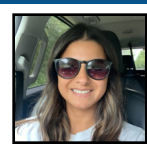

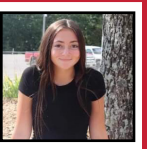

Massive Grant Brings Big Bucks, Major Improvements To Warsaw

United States Missouri Senator Eric Schmidt has informed the City of Warsaw that the community has received a \$24,997,004 RAISE grant. The strength of this grant application is the community's 25-year continuous effort to improve its Drake Harbor Waterfront Park, the revitalized downtown, and combining this with a detailed planning process to develop its three primary roadways into complete streets.

The grant will provide the funds to link the three roadways through the downtown, to the waterfront trails with expansion of one of the trails. A unique feature is a stormwater mitigation area on the Town Branch that will also incorporate a park area known as Light Plant Park.

Mayor Eddie Simons was ecstatic about the RAISE grant.

"The City Council and City Administrator, Randy Pogue, have worked diligently on this grant to improve the streets of Warsaw," said Simons. "We have applied for this grant several times over the past 12 to 14 years and it is very rewarding to finally be selected. Our partnership with Burns and McDonnell in Kansas City helped us finish up a winning grant."

A VITAL SOURCE FOR WARSAW, City Administrator Randy Pogue was instrumental in securing a near 25 million dollar grant. It will be used for a host of worthy projects. Pogue met with Mayor Eddie Simons to review plans for the funding.

Simons pointed out that the work to be done would change the "Face of Warsaw" for the better.

"With the work to be done we will have sidewalks all the way to Eastgate Shopping Center as well as all the way to J&D Pharmacy. There will also be a plan to control flooding of the Town Branch," said Simons. "We will have new LED street lights throughout the city and people will be able to walk around much easier."

Warsaw sits on the 90-

mile marker of the Lake of the Ozarks and is just one mile downstream of Truman Dam and Reservoir.

Connecting to U.S. Route 65 (US 65) and Missouri Route 7 (Route 7) in three locations, the roadway segments included in the project span across the city to complete two east-west routes and one north-south route. These improvements will facilitate visitor traffic coming into the city from the major highways as well as local circulation, creating safe links to neighborhoods,

schools, retail areas, and recreation and nature nodes.

The improvements also extend Warsaw's natural water amenities from the Marina District into the community by protecting and expanding on natural wetland areas.

City Administrator Randy Pogue was instrumental in preparing the grant proposal. "Receiving this grant has been a 14-year process. We have submitted 13 times in this 14-year period. We were persistent with the pursuit of this grant, because we knew

it would enhance what the city committed to in 1997, relating to the downtown revitalization and Drake Harbor Recreation improvements. Over this time period, we stayed committed to the Drake Harbor improvements.

This was a highly ranking quality of life item in the grant scoring," said Pogue. "During discussions over the last three years with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) on how to

There used to be three kinds of summer squash—dark green zucchini, yellow crookneck, and pale green patty pan. Now, the colors and shapes are all mixed up; so sometimes they are called tender squash. Whatever, you use for this recipe it is delicious and keeps for a week.

2 lbs. summer squash
Salt and freshly ground pepper
1-1/2 cups fresh breadcrumbs
3 Tbs. butter
1/4 cup sliced shallots
1 Tbs. thyme leaves
1/2 cup salsa (I use green but red is ok too)
1 cup grated cheese, I use Gruyère or Cheddar

thyme, and 1/2 cup salsa, and some pepper. Toss again, and season to taste. To assemble, make a layer of half the squash in a 9x9 inch gratin dish. Cover with half the cheese and then half the breadcrumbs. Repeat these layers of squash, cheese, and breadcrumbs. Bake in a 350-degree oven until the squash is tender and the top is crisp, about 30 minutes.

It seemed that by inviting people to come to Benton County to enjoy our recreational and natural amenities, there was the possibility they might elect to invest in real estate, spend money at local businesses, pay taxes, begin businesses, and spread the news about us by word-of-mouth.

