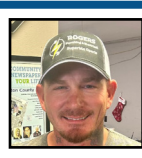

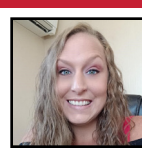

Local Company Soars To Success With Unique Niche

In 2013, Brent Bell started the Climalock business at 34405 Hwy PP, Warsaw, near South School with 3 employees; himself, Fawn Fajen and Dwayne Townley. There are now 36 employees, and their sales continue to grow. They are tank insulation developers and installers that service agriculture, bioenergy, fire and industrial industries throughout the U.S. and Canada.

"Before we started the new business, my brother Brian Bell owned a tank manufacturing business, and we used a contractor who insulated the tanks," said Brent Bell. "But the contractor couldn't keep up with our demand, so I learned the skills and enjoyed doing it, plus there was a need for the service. In November 2021, we sold our company to an investment group called Crown Capital which has given us more flexibility to continue to grow and a better platform for employees."

Bell said that the biggest market they serve is for bio energy. He said it involves such things as storing food waste. The company just insulated bio tanks in Iowa that contained 35 million gallons of manure, so it

doesn't freeze in the winter. Another high priority is fire protection, and Climalock was recently hired to insulate a sprinkler system tank at a Walmart store.

"We do a lot of projects," said Bell. "We did some insulation for condensation in Fort Worth, Texas, at Lockheed Martin where F-35 fighter jets are built and were also on the east coast insulating fire protection tanks at a facility. We are involved with the military as they work on

using battery power on bases, and we partner with Paul Mueller in Springfield where his company makes dairy tanks, shipping the products all over the world, including Japan."

Bell explained that crews working on insulation projects have their own crew trucks with tools. When arriving at the work site, man lifts are rented to take installers anywhere from four to 90 feet off the ground to service tanks that hold from 2,000 to five

million gallons of product.

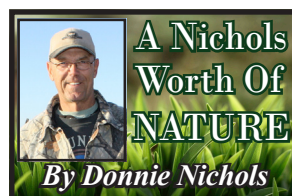
Climalock is exploring into the Canadian market and has lately installed a bolted steel water tank in Shageluk, Alaska for toilets. It is a native Alaskan village with 12 square miles of land and water. Bell said that when he and his crew landed, they had to go by boat to the village. It is just part of some of the interesting stuff they get into.

"When we were in Alaska, up on man lifts, we couldn't get down because there were

three grizzly bears eating out of trash cans below us," said Bell.

He said that the investment group that owns the business has around a dozen other businesses in the group and Climalock partners with some of them. He said the investment group ownership allows them more leadership and more capital as well as the previously stated opportunity for growth.

My neighbor, Flo Dwyer, called me one day last week. She told me she has been seeing a lot of walkingsticks and wondered if that was unusual. Walkingsticks (also called devil's darning needles) are members of the order Phasmattodea of insects from the Latin plasma, meaning apparition. They are masters of disguise. Four species live in Missouri. The most common species is the northern walkingstick. Males are brown and females are greenish brown or green and grow up to 3 3/4 inches long and have long and slender antennae.



The second most common is the giant walkingstick and is the largest insect in North America with females up to seven inches long. The females middle and hind legs have spines; males have a single large spine on each leg.

They don't bite or sting. Their main defense mechanism is their camouflage and body shape resembling a stick.

They spend most of their adult life in trees **NICHOLS Page 3**

Retirees Take The Wheel To Help School Buses Roll

School has been in session for several weeks, however, county superintendents are

still looking for qualified bus drivers and substitute drivers to get the children to school.

"We are still accepting applications for bus drivers," said Warsaw R-9 Superintendent Scott Gemes. "We still have

a need for one full time driver and of course we are always looking for substitute drivers."

According to Gemes, a school bus driver must have a CDL as well as bus endorsement and passenger endorsement. A driver must go through 20 hours of training which is paid for by the school district.

Warsaw bus drivers start out making \$25.70 per hour, three hours day for most routes. Substitute bus driver pay is \$40 per route and trips are \$15 per hour. Drivers have a full benefit package which includes health insurance.

Warsaw driver J. D. Findley has driven for Warsaw for 45 years. "I just keep on going," said Findley. "I love the kids."

