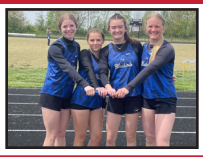

Youth Shines Bright In District Championship For Ladycats Softball

In a game that took nearly 24 hours to complete, Warsaw defeated the Lone Jack Lady Mules, 8-2 in the Class 2 District 8 championship last week in Cole Camp, staking claim to their sixth district crown in the past seven years.

The title tilt began just a little before 5:00 PM on Tuesday and didn't wrap up until shortly after 3:30 PM the next day after threatening storms and lightning moved across northern Benton County, forcing fields to clear and the game to be postponed.

Ladycats sophomore southpaw Brylee Brewster delivered another dominant

pitching performance, holding the Lady Mules to just 2 runs on 5 hits. Lone Jack had averaged 10.4 runs per game coming into the contest.

In the top of the first inning, she struck out the first two batters swinging before giving up a single and then sat down the next Lady Mule on another swinging strike to end the top half of the first frame.

With 2 outs, sophomore Carly Price drew a walk to leadoff the first for Warsaw. She moved to third on a single to left field by Brewster, who also advanced to second on the throw. Another

sophomore, Haylee Cobb hit a fly ball and reached on a communication error in left-centerfield. Price and Brewster both scored on the drop to give Warsaw the 2-0 lead and that would be just about all the Ladycats would need.

Brewster fanned the first two Lady Mules in the top of the second inning before allowing her first base on balls and then picked up another strikeout swinging for the third out.

The Ladycats tacked on 2 more runs in the bottom of the second when senior Janie Kilgore led off the inning by taking a 2-1 pitch to the left thigh. Senior

Faith Tharaldson laid down a sacrifice bunt to move Kilgore to second and she moved up 60 more feet on another bunt by freshman Sadie Chapman who was safe and advanced to second when the ball was thrown in the dirt and skipped past the Lone Jack first baseman.

With just 1 out and the top of the order rolling over for Warsaw, freshman Tanna Howe belted a 1-0 pitch to left field for a double. Kilgore and Chapman both raced home to give the Ladycats a 4-0 lead. Freshman Adison Sherrill drew a walk and then,

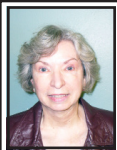
In new business Monday eve, Warsaw's Board of Aldermen, desiring to protect the public health and safety by establishing reasonable regulations concerning marijuana related businesses and qualifying customer cultivation regarding noise, air quality, neighborhood safety, security, other health and safety concerns, and time, place, and manner of marijuana facility operations, adopted a related ordinance. The ordinance, said to mirror state regulations, regulates how much and where a person can buy recreational marijuana, and stipulates for instance that such sales cannot take place within 1,000 feet of a school or church.

The meeting began at 6 PM with Aldermen Doug Hedrick, Reba Slavens, Eric Flores, Lou Breshears, Adam Howe present. Alderman Rob Coskey was absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided.; Acting City Clerk Jill Cobb recorded. First business conducted by the group was to approve the evening's agenda and minutes of the group's April 17 meeting, then okay payment of April 15 - May 11 bills.

In early session Ron Cobb, with 911 Dispatch, presented two certificates of appreciation to Police Officer Tony Helms and one certificate to Nikki Haake for their recent actions in serving the public good. Police Chief Sean

Cole Camp Pharmacy Marks 25 Years Amid Growth Spurt

Mike Snell and wife Tammy have been owners of the Cole Camp Pharmacy for 25 years. On February 6, they moved the business from 106 South Maple Street to 512 West Main

Street where it has more indoor space, parking spots and a new drive-thru window. The independent pharmacy not only serves neighbors with their commercial medication needs, but also provides certain custom mixtures requested by physicians. It also has many medications used by a couple of local long-term care facilities.

"We still own the old building at 106 South Maple Street," said Snell. "I have things remaining there, but we have several interested buyers and will sell it to a Cole Camp business. The building is old. I believe it was first a bank in 1911, and then a retail store, office, and other businesses. There was no pharmacy in town for 30

(Continued from Page 1) with 2 outs in the books, Brewster doubled on a fly ball to left field scoring both Howe and Sherrill easily as Warsaw stretched their lead to 6-0.

Lone Jack tallied their first run in the third when they picked up a 2-out double on a line drive to right field. That run would come around to score on a follow-up single as the Lady Mules finally got on the board.

Warsaw went 1-2-3 in the bottom of the third and Lone Jack was retired in order in the top of the fourth. Chapman reached on another error on a ground ball in the hole to lead off the bottom of the fourth, but she was left stranded to end the inning. Lone Jack manufactured another run in the top of the fifth to pull within 6-2, and then Mother Nature called.

