Perfect weather brought thousands of people to the twin lake area during the three-day Memorial Day weekend.

Osage Bluff Marina manager Jason Reynolds reported a perfect beginning to the summer for the lake area.

"This was the best Memorial Day weekend ever," said Reynolds. "The weather was perfect; the fish were biting and everyone seemed to be having a good

time." Reynolds is beginning his forty-second year at his location on Truman Lake. "We sold completely out of ice cream and life jackets," said Reynolds.

Truman State Park Marina also reported a wonderful weekend.

"We had our busiest weekend this past weekend since we took over the business in 2018," reported owner Lisa Gladson. "Our amazing staff worked so well together to make sure all our customers were taken care of."

Gladson said that all the rentals were out the whole weekend and that all slips

were full.

"We are starting our new dock project this next week," said Gladson. "We have a waiting list of people who want to rent a slip so we are building more."

Truman State Park Marina is open from 6:00AM until 6:30PM seven days a week until October 31.

"We didn't have any complaints this weekend, everyone was happy to be here and were all having a great time," said Gladson.

Truman State Park Marina offers a variety of services including: fishing boat and pontoon boat rentals, nightly and seasonal slips, fuel, bait and convenience store items.

Beth Drake at Beth's Osage Mini-Mart reported a great weekend as well.

"We had a lot of traffic this weekend and I predict a very busy summer," said Drake.

Osage Mini Mart sold 40,000 minnows over the Memorial Day weekend.

Beyond Marine at Sterett Creek was packed with visitors over the three-day weekend according to manager Mandy Persinger.

Ancient Benton County Cemetery Gets A Little TLC

Memorial Day is a time when family and friends visit cemeteries where their loved ones have been laid to rest, but local historical buff Jeff Polly has been spending a great deal of time at a local

cemetery working to restore headstones and maintain the cemetery in general.

Mount Herman Cemetery located in southern Benton County, south of Fristoe, was in need of repair as some stones were hard to read. The oldest stone was Robert Wright Kirby who was a veteran of the Wars of 1812. Kirby was a relative of Polly's so he was very

interested in researching the people buried at Mount Herman and helping to restore the stones.

John Ferguson of Oregon and Dennis Kopp of Odessa also helped with the clean up and repair. Ferguson reached out to the Benton County Historical Society to find the location of his relative's grave and Polly who is the vice president of the BCHS helped with the cleanup.

Mount Herman, also known as the Joplin Cemetery or the Kirby Cemetery, is one of the oldest cemeteries in Benton County. The last person to be buried in Mount Herman was Lorinda Caroline Minner McShane in 1933. Since then the cemetery had fallen into disrepair.

Another forgotten Benton County cemetery is Halligan Cemetery located at the corner of U.S. Highway 65 and Missouri Highway

(Continued from Page 1) 7 to the west of Pump and Munch.

At one point many years ago, the headstones at Halligan Cemetery were removed and used as posts and then later the stones were discovered in the creek where the water had destroyed the inscriptions. While it is impossible to know where these graves are located, the stones have been repaired and placed in what was once Halligan Cemetery.

“Some of the stones were discovered by a farmer when he was plowing up the land,” said Polly. “In fact, one stone was taken by someone who just happened to be driving by when the farmer was plowing.”

One of the stones was

inscribed as Richard Halligan born in 1817 and died in 1878. Two Civil War soldiers, John Potter and David Kidwell, are also buried in the Halligan Cemetery.

“There are many small cemeteries located in Benton County since most people were buried close to their homes,” said Polly. “People researching their family history find a cemetery to be a good resource.”

When Truman Dam was built, many cemeteries had to be moved and many of those remains were excavated and taken to what is now the Shawnee Cemetery. To find out more about area cemeteries, check out the Benton County Museum for information.

(Continued from Page 1) The organization was founded in May 2011 in response to a need for tornado relief efforts in Joplin, where competitive pitmasters from nine different states fed displaced families and first responders. It has built a network that to date has provided over 10 million meals, after disasters, throughout the U.S. and internationally. They serve the homeless, first responders, veterans, and members of the military.

“I got involved with the OBR a decade ago when I had a food truck in Kansas City,” said Atkinson. “After a tornado hit Moore, Oklahoma on May 20, 2013, I drove down to serve meals and met people from OBR. They served 2,000 meals at the time. I was a good cook and was personally ready for a change. The service industry (that he was in at the time) is a wild, wild west with long hours and little pay. After running with the OBR crew, I knew they needed someone for an open position. I am single, and my daughters are grown so it was a great fit for me.”

Atkinson is now Facility Manager at Camp OBR at 32446 Golden Acres Road in Lincoln. He spends most of his time there and it is hard for him to get away to help after disasters, although he loves being able to when possible. He said that there are not disasters every year and the OBR still wants to help people so one way is through this camp for first responders and military personnel with an emphasis on the family unit.

“The previous owner of this 200 plus acreage built a beautiful log home which serves as the lodge,” said Atkinson. “We are also building cabins for families to stay in. We want them to be active. We offer outdoor experiences on the lake such as water sports, plus hunting and fishing. I am currently working on bee colonies. You never know what will catch someone's eye. We will show them different ways to cook the game they hunt and at the end of the day we will try to create a culture of community, like eating together at a table. We expect to have five or six families stay a few days at a time and the first camp experience is set to begin in July with Gold Star families invited to the camp. I grew up in the country, and have a background in farming and agriculture, so I feel able to take care of this place.”

Atkinson said that the OBR is financed through corporate donors because it takes a lot of money and products to do what it does. OBR's last response to a tornado disaster was in Port Charlotte, Florida in October 2022. Its team served just under 1000 meals which would have cost an astronomical amount of money, but corporations send food for things like that.

