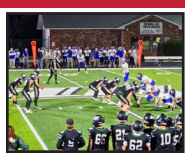
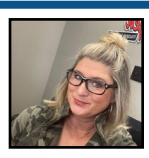

## Warsaw's Hottest Club: Legion Is Refuge For Vets & Civic Booster

American Legion Post 217 (AML) at 32739 Hwy MM is growing and improving its services to veterans and the community. Its members and volunteers take care of local veterans and spouses as well as those in the Missouri Veterans Home in Warrensburg. It sends care packages to active-duty personnel who cannot be home for Christmas at Whiteman Air Force Base and those deployed overseas. It also arranges many activities, benefits and entertaining events for the public.

Some of the major local AML programs for vets include an active Service Officer, Veteran Relief Fund and Honor Guard. The Service Officer helps vets and eligible spouses attain benefits which they might not have known were available to them. The services may include putting people with disabilities together with the Veteran's Association for monetary benefits, college training or medical assistance. The Service Officer is available on Tuesday mornings until noon and is available for appointments.

The Veteran Relief Fund is supported by charitable donations only and provides one-time emergency relief

for vets and their families. This could be in the form of propane gas, help with insurance or mortgage payments. It also helps widows or widowers whose indemnity may take a while to get started.

"We have bought power scooters, hospital beds and other medical equipment," said Post 217 Commander Barry White. "We recycle equipment and fix it up. A vet doesn't have to be an AML member to get this help. Once someone comes

in, we set them up with the Service Officer for more long-term help."

CDR White said that the post's Honor Guard is a big service ensuring that vets receive military honors when passing. He said that it is also a way to be in touch with dependents so AML can try and help them. The Honor Guard recently bought new uniforms and they train two or three times a month. He said they look and perform like an active-duty unit.

The AML Auxiliary President, Jessi Kendall, said that this group is very busy and has many large groups at meetings. She said the Auxiliary is mainly composed of women, but is also open to men who are spouses of vets.

"We have built up in recent years," said Kendall. "We support legionnaires and vets. We take candy to Warrensburg, hygiene and clothing supplies to school children, and send Christmas gifts overseas to military

personnel. We sent 215 packages overseas last year. We spearhead a lot of the functions that go on at the post. Funds from the sale of poppies and donations all go back to vets."

Kendall added, "We had Halloween Hoopla last month and Wreathing of Waters will take place at 11:00 AM on November 11 at Drake Harbor. Afterwards, there will be a social with soup and chili at the AML. Our big thing is **LEGION Page 3**

**A Nichols Worth Of NATURE**

Black bears were once abundant in Missouri. Many county histories contain notes and reports of the remarkable number of bears in all areas of the state. Bear was a staple item for early settlers. They used it for food as well as the fat and skins. Bears were more widely killed by pioneers than any other larger mammal in Missouri other than deer.

Henry Rowe Schoolcraft's notes of his travels in the Missouri Ozarks during 1818-19 has many accounts of settlers dependence on bear meat and fat and income from hides, illustrating the abundance of bears in Missouri. However, by the 1830s and 1840s, bears were rare in north Missouri and by 1894 were reported to be almost extinct

Brenda Mosley, also in the Auxiliary, oversees the kitchen. She said her duties include buying all supplies, separating bills, getting volunteers together, organizing celebrations of life for vets and candy buying.

In addition to Wreathing of the Waters on November 11, Post 217 has planned a first-time breakfast with Santa and Mrs. Clause on Saturday, November 25. It will take place from 8:30 AM until 10:30 AM. Children 12 and younger will have a free pancake breakfast, but anyone 13 years of age and older will pay a small fee. There will be free pictures with Santa.

The 20th Annual Toy Run, sponsored by the Sons of the American Legion, will take place at 5:00 PM on December 1, at the post. It is open to the public and admission will be a new toy or free-will donation. Last year, donations topped \$10,000 for underprivileged children.

(Continued from Page 1) in the Ozarks. Schwartz (1920) reported bears were still present in southeast Missouri and "occasionally seen in the bootheel until the flood of 1927." One of the last verified records of a wild bear killed in Missouri was 1931.

