

This time of year, in the evenings, mosquitoes are a problem if you're sitting outside. Most people think attracting purple martins to your property will greatly reduce the mosquito population in your area. If you really want to control mosquitoes, you should try to attract bats.

Bats, which are mammals, and the only group of mammals capable of true flight, make up over 20% of mammal species worldwide and are surpassed in numbers only by the order Rodentia (rodents and mice). There are 1,116 recognized species of bats, including 46 in the United States. Sixteen species of bats have been documented in Missouri while some of the species are considered common and can be found in just about every one of Missouri's 115 counties, others are considered rare, endangered or even



MOST BAT SPECIES have only one baby per year.

Bats belong to the order Chiroptera (from the Greek word "hand wing"). A bat's wing contains the same bones present in the human arm and hand, just in different proportions.

### Fires Ravage Barn On Hwy BB, Dam Restaurant

### **Lincoln Receives** "Clean Opinion" On 2022 Audit

Under new business Monday eve KPA Auditor Mary Brune informed the Board that her recently completed financial audit of the city's books produced a "clean opinion," which was about the best audit result possible. She also noted that the city's revenues were up overall, but expressed a concern about its lack of segregation of duties, thus exposing the city to possible economic harm. But she added that cities the size of those in Benton County lack financial resources to hire sufficient personnel to ensure all financial operations are separated.

The meeting opened at 6:00 PM on June 12, with Aldermen Phil Fisher, Janice Swearngin, Jack Lietzke, Barbara Hammond present. Mayor Glen Nelson presided; City Clerk Sabrina Brown recorded.

First actions by the group were to approve the evening's agenda and minutes of the May 8 regular meeting, then agree to pay bills presented.

Benton County Economic Development Director Jo Ann Lane said Pink Silo Company's remodel is still in progress; they hope to open in mid-July. Mozark Mocha has purchased a mobile trailer. They were in Warsaw over the weekend selling coffee, smoothies, LINCOLN Page 16

Growth Transit, LLC about three years ago to provide rides to health and wellness appointments for people who needed transportation. About six months ago the program was introduced in Warsaw and volunteer drivers are being recruited.

"I am going to doctor's offices, senior centers and libraries to inform the public about this community service and to recruit volunteer drivers," said Marissa Scott, Community Mobility Coordinator with New Growth Transit. "I give out cards to individuals with contact information so those needing a ride can call us and get on our schedule. We can't schedule a same-day ride. We need at least 48 hours advanced notice. A ride may be scheduled by calling 417-283-7991 Monday through Thursday. But the actual

Heading into the fresh fruit and berry season, the following recipe for a sweet easy to make dough comes in handy, making enough for one 9-to-12-inch tart.

The egg yolk means the pastry is a little sturdier and a little less flaky than regular pie dough.

cups all-purpose 1-2/3 flour

2 tablespoons sugar 9 tablespoons butter, chilled pinch of salt

1 egg yolk 3 tablespoons cold water



In a large bowl, combine flour, sugar, butter (cut into small pieces) and salt. Using a pastry blender, two knives or your fingers, work the butter into the flour until it has the texture of oatmeal. Make a well in the center of this mixture and pour in the egg yolk, beaten with the water. Mix lightly with a fork (if the dough is too dry, sprinkle with a tablespoon more water), then turn the

dough onto a floured board and press dough into a ball. Knead just a few seconds to distribute the fat evenly, then re-form into a ball. Wrap in plastic or wax paper and refrigerate for at least 20 minutes. It will keep for a few days in the refrigerator or several weeks in the freezer.

(Continued from Page 1) rides are available evenings and weekends as well as during weekdays."

Kelly Ast, Chief Mobility Officer with WCMCAA, said that volunteer drivers must be 21 years of age or older. They are screened with a background check before being certified. Then, they are trained and provided a tablet that lists ride reservations they can choose from. The volunteer driver decides whether to give rides in town, or to drive longer distances. He or she may also do both types of driving. Once a driver accepts a scheduled ride, necessary information about the person and destination is provided. These volunteers have technology brought to their individual cars that records their trip in real time -- a safety feature. New Growth Transit gets a digital map of each completed ride.

"We have provided 30,000 miles of service in the 10 counties that we serve during 2023," said Ast. "We did less than that during the whole year in 2022 so we are expanding in service and new technology. Our volunteer drivers receive mileage reimbursement at the federally approved rate of \$.655 per mile. They are not allowed to receive tips from their riders. However, if a rider wants to make a donation to New Growth

Transit, it is permissible." Scott said that although funds are available for the program through a federal block grant, there is not a lot of money available, and

fundraisers are often held. There are six staff members running the New Growth Transit program in WCMCAA. Ast has been trying to get this program working for seven years while working throughout the state in some of the other 19 agencies, as well as during the past five years that she has been with WCMCAA. Scott began working with the program in December 2022.

