Baby Food, Supplies Hit All Time High, Hurting Some Area Familie

According to www.nbc.25. com, data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics show the average consumer prices for items like baby formula, canned baby food, and diapers all increased in the past two years. But help is available to Benton County families who struggle with the ability to pay the high prices for their infant's needs.

Crossroads Family



INFLATION COMPLICATIONS have sent the cost of baby items sky high, causing some families to struggle with the basics. Benton County Health Department WIC Coordinator Bonnie Etter and WIC Certifier Ethel Keyte say they are working to help pregnant women and their babies with free formula and breast pumps.

Ministries Commercial Street Warsaw runs a pregnancy resource center for pregnant women and those with small children. The organization gives diapers when first asked, and formula if it is available. Crossroads also offers free classes to help with knowledge in various stages of pregnancy and parenting and helps with things needed for baby and beyond. Each class allows clients to accumulate credits through the Earn While You Learn Program which can then be used to acquire diapers and other baby and child supplies from the Crossroads' Thrift 4 Life

"Our classes are one on one and include subjects such as prenatal, labor and delivery, breastfeeding, child development, parenting, and bible studies," said

Paulsen said that Crossroads is pro-life and offers free pregnancy tests and pregnancy options counseling. It is open on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Call (660) 438-9140 or go to https://crossroadsprc.wordpress.com for more information.

Benton County Health Department WIC Coordinator Bonnie Etter reported that the cost of formula is indeed up and that breast feeding supplies are expensive. She said that a breast pump costs \$200 and more. However, a free breast pump is available to those on WIC from the Health Department, as well as infant formula. Clients are given EBT credit cards to use when purchasing pregnancy and infant needs.

"In August, we saw an increase by 28 new moms in the area, not including the ones we already serve," said Etter. "We work together with Crossroads to help pregnant women and their babies."

The Health Department is located at 1238 Commercial Street and can be reached at (660) 438-2876. It is open during weekdays from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM.

Basic for Families, located at 1651 Commercial Street, distributes clothing and diapers to local families who need them. They serve children from 0 to 18 years of age, and presently help about 170 children.

"We get donations from different organizations and are able to order what we need," said JoAnn Ruble, Executive Director of Basic for Families. "We get diapers from the Changing Table out of Osage Beach, and seldom run out. The Salvation Army sends a lot of our clients to us."

This organization is open from 10:00 AM. to 4:00 PM on Monday and Tuesday, and 10 AM to 2 P.M. on Wednesday. It can be reached by calling 660-223-1867.

The Salvation Army, HeadStart Program and Parents as Teachers are other organizations that interact with each other to help children in the county. Any of the above-described agencies should have access to a free resource guide for help in Benton County.

Ron Steuck, OVEC's Board President, addressed members and guests referencing his written report provided in the program. He then introduced Jarrod Campbell, CEO/General Manager, to present his report.

Mr. Campbell addressed the membership, reflecting on the highlights of the past year which included the Cooperative's efforts for an increased emphasis on the culture of safety, challenges faced by cooperatives regarding service reliability including an increase in demand for electricity, decreased electricity supply due to disorderly retirement and insufficient replacement of existing generation, permit delays preventing new electric infrastructure, supply chain challenges, and problems with natural gas availability. Mr. Campbell informed the members we would be working with our policy makers to ensure the national approach to energy remains focused on affordability and reliability. Mr. Campbell also updated the members on OVEC's broadband project being built in conjunction with Conexon Connect, noting his hope to complete the build by the 2nd quarter in 2024. In closing, Mr. Campbell thanked cooperative members for being present at the annual meeting and for supporting

the cooperative in their

work.

There being no new business to address, Mr. Steuck called for a motion to adjourn, wishing the crowd safe travels home.

After the Tigers got on the board first and took a 7-0 lead after their opening drive, Warsaw answered on a 1 yard touchdown run by Josh Harvath to tie the game at 7-7.

Later in the opening period, quarterback Garrett Ferguson scored on another 1 yard touchdown run for the 'Cats, the PAT failed, but Warsaw had their first lead at 13-7.

The Wildcats went up 21-7 midway through the second on another 1 yard scoring run, this time by Jayce Depriest. Ferguson tacked on the 2-pt try to give the 'Cats a two-score lead.

Versailles cut into that lead on their next possession after a 32 yard touchdown pass from Fletcher Bias to Reese Murdock landed him in the endzone to make it 21-14 after the successful

It didn't take Warsaw long to answer though when they marched down the field and scored on another Harvath run, this time from 6 yards out. The PAT failed again on another bad snap but the Wildcats went up 27-14.