There were rumors of bear sightings in the Ozarks in the 1940s and two incidents of bears killed in Dent County in the 1950s.

In 1959, the Arkansas

Game and Fish Commission (whose bear population was also depleted) quietly initiated a black bear restoration program. Between 1959-1967, 254 black bears captured in Minnesota and Manitoba, Canada were released in the Ozark and Ouachita Mountains of Arkansas. The program was so successful that black bears became a legal game animal and have had a conservation fall season annually since 1980. As the Arkansas bear population increased, bears seeking new territories traveled into Missouri.

The Missouri Department of Conservation collaborated with the Carnivore Ecology Laboratory at Mississippi State University and the University of Missouri to form a Missouri black bear project which began in 2010. It began with an initial population research to measure reproduction and survival rates of females in Missouri. Other objections included measuring black bear habitat use and bear movements and patterns; also identify suitable but unoccupied bear habitat and to delineate travel corridors. Since 2010, MDC has radio collared over 100 bears and also using hair snares have collected hundreds of hair samples. Through DNA genotyping, individual bears can be identified and their lineage traced. This testing revealed that a true remnant native population considered extinct in Missouri since the 1940s was found to still exist.

Over the years, researchers have been able to monitor and assess cub production, cub sex ratios and cub survival, habitat use, movements and breeding range. A female's home range covers about a thirty mile radius. A male's territory may cover hundreds of miles. Dominant older males push young males out of their home range forcing them

to establish new territories (lateral dispersal). Feeding patterns are also monitored. Bears are omnivores but 80-85% of their diet comes from plant material.

Today, Missouri's bear population is approximately 1,000 with about a 9% increase each year.

This year, Missouri's third bear season ran from October 16-25 and was open only to Missouri residents. More than 5,370 hunters applied during May for 400 permits with a maximum total harvest being 40 bears. Of the 400 selected through a random drawing of all applicants, 342 purchased tags for the season.

There are three bear management zones all south of the Missouri River. Each zone has an allotted number of hunters and strict quotas of numbers of bears harvested: Zone 1: There were 9 bears harvested out of a maximum of 20 bears allowed with 173 hunters purchasing permits for that zone, Zone 2: there were 3 bears harvested out of a maximum of 15 allowed and 125 hunters purchasing permits, Zone 3: (the zone in which Benton County is included ) No bears harvested with a maximum of five allowed and 44 hunters purchasing permits. Hunters had to call each morning before hunting to see if the quota for that zone had been filled. If a harvest quota is reached in a zone, the season closes in that zone. All twelve bears, three boars and nine sows, were harvested using firearms.

Coskey and Doug Hedrick were absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided; City Clerk Jessica Kendall recorded.

First actions by the group were to approve its October 4 council meeting minutes, and agree to pay October 3 - November 2 bills presented.

The group also approved two ordinances: (1) leasing the former Cintas building to the Stanbury Uniform Co. at \$1.00/yr., per an earlier agreement in which Cintas gave the building to the city in return for the city leasing the building to future occupants in that fashion, and (2) executing a supplemental agreement for a #1 Municipal Airport apron expansion northward. The city will spend about \$21,000 to do so, 10 percent of which will be from city funds and the balance will be from a grant. The group also approved a resolution for a small increase in 2024 funding to People Service Co., deemed "standard," by City Administrator Randy Pogue. Pogue also provided updates on a RAISE project to construct a roundabout intersection at the intersection of Main and Jackson Streets, a RAISE sidewalk and roadway funds, a bicycle lane and other projects to be completed as part of the CDBG and TAP projects on Main Street. He then said the city will receive a 50-50 grant for several Drake Harbor projects, and described several playground fundraising opportunities. He concluded that the city has received a \$500,000 federal grant for its Main Street projects.

The group went into executive session about 6:20 PM. The group welcomes visitors to its open sessions, which are usually held on 1st and 3rd Monday eves.

The Wildcats had three rushers eclipse the century mark and the offense racked up nearly 500 yards in a wild 46-28 win over South Callaway at home on Friday night in one Class 2 District 3 semifinal.

Uncustomarily, the visiting Bulldogs won the toss and elected to receive the opening kickoff, but Warsaw forced a punt and quickly went to work.