When teaching the younger students, they are usually so excited about coming to school and want to be there. I felt it was not only my job to teach them, but to keep that excitement going. My favorite words to hear were always 'This is the best day ever, Mrs. Huffman!""

Contrary to popular belief, only one common bat species (the gray bat) uses Missouri caves year around. Many of our species hibernate in caves or mines during the winter but during the summer they often roost in tree cavities, under peeling bark on tree trunks, in foliage or in buildings. Research done in Missouri showed that some species live in trees or foliage year around, and one species, the Eastern red bat, often hibernates under the leaf litter on the forest floor during cold snaps in winter. Mating occurs during the fall or winter. The sperm and egg are stored dormant in the female until spring when fertilization occurs. Most bat species have only one baby per year. Gestation period is 50-60 days. Usually pups are born in mid-June. To permit gravity to assist birth, the female hangs head up by her thumbs. The mother's tail membrane catches the pup keeping it from falling to the ground. Bats have the largest baby in proportion to the mother than any other mammal. Translating that to people would result in a 150 pound woman having a 30-37 pound baby! The pups can fly on their own at 3-4 weeks of age and are weaned at about six weeks. By two months they are adult size.

Bats are one of the few animals which During truly hibernate. hibernation, bats use a physiological phenomenon known as torpor drastically decrease their metabolic rate. They do this by allowing their body temperature to drop from the normal active temperature of 100-102 degrees to 35-50 degrees. Their heart rate slows to a few beats per minute compared to as much as 1000 beats per minute during flight. In addition, they only breathe once or twice a minute. Interestingly, all torpid bats must periodically arouse (warm up), on average about once every two weeks, but the reasons for arousal are still largely unknown.

A common falsehood is that all bats carry rabies. Studies have shown that in reality only one-half of 1% of bats carry rabies. You are much more likely to contract rabies from a

raccoon or skunk than from a bat, and much more likely to get rabies from a cat or dog than from any wild animal. Worldwide, 99% of human rabies cases came from dogs.

So what do bats have to do with mosquitoes? All bat species found in Missouri and 70% of the world's species are insectivorous. Bats are one of the very few predators of night flying insects.

Bats evolved have technique called echolocation to use the reflection of sound in navigation and location of prey. To echolocate, bats emit pulses of sounds then listen for the returning echoes. The frequency and pattern of sound used varies with each species (which can be used to identify species). Usually the frequencies are above human hearing range. To prevent deafening itself and to be able to hear the returning pulses the bat disarticulates three bones in its inner ear when sending a pulse. Echolocation allows bats to catch insects while in flight by telling the bats the distance away, direction moving, and size and shape of its prey.

A single little brown bat can consume up to 1,200 mosquito sized insects per hour. Most bats eat from one-fourth to one- third their weight in insects each night. That would equate to a 160 pound person eating 160 quarter-pound cheeseburgers in one day. If you want to help with

bat conservation and help control nighttime insects problems, you might want to put up a bat house. You can buy ready made bat houses or find many good blueprints for bat houses online. Youtube has a very good step-by-step "Build a bat house" you might check. Many bat species are in great peril from a disease called "White Nose Syndrome", a fungus (Pseudogymnoacus Destructans) which infects hibernating bats. White nose syndrome kills 90% of bats living in infected caves. It was likely introduced from Europe to the United States and first documented in New York in 2006. No cure is known.







It's unfortunate, but true: During times of turmoil, whether it be a geopolitical situation or the economic stresses of inflation and rising interest rates, scam artists in cyberspace will try to take advantage of unsuspecting investors. What can you do to protect yourself?

Here are a few suggestions: Ве suspicious of unsolicited investment offers. Through tweets, direct messages, emails or some other form of social media communication, you might get unsolicited offers to invest from senders you don't know. Unsolicited sales pitches may be part of fraudulent investment schemes, so you'll want to be highly suspicious of these offers, especially if they use words or phrases such as "guaranteed" or "can't miss. • Do some research. Given the market volatility of recent weeks, cyberspace fraudsters may use social media to encourage unwary investors to go outside the normal investment world and put their money in "specialized" vehicles.

But these instruments may have significant risk and lie outside the supervision of those agencies whose mission it is to help protect investors, such as the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), which oversees stocks and other securities, and the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC), which regulates more complex investment vehicles, such as futures and options. If you're suspicious of an investment offer, you could take several steps, including checking with your state's securities regulator, to determine if the person making the offer is even registered to sell investments and if the investment itself has been registered.

