

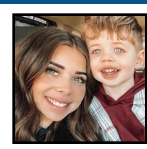

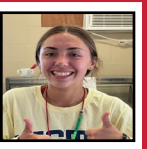

The area will present many opportunities to celebrate the birth of our nation at many events being hosted in and around Benton County.

There will be plenty to do in Lincoln on Saturday, July 1, at the Lincoln 4th of July Celebration.

At 8:00 AM, registration for the baby contest will open and at 9:00 AM that competition will get underway at the shelter house.

Then at 10:00 AM, the Lincoln 4th of July parade will begin down Main Street. A bounce house will also open at 10:00 AM, followed by barrel train rides at 11:00 AM.

Registration for the 3 vs. 3 basketball tournament will begin at 10:30 AM and teams will hit the court at 11:00 AM.

From 11:00 AM until 12:00 PM, registrants can enter their names for the 3rd Annual Best of Benton County Arm Wrestling Tournament and that event will get underway at 1:00 PM.

At 2:00 PM, it's the Pet Parade and Costume Contest sponsored by Heavenly Pets at the Lake.

The teen cornhole tournament will take place from 2:00 PM until 4:00 PM and the adults cornhole tournament will throw from

At 6:00 PM, the beer garden will open and Midnight with Brandon Ward will take the stage first. They'll be followed by Cedar Creek. The beer garden will be open until 12:00 AM.

Throughout the day, many vendors will be on hand with food, drinks and sweet treats, including Balke-Q BBQ, 32 Below Snow Cones, Boba Tea, A Bushel

& A Peck and much more! Also on the evening of July 1, it's the Drake Harbor Fireworks Experience in Warsaw, hosted by the City of Warsaw.

That display will go off at dusk and should be able to be viewed from Drake Harbor and other downtown areas including M.K. White Park, levees and trails.

Meals, snacks, drinks and other goodies will be available at many downtown establishments.

On Sunday, July 2, Osage Bluff Marina will host their

annual fireworks show. The first shot will go up at dusk. The fireworks at Osage Bluff have quickly become one of the areas largest and most attended shows on Truman Lake.

Cody's Bait and Tackle will set off their fireworks display on Sunday, July 3. That display is viewable from town, as well as many areas on the west side of the Osage River. Everyone is welcome to their location at 31046 Cold Springs Ave in Warsaw at 6:00 PM for free food. There will also

be bounce houses and other activities for the kids.

The American Legion Post #217 in Warsaw will begin their 4th of July celebration at 5:00 PM on Tuesday at the hall with The Treble Makers band. The Hibachi Ice Cream Company will be hand and drinks will be available in the lounge.

The flag retirement ceremony will be held at dark with the fireworks display to follow.

## City Of Warsaw Receives 'Clean' 2022 Audit

In early session Monday eve, the Warsaw City Council heard Auditor Jon Cummings, with KPM, CPAS & Advisors discuss his recently completed audit of the city's 2022 financial operations. He commented that it's overall revenues were up, but so were expenditures, which nonetheless produced a net surplus for the city exceeding \$500,000. He issued a "clean opinion" on the city's overall operations, while noting that inflation may be driving some of its increased revenues. He ended his presentation with a word of caution on the city's future operations.

The meeting opened at 6:00 PM on Monday, June 26, with Aldermen Eric Flores, Lou Breshears, Reba Slavens, Adam Howe present. Aldermen Doug Hedrick and Rob Coskey were absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided; City Clerk Jessica Kendall recorded.

First actions by the group were to approve the eve's agenda and minutes of it's June 5 meeting, then agree to pay bills presented. Police Chief Sean McCannon then introduced new police officer Ashley Taylor, whom he said was just out of the police academy and was performing well.

In new business, Aldermen approved two similar ordinances: one adopting

The annual Benton County 4-H FFA Fair is scheduled to be held this week in Lincoln at the 4-H FFA Fairground located on Park Street.

