In 2023 the 911 Center responded to a total of 41,855 calls. Of those calls 11,514 were for emergencies and 30,341 were administrative or non-emergency calls. When someone dials 911, trained dispatchers connect callers with the appropriate emergency services including law enforcement, firefighters, and emergency medical personnel.

(Continued from Page 1) City Attorney Cale Haddock and Clerk Kendall.

Aldermen Lou Breshears and Reba Slavens were also in attendance to provide a quorum. Aldermen absent were Eric Flores and Rob Coskey. Mayor Simons presided; Clerk Kendall recorded. The group approved the eve's agenda, minutes of its April 1 meeting, and payment of bills presented.

Megan Peterson, Executive Administrator of the Warsaw Area Chamber of Commerce, and Whitney Day, Board President of the Chamber of Commerce, then spoke of a planned May

18 Warsaw Outdoor Expo, to be a one day event this year. They added that they expected to have a beer garden and a petting zoo. The board indicated that it would make exceptions for both attractions. Lastly, the two noted that the Chamber of Commerce has no current contract with the city and were informed that the contract issue would be dealt with in the group's regular session this same eve.

When resuming new business, the board tabled the subject of approving an annual contract with the Chamber of Commerce, said to be about \$4,000, until absent members are present. Day and Petersen then asked if they could act as an umbrella organization to issue licenses to vendors. The group indicated that it would study the issue but until then, food vendors will still have to obtain a city license as is the current process. The group then heard a City of Warsaw Police Chief Chad Eledge discuss a need for new police badges, because of deterioration of some badges and a lack of uniformity in the appearance of those badges. The board agreed to purchase new badges for the police department at a total cost of \$479.88, less shipping.

Just before aldermen closed their regular session at about 6:25 P.M., Bill Roberts, the owner of a building in Northtown now vacant but formerly operated as The Dam Restaurant, said the last tenant left that building exposed to recent cold weather, and a pipe broke causing excessive water use. He requested that the bill be reduced. Alderman Breshears motioned that his current bill be cut in half, Alderman Slavens seconded, and the group agreed.

