

Is Nothing Sacred? Vandals Strike Methodist Church Multiple Times

The First United Methodist Church of Warsaw was vandalized twice during the past week causing very costly damage to the buildings and the church vehicles. The most recent event was on Friday at approximately 3:00 PM. The destruction was discovered by UMC Pastor Loren Whetsell when he went to the church at 5:00 PM to check on the windows of the church bus.

"A storm was blowing in and I wanted to make sure that the plastic we had placed on the bus was secure," said Whetsell. "I noticed that the window to the food pantry had been removed so I went to the front door of the church and I could see there had been someone inside. I called the Warsaw Police Department and waited for them to arrive."

The WPD went through the church with flashlights since the storm knocked out the power. They discovered that someone had set off several fire extinguishers in the church basement and did some major damage to the Sunday School rooms and Fellowship Hall.

Different rooms were vandalized with supplies and other materials thrown about the rooms. Food

was taken from the kitchen and food pantry and tossed around. The vandals opened every cabinet and every door and pulled out kitchen utensils then poured liquid detergent and hand sanitizers everywhere. They took food from the Blessing Box and threw mayonnaise, rice, beans and all sorts of food stuff on the floor. The vandals also took chocolate syrup and spread it all over walls in the basement of the

balcony and threw CD's and other equipment across the sanctuary. The altar was damaged and mayonnaise was spread all over the open Bible on the altar.

Pastor Loren Whetsell surveyed part of the damage on Tuesday morning.

The fire extinguishers damaged almost every room except the sanctuary. In the nursery countless toys were dumped and sprayed with the extinguisher powder.

Toilets on both floors of the building were clogged with items to the point that they are unusable. The vandals threw a chair at a television it was destroyed.

PREYING ON THE FAITHFUL, vandals and thieves have hit the First United Methodist Church in Warsaw twice.

UMC has hired ServPro to start the massive cleanup. Whetsell Pastor has contacted the Belton UMC and they are sending all of their Vacation Bible School materials to replace those damaged by the vandals.

While an exact damage estimate has not been established, church officials are anticipating the damage will cost approximately \$50,000 to repair.

"It is costing the church \$2,000 a day to clean up the mess," said Whetsell.

(Continued from Page 1) Salvation Army's program to feed children during the summer when they are not in school. Over 400 children per week are given sack lunches to replace the free meal that they do not receive from school. Whetsell said that they plan to have the area cleaned up so they can receive the food and distribute it as usual this week.

The Soup and More program that operates out of the basement of the church will be closed this week but there are plans to have the program up and running again by next week.

Vacation Bible School will go on as planned starting on July 24 at 9:00 AM and running until Noon for children 3 years to those who just completed fifth grade.

"This setback will not stop us from serving our community," said Whetsell. Sunday services were held at the First United Methodist Church Warsaw; however, members did not go downstairs since the fumes from the fire extinguishers were still in the air.

This destructive act was not the first the Methodists have endured during the week. On Saturday, July 8, unknown persons broke all the windows out of the church van and destroyed three windows on the church bus.

A window was broken near the food pantry in the basement of the church and food was stolen from the Soup and More food pantry. The vandals took the food to the church bus and sat in the bus to eat the stolen food.

"We give food to anyone who needs it," said Sarah Wynn, secretary of the church. "All anyone has to do is just ask."

Lifelong UMC member Whitaker LeRoy shocked by the vandalism.

"There is no excuse for this sort of behavior," said "Someone is Whitaker. falling down on the job and I think it is the parents. Children have to be taught the difference between right and wrong. It is just very sad that a church members work so hard in this community to give back are disrespected this way."

(Continued from Page 1) Michael Collins, concerned citizen attendance, stated, "If it were important to the man at the Corps, he would be here".

In their absence, it was to Treece to relay information from her conversation with Jim Sandberg regarding the USACE's plan for the Visitor Center.

Treece informed the crowd that Sandberg told her that the government had stopped funding Visitor Center's directly and the districts were told that they would have to implement creative means to keep their facilities open. He said this district was able to divert funds from the recreation budget to keep the Harry S. Truman Visitor Center open, but only for peak hours on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and federal holidays that fall on a Monday. Furthermore, he stated the plan was to keep the facility open until fiscal year 2022.

Sandberg also shared with Treece that his belief is the best of the options being considered is to move the USACE offices from the three buildings where they are currently housed to one location; that location being the Visitor Center. He went on to tell her that housing the offices in that facility would be a "winwin" situation. According to Sandberg, by having the offices there, the utilities would be budgeted for and the buildings, and where the offices are currently located, as well as the land around them could be leased to bring in revenue.

