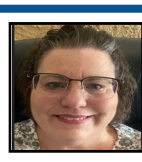

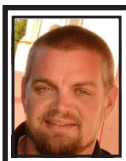

King include: Nate Banfield, Dylan Elmer and Zane Huffman.

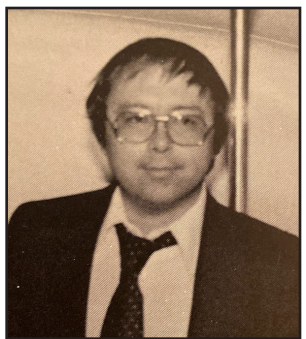
Crown bearers for the court will be Case Kreisel and Cady Larson.

Longtime, retired Warsaw educator, Bob "Coach" Campbell passed away on Saturday. He was 70 years old.

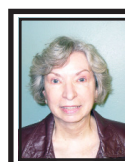


In his day, Campbell was an All-Conference and All-District point guard for his Wildcats basketball team.

City Of Lincoln To Consider A 'Tent City' Ordinance

In late session Monday eve, Mayor Glen Nelson introduced a proposed ordinance dealing with construction of a semi-long term "tent city" built by outside residents which, he indicated, would deal with a possible influx of persons who may be drug-addicted

refugees from larger cities. He said the City might do well to study its response to such a scenario. The group agreed to study the matter.

The meeting opened at 6:00 PM on September 11, with City Aldermen Jack Lietzke, Janice Sweargin, Phil Fisher, Barbara Hammond present. Mayor Nelson presided; Deputy City Clerk Kerrie Casey recorded.

First actions by the group were to approve the eve's agenda and minutes of its August meeting, then agree to pay bills presented.

Lauren Mote, a City resident, next spoke of a house on city property she

owns, saying it has sewer problems. The age of the house suggested to some that it could have a septic system, grandfathered in when the city constructed its centralized sewer system. Mayor Nelson advised that if the house has a septic system, the homeowner is responsible for repairs to that system.

Jim Bentsch, on the City's Airport Board, thanked City Board members who helped prepare the Municipal Airport before the recent fly-in. Mayor Nelson commented that the airport's grass strip is considered by some to be the best airport grass strip in Missouri, and the recent fly-in there likely was the best such event recently held.

Benton County Economic Development Director Jo Ann Lane reported that the Pink Silo Co. is now open with updated hours: Monday through Friday 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM, and Saturday 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM. The company is closed Sunday. She added that the County Entrepreneurial Conference pre-event will meet in Lincoln on September 19, and the conference itself will kick off on Wednesday, September 20, at 11:00 AM in Cole Camp. There was no old business.

Police Chief Jason Wenberg reported that

This year marked the 150th anniversary of the Cole Camp Municipal Band. It was the first time in 25 years that it had played at the fair and they provided a free Saturday evening of music.

Fair board member Earl Theisen said that the temperature was perfect for the fair, and everything went well. He said that most fairs only have one parade, but Cole Camp paraded three nights. He said that on Thursday, there were four high school bands in the parade and two bands on Friday and Saturday. The bands were from Smith-Cotton High School, and other high schools in Cole Camp, Smithton and Lincoln. Theisen said that the bands bring a lot of parents to see the town and the people, and they are likely to come back to visit later.

"The fair changes every year with different shows," said Theisen. "There are many ways for people to participate in contests such as providing produce, canning and photography. Everything is free unless you ride at the carnival or eat. There are a lot of fair burgers, and after three days of eating them people are usually looking for something different like pork chops. The fair is always a treat and we will have a board meeting in October to discuss the one taking place in 2024. There will be a mass meeting in November so people can come and make comments. We get a lot of information that we use for our themes from teachers who ask their students to tell or draw their favorite things at the fair."

Thursday was a big day for entries and judging, opening of exhibits, Super Teen Contest, start of carnival rides, presentation of National Colors, Welcome Address, Queen Coronation and the opening of the Jaycee Beer Garden from 8:00 PM to 1:00 AM.