Lynette Stokes started as the Assistant Director of BCTR in April 2017 and was promoted to Executive Director in June 2017. She is the single employee of the corporation working as a contractor and is responsible for overseeing and implementing all aspects of tourism including accounts payable, accounts receivable, marketing, administrative aspects, updating the website, sending out brochures to all Missouri Welcome Centers, updating brochures, county-wide events cards, Top 15 Things to Do in Benton County, MO State Fair Booths, ordering collateral to distribute, writing grants, overseeing social media management, analyzing reports, monthly newsletters and much more. She has helped with the Cole Camp Walking Tour Guide and was the organizer of the revised Warsaw Walking Tour that was newly published during the Missouri Bicentennial in 2021.

Stokes has help from a board of 10 representatives from different sectors, such as economic development, City of Warsaw, County/Lincoln, bank, lodging, insurance, and business owners.

"I have many 'bosses' that I report to because everything must be approved and go through all the channels so there are many checks and balances, but I like it that way," said Stokes. "I enjoy the aspect of people helping each other and people supporting each other. My prior professional experience has been an asset in allowing me to be able to do this position successfully that includes multi-tasking, teamwork, accounting, customer service, marketing/advertising, event organization, and business management."

Stokes is also a Warsaw representative for the Whiteman Base Community Council, which meets monthly to provide sister-city support for airmen in the 509th Communication Squadron on base. June 17th was the first annual Whiteman Day which was

organized by a committee (with her as liaison). It brought military personnel and their families to Warsaw to participate in sporting and crafting activities, enjoy a catered meal, plus tours of the Visitor Center and Lost Valley Fish Hatchery.

She said that there are three meetings every month that include partnerships with the chambers, economic development, State Fair Community College, MU Extension Office and city officials. They discuss upcoming events and how they can support each other.

"I have been the catalyst for programs such as the Building Local Prosperity Workshop held back in 2019, the Barn Quilt Trail of Benton County, Arts Fest (formerly Art Walk), KCBS Master Series and Backyard Series BBQ Competition, the former Ozark Cigar Box Guitar Music Festival and Smokin' Hot Harborfest. She organizes these events and sees to the marketing plan approved by the Board of Directors which includes advertising on three radio stations and the digital billboard in Sedalia for all chamber and city events."

The annual County Tourism Plan includes a budget based on estimated bed tax, grants, and community contributions. From there she builds her marketing plan.

"Without the three percent guest tax and the support of the County and Cities – we wouldn't be able to promote Benton County," said Stokes. "This year, we are estimated to spend in marketing/promotion: \$17,000 in events, \$22,000 in billboards, \$6,600 in brochures, \$15,000 in digital advertising, \$43,000 in print advertising, \$14,000 in radio advertising, \$3,000 in postage, collateral, fair/sports shows."

Board member Suzie Brodersen said that BCTR is bringing customers into restaurants and expanding businesses. There are more people paying bed taxes and there are more people being brought into shops.

"I would say that in the years since Lynette Stokes has taken over BCTR as director, the tourism budget has increased dramatically," said Brodersen. "This is mostly due to her drive to bring more people into our county and make people aware of how tourism benefits their business. We have grown in infrastructure and people are staying longer on weekends."

Kimberly Percy, Warsaw

Chamber of Commerce Director, said that BCTR does an amazing job connecting tourists as well as local people with all the fun and excitement Benton County has to offer.

"Their events and publications increase tourism and also help our local economy that relies on them," said Percy. "We are lucky to have Lynette and her board in our county."

Total expenditures in FY22 were \$24,447,361 compared to \$13,789,041 in FY10.

Look for the popular Smokin' on the Harbor and Master Series BBQ Competition August 5-6 at Drake Harbor, as well as the Backyard Series BBQ Competition. The Smokin' Hot Harborfest takes place August 5 from 11 A.M. to 7 P.M. with live music, food trucks, beer and wine garden, cornhole tournament, water show contests and more. Admission is \$5 for adults and \$3 for kids \$17 and under.