According to Treece, the plan that Sandberg shared not only moves the offices, but it also reduces the size of the visitor portion of the Harry S. Truman Visitor Center by building offices on the overlook level of that facility. He further said that they had looked at the option of using the other floor of the building, but that would require people to walk through the office space to get up to the overlook area. Treece admitted to the

crowd that it had been a while since she had been to the Visitor Center herself so she and her husband made the visit on Saturday. She said she wanted to see for herself if what she had been told could be true. In her opinion, taking away the floor that is the overlook area was not the only option. She shared several alternatives that she could see as being a viable option for housing the offices without having to take away the overlook floor. She expressed that she understands what he is saying about reducing costs by combining the offices with the outlook, but she does not see the need to lose the overlook in its entirety.

The crowd seemed to be split about the need for the USACE to make that move. Treece expressed there may need to be some compromise and shared the various ideas that came to

her while at the facility.

The most viable option she could see was to remodel the entrance so the information station at the entrance would he smaller and moved to the left. There would be a wall and door on the right side of the entrance which would be the entrance to the offices, and the USACE could build offices on the other side of the walls with a hallway that could lead to the overlook, if needed. That plan would leave the left side of the building, including the space where videos are shown and classes held. The area would need to be rearranged to house the current Visitor Center display items, and possibly downsized, but it would leave at least half of the overlook, including the ability to see Harry S. Truman Dam, for the visitors to enjoy.

Many in the crowd thought that was a good option, but there were also several who still didn't believe the offices needed to be moved at all. In some views, even if the USACE wants to consolidate the offices, they could build a building or add on to the Visitor Center to accomplish that goal without having to disrupt any of the visitor's experience.

Treece answered several

There were a few questions she would not answer because, as she said, she could only answer questions that she had personally discussed or had asked Mr. Sandberg herself. She was very clear that she did not want to guess at answers that she did not personally and absolutely hear from Mr. Sandberg.

There were some in the crowd who continued to say there was no need to consolidate and the USACE could fund the center and increase the hours to what were pre-COVID. thev However, most of the crowd expressed a willingness to compromise, but not to the extent of losing the overlook. Towards the conclusion

of the public meeting, Representative Mark Alford spoke.

had previously Alford made a statement saying that he had met with the top USACE's personnel, as well as someone who represented this district and was assured that there were no plans to close the facility and they intend to keep it open for fiscal year 2024 with the reduced hours that it is currently open. Alford stated that the Master Plan was expected to be released for comment in August and people would have an opportunity at that time to make statements.

After hearing what was said at the meeting and realizing what was told to him did not match what was told to Mrs. Treece, Alford shared his concern for the differing "stories" as well as the possibility of losing the overlook.

Alford acknowledged the well-deserved passion that the community shares and stated that this mission is also important to him. He pledged he would meet again with representatives from the USACE and get to the bottom of the situation. He went on to say that he wants to get "on" this and get answers and share ideas before the Master Plan is released next month.

The evening's meeting ended with people signing up to receive informational emails, as well as information on what they can do to volunteer and help Treece also said that she is creating a Facebook group dedicated to preserving the Visitor Center and it will share information as well.

(Continued from Page 1) his aircraft.

Born in Tampa, Florida in 1933, he lived with his parents at several locations in Tampa from birth until high school. May graduated high school in about May 1951 at Florida Military Academy in St. Petersburg, FL. He enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in June 1951. He was an aerial gunner in Korea on a B-26 light bomber and flew 50 missions in 1952 and 1953, while stationed at Pusan Air Base.

May commented, pilot, a WWII retread, said once that if I ever got a bad feeling during one of our missions, I should let him know. On one night mission, we had been flying along on one course for perhaps 10 minutes. I got that 'bad feeling' and told him so. He responded by flipping our left wing up as we left our course, and an anti-aircraft round exploded where our left wing would have been if we had maintained our previous course. Didn't happen again.".

May received Distinguished Flying Cross and a few other medals during that period. He was discharged from the Air Force at MacDill AFB, in Tampa on June 14, 1955, and was close enough to his residence to take a taxi home. He obtained about 2 years of college education at that last base through night studies.

May went on to say, "I transferred those credits to Florida Southern College, Lakeland, and graduated from that college about March 1957 with a major in Social Sciences and a minor in English. I moved to Boston, MA immediately thereafter and began working at National Shawmut Bank within a month or so, as a credit investigator. I left that employment in early 1959 and returned to Tampa, where I worked for a few months as a social worker.; Furthermore, he said, "I moved from Tampa to Panama City, FL, in late 1959, and married Audrey LeTourneur at year end. We had three children. The earliest was Hugh Douglas May, born in 1960 with a breathing problem. He lived only a few days. The second was Maren Louise May born April 3, 1961. The last was Kathryn Phyllis May, born December 10, 1965.

I was employed in Panama City as a management analyst for the Navy Mine Defense Laboratory from late 1959 to about 1962, when I began training for the U.S. Border Patrol as a law enforcement agent stationed in Harlingen, TX, serving for several years in that capacity until being promoted to a management position in its Washington, D.C. office for a year or so, until I discovered that once I had worked in law enforcement, I was thereafter unsuited for any honest work"

In approximately 1967, May returned to law enforcement as a Criminal Investigator with the U.S. Department of Agriculture in Kansas City, MO.