New activities on Friday included the tractor show, adult games and children's contests, the Grand Parade of all floats and awarding of ribbons, and the Girls Next Door at the bandstand.

Saturday's new highlights included the 5K Run/2-Mile Walk, Coon Dog Show, Kiddie Parade, Baby Show, Children's Pedal Pull, Cow Chip Throwing Contest and the Teen Garden Dance from 8:00 PM to 11:00 PM.

role in the gym, Campbell spent many, many hours in gyms and on fields coaching junior high football, track, high school softball, little league baseball and summer softball.

Unofficially, Campbell is said to probably have coached and won more games in the Warsaw Lion's Club Basketball Tournament than any other coach. Oftentimes, Campbell coached multiple teams in basketball tournaments and ended up playing his own teams against one another.

Along with his wife, Anita, the Campbell's received the 2011 Academic Service Award and in 2018, "Coach" was inducted into the Warsaw Sports Hall of Fame for his contributions not only as a player, but also for his illustrious career as a physical education teacher and coach.

After his retirement, Campbell worked the family farms in Edwards, Frisroe and Warsaw.

Several former colleagues and/or students shared their thoughts of Coach Campbell...

Barry Edwards: "In any small community there are a handful of people that are integral to the life of that community. For Warsaw, Bob was one of those people. He was a larger than life character to the little students that he taught. He was full of energy and enthusiasm which was contagious. Having coached with Bob for several years, I saw his love of competition, his desire for kids to give their best and enjoy the challenge of becoming better. Literally hundreds of kids, parents and friends were touched by Bob's life."

Mike Schockmann: "I think Coach Campbell's greatest impact can be seen in the success of our student athletes starting in the late 1980's and continuing throughout the 1990's. Most of our athletic programs enjoyed a good bit of success during the time. That success is directly related to his leadership in the youth programs at the time and also how he structured his P.E. classes to teach sections on the sport that was in season. His influence went beyond

the athletic field as well; case in point would be my oldest daughter. When she had Coach Campbell as her P.E. instructor, she always wanted to dress up on the days she had it. She said that P.E. was special to her and that she wanted to treat it accordingly by looking nice. She also developed a love for the band Queen because Coach Campbell would play their songs during P.E. To this day, Queen songs are still in her playlist."

Loren Burke: "Bob had almost every boy and girl to come through Warsaw elementary schools for around 30 years. He touched a lot of lives. God bless you Bob Campbell!"

Josh Noland: "I am forever grateful that I got to play for Coach Campbell. For many of us, he was the first person, aside from family, who taught us about paying attention to the details, working hard and doing things the right way. He was intense even when we were young but when you succeeded, he loved experiencing that with the whole team. His genuine caring for his players is something I will always appreciate."

Eddie Carroll: "Coach Campbell left a positive influence on our girls while not only in school, but how he was seen within the community. In every way that he left his thumb print on this community was positive, dedicated and inspirational. He will be truly missed not only by his loving family, but all those countless people that had the opportunity to know 'Coach Campbell.'"

Billy Daleske: "There are few people who come to mind who did more for the youth of Warsaw than Coach Campbell. He was a dedicated educator and coach to so many over the years. What made him special is not only did he teach students the basics of physical education, he taught us to love our school and to take pride in our community. He loved Warsaw and he loved being a Wildcat."

David Fajen: "Selfless dedication and pride are words that I would use to describe Coach Campbell. Coach worked more hours than I can imagine to provide everyone an opportunity to participate in youth sports, often coaching North and South youth basketball teams

(that played against each other on occasion). Prior to his retirement, I don't recall ever seeing him in anything other than Wildcats green."

Jared Steenburg: "Bob Campbell's impact on Warsaw is truly immeasurable. He laid the foundational principles that still stand firm in our schools today: Tradition, Pride and Excellence. I don't have a single memory of Warsaw that Coach Campbell isn't embedded into. He was so much more than just a guy who taught physical education. He was like a second father to me, as he was to countless other Warsaw students."