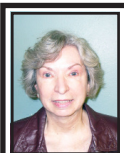

Whiteman Base Community Council liaison appointed by the City of Warsaw for three years and has been planning this event for many months with a committee composed of people from Benton County's community and businesses.

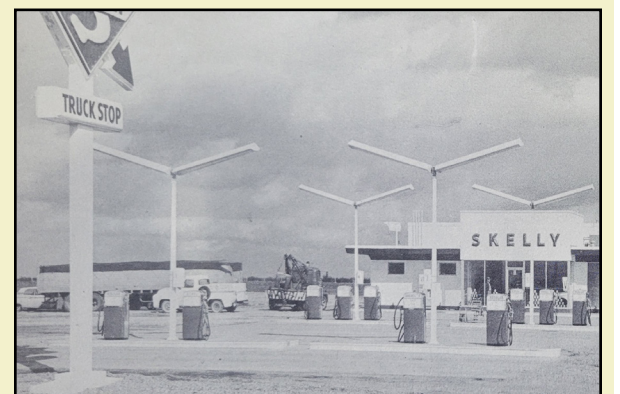

(Continued from Page 1) wide variety of restaurants.

Robert found it increasingly difficult to find good restaurants.

As he saw it, most restaurateurs operated on the philosophy of giving the customer the least amount of food they could while making a handsome profit.

He felt this was exactly the opposite of the way it should be looked at. His motto became, giving the customer as much food as you could, while still being able to make a profit.

It was in his first restaurant in Omaha, Rigby's Steakhouse, that he reaped the benefits of this philosophy. It was always in the back of his mind that the smorgasbord concept was an untapped market at the time. This thought stayed with him, and ideas continued to formulate as time passed.

Back in Missouri, Robert had traveled through Benton County during his years over the road. He liked what he saw of the land and the people. So, after his days with W.W. Grainger ended, and he had cut his restaurant management teeth on Rigby's Steakhouse of Omaha, he began buying land near Lincoln.

The Rigbys soon owned three farms near Lincoln, which totaled approximately 700 acres. On one of these parcels, just south of town on 65 Highway, Robert opened a business that incorporated a variety of ideas. A large warehouse provided the space for his wholesale and salvage marketing ventures. In addition, he started a western wear, boots, tack, and saddle shop, then added gas pumps and an early-day convenience store was born.

After a time, a large part of these businesses were lost to a fire, after which the store closed. But this turned out to be only the beginning of the story as an opportunity to trade the 700 acres Robert owned for the Skelly truck stop on the east side of 65 Highway in town. A lot of men would have had to think long and hard before making such a commitment. But, in the early 1970's, Robert was quick to see the possibilities and saw this as the perfect opportunity to test his smorgasbord theory of successful restaurant operation.

At the same time, the Rigby family owned and operated the hickory chip factory in the old MFA Implement building. This venture was made successful largely due to the efforts of Marjorie. It

would continue to operate in that manner after the restaurant opened inside the truck stop, which became known as the Rigby's Skelly Truck Stop for the next 12-15 years.

Marjorie was an extremely hard and dedicated worker, who played a large role in the ultimate success of both businesses. So successful had the hickory chip business become, that it no longer became possible to keep up with the demand for orders. Eventually, it was decided to cease operations, so all efforts could be focused on the restaurant, which grew into an extremely popular thriving destination for countless numbers of patrons across the region.

Eventually, time passed with the achieved success of the restaurant and truck stop business, until Robert and Marjorie were thinking of retiring to Florida. The business was sold to the Fred Beaman family, and the Rigby's headed for Florida.

The two youngest boys, Barry and Bradley, decided to go along to Florida.

Barry eventually became a successful lawyer in Orlando. Bradley had gotten involved with cooking and the business operation of things at the truck stop.

He was good at both and found he enjoyed both aspects of the business. So, he began training, first in the Cracker Barrel program, and later with Tony Roma's Legendary Grille.

It was at Tony Roma's that Bradley learned and perfected his art of preparing baby back ribs. In later years, Bradley would bring his love of business and the restaurant industry back to his hometown of Lincoln. Just south of his father's earlier ventures, he and his wife would open a hotel and restaurant, which they called Bradley's.

