## Lincoln Enacts Marijuana Measures



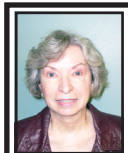

In old business Monday eve the City Board approved an ordinance "establishing reasonable zoning regulations on marijuana related businesses and qualifying customer cultivation regarding noise, air quality, neighborhood safety, security, other health and safety concerns, and time, place, and manner (of) restrictions on marijuana facility operations." That ordinance was amended to specifically exclude the Lincoln Nursing Home from accepted sites, and was followed under new business by approval of a measure which imposed a three percent sales tax on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use marijuana sold within the City, subject to approval by the voters of the City at a municipal election to be held April 2, 2024.

The meeting opened at 6 PM May 8, with Aldermen Jack Lietzke, Barbara Hammond, Phil Fisher, Janice Sweargin present. Mayor Glen Nelson presided; City Clerk Sabrina Brown recorded. First business conducted by the group was to approve the evening's agenda, minutes of the April 10

## When School Lets Out, Salvation Army Will Step In To Help With Summer Meals

Summer break will be here soon, and children who depend on free lunches at school will need community help to keep them from being hungry during June, July, and August. The

Salvation Army in Warsaw raised funds to feed 455 different children last summer over a 10-week period and are beginning a 2023 fundraising effort to be able to provide children five meals a week at various pick-up sites (to be announced.)

Everything changes and life can change in a heartbeat. Last Thanksgiving my husband Mike announced that he was retiring (Mike's Custom Bobcat). Two weeks later he was diagnosed with late-stage pancreatic cancer, which changed everything in our lives. (Accordingly,

sometimes this column will be hit or miss.)

Most importantly I had to rethink my cooking since his chemotherapy changes both the taste and texture of food for him. He used to love pasta but now it doesn't work for him. Getting enough protein and calories becomes our goal. Rice is our ubiquitous staple now, using it as base for stir-frying, casseroles, etc. I love my fuzzy logic rice cooker, but often times I just boil rice in chicken

stock. I use one cup rice to 4 cups stock. When it is done, drain and sauté in unsalted butter over medium heat. When warm add some more butter and add ins of choice. It can be as simple as chopped chives, basil, or tarragon. I add cooked shrimp or chicken to up the protein. So, keeping a large bowl of cooked rice in the refrigerator helps simplify dinner.

vegetables, milk, snacks, and breakfast items. Last year we had pick up sites in Warsaw, Lincoln, Cole Camp and Edwards, and are considering adding Ionia and Fristoe this year."

Price said that this could only be accomplished with the help of the community. She said that funds raised by Salvation Army bell ringing will not be used for this program because of local need for other assistance, and she is hoping for donations that can be mailed to "The Salvation Army of Warsaw, Benton County, PO Box 1432, Warsaw, MO 65355," or dropped off at the office located at 1623 Commercial Street in Warsaw. The office is open Monday through Wednesday from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M. Checks should indicate "Kids Meals" on the memo line. Other fundraiser events are also being planned.

Teresa (Terri) Piersee-Watson, the Welfare Secretary with the local Salvation Army Office, orders the food for summer meals on top of her regular duties of assisting clients with their needs. She said that hunger carries physical pain and the emotional pain of food insecurity, but that free summer meals take some of the pressure off both parents and kids.

"We don't want any child to go to bed hungry," said Piersee-Watson. "It's special when you see the kids come through the drive through line. They are excited sometimes, even when they get something that many of us take for granted. It is like they are getting Christmas presents. They are happy when they get snacks too and one

little girl cried when she got strawberry milk."

Price restarted the Service Unit Extension in 2019. Piersee-Watson began working with Price in 2020 and she brought much experience from her previous work with The Salvation Army in Kansas.

www.fns.usda.gov reports that an estimated 14 percent of American households are food insecure – which means about 15.3 million children are living in food insecure households. About 22.1 million children and teens receive free and reduced-price meals through the National School Lunch Program. But only about one in six of those (approximately 3.8 million) participate in the summer meal programs.

On May 17, the seniors will be honored at the Senior Awards Assembly at 5:30 PM in the high school auditorium followed by the Baccalaureate Service at 7 PM.

Graduation for the Class of 2023 will be held on May 18 at 7 PM on Randy Morrow Football Field.

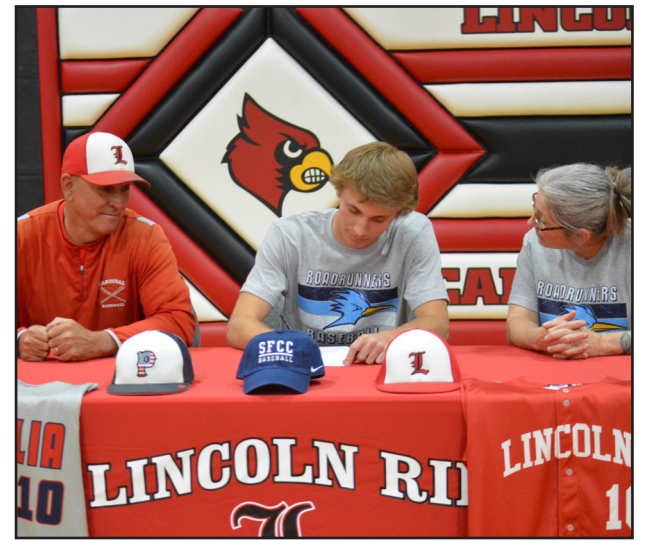
Lincoln committed 11 errors and Green Ridge 5.

The matchup was built up a season ago, but losses by both teams in earlier rounds left them waiting and wondering "what might have been" for another year. The Ladycats (20-6) and Lady Bluebirds got powerful pitching performances from each starter but Warsaw's Brylee Brewster proved to be just too much for the top of Cole Camp's usually reliable lineup.