Dwayne Davis: "Coach Campbell was the first coach I ever had. Among my classmates and friends he is a true legend. In today's times when youth sports programs sometimes struggle to find coaching and leadership, we were blessed to have a man like Coach Campbell. He was always there coaching, no matter the sport. His dedication and commitment to youth sports is something I'll forever be grateful for."

Mike Davenport: Coach Campbell instilled in his students and athletes the values of perseverance, teamwork, and sportsmanship. His profound impact extended far beyond victories on the field or court. He taught valuable life lessons and set an example of integrity that will forever echo in the hearts of those they coached. Coach Campbell was more than just an exceptional educator; he was a beacon of inspiration and support to all who had the privilege of knowing him. His spirit will live on through the lives he's touched. His widom resonates with us, and his legacy will continue to inspire generations to come.

Scott Gemes: "Coach Campbell has touched so

many lives over the years. His pride in the Warsaw School District showed through everything he did. Coach Campbell bled green and black. Personally, I enjoyed having Coach Campbell as my coach and PE teacher, but the best part was getting to work with him as a middle school football coach when I came back home the first time. Recently, I enjoyed conversations with him about his grandkids and the future of Warsaw School District. Coach Campbell loved his students and players. He did a great job building relationships with them. He is going to be missed!"

The Wildcats played hard for four quarters and left nothing on the field last Friday night but still succumbed to their first loss, 27-22 to Lafayette County, the number three ranked team in Class 2 in the state of Missouri.

In their first real test of the year, the Wildcats faced early adversity after giving the Huskers an early 7-0 lead with less than one minute elapsed off of the clock.

However, Warsaw responded with a 17 play drive that lasted over 9 minutes which ended in a 1 yard touchdown plunge by Josh Harvath. Logan Gemes came on to nail the PAT to tie the game at 7-7 at the end of the opening period.

Sparks flew in the second quarter when Lafayette County's Carter Wallpe scored on a 33 yard touchdown reception and quarterback Brock Page converted the 2 point conversion for a 15-7 lead. But Warsaw responded with another score of their own, this time a 1 yard touchdown scamper by 'Cats quarterback Garrett

Ferguson. The 2 point conversion failed and the home team held a 15-13 lead.

On the ensuing drive, the Wildcats caught a break when Harvath came up with an interception deep on the Lafayette County end of the field. Ferguson capped the drive with another 1 yard TD run, the snap was botched on the PAT but the Wildcats had their first lead of the game, 19-15.

But that didn't last long... In another quick scoring drive, Aron Vazquez broke a 28 yard touchdown run thru the heart of the Warsaw defense. Their point-after was no good, but the Huskers took a 21-19 lead into the locker room at the half.

The third quarter was fairly uneventful for both sides but a fumble recovery by

Gemes set up the Wildcats heading into the fourth, still trailing 21-19.

After driving the ball into the red zone of Lafayette County, the Wildcats trotted out Gemes, their sure-footed kicker who gives the Wildcats an extra weapon that many small schools cannot claim. From the 19 yard line of the Huskers, Brennen Slavens placed the snap at the 36 and Gemes split the uprights with plenty of distance to give Warsaw the slim 22-21 lead. The kick set a new school record, previously held by Thomas Hooiveld just 2 years ago who hit a 32 yard field goal at Eldorado Springs.

The Huskers put their final tally on the board on a 47 yard touchdown run on their next drive, the 2 point try failed but they reclaimed the lead at 27-22.

Warsaw had their chance late in the fourth after they converted on a 4th down with 17 to go on a nifty run by Ferguson. But the drive eventually stalled in Huskers territory after a failed pass attempt.

With 3:37 left in the game, the Huskers ran out the clock and escaped with a 27-22 win and handed Warsaw their first loss.

Depriest rushed for 100 yards on 11 carries to lead Warsaw.

Ferguson added 83 yards on 20 attempts and accounted for 2 touchdowns. He was also 8 for 16 passing for 91 yards.

