A BIG Story! Boonslick Regional Celebrates Seventy Amid National Library Week

April 23 through 29 is National Library Week, and April 27 marks the 70th anniversary of Boonslick Regional Library (BRL) that provides public library services to Benton, Cooper, and Pettis Counties. Administrative headquarters for the library system is in Sedalia, and Benton County has satellite libraries in Warsaw and Cole Camp. A big kick-off ceremony will take place at the Sedalia Library on April 28, at 10 A.M. with tours, treats and special acknowledgments. Smaller celebrations will take place at member libraries.

"The Warsaw library was located in several places before settling in its current gorgeous building at 102 E. Jackson Street, in 2006," said Linda Allcorn, Director of BRL. "There is documentation stating that it was first located in a small space in the County Courthouse. After that it is thought to have moved to the Community

Building, then to a place on Main Street, to 235 Washington, then to 950 E. Carpet Barn, each time to find more space. However, there is a lack of supporting documentation of dates of these moves. It is exciting to know that the library now has such massive programs available to our patrons."

Morgan Hudson, supervisor of the Warsaw library, said there will be a meet and greet at the library on April 27, beginning at 11 A.M. to celebrate the 70th anniversary. Tours and refreshments will be provided, and bookmarks that were printed after the bookmark contest will be handed out.

"We will be celebrating our anniversary all year with passive monthly events," said Hudson. "Come in and see what is

going on!"

The Cole Camp Library, located at 701 West Main Street and supervised by Greg Burel since 2014, is scheduling some passive events too such as a literature trivia contest with some great monthly prizes. On forgiveness week (during National Library Week), there will be no fines for late returns of electronics and DVDs, plus

other tech items. "We will have a little celebration for the 70th anniversary," said Burel. "We also are proud of a new thing that happened last fall at our library. Our genealogy room was remodeled and now has a digital microfilm reader to make research more efficient. We are also planning great summer

At 2:15 last Tuesday, afternoon, Lincoln's Kyle Eckhoff signed his letter of intent to play basketball at Westminster College, a NCAA Division III school in Fulton, MO.

Eckhoff, All-State in both football and basketball, helped lead Lincoln to an incredible 28-1 record this year.

Assistant Westminster Coach Billy Jeffries commented on his new recruit, "Kyle played for me in summer ball. He gives us size in the number two position. He can run, play defense and rebound. He can post up smaller guards. I know his family well and played against his dad. We have a real good recruiting class coming in and he is one of those."

Lincoln head coach Tyler Burke said, "It is a good fit for him. It is close to home,

his mom can watch him play. He was a great player for us. We will miss him." According to college coaches, there is zero difference in intensity and focus in practices at different levels. Players are held accountable to the highest degree.

Members of the Guardians of the Children recently placed 65 pinwheels in Warsaw, Windsor and Clinton in honor of the 65 children who died as a result of child abuse in Missouri in 2021. April is National Child Abuse Prevention month so the pinwheels will be in place throughout the month. This number is up from 2020 when 34 children died as a result of child abuse.

J. C. Vandergriff, treasurer of the local GOC, explained that the GOC has a two-fold mission which is to take care of abused children and to inform the public to recognize the signs of child abuse and help.

"When a child of abuse is recommended to us, we interview the adult who has brought the child to our attention then we adopt the child into the organization," Vandergriff said. "We don't legally adopt the child but we bring them into our organization and help them

Get Out And Grow: Area Gardeners Think Spring

April is National Garden Month and is a busy time for local gardeners who are beginning to plant flowers and vegetables. The peak of plant sales in Warsaw takes place in April and lasts until Mother's Day with an increase in sales again on July 4th. Kelley Greenwell, in her sixth year as manager of the seasonal area at

Orscheln, says that plants and other garden items are on sale. The store is carrying annuals, tropicals, hanging baskets, shrubs, herbs, and vegetables, plus flower and vegetable feeds, potting mixes, mulches, and garden soil.

"We are pretty full of plants," said Greenwell. "A lot of our vegetables are cold weather plants like broccoli, lettuce, cabbage, spinach, tomatoes and peppers. A little later we will have eggplant, cucumber,

and watermelon. Everyone has spring fever now and we are selling a lot of landscape timbers, stones, vegetable and flower plants. The peak season will start winding down by the first of July. But we have another peak around Christmas.