Camp OBR's goals are to be a place where veterans, military and first responders can connect with each other and grow their networks; offer programs and activities to help heal emotional, mental, and physical

wounds through team building, fellowship, and fostering individual growth and resiliency; inspire organizations and partners to take part in the lives of veterans, military, and first responders; provide hope, compassion and friendship through activities, programs and events; offer families of those that serve our nation and communities, that have suffered a life altering event, an opportunity to connect and strengthen their family bonds through camp programming in a distraction-free, hands-on bonding environment.

“We are kind of in the healing business,” said Atkinson. “Serve one meal that matters during disasters.”

The City of Warsaw is considering doing something similar at the old Lighthouse area.

“We are considering putting in bike racks, benches and a maintenance trail at the Lighthouse Park next to the town branch,” said Warsaw City Administrator Randy Pogue. Zack Brown, lobbyist and director, economic development, from Jefferson City spoke to the group about helping in the grant application process.

“I am here to help Benton County anyway I can just let me know what you need,” said Brown.

JL-We wish her the very best.

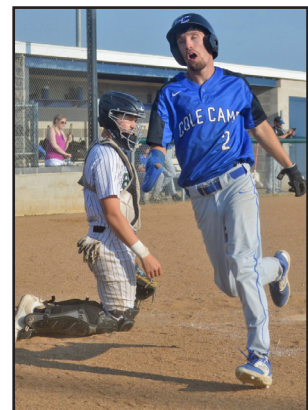
First Inning Sinks Cole Camp In Sectional Play

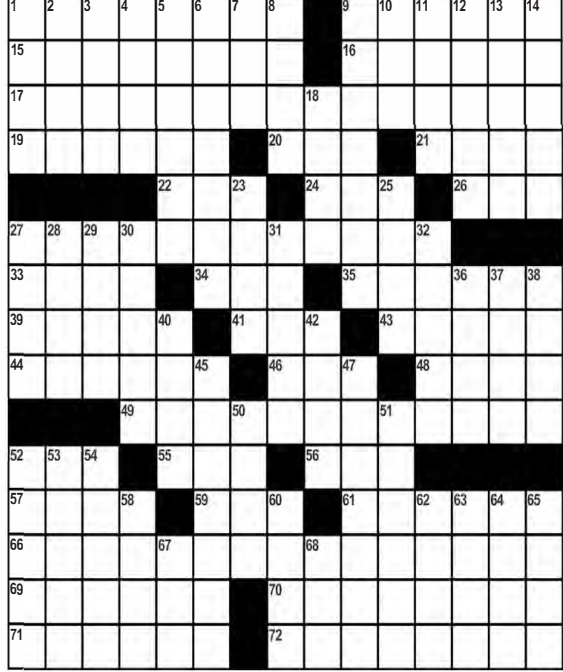

Sometimes I forget about the most basic and simple recipes, my tried-and-true favorites. The following simple Dijon mustard vinaigrette is perfect for beginning cooks because it requires no chopping and no juicing. It's a simple mix of red wine vinegar, mustard, salt, sugar, and olive oil. It's also very child friendly since it doesn't have an acidic bite, the sugar softens it.

- 1 Tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 2 Tablespoons red wine vinegar
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- freshly ground pepper to taste
- ½ cup extra virgin olive oil
- Whisk the mustard, vinegar, salt, sugar and pepper together; then whisking constantly, stream in the olive oil until emulsified.
- Transfer to a storage vessel, store in the fridge. It lasts a long time, bring to room temp before serving

The regular legislative session for 2023 has come to an end. In total, 59 bills were truly agreed and finally passed and sent to the Governor's office to be signed into law. Of those bills, 19 were bills pertaining to the state operating budget, 33 of the bills originated in the Senate, and 7 of the bills originated in the House. Compared to the number of bills filed in total, 59 is a relatively small amount, but we hope to be much more productive moving forward and see more cooperation between the House and Senate Chambers.

Notably, one of the appropriations bills passed by the House and Senate allots funds for the improvement and maintenance of Interstate 70. I-70 crosses the entire State of Missouri and with these funds, we hope to expand I-70 to three lanes going both directions, allowing for six total lanes. Ideally, this will help manage congestion on the interstate and improve the quality of the drive for residents and travelers to our state. There was some concern earlier in the legislative session about public libraries being defunded by the legislature, I am pleased to say that the Senate placed those funds back into the budget.

On a personal note, language from three of my own bills was amended on to Senate bills and sent to the Governor this session. I

have listed the three below.

SB. 103 contains an amendment in which language from one of my bills this session was added. My language modifies provisions relating to pooled estate accounts by public administrators and venue in guardianship and conservatorship cases.

SB. 186 contains language from another bill I filed this session that modifies the offense of unlawful use of a weapon by clarifying circumstances of firing from a vehicle legally and by adding Blair's Law, which adds the discharging of a firearm within or into the limits of a municipality to the offense.

SB. 189 contains an amendment of my own that authorizes the cities of Lincoln and Clinton Missouri to put before voters a public safety sales tax.

The remaining bills that were truly agreed and finally passed this session can be found on both the House and Senate websites.

In an earlier report this session, I mentioned that my office was working on putting together an updated district directory, we are still waiting for them to be printed and mailed, but we hope to see them completed and ready soon. My office is also preparing to send a full, comprehensive end of session report for all of our constituents. We hope to see those sent out sometime

this summer.

With session coming to a close, the House will soon be operating on our interim schedule. My legislative assistant Blake will be in the office on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