Brewster drew a free pass to leadoff the bottom of the fifth inning for Warsaw, but the game was halted immediately by officials and site administration at the first burst of lightning.

Players and fans were whisked to buses and gyms while others awaited a decision in the parking lot. After a long wait, it was agreed to postpone the game from the point of where it was called and resume at 3:00 PM the following afternoon.

"To have a game canceled and then resumed the next day can be challenging, but our girls were extremely determined," Ladycats coach Kelli Eierman said.

After skies had plenty of time to clear, teams picked up right where they left off in the bottom of the fifth inning. Brewster stood at first for Warsaw, but only got so far as second base after the Ladycats went 1-2-3 again in the fifth frame.

Brewster induced a groundout to leadoff the top of the sixth and got the second out on a soft liner hit right back to the circle. After a single to right field, another swinging strikeout brought the Ladycats back to the plate.

With 1 out, Chapman exploited yet another error to find herself safe at first in the sixth and that would bring around the top of the youthful lineup for the Ladycats. They would get insurance when Howe took a 2-0 pitch deep over the left field fence. The ball wrapped around the foul pole for a 2-run homerun, her second of the district tournament, to give Warsaw a comfortable 8-2 lead. Sherrill drew a walk and Brewster knocked a 2-out single, but they both ended the inning on the basepaths.

"Emotions were so high going into the championship game," Ladycats assistant coach Kya Schepker added. "To have it (the game) put on hold for the weather and then to come back to add a couple more runs to get the win, that was big."

On a 1-1 count, the first Lady Mule of the seventh grounded out to Cobb at shortstop . . . 1 out.

After a tough 7 pitch at-bat, the next Lady Mule struck out swinging . . . 2 outs.

Just to make things dramatic, Lone Jack tallied a hit in their next at-bat, bringing up the top of the order . . .

With a 1-2 count, Brewster would not be denied her first district title as she fittingly fanned the final out of the inning for the Ladycats, helping them back on track with another district championship.

"After being upset in last year's district tournament, we all wanted to make sure that didn't happen again," Ladycats coach Megan Daleske said. "I felt like we came to the tournament this year with more intensity and determination than we've shown all season."

Brewster earned the win, allowing 2 runs on 5 hits while striking out 14. She

added to her season total with 46 strikeouts through 19.0 innings pitched in the district tournament.

"I know that if we can put runs on the board, Brylee will keep us in any game," Daleske commented.

Brewster also aided her own cause with a 3 for 3 day at the plate. She also scored once and drove in 2 RBI's.

"The championship game was an all-around team effort," Brewster said. "Our defense was on and our bats were hot throughout the game."

Howe drove in 4 runs on 2 hits, including a double in the second and the homerun in the sixth to help seal the deal. She also scored 2 runs herself.

Chapman went 1 for 3 in the game but reached base in each of her trips to the plate. She also scored twice.

"We couldn't be more proud of how our girls showed up," Ladycats coach Kelli Eierman said.

The Ladycats face(d) Fair Grove in the MSHSAA Class 2 State Quarterfinals on Wednesday evening.

(Continued from Page 1) years before we opened our place in 1998."

Snell said that the pharmacy has 12 employees including relief pharmacists who come in on his days off. Steve Mills is one of these pharmacists who has been relieving Snell for 15 years.

"We have a star staff of 12," said Snell. "They are a dedicated group and I am fortunate to be surrounded by them. They are more like family than employees."

Snell and his wife grew up in Kansas City. He went to the KU Pharmacy School graduating in 1990. Then, he worked for Walmart about seven years before venturing off and opening the Cole Camp Pharmacy.

"As I was growing up, science, medicine and working with people were things I enjoyed," said Snell. "Pharmacy provides a good mix of all those things every day."

Snell said that there have been times over the years when people have come into the pharmacy who might have required hospitalization and he has done quick blood pressures or tested for blood sugar levels. He called for an ambulance when it was deemed necessary. He said that people have fallen on the sidewalk or street and he and his employees tended to them if they needed immediate care.

"We are accessible and that is a good thing," said Snell. "But I can't stitch them up or put on a cast."

He said that being an independent pharmacy has challenges, especially since insurance companies like to deal with the big chain pharmacies. He said that they sometimes struggle to be in the chain, but that they will survive and will sometimes change with the times. Snell said that if there is a need they will be here.

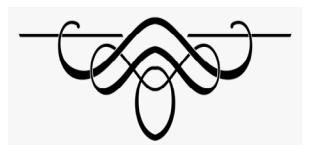

Angela Konopasek will represent the Wildcats in the 100m Hurdles and Kaleb Ragle will run in the 800m.