Gardening has been around since prehistoric times for food production and pleasure. The initial gardeners in the U.S. were essentially harvesters, but

Ozark Foodie

This recipe for Cherry Chocolate Swamp Cake has been around for years. The name Swamp Cake is not very appealing but the finished product is delicious. It is best served warm so if you make it ahead, be sure to let the cake rest in a low oven for about 15 minutes before serving. The syrupy fruit becomes a natural sauce.

1 cup flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
½ teaspoon baking soda

½ cup sugar
6 Tablespoons cocoa powder
½ cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
¼ cup vegetable oil
½ cup dark brown sugar (firmly packed)
1 can or 1 jar cherry pie filling (21 or 24 ounces)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a nine-inch square baking pan, (I use the spray shortening) Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, sugar and cocoa until well blended. Add milk, vanilla and oil, stir until a thick batter forms.

Pour into pan, spread into an even layer. Sprinkle the brown sugar evenly over top of batter, then pour on the cherry filling and spread over top. Bake for 30 minutes or until bubbly around the edges. Cool on a rack for 10 minutes, cut into squares and serve with a large spoon while still warm.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a nine-inch square baking pan, (I use the spray shortening) Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, sugar and cocoa until well blended. Add milk, vanilla and oil, stir until a thick batter forms.

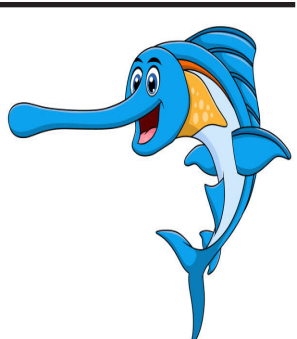

(Continued from Page 1) home gardening started to become a leisure activity in the 1800s.

www.rubyhome.com reports that the U.S. is one of the top three gardening countries, and that 55 percent of people garden to create a beautiful space and 43 percent garden to grow food.

The 23 members of the Stepping Stones Garden Club in Warsaw help to provide gardens and attractive landscapes at public places, and most of them have gardens at home. Their club activities include maintaining gardens around the Boonslick Regional Library in Warsaw where they have just pulled weeds and say that Redbuds and phlox are blooming. They also maintain three gardens at Hooper House that is set up just below the Visitor Center at Truman Lake.

"The deer seem to eat most of the plants behind Hooper House," said Sara Blacklock, Secretary and Membership Chairman of Stepping Stones Garden Club. "They love the wildflowers that we plant. We also maintain a two-mile stretch on Hwy 65 cleaning up trash for MoDOT. We used to maintain a blue star and gold star memorial at Drake Harbor, supporting the military, with help from the community."

Blacklock said that you do not have to be a great gardener to be in the garden club. Members have a love of nature and they have fun. The club has a wide range of people, sometimes including husbands, who get together for meetings and trips. The club meets on the second Wednesday at 10 A.M., usually at the Warsaw Christian Church. But, sometimes they do things differently like visiting nurseries. Anyone interested in finding out

Stepping Stones turned 69 years old this year, is a member of the Federated Garden Clubs of Missouri, and is affiliated with the National Garden Club. Patty Osborn, Treasurer of Stepping Stones Garden Club, said that as far as she knows Verna Rush and a group of ladies founded the club in the 1950s and began working with the Corps of Engineers. The club now partners with the Fish Hatchery and Master Naturalists at times. The club's big plant sale will take place on May 20, from 8 A.M. to 12 P.M. in downtown Warsaw near the courthouse. There will be Hostas, plenty of native plants and free tree seedlings.

"Until this year we always had our plant sale in an old stone building at the end of the Mile-Long bridge, near where Verna Rush lived," said Osborn. "The proceeds from the sales go to scholarships at Warsaw High School, and help us maintain the public landscapes."

(Continued from Page 1) in the City and requested and received permission to do so. She also discussed an August 5 "Smokin' HOT Harborfest" BBQ which will take place in the City. Mac Vorce than discussed an "Off Broadway Rage" event hoped for here soon, then reported a June 6 mountain bike race which will start in the City. Benton County Economic Development Director Jo Ann Lane discussed a Sep. 20-21 Connecting Entrepreneurial Communities Conference to be held in Benton County, with parts to be in Warsaw, Lincoln and Cole Cmp. Sessions are to be held in local businesses. She concluded by adding that the local Dairy Queen business now under construction, is close to a June 6 to 12 opening.