The restaurant was well-known for its fantastic steaks and baby back ribs.

After dinner, The restaurant turned into a lounge with some of the area's finest country music bands playing some of the most favorite dance tunes for patrons of all ages and from all around the region.

Bradley's became known as a preferred evening experience for several years until he chose to pursue other business interests. Sadly, The building which housed the restaurant now sits empty. But for those who enjoyed so many pleasant evenings there,

it will always remain Bradley's, as they remember it in those happy evenings.

EPILOGUE: Robert Rigby of Omaha, Nebraska married Marjorie Dalsin, a Canadian Catholic lady from a family in which she was one of six girls and six boys.

They were Blessed with six sons; Robert, Jr. (of whom we've spoken previously, currently residing in Grove, Oklahoma), Brian (who would become an auctioneer), Bruce (who was quite a basketball star at LHS and later went on to play for Kemper Military Academy in Boonville. He also became an excellent Marine pilot), Brent (nicknamed "Pinkie"), Bradley, and Barry (who would become a successful attorney who sees himself as quite the singer/songwriter in Orlando, Florida). Sadly, Bruce and Bradley have passed on.

Notables from the next generation of Rigbys are; Ben (Bradley's son), who owns a sound company in Nashville, whose clients include Country Music Singer/Songwriter, Eric Church; and Brennan (Brian's son), who is a cheerleader for the Tennessee Titans of the NFL.

The Rigby family has left quite a favorable mark on Benton County. Through their collective talents, efforts, and dedication, they have touched the lives of people not only around the state but surely around the country.

(Continued from Page 1) the 2015 International Property Maintenance Code for new structures within the city; the second adopting the 2015 International Existing Building Code for structures within the city. Cited as an example of the first code was the recent fire at the Dam Restaurant, which apparently damaged it's electrical system so heavily that its replacement will be treated as a new construction.

Adopted as a resolution was the 2023 2nd quarter financial report for the city. Administrator Randy Pogue noted that the city's sales tax revenues increased better than inflation, and indicated its finances were in very good shape. He also indicated the city has funds to match a \$500,000 grant for improvements on South Main St. He suggested a review of the city's building fees, considered low by comparison with such fees charged by some other cities. In conclusion, he spoke of the Pat Peters building project, which is comprised of a vacant lot and the building adjacent to the Yellow Deli. He seemed favorable to Peters' plans.

In late session, the group discussed possible fluoridation of the city water system but decided that further study was needed, then moved into a closed session about 6:50 PM.

Life does not always give us a straight path to our goals and sometimes there are silver linings in our setbacks.

Jackson Beaman came out of Lincoln High School with a scholarship to play baseball for the Tigers at the

University of Missouri; big stuff for a young man from a small town in the middle of rural Missouri.

He was injured on the last play of the last game for the Bismarck Larks. The Larks? How did he get there? By the way, the traveling team is located in North Dakota in case you were wondering. More on that in a moment.

Beaman redshirted at Missouri this season. He took a traditional redshirt

his true freshman year with all of the Covid holdovers. He played his second year at Mizzou, but he was considered a redshirt freshman. He played in just eight games as Missouri had several good shortstops and a roster loaded with upperclassmen.

He also took a medical redshirt in 2023. So now, Beaman will be a 21-year old sophomore in 2024, for eligibility purposes. It seems unusual, but happens to be fairly common with the bonus Covid year allowed. It's not how he got there, but several 23-25 year olds are playing college baseball.

Major League Baseball also cut their draft from over 50 rounds to just 20 because MLB cut 30 minor league teams from its system. College rosters are full of older players, so it is usually very hard for freshmen to see the field.

This season for the Larks, Beaman has hit the ball with home run power and looks to be back on track. He never quit and the long road back could produce big dividends for the 2020 Lincoln grad. Beaman is no longer the lanky 6'2" kid that left Lincoln. He has beefed up some and has a bright future.

Below is the rest of his story.

