

I was watching the national news on tv one evening last week. There was a segment about doctors around the world, and now finally in the United States who are writing prescriptions for nature to some of their patients.

In 2005, when the book "Last Child in the Woods" was published (which I highly encourage every parent and grandparent to read) author Richard Louv coined the term Nature Deficit Disorder. He discussed how our youth are so disconnected from nature.

Today, kids are somewhat aware of the global threats to the environment-but their physical contact, their intimacy with nature is fading. That's the opposite of how it was when I was a kid. Nobody in the 1950s talked about acid rain or holes in the ozone layer or global warming. But I knew my woods and fields. I knew every bend in the creek and every path through the forest and fields. Today, a kid can likely tell you about the rainforest but not about the last time (or ever) he or she explored the woods, or lay in a field listening to the wind or watching the clouds drift by.

When "Last Child in the Woods" came out, Nature Deficit Disorder was virtually ignored by the academic world. As of today, over 1000 studies have been conducted on the

The inevitable question grieving people ask this time of year is, "How will I ever get through the holidays?"

Whether it is the first or second holiday season they face after the death of a loved one, the added strains can create increased pressure for people already experiencing the intense feelings of grief.

How do you "get through" the holidays? There is no single answer.



(Continued from Page 1) help remind me that I would not have missed knowing Micah for 19 years, but I have missed him for 21 years, remembering him every day but vividly on my holiday/ birthday. I do not think I have used the word grief, but I am very happy to have known Micah.'

Grieving a loved one during the holidays can be especially challenging, partly because the person's absence forever changes longstanding rituals.

"Everyone deals with grief in different ways," said Cathy Palmer. "Some don't want to talk about it because the reminder makes them sad. Others want to keep their loved one's memory alive because they don't want to forget them. There is no right or wrong way to grieve. My kids try to keep me busy so I won't feel lonely. My children and grandchildren have given me a happiness to keep me going. Sometimes I feel guilty when we do things together because I think about how much Will would have enjoyed it. Or even more guilty when we do things that we couldn't have done if Will were here because he didn't enjoy it. I know he wouldn't want me to feel that way. The 'Year of Firsts' was so hard going thru special occasions without him but the second time hasn't been much easier. I know time will ease the pain but we will always miss him. Our situation is different from others because we watched him suffer for almost 3 years so we have a peace in knowing that he is no longer in a wheelchair but is walking on streets of gold. I don't know how people deal with the loss of a loved one when they don't have the comfort that only God can give," said Palmer.

While loss due to a loved one's death is typically the most acute experience of grief, the loss of primary relationships can especially painful during holidays. In life, rituals provide a sense of direction, stability, and an anchor for us as we move through the

"Surrounding with family Praising God for his help and remembering all the good times with our spouse or love ones that passed but remembering that they are free from pain and are in the loving arms of the Lord. God helps me every day with the passing of my husband and gives me strength throughout the day," said Debbie Smith. "I try to help other people with a loss of a love one and try to help them during grief by being there for them just to talk or doing something with them. Everyone goes through grief differently and we need to help if we can. Sometimes a hug is all they need and by keeping busy with something like sewing painting or helping other people. I hope this will help you, the pain never goes away but knowing I will be in heaven with him and being with him helps. God helps me daily," said Smith.

"Grief is like the ocean it rolls in and out and with the holidays, it sometimes feels like it is washing over us. We feel what we feel, but we don't park ourselves there," said Dusty Mills. "The memories become until bittersweet that blessed time when they're iust sweet. I allow the grief, and I feel my feels, but then I get up and carry on. The best way we can honor our loved ones is to live the life we're given each day. They wouldn't want us to wallow in grief and despair. I rely on the comfort that only Jesus can give. I'm sad for us because we miss them but I'm joyful that they're no longer unwell and they're in the presence of the Lord. I can't be sad about that,"

said Mills. According to Psychology Today, it can be helpful to participate in holiday rituals in memory of someone you've lost, especially if it relates directly to his or her interests.

-Light candles.

-Talk, write about, or post on social media about the person.

-Donate children's toys or books.

-Dedicate a prayer or religious service to the loved one's memory, such as a Catholic Mass or Jewish kaddish.

-Plant a tree in memory of the deceased, in your own yard or in a forest (through a group like the Arbor Day Foundation).

-Make a card or write a holiday letter with the person's picture.

-Place the deceased's photo or a significant item of his on vour Christmas tree or among holiday decorations.

topic and they point in one direction: Nature is not only nice to have but it's a haveto-have for physical health and cognitive function.

These studies have shown that time in nature is an antidote for stress: it can lower blood pressure and hormone stress levels. nervous reduce system enhance immune arousal, system function, increase self-esteem, reduce anxiety improve mood. Attention Deficit Disorder and aggression lessen in natural environments which also help speed the rate of healing.

Nature can't offer flat screen tvs, air conditioning or wifi but can potentially offer something more important: improved health by way of a stronger immune system, better sleep and reduced

Countless studies have shown that as little as 120 minutes in nature per week (more would be better) result in our physiology.