Also under new business, Aldermen approved three ordinances: (1) revising water and sewer rates for City users, (2) authorizing a contract between the City and LePage Engineering Services in connection with the City's water main project, and (3) authorizing the City to contract withand MO Highways and Transportation Commission relating to Municipal Airport improvements. City Administrator Randy Pogue said the project has already been approved and budgeted.

In late session, the group approved a resolution to reimburse itself for costs of purchasing 25 new golf

carts out of City funds then later being reimbursed by the financing bank for their purchase. The group also okayed an April 29 Warsaw Wine Stroll, then approved hiring a City Code Enforcement Officer, starting May 1, and hiring of a Community Development Administrative Assistant. Administrator Pogue then discussed the Municipal Airport, saying it is a good candidate for grant funding a new terminal building and related aprons. He added he thought two new baseball batting cages desired by the City should be constructed with City crews, because of a time problem with a commercial installer. He added the City has the money to do so.

The session went into executive session about 7 PM. The public is invited to attend the regular sessions of this Board, which are usually held on 1st and 3d Monday eves.

(Continued from Page 1) throughout their childhood. We are there with Christmas and birthday presents, we attend their sporting events, we step in where they want us."

Vandergriff explained that the GOC members are on call 24 hours a day and seven days a week to receive calls from their children to help them anyway they can.

"I got a call from one of our kids just to tell me that he received a 100% on his spelling test," said Vandergriff. "He just wanted someone to know."

The GOC volunteers ride motorcycles; however, they also have volunteers who are supporters and help with fund raising but are not bikers.

"The kids love the bikes,"

said Vandergriff. "When we adopt a child we give him or her a jacket with our insignia, a teddy bear and then we take them for a ride on our bikes. They love the bike ride."

Members of the GOC will escort the child to court, attend school and social events at the child's request, provide protection and support and sponsor "Little guardian" private events, yearly. The goal of these events is to provide a safe space where the Little Guardians can have fun, socialize with others that have experienced similar trauma, and forget for a moment about the fear, doubt, and insecurity that was forced upon them at such a young age.

When the GOC escorts a child to court, they will stand at the child's request between the child and the person who is on trial for child abuse so that the child can look at the GOC members and not the person who is on trial.

Vandergriff, a retired Air Force and U. S. Army veteran, is a trained child abuse advocate. He also has worked as a part time police officer for over 12 years.

"I became involved in GOC because I wanted to help children as well as ride my motorcycle," said Vandergriff.

"Not a day goes by that I don't get a call either from someone reporting a child abuse case or one of our Little Guardians who needs assistance," said Vandergriff. All members of the GOC are volunteers.

The GOC will be holding a Corn Hole Tournament on Drake Harbor on May 13 as a fundraiser. Their major fundraiser is a Dice Run to be held on May 20 in Clinton. There will also

be a Corn Hole Tournament as well as a charity auction held at the Eagles Club on North Third Street in Clinton.

Guardians of the Children is a nonprofit 501 ©3 organization comprised of motorcycle enthusiasts that use motorcycles as tools to help children who have overcome child abuse, ages 0-17, become strong confident, and courageous again. The Golden Valley Chapter of GOC was established in 2016. The GOC was first organized in 2006 in San Antonio, Texas. There are 35 members of the Golden Valley GOC and they meet every second Friday of the month in Clinton at the Henry County Museum. Meetings are open to the public.

"Every child has all the power and strength within, just like a motorcycle on the open road and the biker behind it, we just encourage them to unleash it as we fight their demons together," said Vandergriff. "I look forward to the day when there won't be a need for GOC, where all children can grow up in a safe and loving environment."

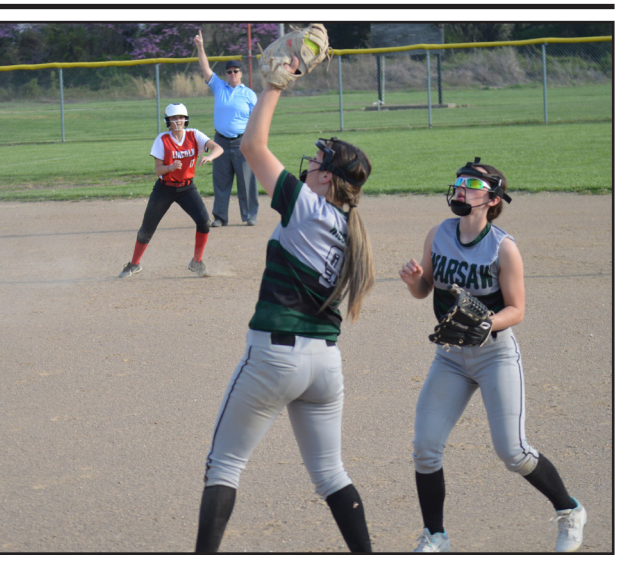

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reports that it sampled and tested more than 33,000 deer for chronic wasting disease (CWD) during the 2022 CWD surveillance year between July 2022 and April 2023. Of the more than 33,000 deer sampled, 117 tested positive for CWD.