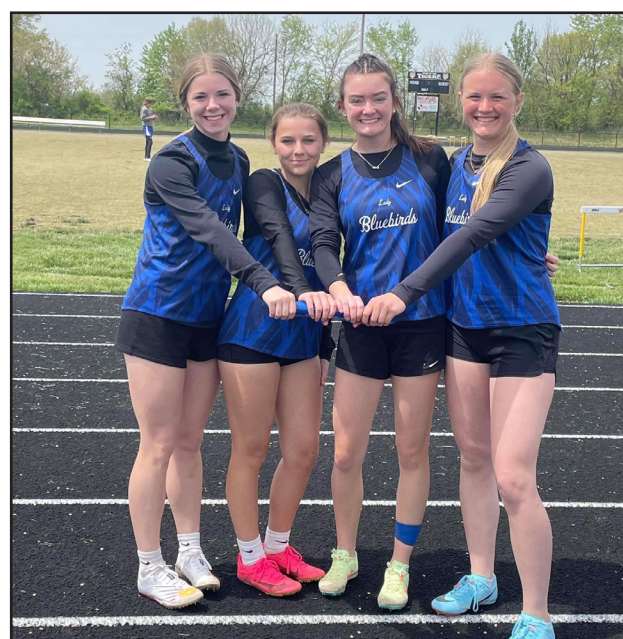
Several other athletes came very close to moving on with great performances on the day.

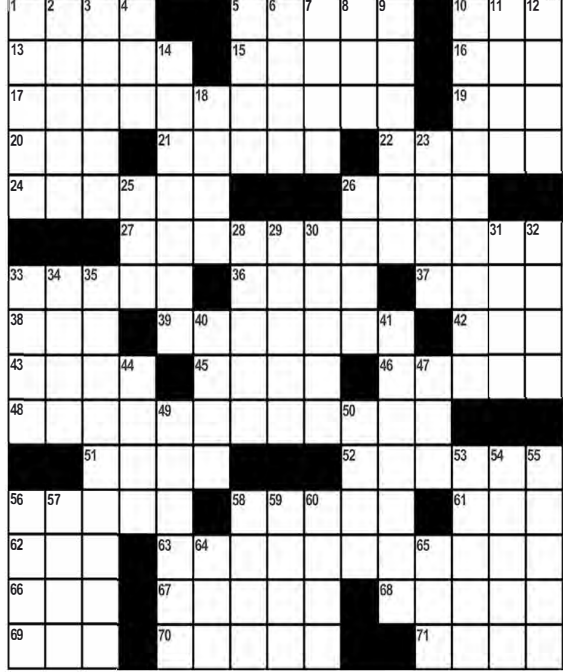

McCannon then described a proposed May 19-20 County Sheriff Auction involving closure of a portion of downtown Washington St., approved by the group. Then Holly Hatzenbuehler, Chair of West Central Association of Realtors, and associate Skeeter Smith, described a proposed car show to help raise money for Benton County School Districts,

Lincoln Senior Center, and Harbor Village, to be held 10 AM - 4 PM July 22 at Drake Harbor, Maples Ford, or Bledsoe Ferry Park East. The group was favorable to the proposal, but will study availability of Drake Harbor for the event. The Chair asked that the usual fee be waived, if the event is held at the Harbor.

Also approved were two ordinances: (1) accepting new pay grades and steps for City employees, and

(2) enacting regulations from the 2015 International Swimming Pool & Spa Code regarding barriers to be placed in the vicinity of on ground residential pools. The purpose of this measure was to be a little more specific in City regulations. The group also approved two resolutions: (1) accepting a \$4,082.50 sole bid by Steve's Pest Control for service in the City's buildings and parks, and (2) expenditure of \$12,737. for purchase of body and vehicle cameras for the City's Police Department,

following a 50/50 grant by the State's Department of Public Safety.

City Planner Randy Pogue, responded to comments that there was a theft of a city truck and tools from the transportation barn. The vehicle was found after it had been burned on Hannah Avenue. Pogue said that cameras should be purchased to better deal with such events. At Enterprise press time the theft and destruction of the truck was under investigation. The City asks anyone with information to contact them

at 660-438-5522.

The open meeting closed about 6:40 PM to go into executive session. Open

sessions are usually held on 1st and 3rd Monday eves; visitors are welcome.