**JL**-Tell me about your injury.

**Jackson**-I tore my ACL running to catch a ball in foul territory on August 4, 2022, in one of the last games of the summer season. It's been a long and difficult road back to playing, but the lessons and experiences I've learned from this process are something I wouldn't trade for the world and have ultimately made this rehab process the best thing that's ever happened to me.

**JL**-How much eligibility do you have left at Missouri?

**Jackson**-I have 3 years left of college eligibility, if I choose to expend them all.

**JL**-What are your thoughts on Coach Steve Bieser, who recruited you and your new coach Kerrick Jackson?

**Jackson**-I'm very thankful for coach Bieser and the opportunities he gave me at the University of Missouri. I hated to see him leave but I'm excited to play for Coach Jackson and win some games.

**JL**-Tell me about the Larks. How did that come about?

**Jackson**-This is my second season on the Bismarck Larks, a summer collegiate league team in the Northwoods League. Our head coach, Will Flynt, actually used to coach Johnny Eierman when he played Independent Baseball for the Windy

City Thunderbolts and has become great friends with John Eierman, and John helped me get in contact with Will last year about playing for the Larks.

**JL**-They moved you to the outfield. How do you like that?

**Jackson**-I enjoy playing the outfield. I take great pride in being an asset on the defensive side of the ball and playing the outfield also allows me to focus a little bit more on my hitting.

**JL**-Has college been what you thought it would be?

**Jackson**-The college experience has been awesome. It's taught me a ton, helped me learn a lot about myself as well as turning me into a man. It's definitely not all sunshine and roses but it's been great

preparation for the real world.

**JL**-We say you passed the Lincoln torch to Connor Lynde and Kyle Eckhoff. You must be very proud of what they have accomplished?

**Jackson**-I'm not sure that I passed the torch to them. My grade had a lot of great players who they might've looked up to, but I've always enjoyed watching Connor and Kyle compete. They're both two great kids that work very hard and have a ton of ability. I'm very proud of what they've done in their high school careers in Lincoln and wish them tons of success as they prepare to both play ball in college.

**JL**-As we also wish Jackson the very best.

The duo also received a Platinum Award along with a Judges Choice Award-Advanced Acting Award.



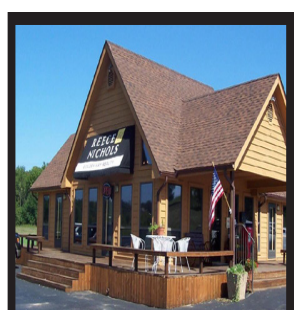
Though maybe their most prestigious, this was by far not the duo's only trophy this year. Reimund and Wright have hauled in several other awards, including:

This is one of my favorite corn salads and always requested by my cousins for our July 4th parties.

- 7 ears yellow corn
- 2 jalapenos
- 4 green onions, chopped (equal amounts of green and white)
- 1/2 cup chopped red onion
- 3 Tbs. minced cilantro juice from 2 limes
- 2-3 Tbs. olive oil
- coarse salt and freshly ground pepper
- 2 avocados

To char the corn, either preheat a charcoal or gas

grill or an iron pan with ridges. Husk the corn and lay it on the grill to get a light char on it, turning occasionally. When lightly charred wrap all the corn in foil and let rest for two hours. (This is to help it retain the corn juices.)

Also, char-grill the jalapenos. Remove them from the pan, cut off the ends and cut away from the seeds and ribs. Chop the jalapenos about the same size as a kernel of corn.

When the corn has rested, cut the kernels from the cobs and place the kernels in a bowl. Mix in the green and red onions, cilantro, lime juice, olive oil with salt and pepper to taste. (This salad can keep for several days in the refrigerator. If you are planning to make it ahead and store it, it is best to rinse the chopped red onions with cold water to prevent them from discoloring.)

When ready to serve, cut the avocado into small dice and stir gently into the salad. Taste and adjust the seasoning

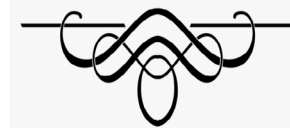