(Continued from Page 1) looking for the right spot for our next venture."

Guevara did a great deal of research before making his decision to come to Warsaw. He was impressed with the tourist trade from people visiting Truman Lake.

"We spoke to business owners in the community as well as taking a traffic count," said Guevara.

The Guevara family also owns and operates the Dairy Queen in Sedalia as well as operating all the concessions at the grandstand at the Missouri State Fair.

Jorge Guevara first came to Sedalia as an exchange student from Venezuela at Sacred Heart High School. He met his wife Meagan in Sedalia.

Guesa, the family company, also owns and operates Urgent Care in Sedalia, Primrose Schools in Jacksonville, Florida and grows and exports beans and sesame seeds internationally from Venezuela.

"No one person is the boss in our company," said Jorge Guevara. "I have worked every job that we have. Our employees are very important to us and there is no one person more important than the other."

Dairy Queen will be employing teenagers at the Warsaw location but Guevara noted that all employees 14 to 16 wear red hats and when their work time is up there is a signal that all red hats are finished for the shift.

Employees who are 14 to 16 can only work four hours a day during the school year and eight hours a day during the summer. They also can only work until 7 PM during the school year and 9 PM during the summer.

Dairy Queen employees receive full benefits: health, dental, vision and life insurance. Employees can also benefit from profit sharing and a 401K company matching benefit.

The Guesa company is also very community oriented and wants to support local groups such as sports teams, clubs and other organizations.

"We would like to hear from leaders of different organizations to help them with their programs," said Guevara.

This is not the first Dairy Queen franchise to come to Warsaw. A group of Sedalia businessmen built a Dairy Queen back in the '90s next to the Phillips 66 station on Missouri Highway 7. After the Dairy Queen closed, a McDonald's was located there until a new building for McDonald's was erected across from Hawthorn Bank. The building now houses the WARM House.

Before that Dairy Queen, Ann and Irv Henry operated a Dairy Queen franchise for many years in the 60's near White Branch café on Old U.S. 65.

"Dairy Queen was a favorite place for teenagers when we were in high school," said former coach Bob Campbell. "We are glad to see DQ back in town."

DQ restaurants are independently owned and operated franchised locations that have served customers for over 70 years. The independent franchise operators of DQ restaurants and their employees, together with American Dairy Queen Corporation strive to provide customers with the best products and service possible.

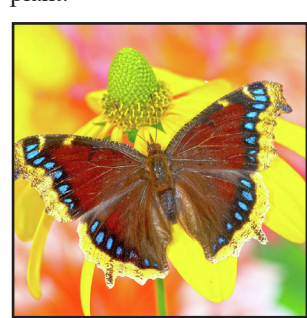
(Continued from Page 1) petals, they are capable of flying thousands of miles at speeds up to five miles per hour.

A butterfly's life cycle is one of complete metamorphosis. Four distinct stages: ovum (egg), larva (worm or caterpillar), pupa (chrysalis) and adult. The larva is the only stage in which growth occurs. Ovum, pupa, and adults do not grow. Little butterflies do not grow into big butterflies. Female butterflies land on different plants drumming her feet to cause a plant to release juices. She uses the taste receptors in her feet to locate that spot on which she lays her eggs in late spring. Eggs hatch into caterpillars in 3-6 days. As caterpillars, they spend almost all their time eating and grow rapidly. If a human ate proportionately as much as a caterpillar, a six pound baby would weigh over eight tons in two weeks. The caterpillar stage lasts 3-4 weeks. They then pupate (form a chrysalis) and 9-14 days later emerge as adults. Some species of adults lack mouth parts and cannot eat. Their goal is to mate, lay eggs and continue the cycle. Female butterflies and moths emit a chemical odor (pheromones) that can be detected by males from over a mile away.



Some of the species that over winter, the Monarch and Morning Cloaks for example, live as long as nine months. Some butterflies are plant specific. Their

life cycle is tied to just one plant.