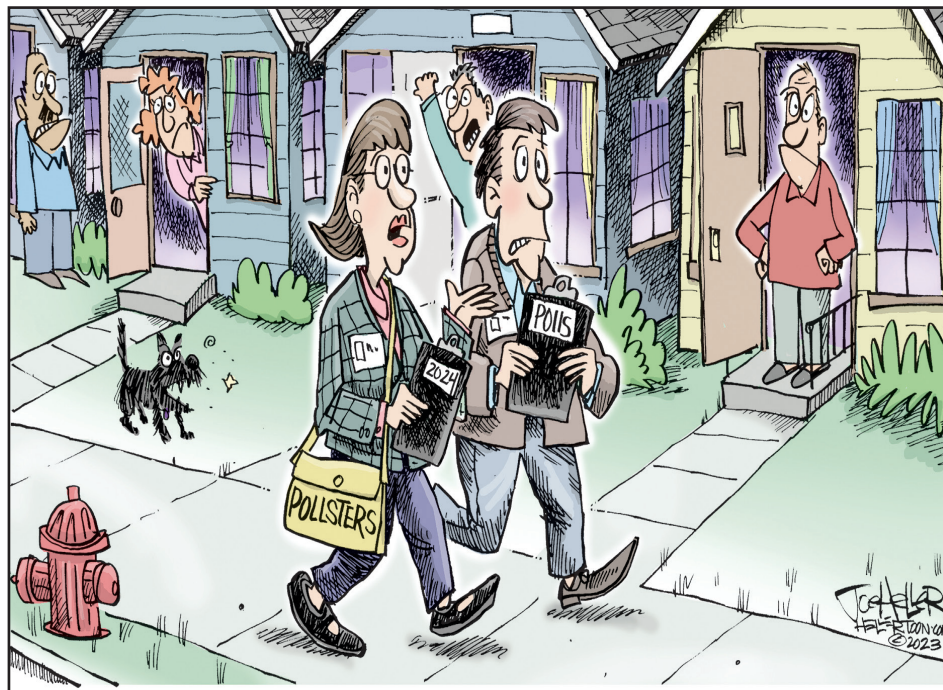

At some point, you may have more money in your 401(k) than in any other investment. And even though your 401(k) is intended for your retirement, you may one day think you have to tap into your account early — but should you? And if you do, how should you go about it?

If it's possible to avoid taking money from your 401(k) before you retire, you probably should do so. You could spend 25 or more years in retirement, and you'll need to pay for those years, so you may want to look for alternatives to your 401(k). If you've built an emergency fund containing several months' worth of living expenses in cash or cash equivalents, you could use some of this money. If you have a Health Savings Account (HSA), you could use it to pay for qualified medical expenses. Or you could sell some of your taxable investments, rather than going into your tax-deferred 401(k).

But if you have determined that you must look at your 401(k) plan to meet a short-term funding need, you'll want to carefully consider how to go about it. You typically have two main choices: loans or withdrawals.

For plans that allow loans, employees can generally borrow up to 50% of the vested amount of their 401(k)s, up to a maximum of \$50,000 within a 12-month period. Administrative fees may apply, and interest will be charged, but it will be added back to the 401(k) account as part of the loan repayments. Except when they're used for a home purchase, loans must be repaid within five years, with equal payments made at least quarterly, unless payments are allowed to be paused temporarily. If you leave the company or don't repay the loan according to the agreement, the loan balance will likely be treated as a taxable distribution.

Now, let's consider withdrawals.

For 401(k) plans that allow current employees to make withdrawals, the withdrawal requests are usually considered either hardship or non-hardship. To qualify for a hardship withdrawal, you must demonstrate an immediate and heavy financial need to pay for certain expenses, including a home purchase, college, a medical issue or other specified costs, and your withdrawal is limited to the amount necessary to meet the need. Non-hardship withdrawals can typically be taken for any purpose but usually are not granted until you're 59½ or older.

Unlike with a loan, a hardship withdrawal can't be repaid, while a non-hardship withdrawal can usually only be repaid by rolling over the amount to an IRA within 60 days. But the bigger issue may be taxes. If you withdraw funds from your 401(k), any previously untaxed money is generally taxed as ordinary income and a 10% penalty will apply if you're younger than

59½, unless you qualify for an exception. Plus, for your 401(k) plan typically must withhold 20% of the withdrawal for taxes, so you'd have to take an even larger withdrawal to meet your needs.

Before embarking on a 401(k) loan or withdrawal, you may want to consult with a financial professional

May everyone have a blessed week. Find a church to attend this week. It will be a great thing to be with God.

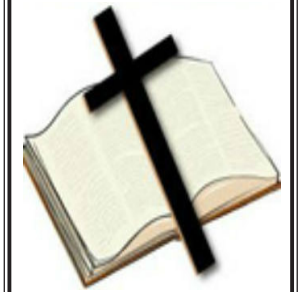