The Wildcats got on the board first on a 6 yard touchdown run by Josh Harvath; the first of several on the night for the sophomore ball carrier. The PAT was no good after a bad snap but Warsaw went up 6-0.

With the Green and Black defense holding tight, the Wildcats scored again late in the opening period on another Harvath run, this time from 1 yard out. A sweet shovel pass to Jayce Depriest from Garrett Ferguson for the 2-point conversion was successful, however, the play was negated on a penalty. Games came back on to try the 30-yard PAT, it sailed right, but

the Wildcats extended their lead to 12-0.

South Callaway closed the gap on their next possession on a 7 yard run by quarterback Tayber Gray. Gray also converted the 2-point try to make it 12-8 with 3:51 left to go in the first half.

Warsaw's next score was no less than dramatic as Ferguson led the troops downfield. A big-time 38 yard completion to Jase Hubert got the Wildcats into the red zone and with no time left on the clock, Ferguson scored on a 1-yard run. The "Cats 2-point attempt fell short once again, but at the half, it was Wildcats, 18; South Callaway, 8.

For fans in the stands, the third quarter was entertaining as it provided nearly half of the scoring of the entire game.

After receiving the kickoff, Warsaw marched down the field and hit paydirt on another Harvath run from 5 yards out. Games came on to put thru the PAT and the Wildcats lead swelled to 25-8.

But just under one minute later, the Bulldogs narrowed the margin again, this time on a 1 yard run by Gray. Gray's pass was intercepted by Harvath on the 2-point try, and the Wildcats still

held a two score advantage, 25-14.

For the Warsaw faithful, things got too close for comfort. The Bulldogs recovered an onside kick on the ensuing kickoff and under one minute later, they scored again on a powerful 41 yard touchdown run by Owen Rees. The 2-point attempt was no good, but things got tight at 25-20.

The Wildcats showed that their offense can strike quickly too when Depriest rattled off a 54 yard run that ended in the paint. Games nailed the PAT and Warsaw led, 32-20.

Harvath's *fourth* touchdown of the night, a 20 yard run and another Games PAT capped the scoring in third and the Wildcats led 39-20.

Oliver Robertson got in on the scoring for Warsaw on a 5 yard run in the fourth and Games put another PAT thru for a 46-20 lead and a Gray pass to Nathan Hecktor from 6 yards out, followed by a 2-point conversion rounded out the scoring for the 46-28 win for the Wildcats.

Hubert sealed the deal with a late interception.

Depriest led Warsaw with 162 yards on the ground and 1 score while Harvath was second with 134 yards while tallying 4 touchdowns. Ferguson also finished in triple digits with 103 yards and 1 rushing touchdown. He was also 4 for 8 passing for 58 yards with 1 interception.

Robertson added 3 carries for 19 yards and 1 TD for the Wildcats.

Hubert hauled in 1 pass for 38 yards, Depriest also had 1 for 12 and Games was on the receiving end of 2 passes for 8 yards.

Games also went 4 for 5 on his PAT's.

For the defense Drake Murrell led the team with 4.5 tackles, including 2 quarterback sacks. Sonny Garrett tallied 4 individual tackles. Devon Boul and Hubert both contributed 3.5 and 3 each were added by Harvath, Riley Taylor and Kendall Bagley.

Robertson also had 1 sack of the Bulldogs quarterback.

With the win, Warsaw punched their ticket to the district championship game this Friday when they'll take on Father Tolton Catholic (10-0) in Columbia.

That game is slated for a 7:00 PM kickoff. Digital tickets only will be accepted, cost is \$6. Those tickets can be purchased by visiting <https://www.mshsaa.org/tickets.aspx>.