Harvath finished with 60 yards on 12 carries with 1 touchdown. He was also on the receiving end of 2 passes for 29 yards.

Shane Poyser hauled in 2 catches for 39 yards.

Drake Murrell led the Warsaw defense with 5.5 tackles and Harvath finished with 5 of his own. Poyser added 4 tackles for the Green and Black.

The Wildcats (2-1) will look to get back in the win column this week when they host the Sherwood Marksmen (1-2) in another Ozark Highlands Conference matchup. That game is set for a 7:00 PM

kickoff at Randy Morrow Field on the WHS campus.

This week's game will also be part of Homecoming 2023. Coronation festivities for this year's royalty will be held at halftime of the game.

Injuries, Shortage Of Players Ends Lincoln Loss In Third Quarter

A lack of numbers has been a deep concern all season for Lincoln football. Friday, the fears became a reality. With 2:43 left to go in only the third quarter with Crest Ridge leading Lincoln 42-8 and Lincoln down to just 10 players, the contest came to an abrupt end.

It was a game full of injuries as Crest Ridge quarterback Daniel Doak lasted just two plays before being sidelined. Crest Ridge also sent an unnamed player to the hospital later in the hard hitting contest.

The Class 1 Lincoln Cardinals came out flat and Crest Ridge's Carlson Hurst scored at the 2:44 mark in the first quarter. The extra point kick failed.

Lincoln, rattled with bad snaps and poor punts, trailed 20-0 at the half.

Wesley Taylor, the new Cougars quarterback, just a sophomore, and Hurst ran wild over Lincoln's inexperienced front line. Ben Eckhoff had a good game for Lincoln on the line and Cam Everhart did a good job at linebacker but wasn't able to slow down Crest Ridge's offensive

attack. Cardinals quarterback Riley Sanders hit Dawson Parrott early in the second half about twenty yards deep and Parrott ran for paydirt for a 73 yard TD. Sanders then sidearmed a pass to Parrott for the PAT as it was 28-8.

Crest Ridge took over in the rest of the third as they led 42-8 in the shortened contest. With Sanders and running back Anthony Srader injured and a few strange calls, Cardinals head coach Brad Drehle had seen enough and called the game.

"We started the game with 14 eligible kids. At the time we ended it, we had 7 linemen and 4 skill kids available. One of the lineman had hurt his knee the play before and was trying to finish. His mother took him to ER after the game, so losing him put us at 10.

He added, "We were without (Riley) Sanders, (Anthony) Srader, and receiver Bradyn Benham after the hit. One of the lineman had been injured on a kickoff earlier. We had 10 healthy kids to put on the field."

Friday's game with Windsor at home is in doubt. Lincoln fell to 1-2.

If you own a small business or are self-employed, you've always got plenty to do, but you can't forget about the days when you'll be less busy — that is, when you're retired. How can you prepare for that time of your life?

One key step is establishing a retirement plan for your business or yourself. And thanks to the 2022 SECURE 2.0 Act, you can now receive tax credits for opening and administering a 401(k), SEP-IRA or SIMPLE IRA. These aren't the only plans available for small businesses or sole proprietors, but they are among the most popular. Let's look at each of them:

• **401(k)** – A 401(k) offers several key benefits: First, any earnings growth is tax deferred, and your contributions can be tax deductible. (Taxes are due upon withdrawal, and withdrawals prior to age 59½ may be subject to a 10% penalty.)

If you choose a Roth 401(k), your contributions aren't deductible, but your earnings and withdrawals will be tax free, provided you meet certain conditions. And a 401(k) offers a variety of investment options. If you have workers, you'll need to consider whether to offer matching contributions, which are tax deductible to you, up to the limit of 25% of compensation paid to eligible employees.

But even if you're self-employed, with no employees other than your spouse, you can establish what's known as a "solo"



or "owner-only" 401(k). In 2023, you can put in up to \$22,500 as an employee, plus a catch-up contribution of \$7,500 if you're 50 or older, for a total of \$30,000. Plus, you can contribute an additional 25% of earned income as an employer, up to an overall employee and employer maximum of \$66,000 (or \$73,500 if you're 50 or older).