• Be skeptical about online newsletters. You can find legitimate online newsletters devoted to investment topics. However, some companies pay newsletters to promote their stocks, so the information



isn't objective. This activity isn't illegal as long as the newsletters disclose who is paying them, but some fraudsters lie about their payments and also fabricate the success they've had in recommending stocks. Furthermore, these newsletters questionable may be advertised on valid websites or on the online

financial pages of authentic

news organizations. • Watch out for "affinity fraud." Your membership in a particular demographic, civic or professional group is no secret to potential fraudsters. So, be wary of any investment pitch that's made through an online group of which you are a member, or that appears in a chat room or online message board dealing with a specific topic of interest to you. Even if the person making the offer appears trustworthy, you still need to be extremely cautious, as this individual could have been fooled into thinking the investment opportunity was legitimate.

In addition to being on guard against investment advice you might see on social media, you can also take some practical steps. For example, keep your personal information birthday, Social Security number, phone number, address, etc. - off social networks. Also, it's a good idea to periodically change the passwords on all your financial accounts. And of course, never communicate financial information or account numbers to an unfamiliar source. If you're already working with a financial services firm, that firm should already have in place the proper protocols for security communicating information to them.

Also in new business, the group passed an ordinance establishing a \$13./hr. salary for a temporary employee who does mowing and weed eating for the City; approved a resolution for the City to continue its membership in the KBRPC; will continue its search for a new City attorney and prosecutor; and approved six liquor license applications.

The meeting closed at about 6:40 PM. These sessions are usually held on 2nd Monday eves. Visitors are welcome.

The Digital Asset Map is a project of the University of Missouri System Broadband Initiative in partnership with the Missouri Department of Economic Development and the Missouri Broadband Resource Rail.

The project aims to build a comprehensive statewide inventory of public computers and Wi-Fi access locations as well as resources such as digital literacy programs, computer classes, one-onone technical assistance centers and adult/workforce education programs, said Alison Copeland, UM System deputy engagement officer.

"Once the map populated, we will work with MU Extension offices in each county to publicize its availability and the breadth of broadbandrelated resources available to the public throughout Missouri," Copeland said.

Entities offering public resources are internet encouraged to help build the Digital Access Map by entering basic information. The information populates a searchable Missouri map to help users find nearby digital resources. As more assets are added to the map, MU Extension will help promote the tool to users across the state.

The MU Center for Applied Research and Engagement Systems (CARES) team verifies that entries meet criteria for accuracy and appropriateness before they are publicly posted. The form lets contributors edit, update and delete their entries.

for civic and cultural participation, employment, lifelong learning and access to essential services," said Jamie Kleinsorge, CARES assistant director and senior project leader for the Digital Asset Map project.

The form also asks 'community anchor institutions" to report available internet speeds. These institutions include sites such as schools and libraries that help people who would otherwise struggle to get online. The form will help identify locations that may be eligible for federal funds for institutions that do not currently have upload and download speeds of at least 1 Gbps, said Adam Thorp, community development specialist with the Office of Broadband Development.

The Digital Asset Map is

projects to expand internet access and use throughout Missouri, Copeland said. The initiative is one of two core partners to help the state's Office of Broadband Development implement Connecting Missourians program. With MU Extension and faculty and resources from the four UM System campuses, the broadband team is working with the state's regional planning commissions to help implement programs funded by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.

The UM System Broadband Initiative, in collaboration with state Office of Broadband Development, aims develop long-term strategies to secure and deploy funding for broadband infrastructure and adoption efforts over the next decade.

### **Public Comment Period Opens** On Draft STIP

The draft FY 2024-2028 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) was presented to the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission today. The draft five-year program includes funding from General Revenue passed by the Missouri

General Assembly – to widen and improve I-70, fix low-volume minor roads, upgrade railroad safety crossings and more. A 30-day public review and comment period begins today.

The STIP makes available \$14 billion of federal and state revenues for all modes of transportation over the next five years. Of the \$14 billion, the draft STIP details \$10.5 billion in road and bridge construction contractor awards, averaging approximately \$2.1 billion per year. It also includes a record \$3.4 billion in state General Revenue funded projects from the General Assembly subject to governor approval of the final budget.

"Overthe past two years, the cost of doing transportation improvements experienced record inflation ranging from 20-30%. Aside from the new funding from the General Assembly, this year's program didn't add a significant number of projects to the last two years as we manage the fiscal constraints of the funding," said MoDOT Director Patrick McKenna. "We are able to continue our asset management efforts while also making critical improvements and upgrades to corridors and safety features across the state."

The draft FY 2024-2028 STIP lists transportation projects planned by state and regional planning agencies for fiscal years 2024-2028 (July 1, 2023 -June 30, 2028) and reflects the transportation needs of communities across the state.




