said that start up was a little slow, but as the water warms the fish will go crazy and in the next week business will double and then be 100 percent

for weeks. There will be crowds for holidays like July 4th and Labor Day. His marina will host a July 4th celebration on Sunday, July 2.

"Our marina is for fishing

Lincoln Mayor Says All City Taxes And Fees Up Over 2022



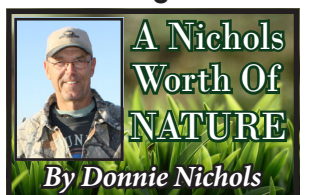

In new business Monday eve, City Mayor Glen Nelson reported that all City taxes and income fees are up over 2022, then praised the City's Directors for sticking to the City's 2023 budget. But he also said he expected some City expenditures to increase, later this year. He was not projecting a resultant budget deficit.

The meeting opened at 6 PM April 10 with Aldermen Jack Lietzke, Barbara Hammond, Phil Fisher, Janice Sweargin present. Mayor Nelson presided; City Clerk Sabrina Brown recorded. First actions by the group were to approve the evening's agenda, minutes of two earlier meetings, and agree to pay bills presented.

Benton County Economic Director Jo Ann Lane followed with comments about her recent work for the City. She thanked the

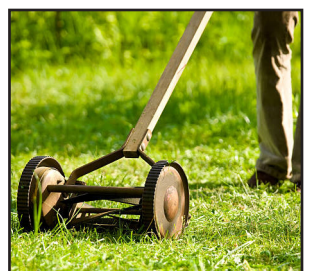

With April comes showers, warm weather, plants and flowers blooming, trees leafing out...and lawns to mow. We didn't use to have a lawn. We had yards that were functional. They were for the chickens, tomato plants and flowers.

Beginning around 1870 and into the 1970s, Americans slowly fell in love with lawns. The one man push reel mower, made in England, arrived



in the United States in the 1750s. Lawns became a sign of taste, calm, power, privilege, order and discipline especially in the aftermath of WWII.

The first internal combustion gas powered mower, also from England, was being used in the US by 1919. In 1953, Briggs and Stratton, who were already providing power

## After Winter Hiatus, Visitor Center Re-Opens Saturday

Visitors will be able to view Truman Lake from the Harry S. Truman Visitor Center starting on April 15 according to Park Ranger Allen Flint.

Flint has been appointed as the ranger in charge of the Truman Visitor's Center replacing Erin Corday who is still working with the U.S. Corps of Engineers.

Opening Day will be full of new experiences as the Kaysinger Bluff Pioneer Heritage Association

(KBPHA) will be welcoming visitors with demonstrations, food and music in the Heritage Day Park located on Kaysinger Bluff.

"It will be a mini-Heritage Days," said Flint. "The members of KBPHA will be dressed in authentic costumes as well as presenting demonstrations of the late 1800's."

One of the major improvements to the bluff area is a trail taking visitors

from the main building to a point overlooking the dam and lake area.

"During the winter, we cleared trees and brush so that visitors can walk about 1.2 miles along the bluff for an excellent view of the lake and the surrounding area," said Flint. "We close the park at 4 PM so anyone wanting to hike the trail should plan to start by 3 PM in order to be back to the Visitor's Center by 4."

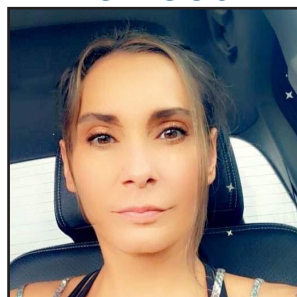

### MDC Hosting Free Global Big Day Birding Hikes On Cole Camp Area Prairies



Join Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) biologists for a free Global Big Day birding event featuring native grassland birds. MDC will host guided birding hikes from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, May 13, at several remnant prairies in the Cole Camp area, south of Sedalia. Grassland and other bird species will be spotted and counted to add to the eBird database. The hikes will also honor World Migratory Bird Day.

