"A Rising Tide Lifts All Boats" CEC **Conference A BIG Win For Benton County**

Connecting Entrepreneurial Communities (CEC) conference was held September 20-21 in Benton Sessions were held in Cole Camp, Lincoln and Warsaw with speakers providing several days of learning about rural innovations for leaders with an eye on business growth.

"This conference was designed for people who decide where resources go," said Annette Kendall, assistant extension professor of business and innovation in the University of Missouri Division of Applied Social Sciences. "Those in government, banking, education, libraries who can provide services to entrepreneurs who want to do something differently."

The event was presented by MU Extension with Benton County Economic Development and Benton County Tourism and Recreation.

"Our communities are so beautiful; all three of them are different and unique," said Jo Ann Lane, director of Benton County Economic Development. "Cole Camp has German heritage, and most of their downtown is on the national historic registry. Lincoln is smaller, but we have a great event planned for Lincoln.

"Rural people tend to stick around," she continued. "They step up and take care of things in rural communities. They're a great source of stability, the foundation of the rural social structure. They volunteer and help each other out.

distributing the processed, ground venison to clients in November.

Missouri's deer season opened with archery hunting on September 15, and will close with the second archery portion on January 15. Since 1992, the Conservation Federation of Missouri and Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) have administered the Share the Harvest program. MDC and The WARM House in Warsaw partner to try and cover the cost of processing, and Jackman Meat Processing does all the work. If there is an excess of venison in The WARM House freezers, its volunteers take some to the Benton County Food Pantry for further distribution and to the Senior Center to be offered as a meal choice.

(Continued from Page 1) passed from generation to generation, and increasing entrepreneurship helps bring kids back to agriculture and ag businesses.

"There's no formula revitalizing rural communities, but it starts with the efforts of local people – people with a vision," said Kendall. "Rural people are the most innovative. They just get on and do things, new ways of doing things that better peoples' lives."

On Saturday there was a break out session held at the Yellow Deli in Warsaw with the speakers including Benton County Presiding Commissioner Steve Daleske, Warsaw Mayor Eddie Simons, Lincoln Mayor Glenn Nelson and Cole Camp Mayor Robert Meuschke. Breshears was the moderator of the session. Presiding Commissioner Daleske spoke about the advantages of living in Benton County. He pointed out that many people retire to Benton County because of the largest lake in the state, Truman Lake, as well as the beauty of the area with opportunities for farming, hunting and fishing.

"During the summer the population of Benton County swells with people coming here because it is a very unique place," said Daleske. "We offer a great deal of opportunities for people and they are discovering the advantages of rural living."

Warsaw Mayor Eddie Simons agreed. "We have all kinds of sports such as kayaking, fishing, boating, hunting and fishing," said Simons. "Warsaw recently received a \$25 million grant to improve the infrastructure and soon we will be able to change the streets and sidewalks of Warsaw to accommodate the growth to the city."

Lincoln Mayor Glenn Nelson reported that many people who work in Sedalia prefer to live in Lincoln and that there is a need for housing in Lincoln.

"We need additional housing in Benton County," said Nelson. "There are no rentals available in Benton County and people are requesting housing every day."

Cole Camp Mayor Meuschke said that Cole Camp has a very active Chamber of Commerce and that they are on the verge of getting COMO internet service to Cole Camp which in turn will encourage people to move to Cole Camp.

"People want to live in small towns but they need to be able to work remotely so fast internet is necessary," said Meuschke.

Lincoln Mayor Nelson spoke about how the Lincoln community had been working to clean up their city.

"Lincoln was looking rather shabby and the community came together to clean up and attract new businesses," said Nelson. "We have a long way to go but Lincoln is definitely looking better and we now

have a grocery store which whole carcass (minus the we had been lacking for several years."

Warsaw Mayor Simons agreed with Nelson on the need to keep the city looking good. "We have to keep people from trashing up property and continue to inspect buildings to make sure they are structurally sound," said Simons.