CWD is a 100% fatal disease in white-tailed deer and other members of the deer family. The disease has been attributed to significant deer population declines in other states. Learn more at mdc.mo.gov/cwd.

Those 117 deer bring the total number of CWD cases found in the state to 409 since the first case in wild deer was confirmed by MDC in early 2012. Including recent sampling efforts, more than 243,000

tissue samples from wild deer have been collected for CWD testing in Missouri since MDC began CWD surveillance in 2002.

Nearly 19,400 of the 33,000-plus deer tested this past CWD surveillance year were sampled as part of MDC mandatory CWD sampling efforts in select counties during the opening weekend of the November portion of firearms deer season, Nov. 12 and 13. Most of the remaining samples resulted from MDC's voluntary sampling efforts conducted throughout the deer season in partnership with taxidermists and meat processors throughout the state.

Of the more than 33,000 samples, about 3,500 were collected during MDC's targeted culling efforts conducted in cooperation with landowners on a voluntary basis after the close of regular deer season in localized areas near where CWD has been found. Through targeted culling, 41 CWD-positive deer were removed to help slow the spread of CWD.

"The goal of targeted culling is to remove CWD-positive deer from the landscape and reduce deer density in these localized areas to slow the spread of the disease and protect Missouri's deer herd," explained MDC Wildlife Health Program Supervisor Deb Hudman. "Targeted culling is a proven method to slow the spread of CWD and Missouri is one of several states that uses it to manage the disease."

Of the deer tested, MDC found CWD-positive deer in 23 counties: Adair (3), Barry (1), Barton (9), Carroll (1), Cedar (1), Crawford (2), Dallas (1), Franklin (22), Gasconade (1), Hickory (1), Jefferson (7), Linn (15), Livingston (1), Macon (13), Perry (4), Putnam (3), Ray (1), St. Clair (1), St. Francois (1), Ste. Genevieve (20), Stone (4), Sullivan (3), and Taney (2).

"During this past year, we found CWD in a number of new counties," Hudman said. "Cases were detected for the first time in Barton, Carroll, Dallas, Gasconade, Hickory, Livingston, Ray,

St. Francois, and Sullivan counties."

She added that MDC expects CWD to spread but the goal is to slow the spread while researchers work to develop a cure and additional management tools, and to keep the percentage of infected deer low.

In Missouri this past year, less than one percent of tissue samples from hunter-harvested deer tested positive for CWD.

"That is good news," she said. "It is a testament to our ability to find the disease early in new areas and apply management actions to slow its spread."

She added that if MDC does not continue to act aggressively to slow the spread of the disease, CWD could have significant effects on the deer population, hunting culture, and economy.

"There are areas of the country where over half of hunter-harvested adult

bucks test positive for CWD," Hudman explained. "We must do everything we can to not let this happen in Missouri and we need the help of hunters and landowners in this fight."

Hunters and landowners are critical partners in the fight against CWD and can assist MDC by continuing to deer hunt, by participating in CWD sampling, by following regulations designed to slow CWD spread, and by cooperating with targeted culling efforts. Learn more at mdc.mo.gov/cwd.

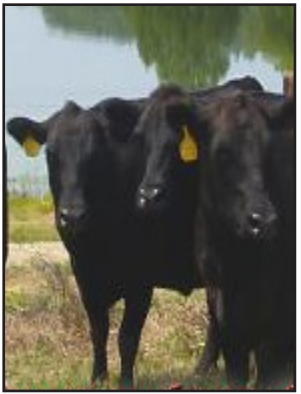

This week was a short one after being on a brief Easter break on Monday. Now with only four weeks remaining in the 2023 Legislative Session the pace quickens as we work to get our priorities across the finish line. I presented my personal property bill, HB. 713, in the Senate Committee on Economic Development and Tax Policy this week. This bill would ensure that motor vehicle valuations would depreciate each year by implementing a depreciation table in the statutes; this fixes a problem that taxpayers faced in 2021 & 2022 when values increased due to an unstable used car market. After presenting the bill to the Senate Committee, Senator Sandy Crawford will now handle the bill while it is in the Senate for consideration.