In Missouri, all school bus drivers must be a minimum age of twenty-one. All **BUSES Page 3**

(Continued from Page 1) school bus drivers must receive an annual physical examination and a driver who is over 70 years of age must renew their driver's license annually and are required to submit proof of a school bus skills test to retain the "S" endorsement on their driver license at the time of renewal.

All school bus drivers must receive eight hours of documented training on an annual basis and all school bus drivers must participate in a drug and alcohol testing program.

Other Employees Who Transport in Non-School Buses— (Vehicles which have an occupancy rating of 10 or less)

All other school employees who are required to transport students as part of their employment on a routine basis must possess a Class E license with the "S" endorsement.

Non-School Bus Drivers— These drivers must receive eight hours of documented training on an annual basis.

These drivers must receive an annual physical examination by anyone licensed in Missouri to perform physical examinations.

This does not apply to school district staff that transport students on an emergency or incidental basis. Incidental is interpreted as transporting students in an unexpected one time per year basis.

Any driver who possesses an out of state license can only transport students if their state will issue a Class E license with an "S" endorsement.

At Lincoln, Superintendent Kevin Smith said that all bus driving positions were full.

"All our full time positions are filled and we also have a full time substitute driver lined up when we need him," said Smith.

Bus driver pay at Lincoln is \$17.67 an hour for four hours a day. Pay for trip driver is \$13 per hour and bus drivers have a full benefit package including health insurance.

Cole Camp Superintendent Christina Hess said that the Cole Camp district was fully staffed with bus drivers but that she was always taking applications for substitute drivers.

Cole Camp has eight full time drivers as well as a transportation director who also drives. Pay for Cole Camp bus drivers is \$77 a day for four hours as well as health insurance for drivers.

So slow down when you see that big yellow school bus and observe the rules for stopping and watching

for children.

(Continued from Page 2) everyone to take an hour or so out of this safety week to double and triple-check their child's car seat or booster seat. Ensuring that it is the right seat for your child's age and size and that it's installed correctly will make a major difference in the event of a crash.

"We hope that Child Passenger Safety Week will provide an opportunity for parents and caregivers to take a little time to

ensure their child is as safe as possible when in a car, truck, or SUV," said Regional Administrator Susan DeCourcy. "Sadly, two children under 13 were killed every day in 2021 while riding in vehicles, and more than 100,000 were injured. Every parent wants to be sure that their child is as safe as possible in a vehicle, so we hope they take this opportunity to check their car seat to ensure it's still the appropriate size for their child and that it's properly installed."



Motor vehicle crashes are a leading killer of children, and the latest research from NHTSA shows that nearly half (46%) of car seats are misused. Using seats that are appropriate for the age and size of children and installing them correctly are the best ways to reduce these deaths. "Thirty-six percent of children 12 and younger who died in crashes in 2021 were unbuckled. Many of those kids could have survived if they were properly secured," said DeCourcy.

Car Seats Versus Booster Seats

There is also a deadly misconception that a certain type of vehicle may offer greater protection for your child. Children are safest when correctly secured in the right car seat or booster seat for their age and size, regardless of the vehicle type. No matter how safe you think your vehicle may be, it is never safe, nor legal, to let your child ride unbuckled.

NHTSA recommends keeping children rear-facing as long as possible, up to the top height and weight allowed by the seat model. It's the best way to keep them safe. Once a child outgrows the rear-facing car seat, he or she is ready to travel in a forward-facing car seat with a harness and tether. After outgrowing the forward-facing car seat, a child should be placed in a booster seat until tall enough to fit in a seat belt properly.

Booster seats are an essential step between car

seats and seat belts. These transitional seats position the seat belt so that it fits properly over the stronger parts of your child's body. Don't feel pressured to put your child in a seat belt too soon. If your child is ready to use a seat belt, ensure the seat belt fits correctly. Bottom line: The safest place for all kids under 13 is in the back seat.

(Continued from Page 1) or shrubs feeding on leaves of deciduous oak, locusts, walnut, cherry or hazelnut trees resulting in what horticulturists call "pinching back" foliage which encourages new leaves and buds to sprout. They are mostly nocturnal, feeding at night and resting during the day.

