The Fifty-sixth Annual Jubilee Days will kick off with the Jubilee Days Baby Contest on Wednesday, June 7 in the Warsaw Community Building. All babies up to 24 months old whose parents reside in the Warsaw R-9 School District are eligible for the event.

According to Jubilee Days Chairman Chuck Allcorn, everyone on the committee is working hard to make sure the "Hawaiian" Jubilee is a big success.

One of the returning events is the Royalty Pageant for all ages of girls in the Warsaw R-9 School District. Little Miss is for girls from Pre-K through second grade; Junior Miss is for girls third grade through fifth grade; Princess is for girls sixth grade through eighth grade and the Jubilee Queen contest is for girls from ninth grade through the twelfth grade.

6:00 PM until 10:00 PM. Wristbands will be sold for \$25 for four hours of all you can ride. The Carnival will also be open on Friday, June 9 from 6:00 PM until 10:00 PM; Saturday, June 10 from 12:00 PM until 4:00 PM and then from 5:00 PM until 9:00 PM.

The food court and craft tents will be open on Friday and Saturday.

Warsaw Outlines Multi-Million Dollar Plan For Airport

In late session Monday night, City Planner Randy Pogue set forth an ambitious plan for multi-million dollar improvements to the city's municipal airport, beginning with additional parking aprons for airplanes parked there, and continuing with additional hangar space. He indicated there may be substantial grant money available to accomplish much of that work; also showed board members a nearby overcrowded repair hangar.

The meeting opened at the Municipal Airport at 6:00 PM on Monday, June 5, with Aldermen Rob Coskey, Lou Breshears, Doug Hedrick, Adam Howe, Eric Flores present. Alderman Reba Slavens was absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided, City Clerk Jessica Kendall recorded.

First business conducted was to approve the evening's agenda and May 15 council meeting minutes, then agree to pay May 15 to June 2 bills presented.

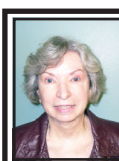
There was no old business. In early moments, Clerk Kendall swore in recently re-elected Alderman Breshears.

Warsaw And Cole Camp Pools Open For Cool Summer Of Fun

The Warsaw Municipal Pool, which opened 10 years ago on Memorial Day weekend at 1009 Jackson Street, began its summer season 2023 on Sunday, June 4 with plans for plenty of fun and exercise. Although it was scheduled to open the previous week, mechanical problems with the pumps had to be corrected. Nina Sprouse is beginning her third year as pool manager, and she is joined by 20 lifeguards.

"All of our lifeguards are high school athletes," said Sprouse. "We are overstocked, but it is important to offer as many jobs as possible to young people. We have not determined when the

pool will close this season because our lifeguards will need to report for training when school starts. We are waiting to get information from the high school about its fall schedule."

Daily admittance to the pool is \$4.50, and a seven-visits punch card is \$28. Punch cards for 24 visits are \$90, for 48 visits is \$168 and the daily twilight swim after 5:00 PM is \$2.25.

Sprouse said that there are many opportunities for swimming classes, parties, lap swimming and open swimming. Open swim hours are Sunday, 12:00 PM to 5:00 PM, and Monday through Saturday from 12:00 PM to 7:00 PM Minnows swim lessons (introductory level), Fish swim lessons (beginner level), Dolphins (Intermediate), and Sharks (Advanced) will be starting at the end of June. cold buttermilk. Since my grandmother had to cook all the time, I think she was happy with his choice too. The following recipe for Tennessee Onions is basically hers with a few extra dried herbs that I prefer. A great side dish for just about anything and I like it cold on sandwiches.

Preheat oven to 350°F. Coat a 13x9-inch baking dish with cooking spray.

Take 3 large sweet onions, slice crosswise into 1/4-in.-thick slices and separate into rings, then toss with: 1 tsp. each dried thyme, herbs de provence, parsley flakes, oregano or other dried herbs of your choice; 1 tsp. garlic salt, 1/2 tsp. dry mustard, 1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper.

Arrange in baking dish, top with 1/4 cup butter, cut into 1/4-in.-thick pieces, then sprinkle with 8 oz. Cheddar cheese, shredded (about 1 cup)

Cover with aluminum foil, and bake in preheated oven until onions are soft and sides are bubbly, about 40 minutes.

