Massive Response As Fire Ravages River's End Motel

Warsaw Awarded Another TAP Grant; Update On RAISE

The following information was submitted by Randy Pogue, City Administrator, City of Warsaw.

This article will address the north and south side of the Main Street Complete Street project. Additionally, an update on the near twenty-five million dollars RAISE project

North Side

The first phase of utility relocation is completed with the placement of the new water mains. The second and final phase of utility relocation will begin within the next two weeks. This phase will be underground burial of fiber optic owned by Brightspeed Internet. Brightspeed contractors will start placing their fiber underground and then removing the poles that the fiber is currently attached to. This project will mainly consist of underground boring and will have little disturbance above ground.

The roadway construction plans are nearing completion and will soon be submitted to the two funding sources for review.

It is the hope of the city to be able to advertise the project for contractor bids by the middle of 2024.

South Side

The City of Warsaw has received a \$500,000 grant through the Transportation Assistance Program (TAP) with a \$500,000 match. This will make the south side a total project of \$1,000,000. In 2022 the city received a TAP for the North Side, and now with the 2024 TAP award, the

A fire completely destroyed River's End Motel located on Missouri Highway 83 on Wednesday, November 22. According to owner Jason Jones, the fire broke out in the utility room and quickly spread throughout the structure. At approximately 6:00 PM, a guest noticed smoke coming out of a vent in one of the rooms and reported it to the manager who was in the office. The Warsaw Fire Department was called but within an hour the structure was completely engulfed in flames.

Warsaw Fire Captain John Powell reported that three engines, six tankers, four brush trucks and a rescue truck were on the scene to combat the fire. There were 30 volunteer firefighters from Warsaw and Lincoln on the scene fighting the fire until 3:00 AM.

"The fire started at the center of the building so by the time we arrived the building was completely engulfed in flames," said Powell. "The structure was a total loss but there was no evidence of foul play."

"Thankfully, no one suffered any injuries," said Jones. "We are so sad about this. We remodeled the entire property just a

few short months ago and to have this happen after all the hard work we've put in it is devastating. The property was completely destroyed in a matter of minutes due to an electrical issue inside the utility room that started the blaze. We do want to thank the Warsaw Fire Department and the Warsaw Police for keeping the property secure and anyone else that assisted in controlling the fire. Seriously, THANK YOU! We're not sure what the future looks like but

we're grateful for everyone that's reached out and offered help, condolences and prayers. We love you all and thank you for the support."

"As you know my managers Sarah and Jeff Plaster and their daughter Ariel lived on the property so they didn't just lose their jobs, but they lost their home and everything in it," Jones added. "If you would like to donate to their family we've set up a GoFundMe page to assist

them in starting over."

Presently the Plaster family is living in Jones' home in Warsaw. They are staying there until they can find a permanent residence and jobs. On Tuesday, the Plaster family was in Springfield looking for a place to live.

"We can't find anything to rent in Warsaw so we are exploring other options," said Sarah Plaster.

Sarah moved to Warsaw from Texas five years ago and had been the manager of River's End Motel for

the past five years. She had previously worked for Steve and Dawn Squires who owned the motel before Jones purchased it.

"We were getting ready to watch a movie in the office when the lights went off," said Sarah Plaster. "My husband went to the utility room to check out the breaker box. He flipped the breaker but nothing happened. About that time, a guest called and reported that smoke was coming out

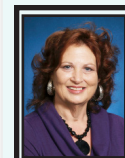

of one of vents in his room. In a matter of minutes, the fire had spread. We think the fire started in the attic of the utility room so my husband was lucky to get out of there when he did," said Plaster. "We called 911 and the Warsaw Fire Department was here in 17 minutes, but it was already too late. They worked until 3 in the morning but we lost everything; our home, our clothing and possessions and one of our cats."

River's End Motel had recently undergone an extensive remodel thanks to it's newest owner. Jones, who attended Warsaw High School in 1994-95 dropped out of high school, moved to Kansas City and began a career in sales.

Since then, Jones has bought numerous properties in Missouri and Kansas as well as an all-inclusive resort in Belize. Jones runs seven different companies in the hotel/motel/rental business as well as a rental boat in Osage Beach.

"When River's End was available, I decided this would be a way to give back to the community that made an impression on me so many years ago," said Jones.