Adult butterflies, with the exception of the Harvester butterfly, which is carnivorous, can only feed on liquids, primarily flower nectar, a few tree saps and juices of decaying fruit, animal carcasses and excrement. Male butterflies occasionally sip from mud puddles that are rich in minerals and salts, which are incorporated in their sperm. These nutrients are then transferred to the females during mating and help improve the viability of her eggs.

Butterflies and moths, especially in the caterpillar stage, are enormously important to terrestrial food webs. Ninety-six percent of all bird species depend on insects to feed their young.

Many species of Lepidoptera are in serious decline due to habitat loss and private and commercial use of insecticides and pesticides.

Buy or make a butterfly net, get a couple of reference books, take your children or grandkids outside and introduce them to nature. Help instill in them the wonders and importance of our natural environments. It will depend on this generation of children to ensure that future generations have the opportunity to enjoy our native flora and fauna.

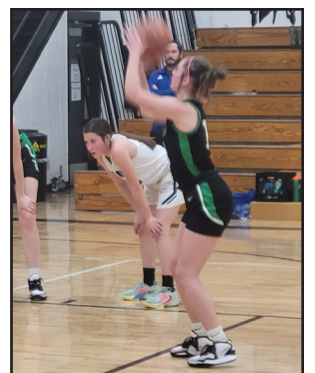

MSHSAA Approves NIL Benefits For High School Athletes That Meet Requirements

The Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA) has approved an amendment to its handbook that will allow high school athletes to profit from their name, image, and likeness (NIL), but only after signing a National Letter of Intent.

The recently approved change was added to the organization's handbook effective Saturday, July 1, 2023.

KY3 Sports and Ozarks Sports Zone contacted MSHSAA Communications Director Jason West.

West provided KY3 Sports and Ozarks Sports Zone with the following language from the new handbook.

By-Law 3.6, *Amateurism and Benefits*, outlines the requirements of amateurism and was amended on the 2023 Annual Ballot to speak to Name, Image, and Likeness. Likewise, during the 2023 Legislative Session, this topic was discussed and a new statute was passed that affects a small sub-group of Missouri secondary school student-athletes.

As per State Statute RSMo 173.280, a high school athlete shall have the right to earn or attempt to earn compensation from the use of such athlete's name, image, likeness rights, or athletic reputation ONLY AFTER signing an athletic letter of intent (NLI*) or other written agreement to enroll in a postsecondary educational institution in the state of Missouri.

*This refers to the National Letter of Intent program, managed by the NCAA and with governance oversight provided by the Division I Collegiate Commissioners Association. There are very specific rules and regulations governing this

program and the signing of the NLI. Written agreements through programs run by other collegiate athletic associations (NIAA/NJCAA) would meet this provision as well.

Therefore, all students must meet the specific provisions of By-Law 3.6, except for those who: 1) sign such an agreement for collegiate sport-specific participation and 2) that agreement is with a Missouri college or university that is participating in the official NLI program or a like program that can be documented.

Other rules do apply for athletes wishing to profit from NIL. If an athlete meets the necessary criteria for NIL benefits, the MSHSAA Handbook states: However, in the NIL Activity, the following may be utilized only with advanced approval by a school administrator: member school name, colors, nickname(s), mascot(s), logo(s), uniforms, etc.

A student may use his/her name, image or likeness (NIL) and receive a benefit (allowable or prohibited) if he/she is not representing a school, not representing or depicting the specific sport desired for amateurism, and is not through such use promoting his/her participation, fame or prowess in that particular sport.

In 2021, the NCAA approved a name, image, and likeness policy for Division I, Division II, and Division III athletes. Since then, more than two dozen other states have adopted similar policies for high school students.

professional tour," World Fishing Tour owner Travis Burch said. "Keep your eyes on their journeys; they are only getting stronger in the sport by the day."

