

City Of Warsaw Names Eledge As Newest

At Monday night's city council meeting, the City of Warsaw Board of Alderman appointed Chad Eledge as the city's newest police chief.



Eledge takes over the position vacated by Sean McCannon upon his resignation in October.

Eledge is a former U.S. Marine who started his law enforcement career in the state of California 24 years ago. He has been with the City of Warsaw Police Department for nearly 5 years and most recently held the position of Sergeant.

"I am happy that the commission and our board of alderman chose to put their faith in me as the city's newest Police Chief," Eledge said. "I'm excited to get to work in my new role." Eledge is married to his wife, Kim. They have three children; Garrett, Zoe and Hunter, and one grandchild, Natalie.

Over 600 volunteers gathered on December 16 to lay wreaths on graves at the Missouri Veterans Cemetery in Higginsville, Missouri, the nearest national facility in the area.

According to Wreaths Across America fundraiser Ed Reis, despite the cooler temperatures and sprinkling rain, this was the largest turnout ever at the Higginsville location.

"It was a spectacular sight to see all the volunteers who came to lay wreaths on the graves of over 3,800 members of the armed forces buried at the Missouri Veterans Cemetery in Higginsville," said Reis.

Geni Harms, Cole Camp, and her family were volunteers.

"My dad was buried there in October, as an Army veteran," Harms said. "Our family started following the cemetery's Facebook page and learned of the opportunity to help out."

Reis, an 80 year old veteran himself, started working on the local Wreaths Across America project six years ago when they only had enough funds for 200 wreaths.

"We are so pleased that we have been able to raise enough money to put a wreath on every veteran's grave and this year we did it

in 15 minutes because of all the wonderful volunteers," he said.

"Seeing everyone from small kids to retired WWII veterans all gathered to show respect to our nation's best was the most impressive thing to see," Harms added. "Even though the weather County C-1 High School

was less than ideal with the cold, drizzling rain, it was heartwarming to know that every veteran would be honored."

As part of the program prior to the actual wreathing of the graves, members of the Lafayette

FFA chapter placed specially designed wreaths for the Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, Merchant Marines, Space Force and POW/MIA's. Other current and former military personnel also addressed the large crowd in attendance.

(Continued from Page 1) and suggested that as long as their name's are spoken, their sacrifices will never be forgotten. I loved being able to share the patriotism with my kids and family, especially since love for country was so important to my dad."

Wreaths Across America is a project in which all veteran's graves across the country have a wreath placed on them at exactly the same time. On December 16, wreaths were placed on graves at noon Eastern Time, at 11:00 AM Central Time, 10:00 AM Mountain Time and 9:00 AM Pacific Time.

In 2023, it was projected that over 2,700,000 wreaths were placed nationwide by over 2 million volunteers and supporters as part of the Wreaths Across America mission to Remember, Honor and Teach.

Wreaths The Across America story began over 28 years ago when the Worcester Wreath Company from Harrington, Maine initiated a tradition of donating and placing wreaths on the headstones of the nation's fallen heroes Arlington National at Cemetery. Recognition of the service and sacrifice of the veterans and their families is especially poignant during the traditional holiday season.

Worcester Wreath Company continues to be a major supporter of the project. Wreaths are sponsored by individuals, businesses and groups from communities nationwide. Wreaths will be placed in all 50 states from Maine to Alaska and Hawaii, and at 24 national cemeteries on foreign soil.

The cost to sponsor a wreath is \$17; however, if purchased through the Wood and Huston Bank fundraising page, the cemetery is given a free wreath for every two wreaths purchased. "The ceremony and volunteer turnout was just really great," Harms concluded. "I had no idea what to expect as a first time volunteer, but it is definitely something that I will be a part of again." From the initial concept of a Veterans Cemetery program, one operational philosophy has remained constant; to honor veterans their service and for sacrifice. With that goal in mind, the Missouri Veterans Commission has created a network of Veterans cemeteries so that every Missouri Veteran will have reasonable access to a Veterans cemetery. At this time, five cemeteries are in operation: Springfield,

Bloomfield, Higginsville, Ft. Leonard Wood, and Jacksonville. In addition, the sixth cemetery at Missouri Veterans Home - St. James is not open to new interments.

(Continued from Page 1) In a lengthy presentation by Warsaw City Administrator Randy Pogue, a proposed 2024 city budget was presented at Monday night's meeting. He noted that the nearly \$6.5 million budget he suggested was less than the city's 2023 budget due to recent completion of its water main project, and he also projected a 3.5% increase in city revenues. He added that his figures needed "fine tuning" and that he would come back with final numbers at the group's next meeting, presently scheduled for 6:00 PM on Tuesday, December 26. The budget proposal was not voted on. The session opened at 6:00 PM on December 18, with Aldermen Lou Breshears, Rob Coskey, Eric Flores, Reba Slavens, Adam Howe present. Alderman Doug Hedrick was absent. Mayor Eddie Simons presided; City Clerk Jessica Kendall recorded.