Jones completely remodeled River's End by investing over \$400,000 to upgrade and bring back the motel to the family-oriented establishment it had been.

Since reopening in March, River's End Motel had been booked every weekend.

Jones lives in Piper, Kansas, near the airport with his four children and girlfriend Trisha. They also have a house on Highway C near Warsaw where they visit on weekends.

By Tuesday morning, the GoFundMe campaign for the manager had raised more than \$5,500.

Osage River Valley from pre-civilization to modern day. Waterfowl, bald eagles and turkey vultures can routinely be observed from the observation deck.

Clint Mason, Branch Chief from the Kansas City District, addressed a group of concerned citizens at the meeting and offered some possible solutions to the problem of how to keep the Visitors' Center open throughout the year.

One solution was to remodel the Visitors' Center and construct 18 work stations so all of the Truman Dam staff could be together in the building. If this were to happen, the current administration building and the two houses behind the building would

be abandoned and possibly demolished.

"We currently have offices in the Administration Building across the lake from the Visitors' Center," said Mason. "We also are currently using the two houses behind the Administration Building for offices. These houses were built for living quarters for Corps employees, but they have been converted into office spaces. These houses were built in the 70's and are in need of repair. After a feasibility study in December, costing approximately \$270,000, Col. Travis Rayfield, the District Kansas City Commander, will make the final decision on whether or not the three current buildings will be torn down and the Visitors' Center will become the main office for employees of Truman Dam and Reservoir."

If the plan is approved, the land where the present administration office sits could be used by the City of Warsaw for campgrounds or other recreational venues.

"We need to remember that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is not the enemy," said Alford. "We need to work together to solve the problem of maintaining the Visitors' Center and keeping the cost of maintenance down."

One concerned citizen questioned why the electricity generated by Truman Dam wasn't being used locally to operate the Visitors' Center.

"The Department of Energy is in charge of distributing the energy generated by Truman Dam," said Mason. "Currently that energy goes to Springfield utilities, southern Missouri and Oklahoma. Electricity for the Visitors' Center runs about \$2,000 a month."

Another Benton County resident questioned why the Corps of Engineers didn't charge a fee to tour the Visitors' Center to help with

the cost of maintaining the Center.

"We are not allowed by the U. S. government to charge a fee at the Visitors' Center," said Mason.

Mason went on to point out that the Truman Visitors' Center itself was in need of repair.

"We replaced the roof ten years ago and windows have been replaced several times," said Mason. "The carpet needs to be replaced but we are waiting to see how extensive the remodel will be. We don't want to replace the carpet and then tear it out for the remodel. There are also plans to update the theater room where we are sitting."

If the Visitors' Center is remodeled, some of the exhibits will have to go because the work stations will take up some of the present exhibit space. The plan is to keep the viewing area available for the public and if this happens then visitors will be able to go into the center throughout the week as the staff will be working there.

Presently, the Visitors' Center is only open Friday, Saturday, Sunday and on Mondays following a holiday from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM from April until September. In addition to the regular summer operation of the Visitors' Center, the area is open during Heritage Days and the Kaysinger Christmas celebration.

of Alderman for approval. We have received approval to move forward with selection of engineers for the project. No schedule has yet been established by MoDOT, but most likely the south side project will not start until early 2025.

Project Design
The north and south side will start at Hackberry and end at the Highway 65 right-of-way. Both sides will have 5-foot sidewalks and bicycle lanes. To make this possible, stormwater pipes will be placed underground and with gutters diverting storm water into open inlets as completed previously in the downtown and Harrison Street improvements. Decorative lighting will be

placed with the ability to place banners and Christmas lights. A center turn lane will be placed for improved vehicle access.

RAISE Project
Earlier this year, the City of Warsaw has started biweekly meetings with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT). The RAISE Complete Street project funds are exclusively for roadway improvements and nearly exact in design to the previously mentioned Main Street Complete Street project. Current discussion center around the contract with USDOT and how the city will procure the project for engineers and contractors.

Tireless Player And Coach, Henderson Finds Home With Cole Camp Bluebirds

Derald Henderson knows sports and he definitely knows his way around a basketball court. While he played high school ball at Skyline on a 24-4 team, he never seemed to get tired running up and down the court. He used to say, "Players think they are tired, but they are really not."

Well, I had a chance to interview this tireless player and coach this week. Below is his story.