Second place was the father/son duo of Jeremy and Joel Johnson. The Johnson team cash checks pretty much every trail they fish, whether it's AIA, Joe Bass, or even when Jeremy throws his name in the Solo Pro, Bassmaster Opens, Toyota's, and BFL's hat. Pladies was his team partner and is no slouch either owning one of the most highly sought after glide bait lines on the market. Pladies' attention to detail is insane and knowledge is out of this world when it comes to bait design for Clutchswimbaitco.com All that time on the water pays off in fishing and bait design and it shows.

Fourth place went to Chris Bridges and Steve Prince. They mentioned going into today wishing fish would cooperate a little better in the hot high skies and that just didn't happen. Bridges and Prince are also no strangers to cashing checks together on Truman Lake.

Fifth place was another MLF Invitationals Pro in Brock Reinkemeyer and Anthony Johnson. They were one big keeper from a different article. As locals to the lake, they know where they live too. So to see a fifth from this team you know the lake and the tournament is fishing tough.

(Continued from Page 1) improve our application, we knew we were getting close to receiving the funds. Last year we conducted a survey of the community to determine if the residents still wanted these improvements. The survey provided a resounding yes to continue the pursuit of Complete Street approach for these three roadways,"

said Pogue. The project is intended to improve safety and livability in the community by reconstructing the roadways to accommodate parking, bicycles, ADA compliant sidewalks, curbing, and pavement striping. The Complete Streets approach will address current shortcomings in disability access, safe routes to school, and citizen's health

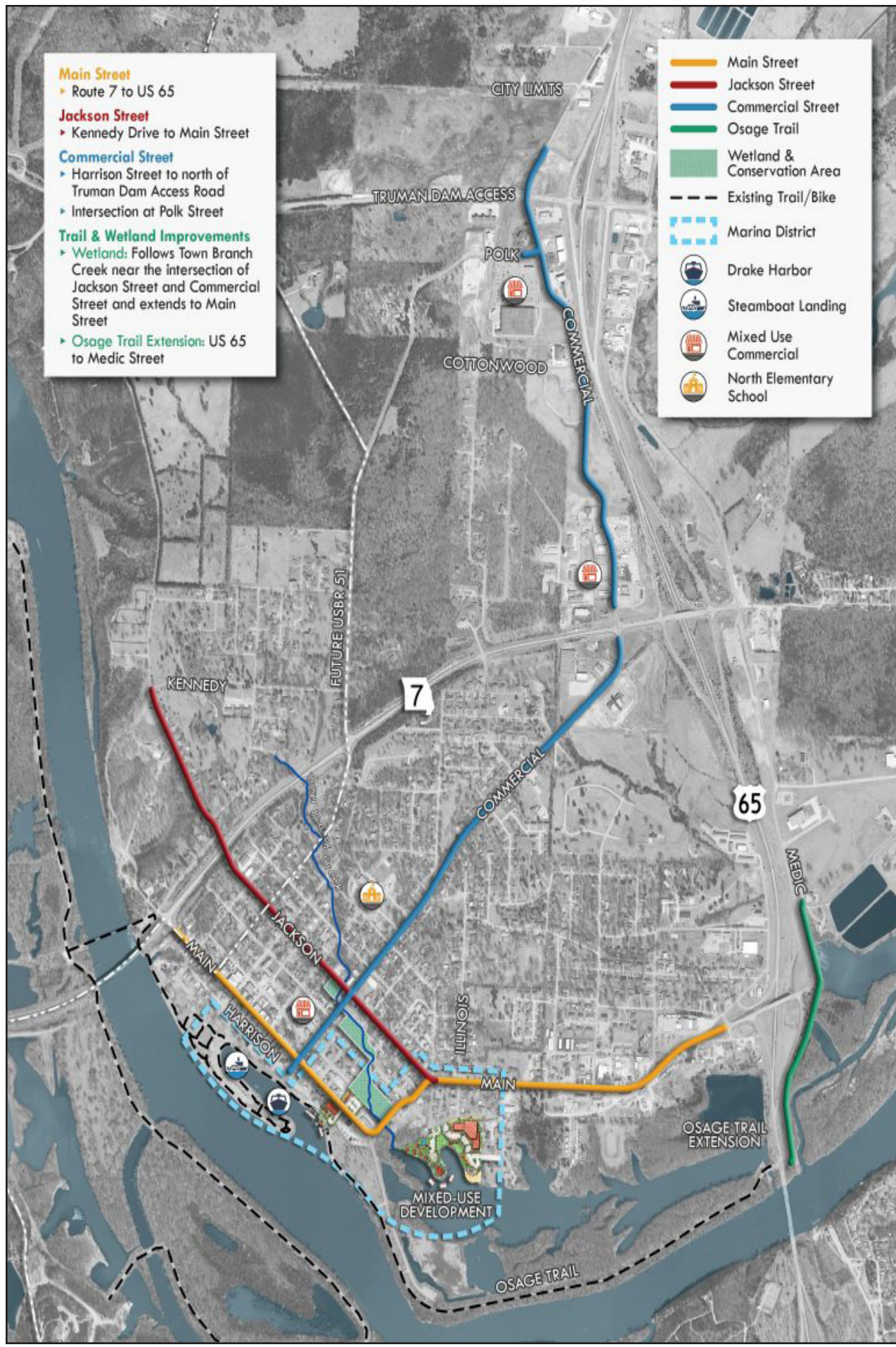
and recreation benefits by providing bike and pedestrian access to the city's trail system along the waterfront. "The infrastructure improvements stated in the application, will allow citizens of all mobilities to have access to daily needs and recreation opportunities. It uniquely allows our three major roadways to reach all corners of the

