# Youth Shines Bright In District Championship For Ladycats Softball

In a game that took nearly 24 hours to complete, Warsaw defeated the Lone Jack Lady Mules, 8-2 in the Class 2 District 8 championship last week in Cole Camp, staking claim to their sixth district crown in the past seven years.

The title tilt began just a little before 5:00 PM on Tuesday and didn't wrap up until shortly after 3:30 PM the next day after threatening storms and lightning moved across northern Benton County, forcing fields to clear and the game to be postponed. Ladycats sophomore

performance, pitching holding the Lady Mules to just 2 runs on 5 hits. Lone Jack had averaged 10.4 runs per game coming into the contest.

In the top of the first inning, she struck out the first two batters swinging before giving up a single and then sat down the next Lady Mule on another swinging strike to end the top half of the first frame.

With 2 outs, sophomore Carly Price drew a walk to leadoff the first for Warsaw. She moved to third on a single to left field by Brewster, who also advanced to second delivered another dominant on the throw. Another

sophomore, Haylee Cobb hit a fly ball and reached on a communication error in left-centerfield. Price and Brewster both scored on the drop to give Warsaw the 2-0 lead and that would be just about all the Ladycats would need.

Brewster fanned the first two Lady Mules in the top of the second inning before allowing her first base on balls and then picked up another strikeout swinging for the third out.

The Ladycats tacked on 2 more runs in the bottom of the second when senior Janie Kilgore led off the inning by taking a 2-1 pitch to the left thigh. Senior

Faith Tharaldson laid down a sacrifice bunt to move Kilgore to second and she moved up 60 more feet on another bunt by freshman Sadie Chapman who was safe and advanced to second when the ball was thrown in the dirt and skipped past the Lone Jack first baseman.

With just 1 out and the top of the order rolling over for Warsaw, freshman Tanna Howe belted a 1-0 pitch to left field for a double. Kilgore and Chapman both raced home to give the Ladycats a 4-0 lead. Freshman Adison Sherrill drew a walk and then,

In new business Monday eve, Warsaw's Board of Aldermen, desiring to protect the public health and safety by establishing reasonable regulations concerning marijuana related businesses and qualifying customer cultivation regarding noise, air quality, neighborhood safety, security, other health and safety concerns, and time, place, and manner of marijuana facility operations, adopted a related ordinance. The ordinance, said to mirror state regulations, regulates how much and where a person can buy recreational marijuana, and stipulates for instance that such sales cannot take place within 1,000 feet of a school or church.

The meeting began at 6 PM with Aldermen Doug Hedrick, Reba Slavens, Eric Flores, Lou Breshears, Adam Howe present. Coskey Alderman Rob was absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided,; Acting City Clerk Jill Cobb recorded. First business conducted by the group was to approve the evening's agenda and minutes of the group's April 17 meeting, then okay payment of April 15 - May 11 bills.



Lone Jack tallied their first run in the third when they picked up a 2-out double on a line drive to right field. That run would come around to score on a followup single as the Lady Mules finally got on the board.

Warsaw went 1-2-3 in the bottom of the third and Lone Jack was retired in order in the top of the fourth. Chapman reached on another error on a ground ball in the hole to lead off the bottom of the fourth, but she was left stranded to end the inning. Lone Jack manufactured another run in the top of the fifth to pull within 6-2, and then Mother Nature called.

Brewster drew a free pass to leadoff the bottom of the fifth inning for Warsaw, but the game was halted immediately by officials and site administration at the first burst of lightning.

Players and fans were whisked to buses and gyms while others awaited a decision in the parking lot. After a long wait, it was agreed to postpone the game from the point of where it was called and resume at 3:00 PM the following afternoon.

"To have a game canceled and then resumed the next day can be challenging, but our girls were extremely determined," Ladycats coach Kelli Eierman said.

After skies had plenty of time to clear, teams picked up right where they left off in the bottom of the fifth inning. Brewster stood at first for Warsaw, but only got so far as second base after the Ladycats went 1-2-3 again in the fifth frame.

Brewster induced a groundout to leadoff the top of the sixth and got the second out on a soft liner hit right back to the circle. After a single to right field, another swinging strikeout brought the Ladycats back to the plate.

With 1 out, Chapman exploited yet another error to find herself safe at first

"Emotions were so high going into the championship game," Ladycats assistant coach Kya Schepker added. "To have it (the game) put on hold for the weather and then to come back to add a couple more runs to get the win, that was big."

On a 1-1 count, the first Lady Mule of the seventh grounded out to Cobb at shortstop . . . 1 out.

After a tough 7 pitch at-bat, the next Lady Mule struck out swinging . . . 2 outs.

Just to make things dramatic, Lone Jack tallied a hit in their next at-bat, bringing up the top of the order...

With a 1-2 count, Brewster would not be denied her first district title as she fittingly fanned the final out of the inning for the Ladycats, helping them back on track with another district championship.

taking money from your 401(k) before you retire, you probably should do so. You could spend 25 or more years in retirement, and you'll need to pay for those years, so you may want to look for alternatives to your 401(k). If you've built an emergency fund containing several months' worth of living expenses in cash or cash equivalents, you could use some of this money. If you have a Health Savings Account (HSA), you could use it to pay for qualified medical expenses. Or you could sell some of your taxable investments, rather than going into your taxdeferred 401(k).

But if you have determined that you must look at your 401(k) plan to meet a short-term funding need, you'll want to carefully consider how to go about it. You typically have two main choices: loans or withdrawals.

For plans that allow loans, employees can generally borrow up to 50% of the vested amount of their 401(k)s, up to a maximum of \$50,000 within a 12-month period. Administrative fees may apply, and Interest will be charged, but it will be added back to the 401(k) account as part of the loan repayments. Except when they're used for a home purchase, loans must be repaid within five years, with equal payments made at least quarterly, unless payments are allowed to be paused temporarily. If you leave the company or don't repay the loan according to the agreement, the loan balance will likely be treated as a taxable distribution.