Remove foil. Bake at 350°F

until top is golden, about 30 minutes.

be \$15 for 15 minutes, and \$40 for 30 minutes. Water Aerobics will cost \$80 for a season pass and will be offered Monday through Friday from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM and on Tuesday and Thursday from 7:00 PM to 8:00 PM for \$3.50 per visit. Lap swimming is from 11:00 AM to 12:00 PM at a cost of \$1. There are also daily concessions. Those who want to schedule a birthday party, reunion, or other type of group pool party, call the pool at (660) 428-2199 for group rate information.

"Even though the costs of running the pool have gone up, we want to keep our patrons happy with discounts when possible. Non-profit organizations can schedule private parties, and groups like those in T-Ball can throw a party after hours. There are not enough weekends to do all requested special parties, but we can accommodate some with after-hours parties."

Sprouse is a teacher during the school year. She is currently switching from her

job with Mizzou Academy to teaching business classes at Warsaw High School.

Cole Camp Swimming Pool, a private pool located at 606 West Bluebird Drive, opened on Saturday, June 4. It had to delay its opening to take care of a water leak and will be working on other pool projects in the fall. The Cole Camp Swimming Pool Board President, Taylor Hayes, said that the pool first opened in 1981 and because of its age needs to have parts replaced. She said that some people who created the pool are not around anymore, so it is unknown what kinds of plumbing and other fixtures were used. She said that the pool underwent some big projects this spring.

"We have memberships, but the pool is also open to the public," said Hayes. "Anybody can buy a daily pass, but there are only so many available to the public compared to members. Beginning June 12, we will have open swim from 7:00 AM to 8:00 AM Monday through Friday. Water Aerobics will be 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM Monday through Friday at \$5 a session, or \$50 for a season pass."

Non-member daily admission is \$6. However, Sunday is Fun-Day with half price admission of \$3 per person or \$10 per family.

Swim lessons are offered June 19-23, June 26-30, and July 10-14 at 9:35 AM to 10:20 AM, 10:25 AM to 11:10 AM, and 11:15 AM to 12:00 PM. Lessons must be paid in full before a spot for a child will be held. The cost for members is \$40 and for non-members \$60. To schedule, stop by the pool or call (660) 668-2424.

Private pool parties and private swimming lessons will also be offered. Hayes said that typically there is a family fun day in mid or late July where there are cardboard boat races and contests for kids.

"We will close the pool on August 19 because all of our lifeguards and our manager are either students or work at school," said Hayes. "We have seven lifeguards, four who are returning to us."

Hayes said that the Board will have an annual fundraiser for the pool on

October 8 at the pool. It will be a drive-by fish fry dinner funded by free will donations.

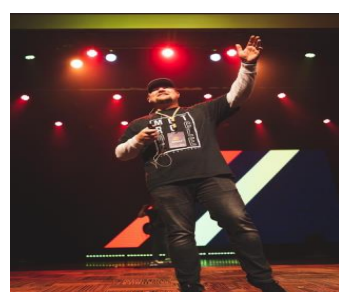

Class Of '23 Boys Leave Unprecedented Mark On Lincoln Sports Programs

The 2023 senior class at Lincoln captured a previously unprecedented achievement in school history this past school year as they won their district championships in football, basketball and baseball. Nothing was easy as they battled through injuries,

setbacks and various disappointments. Kyle Eckhoff lost his father in his freshman year on a Thursday, played football against Tipton on the road on Friday and caught a touchdown pass. He scored 1,000 points in basketball and now has his name on the wall with his father Darren Eckhoff. He was All-State in both football and basketball his senior year. Connor Lynde struggled

through injuries. He missed several games in all three sports. If he receives All-State honors in baseball, then he will be the only athlete ever at Lincoln to be named All-State in all three sports; football, basketball and baseball. The Cardinals were 12-2 in football, a mind-blowing 28-1 in basketball and 17-11 in baseball. The wind beat them in football, only the eventual state champs beat them in

basketball and injuries beat them in baseball. In their sophomore year, they had a new football coach and had to learn a new system. Ross Johnson broke several rushing records on his way to All-State honors. He stayed in the weight room until he looked like he was chiseled out of stone.

Bryce Koll was valuable off the bench and in practice in basketball and qualified for State in golf this past season.

Together, they were a team. Their individual strengths and weaknesses complimented one another. Someone said they were confident of their abilities which helped make them so successful. They enjoyed winning and hated losing.