community from and to the downtown and Drake Harbor Recreation Area," said Pogue. The current ditch-stormwater collection system will be replaced with integrated green stormwater infrastructure and an enclosed storm sewer system to mitigate street flooding and promote environmental sustainability. Intersection improvements, new drive

approaches, and center turn lanes where feasible will address access and intersection safety challenges. "I must thank Mayor Simons and the Board of Alderman for continuing to support the pursuit of this grant opportunity. It would be so easy to decide to not try anymore," said Pogue. According to Mayor Simons, work on the project will begin within the next two years, however, the entire project will not be completed until 2030.

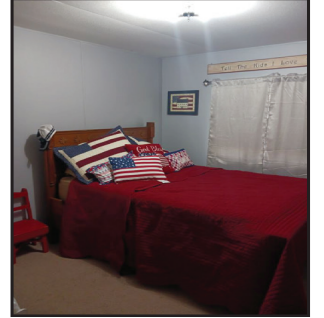
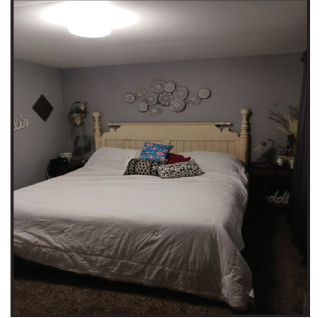



If you’ve ever been involved in building a house — or even if you’ve just heard about it — you know that there’s a well-defined process to be followed. But here’s something to think about: Some of the same steps connected to constructing a home are the same as those needed to build an estate plan.

And the structure of your estate plan may need to undergo some modifications, too. - **Watch for mistakes.** It’s unfortunate, but mistakes do happen in home construction. Water stains can indicate that water is seeping through cracks in the foundation. Or cracks in retaining walls and garage floors could be a sign that the concrete structures were installed improperly. Estate plans can also contain errors or bad choices. Some are inadvertent, such as failing to put intended assets into a trust, but others are done with the best of intentions, such as naming adult children as joint owners of your assets. Even if your children are quite responsible, this move could give their creditors access to your money. If you want your children to be able to step in as needed, you could find other methods, such as giving them power of attorney.

With an \$8 billion dollar surplus we’ve never had, the governor of Missouri just vetoed \$13 million for a police center in St. Louis City, vetoed \$10 million for a public safety access point, in addition to the \$5.2 million he vetoed for youth crime prevention, violence intervention and respite housing. I swear, the Republicans in Jeff City just love to point to crime, “blame Democrats” all while passing laws to prevent law enforcement from doing much of anything about it. The governor said we can’t afford the one-time costs because of the billion dollar tax cut he signed last year that mostly benefits wealthy people and does literally

nothing for the third of people that make the least. And there’s another tax cut bill - benefiting the wealthy - that reduces Missouri revenue by \$300 million.

