

(Continued from Page 1) actions by the group were to approve regular meeting minutes for March 16 and special meeting minutes for March 28, then agree to pay March bills for the City and approve March financials. Aldermen then heard citizen Roy Wagner announce that the Eagles Club Ladies Auxiliary had donated \$1,000. to the City for operation of its dog pound.

Under old business, the group approved a Great River Engineering Associates TAP Grant for sidewalk improvements on the east side of Maple then agreed move \$29,586 in Water Department certificate of deposit restricted funds unrestricted status. to be used by the Water Department to pay its bills.

Under new business, the group heard Missouri State Parks representative Ron Bench, plus Charles Hunter and Marge Lumpe, with the Rock Island Trail Working Group, discuss plans by the City to build a walking/ biking/horseback riding trail from the City to the former Rock Island Trail. They asked citizens of the area to provide suggestions on ways the City can improve walkability and biking in the City and identify where they would like to see the spur trail built. They provided info that in 2016 MO State Parks took ownership of the remaining 144 mile Rock Island RR corridor from Windsor to Beaufort, and the City is one of 19 communities on the corridor working to complete the entire Rock Island Trail in the years to come.

Aldermen then approved an ordinance which allows a City gun shop owner with a federal firearms license to test fire guns in his possession, at his place of business. The group also accepted a proposal by P&Z for a comprehensive plan for the City, costing about \$80,000, which allows for Techtonics of Benton County to perform the task. Aldermen also accepted the resignation of Stephen

Phillips from the Board of Adjustment because of Phillips' move out of the City.

In the late session, the group heard Clerk Paul announce June 8-9 new Aldermen training Columbia, and that a City wide garage sale will take place June 3. She also reported computer problems in her office, due to outdated equipment. Mayor Meuschke recommended its replacement, at a cost of about \$20,000. The group agreed. Public Works Director Heath Roark reported he had received a bid for foam work on the City's sewer buildings, and he was approved to accept that project at a cost of about \$6,083. Police Chief Jeff Canfield said recent tests of the City's two storm sirens were good, and he wanted to purchase a 3rd siren. The board agreed that he could ask for bids on that

The meeting was closed at about 8:05 PM. These open sessions are usually held on 3rd Thursday eves; visitors are invited.

May we all be equally delighted by good fortune, too. Maybe this week? Meanwhile, hang in there old buddy.



If you've done any estate planning, or even if you're just familiar with it, you probably know the basics that is, a comprehensive estate plan can help you pass on assets to your family while also achieving other goals, such as designating someone to take care of your affairs if you become unable to do so. But you may not know about some other estate-planning issues that could prove important in your life:

• Power of attorney for students – Children heading off to college may be considered legal adults in many states. Consequently, you, as a parent, may not have any control over medical treatment if your child faces a sudden, serious illness or is involved in an accident. Instead, a doctor who doesn't know your child or your family may decide on a course of action of which you might not approve. To help prevent this, you may want to have



your college student sign a medical power of attorney form, which will allow you to make decisions on your child's behalf if doctors don't think your child can make those choices. You might also want to combine the medical power of attorney with an advance health care directive or living will, which lets you specify actions you do or don't want to happen. In any case, consult with your legal advisor before taking any of

these steps.

 Community property versus common law - Not all states treat married possessions couples' equally. If you live in a community property state, the property you acquire during your marriage is generally considered to be owned in equal halves by each spouse, with some exceptions. But if you live in a common law state, the property you obtain while you're married is not automatically owned by both spouses. In these states, if you buy some property, you own it, unless you decide to put it in the name of yourself and your spouse.

This doesn't necessarily mean, however, that your spouse has no rights, because common law states typically have rules that guard surviving spouses from being disinherited. But here's the key point: If you move from a community property state to a common law state, or vice versa, you might not want to assume that your and your spouse's property

ownership situations will remain the same. Consequently, if you do move, you may want to consult an estate-planning attorney in your new state to determine where you stand. • Pet trusts – You always strive to take good care

of your pets. But what might happen to them if you become incapacitated in some way? As the end of this legislative session draws near, only 3 weeks remaining, it is a busy time in Jefferson City! We 3rd read and passed our final 4 budget bills and have sent them to the Senate. With still having federal dollars to spend from the pandemic, our budget this year from the house was a little over 45 billion dollars. There is quite a few good things in there that will be of benefit to all Missourians! We also 3rd read and passed a lot of bills and sent to the Senate that I will highlight below. It is an honor to be here and represent the 126th District and our rural values! It is always a pleasure to have district schools come to visit the Capitol. Last week I had the opportunity to visit with Appleton City and Davis Elementary!

Lawmakers Approve Funding for Critical Infrastructure Projects (HB 17, HB 18, HB 19, and HB

House members this week approved four bills that appropriate more than \$5 billion in funding for vital infrastructure projects and programs across the state. House members also authorized \$100 million in funding for maintenance and repair for the state's minor and low volume roadways. The additional funding will help provide much-needed upgrades to overlooked roadways in the state's rural areas.

The bill also works to improve public safety in Missouri by investing more than \$30 million in funding for new facilities and training for law enforcement. It also prioritizes improving access to health care by allocating more than \$26 million for construction and expansion of vital health care facilities across the state. Additionally, the bill appropriates \$10 million to help address the lack of housing for the homeless in Springfield. $HB\,183\,is\,me ant to\,promote$

fairness in competition and opportunity for female student athletes. The bill would prohibit public school districts and charter schools from allowing students grade six to 12 and public and private postsecondary educational institutions from allowing any student to compete in an athletics competition designated for the opposite sex, as determined by the student's official birth certificate.

HBs 45 & 1066 specifies that, any cosmetologist holding a license to practice certain categories cosmetology, as described in the bill, may register with the State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners for a personal service registration provide services to clients who are ill, disabled, or otherwise unable to travel to a cosmetology establishment.

HB 188 establishes the "Immigrant Employment Registration and Taxation Protection Act". specified in the bill, the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DOLIR) is required to maintain a database or registry of qualified immigrant workers.

Thursday, April 27, 2023

HB 1023 authorizes an income tax exemption for: (1) A percentage of capital gains of up to \$6 million per year, as set out in the bill, received by a taxpayer who sells all or a portion of his or her farmland to a beginning farmer; (2) Cash rent income of up to \$25,000 per year received by a taxpayer who leases all or a portion of his or her farmland to a beginning farmer: and (3) Income of up to \$25,000 per vear received from crop share arrangements with a beginning farmer on all or a portion of a taxpayers farmland.

HB 836 establishes the "Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Freedom's Sentinel, and Operation Allies Refuge Program". This Program would award medallions, medals, and certificates of appreciation to veterans who honorably served on active duty in the United States military service at any time between October 7, 2011, and August 30, 2021, and who were honorably separated and discharged from military