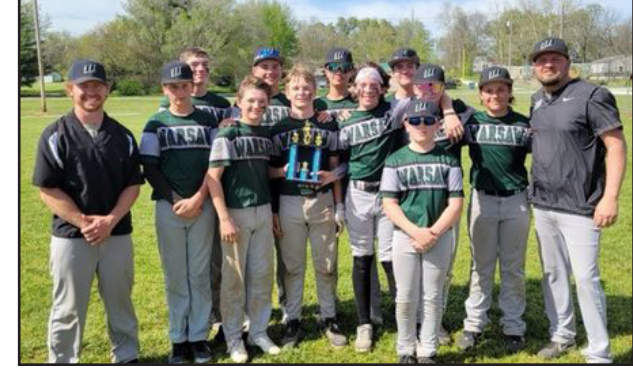

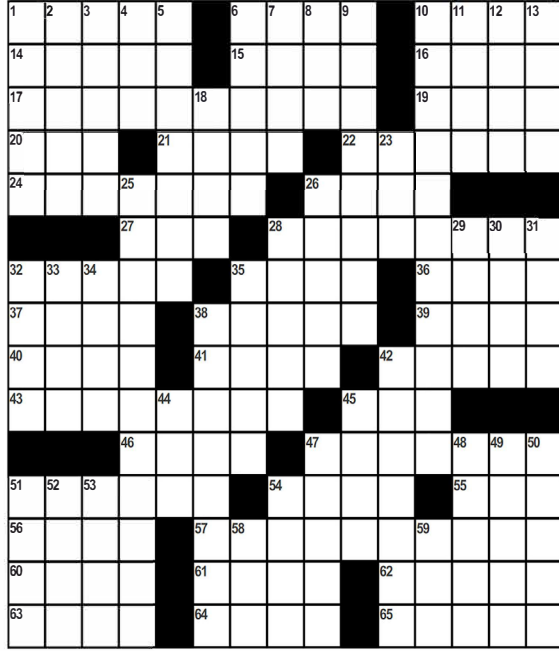

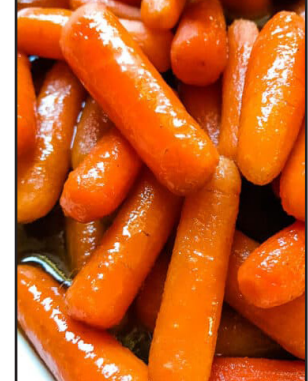

One of my favorite quick vegetable recipes is glazed carrots; a perfect side dish to almost anything. I used baby carrots in the recipe but if you use larger one make sure the slices are all equal in size.

- 1 16-ounce bag baby carrots
- 1/2 cup water
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoon packed light brown sugar
- Salt and pepper (less salt if you use salted butter)

Combine everything in a pan and bring to boil over medium high heat. Cover and reduce heat, cooking on low for about 5 minutes. Keep covered and turn heat to high and cook, stirring occasionally, until all water has evaporated and carrots are tender, about another 5 minutes. Remove from heat and sprinkle with salt and pepper. You can top with fresh herbs or orange juice if desired.



You might not have thought much about beneficiary designations — but they can play a big role in your estate planning.

When you purchase insurance policies and open investment accounts, such as your IRA, you'll be asked to name a beneficiary, and, in some cases, more than one. This might seem easy, especially if you have a spouse and children, but if you experience a major life event, such as a divorce or a death in the family, you may need to make some changes — because beneficiary designations carry a lot of weight under the law.

In fact, these designations can supersede the instructions you may have written in your will or living trust, so everyone in your family should know who is expected to get which assets. One significant benefit of having proper beneficiary designations in place is that they may enable beneficiaries to avoid the time-consuming — and possibly expensive — probate process.

The beneficiary issue can become complex because not everyone reacts the same way to events such as divorce — some people want their ex-spouses to still receive assets while others don't. Furthermore, not all the states have the same rules about how beneficiary designations are treated after a divorce. And some financial assets are treated differently than others.

Here's the big picture: If you've named your spouse as a beneficiary of an IRA, bank or brokerage account, insurance policy, will or trust, this beneficiary designation will automatically be revoked upon divorce in about half the states. So, if you still want your ex-spouse to get these assets, you will need to name them as a non-spouse beneficiary after the divorce. But if you've named your spouse as beneficiary for a 401(k) plan or pension, the designation will remain intact until and unless you change it, regardless of where you live.

However, in community property states, couples

are generally required to split equally all assets they acquired during their marriage. When couples divorce, the community property laws require they split their assets 50/50, but only those assets they obtained while they lived in that state. If you were to stay in the same community property state throughout your marriage and divorce, the ownership issue is generally straightforward, but if you were to move to or from one of these states, it might change the joint ownership picture.

Thus far, we've only talked about beneficiary designation issues surrounding divorce. But if an ex-spouse — or any beneficiary — passes away, the assets will generally pass to a contingent beneficiary — which is why it's important that you name one at the same time you designate the primary beneficiary. Also, it may be appropriate to name a special needs trust as beneficiary for a family member who has special needs or becomes disabled. If this individual were to be the direct beneficiary, any assets passing directly into their hands could affect their eligibility for certain programs.

You may need to work with a legal professional to sort out beneficiary designation issues and the rules that apply in your state. But you may also want to do a beneficiary review with your financial advisor whenever you experience a major life event, such as a marriage, divorce or the addition of a new child. Your investments, retirement accounts and life insurance proceeds are valuable assets — and you want them to go where you intended.

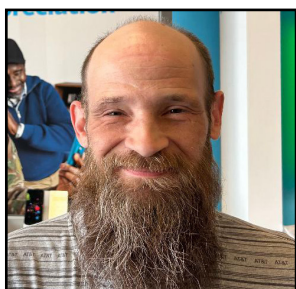