Let’s not forget we still have the lowest state funding of education and lowest paid teachers in the nation; the lowest paid state workers; a wait time of up to a year for care for a kid in crisis so the MO foster system has to bed them in hospitals. MO also has \$2 billion in other funds, mainly additional federal aid for state services like Medicaid. He can use that as general revenue rather than beef up Social Services staff to help Missourians. Remember that next time you call their office to get help and you’re on hold for 4-6 hours. Friendly reminder, another gas tax hike just kicked in thanks to the MO GOP.

This is Missouri under Republican leadership, folks.

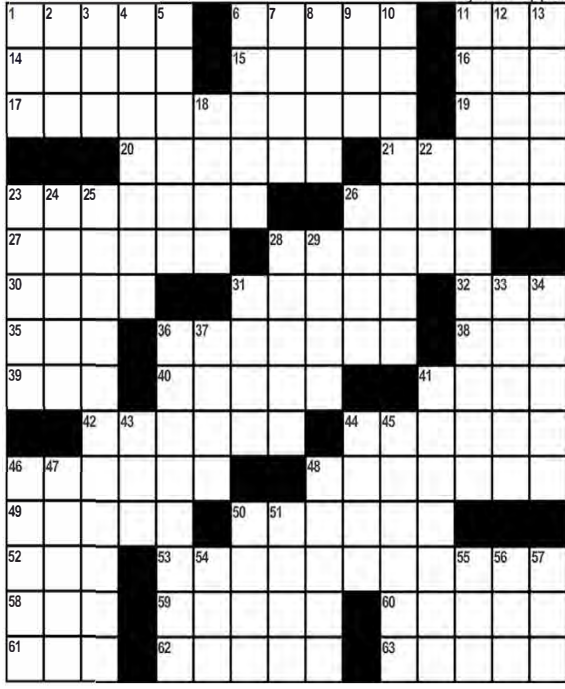

In the eyes of many if you didn't catch any fish or win the state championship then you are a failure and the whole thing was a waste of time. You don't believe me? There is a high school that was considering dropping their girl's team because they have only won the state championship twice in the last ten years and missed a last second game winning shot in the state championship game this past season.

I told someone a while back that I would never ask any fishermen if they caught any fish. The truth is that you are not going to catch fish every time you go. If you say you didn't catch anything, they will usually just walk away. If you go fishing then you have a story and an experience to last as long as your memory stays intact.

People do me that way with church. How many did you have Sunday? I am turning that question around and asking them how many I need to be a success in their eyes. No one ever asked if you had a good service or did anyone get saved which is a dead end question too.

USDA Launches Feds Feed Families 2023 To Combat Hunger And Improve Access To Healthy Food



The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) shepherded in the 2023 summer campaign of the Feds Feed Families program, a voluntary food drive that encourages federal employees to make in-kind contributions, including food, services, and time, to food banks and pantries of their choice. This year's theme is Fighting Hunger - Giving Hope.

"We're the richest country on earth. But even here, people are hungry, and people don't have enough food," said USDA Acting Deputy Secretary Kevin Shea at the official launch event in Washington on Monday that highlighted food and nutrition insecurity, the power of innovation, and the importance of donating to local food systems.

During his keynote address, Shea explained that USDA operates a variety of effective nutrition assistance programs designed to help meet people's basic food and nutrition needs, including the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) and school meal programs.

Shea added that one way federal employees can supplement government programs is by supporting food banks and pantries through the Feds Feeds Families campaign.

The Feds Feed Families campaign launched in 2009. In 2022, the program raised more than 8 million pounds of food and in-kind donations to food systems nationwide. In its 14th year, the program is nearing the goal of donating and delivering nearly 100 million pounds of food.