“More than 200 species have been found in the area including hawks, owls, waterfowl, songbirds, and woodpeckers,” said Krista Noel, MDC natural history biologist. “The Global Big Day bird data

collected on Audubon’s list of grassland priority birds that are at risk will help science develop conservation for imperiled Henslow’s sparrows, northern bobwhite quail, eastern meadowlarks, and others.”

MDC and the Missouri Prairie Foundation (MPF) manage remnant prairies that will be toured. Space is limited to 30 participants divided into two hiking groups. Biologists will answer questions, help identify birds, and talk about prairie ecology and plant life. The prairies are within a broader area designated by MDC as the Hi Lonesome Priority Geography. In this priority geography, MDC staff works on public and private lands to improve native grassland habitat. The geography has been designated as one of Audubon’s Important Bird Areas. Two of the prairies are stops on the Great Missouri Birding Trail.

Some prairies have

colorful names, often tied to history or families, such as Drover’s Prairie, Hi Lonesome Prairie, Goodnight-Henry Prairie, and Paintbrush Prairie. They are remnants of a once vast native grasslands and savannas that covered much of Missouri. Today, they are valuable and species-rich havens for grassland birds, wildflowers, and prairie grasses.

The Global Big Day birding hikes are a family-friendly event. All levels of birding skills are welcome. Participants must be at the gathering point by 7:30 a.m., then the birders will divide into two groups to visit the prairies. There will be a lunch break, and hikers should bring their own food and drinks.

Participants are advised to bring binoculars, wear sturdy shoes for hiking on prairie, bring sunscreen and tick repellent, and have plenty of water. Travel between prairies will be by caravan, carpooling is advised.

Sometimes I forget some of the easiest recipes in my repertoire. My cousin made this side dish for Easter and when I commented on it, she replied that it was one of mine from way back. (Continued from Page 1) and fun and is family oriented," said Reynolds. "We don't have super large boats, but we have a motel with 40 rooms including some with kitchenettes. We also have 50 beds in our convention center that has a commercial kitchen for rent to large groups. The restaurant is open on weekends (and three-day weekends on holidays.) We serve breakfast and lunch now at about 8 or 9:00 A.M., but within the next week will probably be open by 6 or 6:30 A.M. We have one group with six generations that has been coming to us for a long time and are like our family. We are backwoods driven and have the prettiest sunset on the lake."

Beyond Marine at Sterett Creek offers plenty of room for fishing, sailing, water skiing, tubing, and jet skiing. It has ample parking for boats and trailers and has an on-site public boat ramp. It offers a variety of campsites including full hookups and 50 AMP service. Its hotel offers a variety of room types and sizes as well as a retreat and guest house.

Mandy Persinger and husband Travis manage the Beyond Marine at Sterett Creek and are busy with some new additions. They started building a new dock in the middle of April with 44-slips. Thirty-four slips are 10 by 28 feet, and 10 others are 121 by 28 feet. The marina is doing events on its property every weekend including some kid events like tie dyeing, and adult events like camper crawls. They have golf cart rentals, are installing disc golf, and have facilities for basketball, pickle ball and other types of ball games. They are also starting Saturday night fires for those staying on the property or visiting. Guests can sit around the fire that is started by management but is kept going by those sitting by the fire.

"The Drunken Minnow Bar and Grill has its grand opening May 5-6 with a Kick Off for the Season party," said Mandy. "There will be a DJ and alcohol and food specials that day. We are now offering an appetizer platter called ten/four for families and have some new types of pizza with an additional pizza oven, so orders are delivered sooner. We have six new rental boats – all 2023 Lowe Tritoons. We are kicking off to a good season."