As we know, air pollution can trigger allergies, asthma and other respiratory diseases. It might surprise you to learn though that indoor concentration of air pollutants are often two to five times higher than outdoor concentrations. One eight year study of 108,630 women examined relationship between green spaces in neighborhoods. Women who lived in areas with the most green space were 34% less likely to die from respiratory disease. Studies show exposure to natural sunlight affects your circadian rhythm helping you feel more tired at night, shortening the time it takes to fall asleep, improves quality of sleep and helps reduce depression. Studies also show that people exposed to more natural light healed faster after surgery and reported less pain. Sunlight also helps our bodies create vitamin D which studies show may help prevent cancer, osteoporosis and heart attacks. Women also showed an increased white blood cell count which helps fight viruses.

Winter is a great time to be outside. Dress appropriately and go for a walk with your family or friends in the park or hike a new trail. Pack a lunch or snacks and make it an adventure for the kids. Encourage them to enjoy nature and be sure you read "Last Child in the Woods" by Richard Louv. You can download free apps such as iNaturalist where you can take pictures of plants or animals and it will identify them for you. Another app is ebird which will record the bird singing and it will identify that bird.


As the year winds down, you might be wondering whether you still have time to make some positive financial moves - and you do. One productive action to consider is "maxing out" on your individual retirement account (IRA).

You have until April 15, 2024, to contribute to your IRA for the 2023 tax year. But if you can afford it, why not put in the extra money now and get it working for you as soon as possible?

For 2023, you can put up to \$6,500 into an IRA, plus an additional \$1,000 catchup contribution if you're 50 or older. (This limit rises to \$7,000, plus the \$1,000 catch-up amount, in 2024.) If you already have a traditional or Roth IRA, you may know the benefits, but if you don't have either, here's a quick summary:

• Traditional IRA – When you invest in a traditional IRA, your earnings grow tax deferred and your contributions may qualify for a tax deduction. If you and your spouse don't participate in a 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored plan, you can deduct the full amount of your IRA contributions, up to the

contribution limit. But if



you or your spouse invest in an employer-sponsored plan, you may be able to take a full or partial deduction if you are married and filing jointly, with a modified adjusted gross income of \$136,000 or less. For single filers, this figure is \$83,000. (For the 2024 tax year, these figures rise to \$143,000 if you're married and file jointly, and \$87,000

if you're a single filer.) • Roth IRA – By investing in a Roth IRA, your contributions are tax deductible, but your earnings can grow tax free provided you've held your account at least five years and you don't start withdrawing the earnings until you're 59½. And because you're investing with after-tax dollars, you can withdraw contributions — not the earnings — at any time, for any purpose, without taxes or penalties. You may be eligible for a full or partial contribution if your modified adjusted gross income is less than \$228,000 married and filing jointly, or less than \$153,000 if you're a single filer. (For

less than \$161,000 if you're a single filer.) These tax advantages provide a strong incentive to fully fund an IRA each year. Furthermore, you can put almost any investment stocks, bonds, mutual funds and so on — into an IRA, so you can create a portfolio that matches your goals and risk tolerance.

You can still fully fund your IRA for the 2023 tax year, but as you continue to save, you might find a more efficient way to reach the maximum, such as setting aside a regular amount each month. To make it as stressfree as possible, you can have the money automatically moved from your savings or checking account to your IRA. If it's still difficult to come up with these amounts every month, you could put in what you can afford and then add other funds, such as a year-end bonus or a tax refund, when you receive

Any time you contribute to your IRA is a good time - but if you can do it early, or have a savings strategy throughout the year, you can avoid the last-minute dash to put in the cash.

Health Information Management director, said the patient portal is a great tool for patients to know what medications their provider has prescribed, treatment options, future appointments and other health information.

"The portal provides a secure and easy way to manage and stay on top of your health care," she said. "It can be accessed on a computer or through an app on your phone. Patients can request current medication refills, view current and past health information from most clinics and the hospital, view lab results, radiology reports, provider notes, current conditions, medications, and allergies immunizations, as well as a see visit history at any Bothwell facility. It also features a health summary that provides a quick glance at your most current information from demographics to treatment." Warsaw resident Cathy Tealbend expressed her about excitement MyBothwellHealth has to offer and how she can use it

anytime, anywhere. "I love the portal," Tealbend said. "I can communicate with my doctor and the nurses quickly and view my labs after they are complete. The portal allows me to look at anything I need, without bugging the office. The only time I have to call is to make an appointment."

One of her favorite tools within MyBothwellHealth includes the messaging capability between medical staff and the patient. Patients communicate with participating providers through the portal by sending a message with questions regarding and medications, though this should not be used in emergency situations.

"I take advantage of the messaging the most," she said. "I can have quick and efficient communication with my provider about my care and ensure my prescription is refilled even when I am out of town for months at a time."

Sims said creating an account and using the portal is simple.

To sign MyBothwellHealth, patients must have an email address in our electronic records system," she said. "This can be entered by hospital or clinic staff at the time of registration. Your access can be completed at that time or you can self-enroll later. To self-enroll, visit



As a portal user, individuals also have the ability to pay their bill completely online by following the link and using the statement number on their bill. Having physical copies of medical records is also easier, as patients can download and print off current and past documents anytime, free of charge.

New systems can be challenging to learn and understand, which why Bothwell designed MyBothwellHealth to be as simple to use as possible. All a patient needs to access the portal is a computer, tablet or cell phone.

"I don't know if enough people know about the portal and what it has to offer," Tealbend said. "I know navigating technology can be difficult for some, but once you learn how to use the portal, it is simple. Ask any of your health care providers and they will walk you through the process."