"USDA is the designated lead agency for Feds Feed Families. But we work together as a federal community to be successful on this campaign," said Andrea Simao, the 2023 Feds Feed Families National Chair.

The summer campaign was launched to help food banks meet the increased demand

for food during summer break, when donations are typically lower and families with children do not have access to school meal programs.

Daryl Wright, vice president of Community Outreach for So Others Might Eat (SOME), a Washington D.C.-based non-profit that started as a soup kitchen in 1970 but has evolved to assist people experiencing poverty and homelessness, spoke about the importance of donating to area food banks.

Wright credits the Feds Feed Families initiative with empowering SOME to reach people in the city who are challenged with meeting basic food needs in part due to food deserts, or areas lacking access to affordable nutritious food.

"We have 89 full sales grocery stores, and only three of them are east of the river, where you have over 147,000 families competing [for] three grocery stores," Wright said.

Noting campaigns like Feds Feed Families are vital to getting essential food to people daily, Wright reported, "We were able to provide last year alone 27,000 pounds of food that [were] given to families in need within the communities."

Gary Oppenheimer, the founder and executive director of AmpleHarvest.org, a non-profit program that helps end food waste and hunger nationwide, gave a speech on food waste and the impact of gardeners' donations.

According to Oppenheimer, 40 percent of all households have people who garden - in their homes, communities, on rooftops, in container gardens - and they come from all walks of life.

Oppenheimer says that there are millions of people in this country who are food insecure to include minorities, families with children, veterans, and that these people have limited access to healthy food. According to him, they go to a food pantry, and may

not always find fresh food. "The kicker is that people who are gardening usually have surplus food, and there are people who need that food," Oppenheimer said, noting in the past food bank systems encouraged donations of non-perishable goods rather than fresh food, which likely prevented gardeners from donating their produce.

"All that surplus food would funnel to the food pantry, so that rather than that food going to waste, it can get to the pantry and then get to the families in the community," Oppenheimer said. "They are neighbors in communities living across the country - side by side."

With an innovative solution in mind, Oppenheimer launched AmpleHarvest.org in 2009. Today, it works as a cloud-based solution, connecting home and community gardeners directly with local food pantries that will accept their produce as donations. Nearly 8,069 local food pantries across all 50 states participate. AmpleHarvest.org is now rolling out a program specifically for Native American reservations. These efforts complement USDA's Farm to Food Bank Projects that have the goal of reducing food waste through the donation of food to emergency feeding organizations.

Katie Wolf of USDA's Partnerships for Data Innovations, which hosts FFF website's The Hub, gave an overview of the site. She shared new features to include an Events section which displays events taking place across the country, and a Recorded Donations Dashboard, which lists cumulative donations by department and agency.

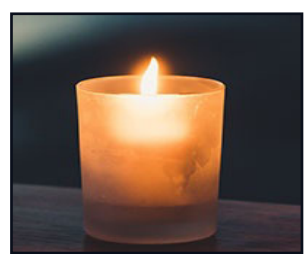

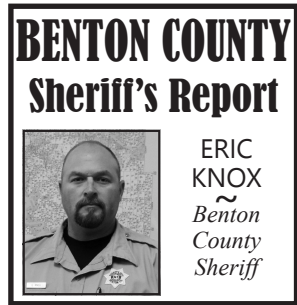

MDC Offers Free Discover Nature — Fishing Lessons July 8 & August 5 At Warsaw



Archery and shotgun instruction also offered at the lessons

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) will offer free Discover Nature — Fishing lessons and target archery instruction from 9 a.m. to noon on Saturday, July 8, at the Lost Valley Fish Hatchery at Warsaw. MDC will also offer fishing lessons and shotgun shooting instruction from 9 to noon on Saturday, Aug. 5, at the hatchery.

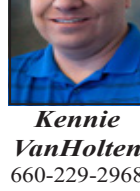

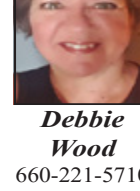