Lisa and Rick Gladson

have owned Truman State Park Marina since the end of 2018 and are excited for the new season. They have a new walkway and have expanded their docks with upgraded nightly slips and additional seasonal slips. They now have close to 300 boat slips and are adding close to 100 new ones. The Sunsetters Bar and Grill is totally up and running with six different bar slushes such as Pina Colada and Wine. There are new appetizers such as pretzel sticks, cheese curds and waffle fries as well as a pork tenderloin sandwich. There is a full patio for outside seating and new breakfast items include biscuits and gravy, and biscuits with sausage, egg, and cheese for people to take with them when they are in a hurry to fish. The bar and grill is open all week and currently starts the day at 6:30 A.M. When days grow longer the times will change. There are hiking trails, picnic areas and campsites in the park's open woodlands.

"We have seven pontoon rentals and one small Jon Boat too," said Lisa. "Since we are located in the middle of Harry Truman Park we have a huge area for swimming and a playground."

Rick's Oar House, owned by Rick Renno, has an upgraded campground, and some new items on the restaurant menu. There is a Sunday special of an eight-ounce bourbon steak served all day, and there are daily specials all during snagging season. The full-size restaurant will be open seven days a week during snagging season and in the summer will close on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The site has a seven-room motel and a campground with full hookups, water, and sewer. All the shoreline in front of the marina is for docks. Swimming is not encouraged.

"Being right on the lake, at the 81-mile marker, we have beautiful views," said Reno. "We sell gas, fishing supplies, ice pop, beer, chips, and boating supplies. We also have a deep-water launching ramp. The weather has not been great for the first three weeks we were opened, but business is up 15 percent over last year for March."

Long-Shoal Marina was bought by a corporation three years ago and is managed by Shannon and Kelly Schmidt. It is a full-service marina with overnight and seasonal slip rentals, the Long Shoal Marina Restaurant,

indoor fish cleaning station, groceries as well as fuel, soda, beer, apparel, tackle, and bait. There is lodging close to the marina and a service center for motor repair needs.

"There is indoor and outdoor patio eating," said Shannon Schmidt. "We have full service on Wednesday and Thursday from 7 A.M. until 3 P.M., Friday, and Saturday until 8 P.M. and Sunday until 5 P.M. The Marina is open every day from 7 A.M. to 3 P.M. We opened April 1 and will close on October 31. We have our usual employees back this season so there are some familiar, friendly faces."

(Continued from Page 1) The road over the dam should be open until June when the Corps of Engineers will close the road to begin repairs to one of the gates of the dam.

The Truman Visitor's Center will have one ranger on duty but there will be several volunteers on hand to answer visitors' questions about the lake and the area. Charlotte Price is the only full-time volunteer and she will be living on Kaysinger Bluff full time during the season.

"We have our volunteers in place for the season," said Flint. "However, members of the community are welcome to apply anytime."

In addition to being in charge of the Visitor's Center, Flint is also in charge of special events. In May there will be a Kids' Fishing Day in Clinton at the Corps of Engineers' pond. Children selected by their teachers will be supplied with fishing poles and bait as well as having instructors teaching them to fish.

"I reach out to all area schools for students to attend this special day," said Flint.

Flint also plans to have special speakers and presentations at the Harry S. Truman Visitor's Center throughout the season.

"I don't have everything set just yet; however, I do plan to have a special event every month during the season," said Flint.

The KPBHA will also host Living History Days on May 4 from 9 AM until 4 PM at the Harry S. Truman Visitor's Center.

The event will consist of living historians demonstrating crafts, trades and life of the 1800's. It is a one-day exclusive event designed for school age children to learn and

experience pioneer life first hand. Numerous crafters and historical demonstrators will be on hand to share their passion and knowledge of early America.

The Harry S. Truman Visitor's Center will be open from April 15 through September 30 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 9 AM until 4 PM. The Center will also be open on Mondays in observance of legal holidays. The Center will be open on Monday and Tuesday for the Fourth of July observation.