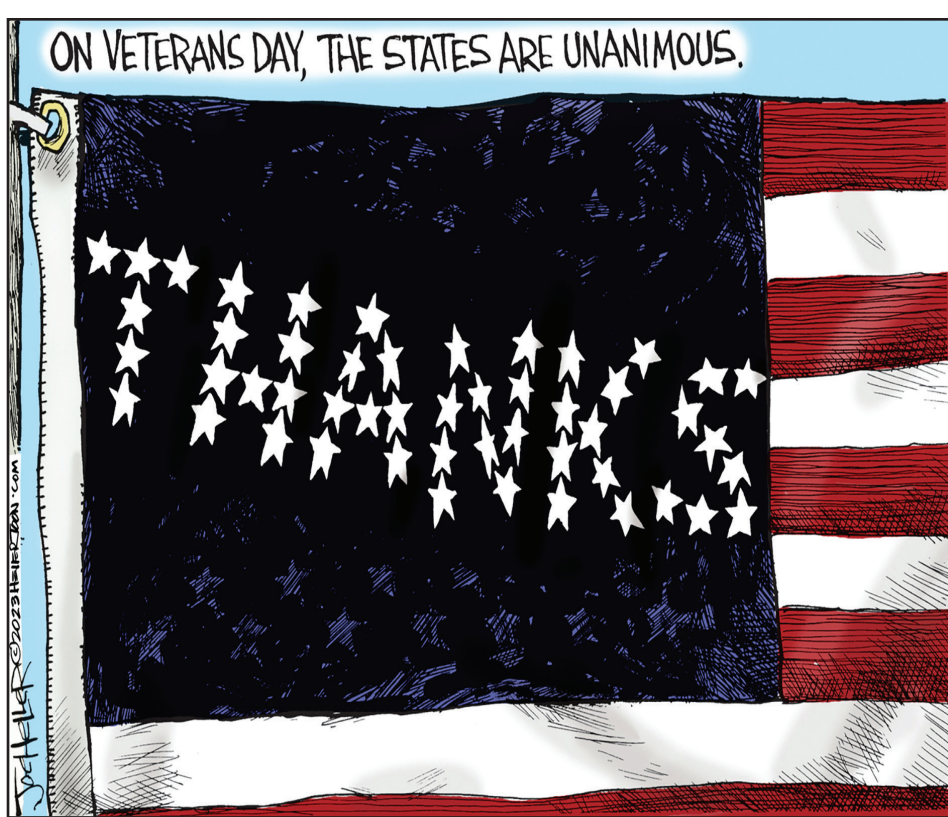
**Have I Got A Line For You!**

You may spend decades contributing to various retirement accounts. But for some accounts, such as a traditional IRA and 401(k), you must start withdrawing funds at a certain point. What should you know about this requirement?

To begin with, the rules governing these withdrawals — technically called required minimum distributions, or RMDs — have changed recently. For many years, individuals had to begin taking their RMDs (which are based on the account balance and the IRS' life expectancy factor) when they turned 70½. The original SECURE Act of 2019 raised this age to 72, and SECURE 2.0, passed in 2022, raised it again, to 73. (If you turned 73 in 2023, and you were 72 in 2022 when the RMD limit was still 72, you should have taken your first RMD for 2022 by April 1 of this year. You will then need to take your 2023 RMD by Dec. 31. And going forward, you'll also need to take your RMDs by the end of every year.)

Not all retirement accounts are subject to RMDs. They aren't required for a Roth IRA, and, starting in 2024, won't be required for a Roth 401(k) or 403(b) plan. But if your account does call for RMDs, you do need to take them, because if you don't, you could face tax penalties. Previously, this penalty was 50% of the amount you were supposed to have taken, but SECURE 2.0 reduced it to 25%.

When you take your RMDs, you need to be aware of a key issue: taxes. RMDs are taxed as ordinary income, and, as such, they could potentially bump you into a higher tax bracket and possibly even increase your Medicare premiums, which are determined by your modified adjusted gross income. Are there any ways you could possibly reduce an RMD-related tax hike?

You might have some options. Here are two to consider:

- **Convert tax-deferred accounts to Roth IRA.** You could convert some, or maybe all, of your tax-deferred retirement accounts to a Roth IRA. By doing so, you could lower your RMDs in the future — while adding funds to an account you're never required to touch. So, if you don't really need all the money to live on, you could include the remainder of the Roth IRA in your estate plans, providing an initially tax-free inheritance to your loved ones. However,

converting a tax-deferred account to a Roth IRA will generate taxes in the year of conversion, so you'd need the money available to pay this tax bill.