The Missouri Association of Counties held their annual Legislative Conference this week. A large number of county officials came to visit the Capitol and talk with my fellow Legislators and I about their policy concerns and issues. It was nice to visit with many friends from across the State of Missouri.

I am pleased to announce that our office has given final approval for our updated District 57 Directory. We hope to see them mailed out soon.

Here are a few highlights of the legislative business conducted this week.

House Members Approve the Save Adolescents from Experimentation Act (HB 419)

House members took action this week to approve legislation supporters say will protect Missouri's children from unnecessary and harmful sex change drugs and surgeries. By a vote of 103-52, the House approved HB 419, which would establish the Save Adolescents from Experimentation (SAFE) Act.

The SAFE Act would prohibit health care providers from performing gender transition surgery on young people under the age of 18. The act also prohibits a health care provider from prescribing or administering cross-sex hormones or puberty blocking drugs for the purpose of a gender transition for anyone under the age of 18. The performance of a gender transition surgery or the prescription or administration of cross-sex hormones or puberty-blocking drugs to an individual under 18 would be grounds for a cause of action against the health care provider. Such action could be brought within 30 years of the injured

individual reaching the age of 21 or the date the treatment of the injury at issue in the action has ceased, whichever is later. The bill's sponsor said, "This is just common sense. You think about smoking cigarettes, purchasing alcohol, gambling, consenting to sexual activity. There are a number of substances and activities that we as a society agree that children should not be exposed to and involved in because they have not developed yet to the point cognitively where they can fully understand the life-altering consequences of decisions that they may be making."

The bill now moves to the Senate for consideration. Missouri House Gives Initial Approval to the Save Women's Sports Act (HB 183)

House members this week gave initial approval to legislation meant to promote fairness in competition and opportunity for female student athletes. By a vote of 107-41, the Missouri House perfected HB 183 to establish the Save Women's Sports Act.

The bill would prohibit public school districts and charter schools from allowing students grade six to 12 and public and private postsecondary educational institutions from allowing any student to compete in an athletics competition designated for the opposite sex, as determined by the student's official birth certificate. The bill clarifies that biological sex is only correctly stated on birth certificates if it was entered at or near the time of birth or modified to correct scrivener's error. The bill also makes it clear a female student may be allowed to compete in an athletics competition designated for male students if there is no such athletics competition for female students offered.

The bill's sponsor said the legislation is important because, "Biological males are bigger, they are stronger, and they are faster. The majority of women simply cannot compete. Years of competing against biological males will wipe out female sports as we know it. We must protect the gains women have made in the last 50 years."

The bill now requires a final vote in the House before moving to the Senate.

Bill to Provide Direct Access to Physical Therapy Receives Final Legislative Approval (SB 51)

Legislation now on its way to the governor's desk would give Missourians direct access to physical therapy. With a bipartisan vote of 146-2, the Missouri House gave final approval to SB 51 to allow physical therapy visits without the need for an appointment with a physician.

The legislation would allow physical therapists with a doctorate of physical therapy or five years of clinical experience to evaluate and initiate treatment on a patient without a prescription or referral from an approved health care provider. The bill also states physical therapists must refer to an approved health care provider patients with certain conditions, including those with conditions beyond the scope of practice of physical therapy, as well as any patient who does not demonstrate measurable or functional improvement within ten visits or 30 days, whichever occurs first.

The bill's sponsor said, "This legislation allows Missourians to have direct access to physical therapists. Currently,

Lawmakers Give First-Round Approval to Constitutional Amendment to Protect the Right to Hunt and Fish (HJR 20)

A piece of legislation moving through the General Assembly would allow voters to decide if the rights of hunters and anglers should be enshrined in the Missouri Constitution. This week the Missouri House gave first-round approval to HJR 20 with a voice vote.

If approved by both the House and Senate and by the voters of Missouri, the measure would guarantee the right of hunters and anglers in the state to engage in hunting and harvesting wildlife and fishing by legal means, subject to duly authorized powers of the Conservation Commission.

The sponsor of the legislation said, "This preserves the right of folks in our state to hunt and fish. The same rights we enjoy now, it intends to preserve those rights." He added, "More than 25 states have adopted an amendment similar to this as a result of the similar

concern that some groups across the country might want to detract from this fundamental right that we enjoy to hunt and fish."