They wouldn't talk about their undefeated streak in basketball. They had bigger goals. They shrugged off their surprising loss in football to Tipton and mowed down opposition until they met Monroe City in sectionals with the wind blowing to the extent that they couldn't throw the ball. Pre-season injuries in baseball to key players forced them to play a slew of promising freshmen. This reporter watched them lift weights at six in the morning, traveled at times with the basketball team on the bus and sat through numerous practices. He had many interviews and

took a thousand pictures. They were fun to watch and I enjoyed interviewing them after the games. It seems like yesterday that they were freshmen trying to earn a spot somewhere. On behalf of all of the Lincoln fans, I say, thank you, for the memories.

Boone Kroenke and his

class passed a legacy to Jackson Beaman and his class. Beaman passed it to Connor Lynde. Lynde has passed it to Riley Sanders and Sanders will pass it to one of the Dunkin boys. The future looks bright. As Sonny and Cher used to sing, "The Beat Goes On."

Another school year has come to a close. And if you have young children, they're now a year closer to heading off to college or some other type of post-secondary education or training. So, if you haven't already done so, you may want to start preparing for these costs.

And they can be considerable. During the 2022-23 school year, the average estimated annual cost (tuition, fees, room and board, books, supplies, transportation and other personal expenses) was nearly \$28,000 for public four-year in-state schools and more than \$57,000 for private nonprofit four-year schools, according to the College Board.

Of course, some students don't pay the full bill for college. Any grants and scholarships they receive can bring down the "sticker price." Still, there's often a sizable amount that students and their families must come up with. To help fill this gap, you may want to explore various strategies, one of which is a 529 education savings plan.

A 529 plan offers several key benefits. First of all, your earnings can grow tax deferred and your withdrawals are federally tax free when used for qualified education expenses, such as tuition, fees, books and so on. You may be eligible to invest in a 529 plan in most states, but depending on where you live, you may be able to deduct your contributions from your state income tax or possibly receive a state tax credit for investing in your home state's 529 plan. Tax issues for 529 plans can be complex. Please consult your tax advisory about your situation.

And 529 plans aren't just for college. You may be able to use one to pay K-12 expenses, up to \$10,000 per student per year. (However, not all states comply with this 529 expansion for K-12, so you might not be able to claim deductions and your withdrawals could be subject to state tax penalties.)

A 529 plan can also be used to pay for most expenses connected to apprenticeship programs registered with the U.S. Department of Labor. These programs are often available at community colleges and combine classroom education with on-the-job training. Furthermore, you can now



withdraw funds from a 529 plan to repay qualified federal private and student loans, up to \$10,000 for each 529 plan beneficiary and another \$10,000 for each of the beneficiary's siblings.

But what if you've named a child as a 529 plan beneficiary and that child doesn't want to pursue any type of advanced education? If this happens, you, as the account owner, are free to name another family member as beneficiary.

And beginning in 2024, you may have even more flexibility if a child foregoes college or other post-secondary education. Due to the passing of the Secure Act 2.0 in December 2022, unused 529 plan funds of up to \$35,000 may be eligible to roll over to a Roth IRA of the designated beneficiary.

One of the qualifications for this rollover is to have had your 529 plan for at least 15 years. To determine if you qualify for this rollover, you will want to consult your tax advisor.

A 529 plan has a lot to offer — and it might be something to consider for

your family's future.

Withdrawals used for expenses other than qualified education expenses may be subject to federal and state taxes, plus a 10% penalty. (Continued from Page 1) said he has a streamlined enforcement process for accomplishing that work. Mayor Simons then proposed reappointment of the city's committee members as follows: Mayor Pro Tem, Flores; Finance, the Mayor and Breshears; Police, Flores, Howe, Coskey; Public Works, Hedrick, Flores; Parks & Rec, Slavens, Howe, Coskey; Planning & Zoning, Breshears, Hedrick. His suggestions were okayed by the board.

In new business, the group approved two ordinances: (1) amending a section of the city's municipal code book to authorize Code Enforcement Officer Blankenship to act in related matters, and (2) amending the city's municipal code to refine what is deemed a public nuisance. Citizens may wish to familiarize themselves with its provisions. Aldermen also adopted three resolutions: (1) authorizing the city to sign an agreement with Lovelace and Associates to provide a \$655,000 to \$660,000 topographic design survey along Commercial St., funding expected to come from a grant; and (2) providing an inventory of lead pipes in houses and businesses in the city, grant funding also expected; and (3) authorizing the city's continued membership in Kaysinger Basin Regional Planning Commission, at a cost of 22 cents per citizen of the city.