In early 1975, he was divorced by Audrey May, and on October 10 that year, married Sharon S. Kinsley. May was later transferred to another office in Denver, CO and lastly promoted to a one-person office in Des Moines, IA, from which he retired in June 1985.

(Continued from Page 1) include Left Coast, Picket Fences, or Planet Oregon. A stellar Red Blend if you are feeling adventurous is Petalos, a Spanish wine, that is a little heavier than a Pinot Noir but not quite as bold as a Cabernet Sauvignon.

On the lighter side, "People I Want To Punch in the Throat," by Jen Mann could be the laugh-out-loud release you've been waiting for. The humor is sharp and based on Mann's real life. Currently, there are three books in that series:

"People I Want To Punch in the Throat: Competitive Crafters, Drop-off Despots, and Other Suburban Scourges," 'Spending the Holidays With People I Want To Punch in the Throat: Yuletide Yahoos, Humblebraggers, Но-Но and Other Seasonal Scourges," and "Working With People I Want to Punch in the Throat." The last two offerings are not carried by the library but perhaps could be requested through interlibrary loan.

When reading humorous material, light-bodied wine like a Pinot Grigio can go a long way. A great French, affordable dry white wine, suitable for a LOL read, called La Chapelle du Bastion Picpoul is a crowdpleaser with book clubs

and with Pinot Grigio and Sauvignon Blanc drinkers. Also, the sparkling Cune, a Cava Brut, with hints of apple and good acidity is a terrific summer treat (and excellent for a mimosa).


If you are feeling a little nostalgic, "The Reading Promise: My Father and the Books We Shared" by Alice Ozma is a journey down memory lane. Her father reads books to her from childhood until she leaves for colllege and Ozma recounts the lessons learned along the way. The library carries this item as a downloadable audiobook. Get your favorite chillable red and enjoy a fan favorite. Las Jaras Glou Glou is a popular chillable red among wine-lovers.

Thinking of more of a challenge rather than an escape? Wanting to get deeper? Take a psychology plunge with anything by Brene' Brown, a researcher and professor, whose 2010 Ted Talk, on "The Power of Vulnerability," struck a chord with millions. Her latest book, "Atlas of the Heart," examines the 87 emotions and experiences that characterize us all. If you are going seriously heavy, such books call for a Cabernet Sauvignon. One inexpensive one to start out with is named the Introvert. 





What happens when we die? If I understand the Scriptures correctly, those who die in faith are with God. Our physical bodies die and return to dust, but the human soul lives on. The final judgment will involve the return of Christ from heaven and the resurrection of our physical bodies.

We don't know a lot about this intermediate state. Paul once reflected on his death, describing it as departing this earthly life to be with Christ. However, the Scriptures are clear. We do have souls that live on after bodily death. We cannot conceive of what their experience is like. We can put it like this: Life on Earth is good. Life in the intermediate state is far better, but the best is yet to come. Scripture teaches that a day will come when our physical bodies will be resurrected and united with our souls. Then will come the new heavens and earth we read about in the Book of Revelation.

While I cannot say anything

about the intermediate state beyond what is revealed in Scripture, it is enough for me to know that the redeemed are with the Lord and are far happier than they ever were on earth. They await that day when the final judgment and resurrection will occur when souls and resurrected bodies are joined forever. I get the impression from Scripture that the redeemed will ultimately live everlastingly on a new and renewed earth. The Book of Revelation is full of images of the glory

of that final state. I do know the redeemed are happier than they have ever been. We can all join them one day if we put our faith and trust in Jesus Christ, believing He is the Son of God who took the judgment we deserve at Calvary. Those who believe in God's Word in John 3:16, Ephesians 2:8,9, or Titus 3:5, etc., will learn firsthand what heaven is like.



OVEC Announces Return Of **Capital Credits** To Members



Osage Valley Electric Cooperative (OVEC) is continuing its long-standing practice of retiring capital credits to its members. The OVEC Board of Directors has elected to retire approximately \$1,000,000 in capital credits effective August 1, 2023.

OVEC is a not-for-profit member-owned utility that operates at cost. Revenues above the cost of doing business are allocated to the members annually in the form of capital credits. The board of directors vote to retire capital credits when the financial condition of the cooperative will not be impaired. The decision to retire capital credits again this year was made due to continued financial strength and sound management of the cooperative.

This year we are returning margins from the years 1996 and 2022. Your share is figured based on the amount of electricity you used during each of those years. Current members that are eligible will receive this refund as a credit on their August 1st bill. Former members who longer have service with the cooperative will receive their refund in the form of a check by mail. If you were not a member during any of these years, you will not receive a refund this year.