Presiding Commissioner Daleske pointed out that it takes time to make things better. "People in Benton County aren't always receptive to change," said Daleske. "They don't want the government telling them what to do, but we have to work together to make improvements."

Cole Camp Mayor Meuschke agreed with Daleske. "I am not originally from Cole Camp and it is sometimes difficult for people to accept change, but while we want to retain our traditions, we have to attract people to this area if we want to remain a vital community."

All three county mayors spoke about the need to improve the water and sewer systems in their respective cities.

"That may mean an increase in rates to install improvements," Simons.

At the closing session of the CEC Conference Senator Sandy Crawford and Representative Roger Reedy presented resolutions to the oldest businesses in each of the three Benton County cities: MFA Producer's Exchange in Lincoln; Farmers Insurance in Cole Camp and the Benton County Enterprise in Warsaw.

The CEC Conference will be held in Fulton in 2024.

(Continued from Page 1) get a choice of venison or hamburger," said The WARM House Board Secretary Rosie Wall. "There is usually more deer meat available than hamburger, so clients get more servings if they choose venison. For those who think they might not like the with spagnetti sauce or use it to make sloppy joes so it is hard to detect a difference

from hamburger." Wall said that The WARM House freezers are usually filled two times during deer season, and the state requires that the donated venison be distributed before May 1, motivating volunteers to pass out as much as possible in March and April. The May 1 deadline does not affect the Senior Center, so venison may be a menu option for a longer time. Wall said that less venison was donated last year than in previous years, but she hopes the amount will be back to normal this year.

Jackman's is the only approved Benton County Share the Harvest deer processor. The county is not in the chronic wasting disease zone where deer must be tested. Hunters who donate a portion of their venison must pay processing fees, but if they donate a

In a back-and-forth battle on Saturday morning, the Wildcats let one get away from them when Hogan Prep Academy scored with under one minute left in the game to narrowly nip Warsaw sending them on a long bus trip home with a 22-21 loss.

The Wildcats led 7-0 after a 7 yard touchdown run by Jayce Depriest and a Logan Gemes PAT with three minutes remaining in the first frame.

Hogan bounced back quick though when Dacian Mulderew broke loose on an 86 yard touchdown run less than thirty seconds later. The Rams 2 point try was no good and the Wildcats held a slim 7-6 lead.


The week off came as Slater went to eight man and Lincoln, in a rebuilding season, chose not to add anvone. Head Coach Brad Drehle

You might have access to a Health Savings Account (HSA) or a Flexible Spending Account (FSA), so let's look at both.

An HSA is a personal savings account used to pay health care costs. If you're enrolled in a highdeductible health plan, you also may be eligible to contribute to an HSA. You aren't taxed on the money you put into this account or on the earnings generated from your contributions, as long as withdrawals are used for qualified health care costs such as deductibles, copayments coinsurance. there's no "use it or lose it" provision with HSAs - the money stays in your account until you use it. In fact, you can carry your HSA with you all the way until retirement, when you can use the money to pay for qualified expenses that Medicare or Medicare Supplement Insurance (Medigap) doesn't cover. In 2023, you can contribute up to \$3,850 to an HSA, or \$4,850 if you're 55 or older; for family coverage, you

can put in up to \$7,750. It's important to keep in mind that your HSA's tax benefits only apply when your withdrawals are used for qualified heath care costs. If you use the money for non-qualified expenses, it is considered taxable income, and you may also face a penalty of 20% on the amount withdrawn. However, once you turn 65, you can use your HSA funds for any purpose without a penalty, though the withdrawals will still

count as taxable income. Now, let's turn to the Flexible Savings Account. An FSA may be available to you if you get health insurance through your employer. And because you fund your FSA with pretax dollars, your contributions can reduce your taxable



income. (In 2023, you can contribute up to \$3,050 to an FSA.) Your employer may also choose to contribute to your FSA. Once your account is funded and active, you submit claims with proof of your medical expenses, along a statement that these expenses aren't covered by your plan, and you can be reimbursed for your costs. It's helpful to have a good estimate of your yearly medical expenses for a Flexible Savings Account.