The Lady Bluebirds would finally get on the board in the fifth when Kyla Harms led off the inning with a double. She moved to third on a sacrifice bunt by Grace Thompson and then scored on a single by Marilyn Hesse to make the score 2-1.

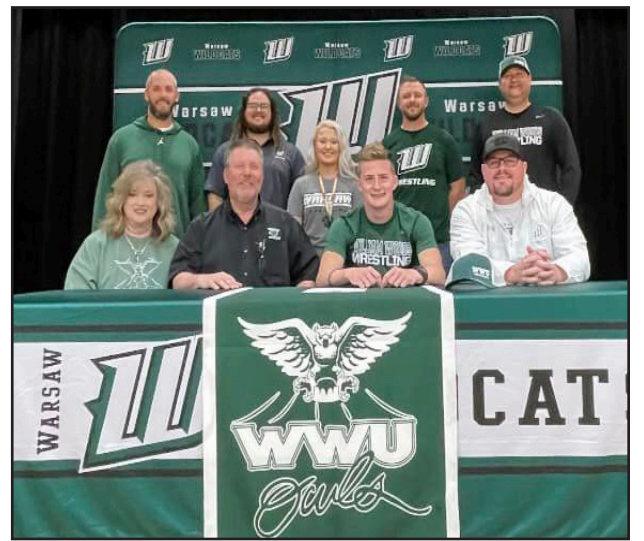

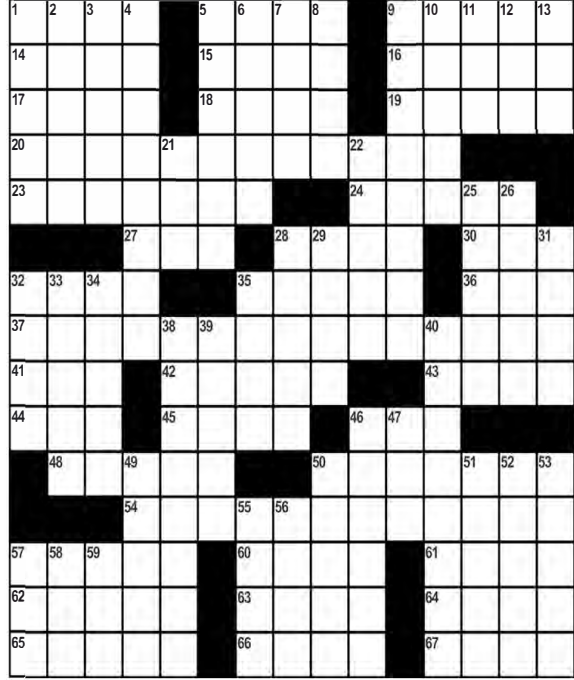

Like everyone, you may have a lot of financial goals. But are they all of equal importance? Probably not. And do they share a similar timeline? Again, it's unlikely. So, your first step may be to prioritize your goals — and then follow a process that can help you achieve them.

This process should include the following steps:

- *Identify your goals as "must have" or "nice to have."* Making sure you can retire comfortably and won't outlive your resources is a "must have" goal. For your main "must have" goal — retirement — you'll be helped by the ability to automatically invest through your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. If you're on track toward this goal, and you budget carefully and potentially receive salary increases over the years, you may also find space to keep contributing toward the "nice to have" goals.

- *Put "price tags" on your goals.* You need to know what your goals will cost. Of course, you may need to estimate the costs for some goals based on different factors. For example, when you think about your goal of retiring comfortably without outliving your money, you'll need to consider some key questions, including these: When do you want to retire? What sort of retirement lifestyle do you envision? Do you see yourself downsizing your living arrangements? For other goals, though, such as purchasing a vacation home, you could get more specific on how much money you'll need.

- *Follow an appropriate strategy.* The nature of your goals, and their estimated cost, along with your appetite for risk, should drive your investment strategy — but another key factor is time.

So, for a long-term goal like retirement, you'll likely need a reasonable amount of quality growth-oriented investments in your portfolio. While these investments — such as stocks and stock-based mutual funds — will fluctuate in value over shorter periods of time, your hope is that, over several decades, they will ultimately provide the growth you need to meet your retirement goal. However, to achieve a goal you want to meet in a year or so — perhaps you're paying for a wedding or planning a long vacation — you may want to consider more stable investments, such as certificates of deposit (CDs), short-term bonds or even cash or cash equivalents. They may not

provide much in the way of growth, but you can essentially count on them to provide the amount you need when you need it. You'll need to regularly review the performance of your investment strategy for each goal to assess your progress.

Achieving any goals — whether they're "must have" or "nice to have" — can be challenging. But by identifying and prioritizing these goals, following an appropriate strategy to meet them, and consistently reviewing your approach, you can help yourself get to where you want to go.

## 41,970 Birds Harvested During Spring Turkey Season

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows turkey hunters checked 41,970 birds during Missouri's 2023 regular spring turkey season, April 17 through May 7. Top regular season harvest counties were Franklin with 973 birds harvested, Callaway with 801, and Osage with 792.

Young turkey hunters also harvested 2,566 turkeys over the youth weekend, April 1 and 2, bringing the overall 2023 spring turkey harvest to 44,536 – the highest harvest total since 2016.

"Stable, though still lower than the ideal, hatches each of the past three years and excellent spring turkey hunting weather likely contributed to this year's higher harvest total," said MDC Wild Turkey Biologist Nick Oakley. "The 2023 harvest was 23-percent higher compared to 2022 and it was 19-percent higher than the average over the previous five years."

Last year, young turkey hunters harvested 2,894 turkeys over the spring youth season and hunters harvested 33,359 during the regular spring season for a 2022 spring season total harvest of 36,253.