First actions by the group were to approve the eve's agenda and November 6 meeting minutes, then agree to pay bills presented. There was no old business. During the meeting a flyer was presented to aldermen, notifying them that a "Holiday Appreciation Lunch" will be furnished for city employees at 11:00 AM on Friday, December 22 at the Community Bldg.







medical expenses, first-time purchase of a home (up to \$10,000), after the birth or adoption of a child (up to \$5,000) and more (see irs. gov/taxtopics/tc557). With a Roth IRA, which is funded with after-tax dollars, you can withdraw contributions - but not earnings — at any time, for any purpose, without incurring penalties. Given these issues, how can you avoid dipping into your retirement accounts when you're faced with a financial need?

One possibility is to take out a loan from your 401(k). Unlike a 401(k) withdrawal, a loan is neither taxable nor subject to tax penalties. Also, the interest you pay on a 401(k) loan goes back into your account. Still, a 401(k) loan has its drawbacks. If you leave your job, you'll likely have to repay the loan in a short period of time and if you don't have all the money to repay it, the loan will be considered in default, so you'll owe taxes and the 10% penalty if you're younger than 591/2. But even if vou don't leave your job and you do repay the loan, you'll still have taken away money that could have potentially kept growing within your tax-deferred account. As mentioned above, as your money compounds, you'll want to minimize disruptions. Building an emergency

fund is another way to gain access to cash. Such a fund should contain at least six months' worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account. It can take time to build a fund of this size, so it's never too soon to start putting away money for it. To avoid the temptation of dipping into your emergency fund, you'd ideally keep this fund separate from your daily spending accounts.

Explore all your options before tapping into your IRA or 401(k) early. Keeping these accounts intact as long as possible is one of the best moves you can make to help build your future retirement income.

If you want to make a big purchase, such as a new car or a piece of property, or you were faced with a large, unexpected expense, such as a major home or auto repair, would you have the funds readily available? If not, you might look at what may be your biggest pool of money — your 401(k) or IRA. But should you tap into these accounts well before you retire?

Maybe not — and here's why:

•Less money in retirement-The more money you invest in your retirement accounts. and the longer you keep it invested, the more you'll probably have when you need it most — when you're retired. 

Is Christianity reasonable, or do we just accept it on blind faith? I have heard sincere Christians suggest that faith and reason are incompatible. I beg to differ. The theologians of the ancient and medieval church wrestled with this question. They argued as follows: It is true that reason alone can never discover God as we know Him in the Christian faith. God has revealed Himself to us in the written word (Scripture) and the incarnate word (Jesus). However, once faith has been born in the soul, the mind does want to know if revealed Christianity is reasonable. The answer is a resounding "Yes."

This must be the case if the God in whom we believe is a God of truth. The revealed God is (among other things) a reasonable God. The intelligence/reason we humans possess dwells in us because we were created in God's image. The God of the Bible does not act in an arbitrary or capricious manner. Once we have received the salvation offered to the world in Jesus Christ, we begin to think about such things as creation, divine providence, the nature of Jesus Christ, the Trinity, the authority of Scripture - - - all the truths which make up the Christian worldview. Those who put their minds to these matters learn that the faith revealed to us in Jesus Christ is reasonable. Why do so many intelligent

people reject Christianity? There are several reasons,

but a key problem is that they do not grasp the fact that faith precedes reason. You will fail if you try to find the true God using unaided human reason. Aristotle had no divine revelation, but he did conclude there is a God based on reason alone. His God was an unmoved mover, the first cause, an eternal being. However, he was ignorant of the love of God and His saving grace. His reason concluded, "There is a God," but his reason did not lead him to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Once we accept the testimony of the Apostles that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, Lord and Savior of the world, and then put on our thinking caps and reflect on the Christian message, we learn that the Gospel is very reasonable. We look at the world in which we live. examine the Scriptures, and conclude that the biblical view of reality fits with what we see.

Faith and reason are not in conflict. Those who reject Christian worldview the unreasonable assume as reason is superior to faith even though that conclusion cannot be rationally verified. Those whose hearts have been enlightened by God's Word and Spirit understand that reason must take a back seat to faith, and from that position, reason proves to be very useful. Reason divorced from faith leads nowhere. Reason informed by faith reinforces our confidence in the Christian revelation.