The Visitor's Center will reopen on October 21 and 22 for the Pioneer Heritage Days sponsored by the KPBHA. The Center will also be open for the Kaysinger Christmas on December 1 and 2 from 3 PM until 9 PM.

for innumerable agriculture and military applications in the 1920s, revolutionized the lawn and garden industry by developing the first lightweight aluminum engine. Part of the 20th century dream was to have a quarter-acre lawn of Kentucky bluegrass which was good for recreation and admiration and not much else.

On the American front, lawn men used power machinery and chemicals, the tools of war, to engage in a battle with Mother Nature.

For a lot of American history it seemed like we had boundless access to land and we kept extracting from it and building on it. Today's chemical fed, water gulping lawns of monoculture turf grass are static, nonfunctional, tedious and not nature friendly.

There is something a bit decadent about millions of American homeowners spending billions of dollars applying millions of pounds of fertilizer and chemicals (that poison our environment and contaminate our water) and pouring millions of gallons of water on the ground (sometimes using elaborate systems of pipes) to grow something you cannot eat. Everyone loves their yard except Mother Nature. I've always been amazed that people would spend more time and money on their lawns so they could spend more time and money mowing their lawns.

In 2010 when I first began giving prairie and other types of educational tours and speaking to various groups around our state, I always mentioned that water, maybe not in my lifetime but definitely in my children's, would become an expensive commodity. Ted Turner is one of the

largest private landowners in the Southwest United States in part to own water rights. For the first time, water traded on the Chicago

Mercantile Exchange in October 2020 at \$486.53 per acre foot.

Know what the biggest irrigated crop is by area in the United States? Not corn or soybeans but unproductive ornamental lawn: around 40 million acres of it or 20% of the land area of the lower 48 states (cited by Gary Gutman, program manager for NASA's land/cover/land use exchange program).

The entire state of Georgia couldn't contain America's total lawnage. We pour about nine billion gallons of water on landscaping everyday. Meanwhile the Southwest United States is enduring a mega drought. The last two decades constitute its driest period since the year 800.

Even as our planet accelerates its revolt against us we tend our lawns, one part of earth we can control. Over the last 50 years we have slowly fallen out of love with lawns. They began to signal waste, disregard, disharmony, homogeneity and gentrification.

In some places lawns have become a liability, or in some cases, an asset on the condition of its removal. California's main water utility is paying its customers between \$2-\$5 for each square foot of living turf they remove. Last year, the Nevada state legislature prohibited the use of water from the dribbling Colorado River to feed certain types of "nonfunctional turf" which in southern Nevada slurps up to 12 billion gallons of water every year, more than 10% of the states usage of the river.

Before the law passed, Sun City Anthem, a retirement community in Henderson, Nevada, had already removed almost 40,000 square feet of grass (replaced with native plants) which nearly halved its water bill.

There is a grass roots movement to turn lawns into an oasis of native plants to help regenerate biodiversity. Native plants require little if any water or supplemental nutrients because they thrive in local weather and soil conditions. They attract pollinators, insects and tiny creatures that prefer to eat and reproduce on them which benefits birds and other animals in the food chain. Native plants' deeper roots also sequester more carbon from the atmosphere.

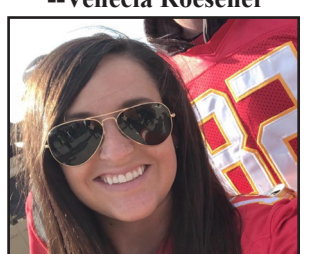

Becoming part of a blended family can certainly be rewarding. Of course, as is the case in all families, there will be challenges, one of which is financial. A blended family must deal with some specific financial issues, so it's a good idea to become familiar with them.

In particular, consider these areas:

- Separate or joint accounts? – Should your two family units combine all your finances or maintain separate accounts? There's

But if you are joining households with a spouse or partner with younger children, you may want to merge accounts to pay for household expenses and work toward your new, shared financial objectives. And it doesn't have to be an "either-or" approach — you might decide to blend some accounts and keep others separate.