We rarely notice walkingsticks until late summer or fall when they descend from the canopies and higher limbs to mate and lay eggs. We see them when they venture onto a building or sidewalk. Virtually all walkingsticks we see are females. It's estimated that only one in 1000 are males. They are parthenogenetic, meaning they are capable of asexual reproduction. Female walkingsticks can reproduce even without a male partner although all their offspring will be female. If a male does fertilize the eggs, the resulting prodigy have a 50% chance of being male.

Depending on the species, eggs are either laid on the ground or a host plant where they overwinter. Adults die when it freezes. Eggs hatch in the spring and the young

climb into trees. Like most other insect species, they molt through a number of immature stages before a final molt from which they emerge as sexually mature adults.

Some small mammals will feed on walkingsticks but their biggest predator are birds.

Wildcats Escape Homecoming Week With Win Over Sherwood

A win is a win, no matter how pretty or ugly, they say . . . And the Wildcats were happy to escape with the latter on Friday night when they came out on top of a 26-14 final over Sherwood, putting the cap on a long Homecoming week.

"We'll take it," Warsaw head coach Ryan Boyer said. "We're 3-1 now and 2-0 in the conference. And we always like to break the season into thirds. Right now, we're 1-0 in the middle third of our season and we're happy with where we're at."

The points were at a premium in this one and nearly every yard gained for the 'Cats came on the ground.

Warsaw's first score came midway through the opening period when quarterback Garrett Ferguson scored on a 1 yard touchdown run to give the home team an early 6-0 lead after a botched snap resulted in a failed 2 point conversion attempt.

Things were quiet for the rest of the first and the Wildcats hit paydirt again early in the second on a 3 yard TD run by Jayce Depriest. The 2 point conversion was no good once again, but Warsaw took a 12-0 lead.

The defense of the Green and Black played tight and showed little vulnerability throughout the first half, blanking the Marksmen for a 12-0 halftime lead.

After the elongated half to crown royalty for this

year's Homecoming court, the Wildcats got back to business in the third.

After receiving the second half kickoff, the 'Cats were pinned deep in their own territory. A penalty retracted them to their own 2 yard line and things were looking bleak for the opening possession of the half.

However, on 2nd down with 10 yards to go, Ferguson handed the ball to Depriest, just trying to gain some breathing room. But Depriest had other ideas when he hit the corner, followed a couple good lead blocks, found open space and raced 98 yard down the home sideline for another Warsaw touchdown. Logan Gemes came on to nail the point after touchdown to make the score 19-0.

Depriest's run tied him in the MSHSAA record books for the second longest run from scrimmage in state history.

The stingy defense of the Wildcats forced a turnover on Sherwood's ensuing possession and the offense took over again after a jarring hit by Drake Murrell and a Sonny Garrett fumble recovery.

Ferguson put the 'Cats on the board again on a 6 yard touchdown and Gemes came on again to split the uprights on the PAT to make the score 26-0 at the end of the third.

The Marksmen broke the plane early in the fourth on a 3 yard touchdown run by Garhett Cardwell and Cardwell scored again late in the game on a 2 yard run for the 26-14 final.

Murrell secured the victory

late in the game with an interception for the Wildcats defense.

Depriest finished with 150 yards on 9 carries with 2 touchdowns.

Ferguson gained 69 yards on 17 rush attempts and also found the endzone twice.

Murrell was all over the field and led the Warsaw defense with 10 tackles. He also had a forced fumble and the interception while also recording 2 pass breakups.

Josh Harvath recorded 7 tackles and Garrett followed closely behind with 6.5. He also had a fumble recovery for the Wildcats. Riley Taylor had 6 tackles.

Gemes was a perfect 2 for 2 on PAT's for the night.

Warsaw improved to 3-1 on the season and 2-0 in the Ozark Highlands Conference.

A living trust can hold a person's financial assets and other property while the trustee manages the money and makes investment and spending decisions. A living trust can be complex, so before establishing one, you'll need to consult with your

legal and tax professionals.

When you're dealing with the financial issues associated with your loved one's Alzheimer's or dementia, it can feel like you're on a long road. But diligently seeking out the appropriate financial moves can help make the journey less stressful — for everyone involved.

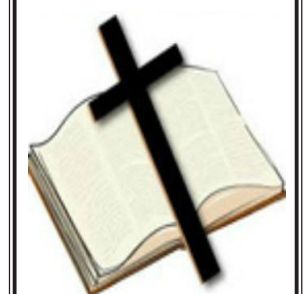