• **SEP-IRA** – An SEP-IRA may be attractive to you if you're self-employed or if you own a business but have few or no employees. That's because you must contribute an equal percentage of your own compensation to every eligible employee. In 2023, you can contribute up to \$66,000 or 25% of your

income, whichever is less.

• **SIMPLE IRA** – A SIMPLE IRA is easy to establish and administer. As with an SEP-IRA, earnings in a SIMPLE IRA can grow on a tax-deferred basis. If you have employees, they aren't required to contribute to this plan — but you are. You must match up to 3% of employees' contributions or provide 2% of their annual salaries, although you do have some flexibility. If your business goes through a rough patch, you can temporarily decrease SIMPLE IRA contributions to 1% for up to two years out of the previous five. Your contributions to your employees' accounts are tax deductible, but in terms of

building resources for your own retirement, a SIMPLE IRA may be less appealing because of its contribution limits, which are relatively low compared to a 401(k) or SEP IRA. In 2023, you can put in up to \$15,500, or \$19,000 if you're 50 or older.

You should consult with your tax advisor to determine which retirement plan is right for you. Your financial advisor can also help you explore your options. And the sooner you put a plan to work, the better

Southwest Electric Cooperative (the "Cooperative") hereby gives public notice regarding the process to be followed by it in implementing the statutory directives in the 2021 Infrastructure

Investment and Jobs Act (2021 Infrastructure Bill), which amended the Public Utilities Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 (PURPA). The 2021 Infrastructure Bill established new Federal standards under Section 111(d) of PURPA, which certain nonregulated electric utilities (such as the Cooperative) are required to consider and to "make a determination whether it is appropriate to implement such standard[s]" within certain defined timelines based on evidence collected pursuant to a public notice and hearing.

The two new PURPA standards defined by the 2021 Infrastructure Bill which the Cooperative must consider are set forth below. *1. Demand - Response Practices.*

(A) In general Each electric utility shall promote the use of demand-response and demand flexibility practices by commercial, residential, and industrial consumers to reduce electricity consumption during periods of unusually high demand.

(B) Rate Recovery A nonregulated electric utility may establish rate mechanisms for the timely recovery of the costs of promoting demand-response and demand flexibility practices in accordance with subparagraph (A).

*2. Electric Vehicle Charging Programs.*

Each State shall consider measures to promote greater electrification of the transportation sector, including the establishment of rates that:

(A) promote affordable and equitable electric vehicle charging options for residential, commercial, and public electric vehicle charging infrastructure;

(B) improve the customer experience associated with electric vehicle charging, including by reducing charging times for light-, medium-, and heavy-duty vehicles;

(C) accelerate third-party investment in electric vehicle charging for light-, medium-, and heavy-duty vehicles; and

(D) appropriately recover the marginal costs of delivering electricity to electric vehicles and electric vehicle charging infrastructure.

In order for the Cooperative to fully consider the views of the Eligible Participants regarding the standards so that it may determine whether it is appropriate to implement such standards, the Cooperative will follow the procedural schedule set forth below (each component of which is more fully addressed in the ensuing portion of this Notice):

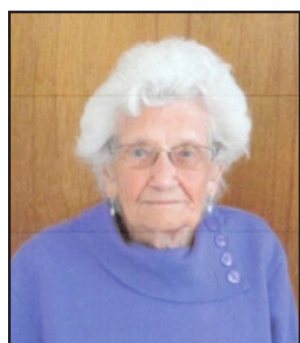

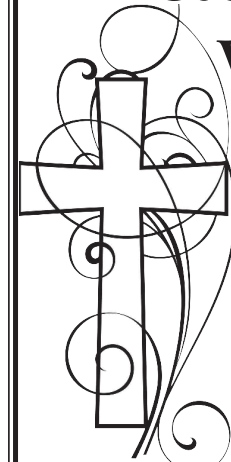