• Debts and credit ratings – It's likely that you and your new spouse or partner, and perhaps even some children, will bring debts into your blended family. As these debts can affect your family's finances in several ways, including your ability to borrow and your credit ratings, you will want to know what everyone owes, and the amount of monthly payments needed to meet these obligations. After that, you may be able to find ways to consolidate debts or find other ways to reduce or eliminate them.

• Legal issues – When you establish a blended family, you may want to review, and possibly update, the beneficiary designations on your life insurance policy and retirement accounts, such as your IRA and 401(k). These designations can supersede instructions you may have left in your estate planning documents — including your last will and testament — so it's important to ensure they

reflect your current wishes. And speaking of your estate plans, you may well need to revise them, too, in consultation with your attorney.

• Attitudes toward money – Attitudes toward money — yours and those of your new spouse or partner — should be addressed when starting a blended family. Is one of you more of a saver while the other spends more freely? As investors, does one of you favor taking more risk while the other is more conservative? It's important to reconcile these differences as best you can, especially if you plan on merging your finances. This means that you both may need to compromise somewhat, but you should strive to avoid having either of you feeling uncomfortable in your choices. In any case, open and honest communication

is the first step in achieving a harmonious financial strategy.

These aren't the only financial considerations involved with blended families, but they should give you some things to think about — and the earlier you start thinking about them, the better.

Tommy married Kay Phillips on September 6, 1958, in Auburn, Nebraska. She survives of the home.

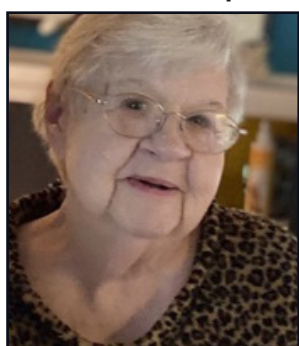

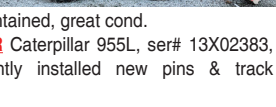

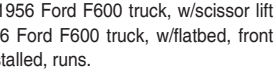

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) congratulates Tyler Goodale of Doniphan for swiping the second state record fish of 2023 with an 11-ounce flier he caught March 26 from Duck Creek Conservation Area using the pole-and-line method. Goodale actually caught two record-worthy fliers that day, both identical in weight and length.

The previous Missouri record flier was a 10-ounce spotted sucker at Duck Creek in 1991.

Fliers are a species of conservation concern in Missouri. Largest populations are found at Duck Creek Conservation Area and nearby Mingo National Wildlife Refuge, where extensive areas of standing-water habitat remain. Fliers prefer quiet, clear bodies of water with little current and considerable aquatic vegetation and mud bottom. MDC staff verified the fishes' weight using a certified scale in Wappapello.

This is the second state record Goodale has reeled in from Duck Creek Conservation Area. He caught a 5-pound, 4-ounce spotted sucker at Duck Creek in 2020 that also happens to be the current world record.

Devon Parrott, now 20 years old, was diagnosed with Long QT type 3 syndrome over 10 years ago. He was walking to class when he collapsed in the hallway but he woke up on his own. He is lucky to be alive. His life has changed, but after having an ICD implanted he is doing well and doing things he loves. When you hear of a young person that has collapsed with no apparent reason or warning signs, that is usually long QT or some other type of SADS (Sudden Arrhythmia Death Syndrome) Condition. Unfortunately, many don't make it or have to be resuscitated. On August 15th, 2015 Devon was at the movies when he went into cardiac arrest and was saved by his device twice. He was admitted to the hospital again and was given a new drug under observation. He is doing great now and a true blessing to his friends and family. We are motivated more than ever to screen more kids and possibly save someone else's life in the process!

Our 10th year was a success for Devon's Beat raising over \$17,000 and screening 169 kids, making our new total 1,296 kids screened.