JL: Where have you coached?

Coach Henderson: From 2014-16, I coached Warsaw

High School JV/Assistant basketball coach under Jared Wallace and Jason Ollison.

Then from 2016-20, I was the head coach at Stockton High School (57-48 in 4 seasons) and we appeared in 1 district championship game.

While there I helped 3 players get to play basketball at the college level; Drew Wheeler, Concordia University in Seward, NE; he was the all-time leading scorer at Stockton High School. There was also Gannon Kenney who went to Fort Scott Community College in Fort Scott, KS and D.J. Bays who went to Baptist Bible College. We set a team record for fewest defensive points allowed

for a season twice; 2017-18, 2018-19.

From there, I coached from 2020-22 at SBU as the men's basketball graduate assistant.

Worked under Clark Sheehy and Aaron Niven at SBU. My Responsibilities included coaching guards, regional recruiting, scouting and game preparation, video and film coordinator, observed and assisted professional basketball player workouts; Damian Prgomet (Australia), Quinn Nelson (Germany).

At SBU, in the 2021-22 season we went 21-6 and were the GLVC regular season champs.

After SBU, I came to Cole Camp. In 2022-23 I was the Cole Camp junior high girls basketball coach. We went 11-4 and now I am the 2023-24 varsity girls basketball coach.

JL: What is your favorite sport to coach? You have done almost everything.

Coach Henderson: I've

coached baseball as an assistant for 3 seasons. I also played baseball in college at Lindenwood University. I've coached football as an assistant for 7 years. Basketball is my favorite sport to coach.

JL: You played ball at Skyline. What honors did you and your team receive?

Coach Henderson: In 2008-09, we were 24-4. We won a district title under head coach Jackie Payne. (This reporter saw Jackie play. He is a legend at Skyline.) We won the Skyline Tournament as well.

JL: What challenges are you facing rebuilding girls basketball at Cole Camp?

Coach Henderson: I think girls basketball at the high school level is seeing some issues with participation. Numbers of kids playing are lower than in the past and some teams are unable to field teams. I want to coach and teach girls basketball and allow athletes to have a positive experience.

JL: You have a longtime friendship with Cole Camp coach and administrator, Kevin Shearer. Can you comment?

Coach Henderson: Kevin coached (football and basketball) and was the principal at Skyline High School for me and my siblings. My family has always thought highly of him. He returned to Cole Camp when I was a middle school student. My wife and I both teach and were wanting to find a community we could work together in and settle in. Our relationship with Coach Shearer meant a lot in the process. We are blessed to work with great staff members at Cole Camp High School.

SEEKING NOMINEES Benton County SWCD Board of Supervisors

Let it be known that the Benton County Soil and Water Conservation District will hold an election for one supervisor in each of two different territories in the county between February 1st and the 20th, 2024. Anyone that owns a farm in Territory 1 (Northwest section of Benton Co. including White Township) or Territory 3 (Middle section of Benton Co. including Lindsey and Cole townships), and meets the qualifications listed below, may be considered as a candidate in the election. You may submit your name for participation in the election by completing the self-nomination form and delivering it to the district by 5:00 P.M. on November 30th, 2023. The self-nomination form is available online at <https://mosoilandwater.land/benton> or in person at the district office at 535 N Hwy 65, Lincoln.

Supervisors of the district administer district policies and programs, district personnel, and cost-share funding made available by the one-tenth-of-one-percent parks, soils and water sales tax. During fiscal year 2023, the district provided \$93,000 of cost-share funds to assist the landowners with installing agricultural erosion control and water quality practices.

The qualifications required to be a supervisor are:

1. Being a land representative from the district (10 CSR 70-4.010 (1) (I)). A land representative is defined as the owner or representative authorized by power of attorney of any farm lying within an area proposed to be established, and subsequently established, as a soil and water conservation district under Chapter 278, RSMo. Each farm is entitled to representation by a land representative: provided, however that the land representative is a taxpayer of the county within which the soil and water district is located.
 2. Residing in, or owning a farm in, the area from which he/she is nominated where there is an expiring term.
 3. Being a cooperatoer of the district, defined as, "a person who is actively engaged in farming and practices conservation activities related to agriculture".
 4. Being a current resident and tax-paying citizen of the county for at least two years preceding the election date.
 5. Be eighteen (18) years of age or older by the election date.