- **Donate RMDs to charity.** In what's known as a qualified charitable distribution, you can move up to \$100,000 of your RMDs directly from a traditional IRA to a qualified charity, avoiding the taxes that might otherwise result if you took the RMDs yourself. After 2023, the \$100,000 limit will be indexed to inflation.

Of course, before you start either a Roth IRA conversion or a qualified charitable distribution, you will need to consult with your tax advisor, as both these moves have issues you must consider and may not be appropriate for your situation.

But it's always a good idea to know as much as you can about the various aspects of RMDs — they could play a big part in your retirement income strategy

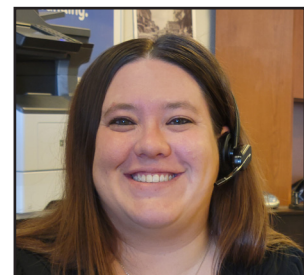

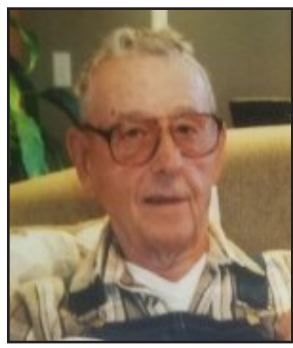

*Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry; both to abound and to suffer need. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.* (Philippians 4:11-13)

What Paul says is true for all of us. Life is never perfect. There are happy times, and there are sad times. Sometimes, we thrive, and sometimes we suffer. The stronger our hold on Jesus, the more likely we can say with Paul, "I am content." So many people died because of the Coronavirus. Many were deathly ill but recovered. Thank God the pandemic is over! We don't like such things, and we don't understand why they happen. Do you think you can join Paul and declare, "I am content because Christ gives me the strength to endure anything?"

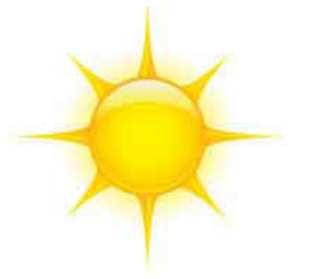

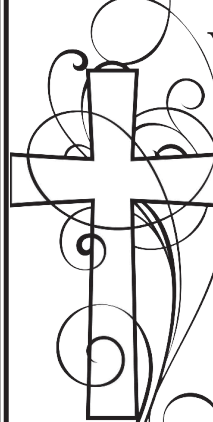

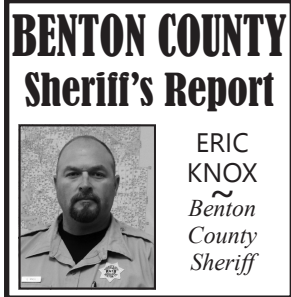

**Missouri Hunters Harvest 2,219 Birds During Fall Firearms Turkey Season**

*Top harvest counties were Dent, Crawford, and Washington.*

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that hunters checked 2,219 turkeys during Missouri's fall firearms turkey season, Oct. 1-31. Top harvest counties were Dent with 86 birds harvested, Crawford with 82, and Washington with 72.

Hunters harvested 1,844 birds during the 2022 fall firearms turkey season. "It is great to see an uptick in fall harvest," said MDC Turkey Biologist Nick Oakley. "We saw an increased harvest during the spring season and an increase in poult production this year, so it makes sense that fall harvest would follow suit."

Fall archery turkey hunting continues through Nov. 10 and resumes Nov. 22 through Jan. 15, 2024. Get more information about fall turkey hunting at [mdc.mo.gov/hunting-trapping/species/turkey](http://mdc.mo.gov/hunting-trapping/species/turkey).

MDC is again asking Missouri turkey hunters to save and send feathers from the wild turkeys they harvest this fall. MDC asks hunters who harvest turkeys to mail

feathers from their turkeys to MDC using a postage-paid envelope from MDC. The feathers will help MDC scientists improve research models used to monitor turkey population trends and estimate turkey numbers across the state. MDC instructs turkey hunters to save the 9th and 10th primary wing feathers and 3-5 breast feathers from harvested turkeys after Telechecking.