That's because an FSA generally needs to be spent before the end of the plan year — if you don't use all the money, you can only carry over some of it and any remaining balance is forfeited. (You can carry over up to \$610 from 2023 into 2024.)

You can't contribute to an HSA and a traditional FSA in the same year. But if you have an HSA, you might be able to use what's known as a Limited Purpose Flexible Spending Account (LPFSA) for dental and vision expenses. You'll need to check with your plan to see if this option is available.

MDC Asks Turkey Hunters For Input On Possible Changes To Hunting Regulations



Possible changes include all-day spring hunting and reduced harvest limits for fall seasons. Comment online by Oct. 6.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) is seeking input from turkey hunters on possible changes to spring and fall wild turkey hunting seasons, including all-day spring hunting and reduced harvest limits for fall seasons.

"In the nearly 20 years since the last significant regulations change for turkey hunting, much has changed for both hunters and wild turkeys," explained MDC Wild Turkey Biologist "Turkey Nick Oakley. populations across the country and in Missouri have declined, predictably, after a post-restoration boom. Turkey hunting participation, over time, has also declined."

According to Missouri's spring turkey hunting season, specifically the start date, was designed to take place after the peak in turkey breeding had occurred. Additionally, MDC research indicates that the current season structure, combined with the reproductive ecology of turkeys, has resulted in relatively low harvest rates on juvenile and adult gobblers over the years.

"This means that a small increase in the total number of the males harvested each spring would be sustainable," explained "Extending Oakley. shooting hours during the spring season may expand the opportunity for individuals to take up turkey hunting or offer more time for others to return to the field while maintaining a healthy turkey population." Oakley added that MDC is considering changes fall turkey hunting regulations that aim to balance the wellbeing of the turkey population while trying to maximize hunting opportunities.

"Considering the increase in stakeholder concern over hen harvest in the fall, we are considering several possibilities that may reduce hen harvest while maintaining as much of the fall hunting tradition as possible," he said. "Information gathered during this input period will be used by MDC as we consider ways to reverse declining hunter participation."

MDC encourages turkey hunters to go online to mdc. mo.gov/turkey-regs for more information on potential regulation changes and to provide comment. The comment period closes Oct. 6. The webpage also has information on the history and structure of Missouri turkey hunting and possible effects of regulation changes on turkey numbers and hunter opportunities.



An interesting passage about the angels is found in Hebrews 1:14: "Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?" This is where the idea of each of us having a guardian angel comes from. I like to think there is a big, ol' angel looking after me! We know that God watches over the redeemed, and perhaps one of the means He uses is the angels. Most of this angelic aid is done secretly behind the scenes, unknown to us.

Matthew John (Jesus' cousin) has followers not unlike Jesus' disciples, and they ask Jesus why they and the Pharisees fast, but Jesus' disciples do not? Fasting was often associated with mourning and seeking the face of God, where one would spend the time typically preparing and eating food, focusing on God's desire for them. Fasts were short, often 24 hours or less, then one would eat as a sign that God had revealed Himself. Jesus responds saying, "How can the guests of the bridegroom mourn while He is with them? Why would they fast when they are with Me"? Sometimes denying ourselves is recognizing we do not have the capacity to forgive our sins. Some let their denial get in the way of spending time with Jesus. If the purpose of fasting is to seek the face of God, why then are we not seeking the face of God? There is nothing wrong with denial if we are focusing on God.

That same Jesus lives inside everyone who has put their faith and trust in Him. We've been taught the Messiah is coming and Jesus says, "I'm here, now. I'm standing right here"! When He comes into our hearts, if we try to make Him fit in to what has always worked, we miss out on what Jesus is doing. Every one of us has traditions, then suddenly when He comes into our hearts, we keep trying to put Him somewhere where there is no room. Traditions are not bad, Jesus tells us, but sometimes we get so confined and anything else makes us uncomfortable. Sometimes change can