The open meeting closed about 6:55 PM to go into executive session. Visitors are welcomed to the open meetings, which are usually held on 1st and 3rd Monday eves at its Community Bldg. site.

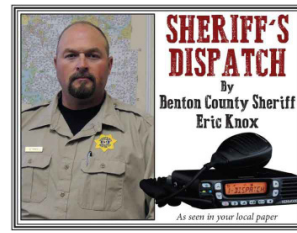

Hello Benton County,

It has always been my way to keep you informed, a measure some appreciate, and some criticize me for. I am informing you that we are operating with half of the staff we need to be effective. The honest statement is, if you call 911, we may not be able to be there, currently we are forced to take the calls in order of life safety. For instance, if your being shot at by your neighbor, that would take precedence over some fellas fist fighting down at the watering hole, simple assault, verbal domestics, suspicious vehicles, suspicious subjects, things that go bump in the night, noise complaints, smashed mailboxes; well you get the idea. We may not be able to be there; it is physically impossible to cover over all 740 square miles with half the people.

We have a total of 16 road positions, and we are down eight deputies. Recently we lost some senior staff with over 28 years of experience combined. The staff that has left is getting out of law enforcement and taking up employment in non-law enforcement careers. This is a trend that is happening across America, not just Benton County. We start new deputies at \$20 per hour now. That helps, but it's not enough. We need to change the county's retirement system to LAGERS and have better health insurance for our employees (\$1,100 per month for a family) I turn away candidates every year from larger agencies who are tired of the county and own lake properties here in Benton County. They can afford to work here after years of better pay, they just can't afford to lose their quality retirement. Most law enforcement agencies have LAGERS retirement system and can't work for

us due to the fact they can't continue their retirement. I am working to try to present the opportunity for the LAGERS retirement system to Benton County, not only for my staff, but for all county employees.

Believe it or not, all the crazy that goes on outside our county borders does eventually affect us in one way or another. The illegals pouring across our borders will eventually find their way here, bringing their crime and issues. The drugs have already found their way here. The passing of Amendment 3, in all its wisdom. Remember, I'm not against the use of marijuana in your own home. What you do is your business. I was, and still am against the way Amendment 3 is written and all the extra that are detrimental to our way of life! Take the time to read all 38 pages; you should be as scared as I am. The language in this amendment has hampered our ability to reach Methamphetamine, Fentanyl and other deadly street drugs, as well as increasing the amount of impaired drivers passing you on our roads.

Someone visited the office recently who was very upset because of a nest of thieves living on their road. We know who they are, and we have been picking them off as the opportunities present themselves. Our efforts were not good enough or fast enough to satisfy this individual. When it was explained to him, we were eight short and that violent crimes were up, he stated that wasn't his problem. Not quite in those words, but I cannot repeat the actual statement. He went on to say that's what he paid his taxes for and demanded service.

Folks, I'm not ranting here. I'm leading up to a truth here in your county. THIS OFFICE BELONGS TO YOU! Everything that goes on in this county and within this office IS YOUR PROBLEM. You allowed me the privilege to manage your office, bring in my business sense, passion, and transparency but at the end of the day, it's all OUR problem. Please don't forget that all public offices belong to YOU! At the end of the day, there are only so many licensed peace officers willing to do this line of work under the conditions that our society has allowed to stand. We are in trouble, fellow Americans! Band together, take care of one another. There is power in numbers. Get involved and be aware of your surroundings.

Speaking of transparency, some folks that have limited knowledge of their sheriff's office, are saying that "Sheriff Knox changed the radios and got rid of scanner land". The truth is, I had nothing to do with the radio change, but I support it 100%. I love the community's input and many times, it's a citizen with a scanner that helps us find the bad guy! The problem is, the antiquated radio system from the eighties only worked in certain areas of the county, leaving my staff with no ability to communicate when outside that range. As much as I love sharing our days and nights with you, the safety of my staff is more important. As always, my door is always open to you and I welcome your questions and suggestions.

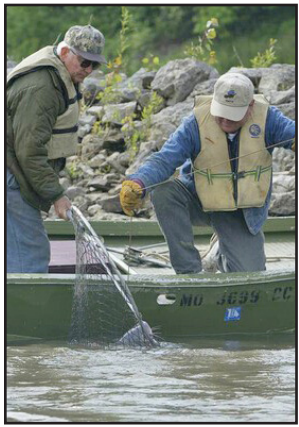

MDC Offers Free Trotline Clinic On June 8-9 At Truman Lake



MDC will host a free clinic on using trotlines to catch catfish June 8 and June 9 at Truman Lake.

Learn how to catch catfish with setline method

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) will host a free clinic on how to catch catfish on trotlines on Thursday, June 8, and Friday, June 9 at the Sparrowfoot Campground on the Grand River Arm of Truman Lake.

This two-part clinic will help newcomers learn how to build, set, and run trotlines. All materials to build a trotline will be provided. Space is limited. The first session will be from 3 to 8:30 p.m. on June 8. Ginger Miller, MDC conservation educator, and Chris Brooke, MDC fishery management biologist, will teach the sessions.

Participants will learn about catfish biology, catfishing regulations, how to build trotlines, and how to set and run the lines in the lake. They will also get an overview of rod and reel catfishing at the lake. Participants will go out onto the lake in MDC boats with instructors to set their lines.

The June 9 session will be from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Participants will go out in MDC boats with instructors to run the trotlines and remove fish. There will also be demonstrations on how to clean catfish to prepare for cooking.

This clinic is open to participants ages 7 and older. All participants must have a valid fishing permit, and for Missouri residents that includes those ages 16 to 64. Personal flotation devices will be provided and must be worn while on the boats. Registration is required. To register, visit <https://short.mdc.mo.gov/4Aj>.

Want some free fun that gets family and friends outside in nature? Get hooked on fishing with the Missouri Department of Conservation's (MDC) Free Fishing Days June 10 and 11. During Free Fishing Days, anyone may fish in the Show-Me State without having to buy a fishing permit, trout permit, or trout park daily tag.

Free Fishing Days is an annual MDC event that takes place statewide during the Saturday and Sunday following the first Monday in June.

Aside from not needing permits, other fishing regulations remain in effect, such as limits on size and number of fish an angler may keep. Special permits may still be required at some county, city, or private fishing areas. Trespass laws

remain in effect on private property.

Conservation makes Missouri a great place to fish, and Free Fishing Days encourages people to sample Missouri's abundant fishing opportunities. Missouri has more than a million acres of surface water, and most of it provides great fishing. More than 200 different fish species are found in Missouri, with more than 20 of them being game fish for the state's more than 1.1 million anglers.

MDC Reminds Public To Dispose Of Fish Waste Responsibly

Maintaining public fishing areas for everyone to use and enjoy requires the help of all citizens.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds the public to dispose of waste responsibly when cleaning fish. Each year, MDC receives numerous nuisance complaints of fish waste on the banks around public fishing access, especially during the paddlefish snagging season. It's important for anglers to do their part to keep fishing areas clean for others to enjoy.

In addition to using trash receptacles, disposing of fish-cleaning waste back into the water is allowed. Waste should not be piled up near the water's edge, and instead should be discarded into deeper water or in the flowing part of the stream. This assures waste cannot wash up to the bank or be concentrated in one area.

The paddlefish snagging season for Lake of the Ozarks, Harry S. Truman Reservoir, Table Rock Lake, and most other waters in the state runs March 15 through April 30. The season for the Mississippi River is March 15 through May 15 with a fall season of Sept. 15 through Dec. 15.

The Wildlife Code of Missouri states that extracted paddlefish eggs may not be possessed while on the water or adjacent banks and may not be transported. Disposing of paddlefish eggs immediately back into the water is allowed. A person cannot transport eggs to another location. This includes by boat to deeper water.

Paddlefish have several regulations to help protect them from poaching. Anglers may keep the eggs; however, extracted paddlefish eggs may not be possessed while on the waters of the state or adjacent banks, and may not be transported. If anglers wish to keep the eggs, they should be prepared to hold the intact fish on ice and remove the eggs from the fish later. Once the eggs have been removed

from the fish, they cannot be transported to any other location. Learn more about paddlefish regulations online at <https://short.mdc.mo.gov/4gb>.

Most species of fish have daily possession limits and disposing of an entire fish is not only wasteful, but a violation of the Wildlife Code. Entire fish cannot be tossed on a bank or dumped back into the water. Anglers fishing in Missouri waters should plan to use the fish they keep.

Maintaining public fishing areas for everyone to enjoy requires the help of all citizens. Anyone fishing in Missouri should be mindful of regulations and impacts to others.
